Shri Venkaiah Naidu sworn-in as 13th Vice-President of India

New Delhi, Aug 11

Former Union Minister Shri M Venkaiah Naidu was sworn-in as 13th Vice President of India today. He was administered the oath of office by President Shri Ram Nath Kovind at a special function at Rashtrapati Bhavan. Outgoing Vice President Shri Hamid Ansari, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, Lok Sabha Speaker Smti Sumitra Mahajan, former Prime Minister Dr Manmohan Singh, Governors, Chief Ministers, Union Ministers, Members of Parliament were present at the event. Shri Naidu, before proceeding to the Rashtrapati Bhavan, paid tributes to the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi at Raj Ghat, Deen Dayal Upadhyay at DDU Park and Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel at Patel Chowk. After the swearing in ceremony, Shri Naidu reached Parliament House and took charge as the Chairman of Rajya Sabha. He also chaired the proceedings of the Upper House.

Shri Naidu was elected as the Vice President on 5th of this month, defeating opposition candidate Shri Gopal Krishna Gandhi.

Congratulating him, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said, Shri Naidu has arisen from grass root and will lead Indian polity to greater heights. He said Shri. Naidu,

The Prime Minister said the concept of Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana was Shri Naidu's initiative.



Shri Venkaiah Naidu took over as Rajya Sabha Chairman on Friday on the last day of the Monsoon Session of the Parliament, after being sworn-in as the Vice President of India.

Electoral Roll Management System; ERO-Net to be launched on Aug. 14

Port Blair, Aug 11
The Election Commission of India, with the objective of bringing a totally error free and authenticated electoral roll, and to have a common Electoral Roll Management System throughout India has come up with an online web-based portal "ERO-Net" (Electoral Registration Officer Net) being launched in all States/ UTs through which all the online electoral roll works will henceforth be undertaken on regular basis.

The ERO-Net will be launched by the Chief Electoral Officer, Andaman

& Nicobar Islands at 3 pm in the Mini Conference Hall of the Secretariat here on Aug 14, 2017.

ERO-Net will enable various services to external stakeholders and will also help in improving efficiency, decision making of internal stakeholders. It is envisioned keeping in mind the mandate of ECI, that no eligible voter to be left behind. The system strives to make an application's entry in e-roll unambiguous and error free without much of a hassle. ERO-Net brings in seamless processing of

forms, easy handling of the databases. It facilitates efficient form processing, simplified dashboards, role based access, and maintenance of E-Rolls.

All the eligible unregistered electors have been requested to use such facilities through ERO Net by logging on to www.nvsp.in so as to enable the Election Department to achieve the target of 100% error free and authenticated electoral roll, a communication from the Dy. Chief Electoral Officer, A&N Islands said.

Parl. Panel recommends 100% pension to widow of deceased soldier

New Delhi, Aug 11
A Parliamentary Panel has recommended that 100 per cent pension should be given to the widow of the deceased soldier so that she can take care of her family. Standing Committee on Defence headed by Maj. General (Retired) B C Khanduri yesterday tabled its report in Parliament. The report said after the death of a soldier, the pension of the spouse comes down to 60 per cent of his

pension. The committee feels that after the death of a soldier, the spouse usually faces severe problems due to the loss of the breadwinner. The committee also recommended that liberalized and special family pensions to be exempted from income tax for the widows of war like counter insurgency situations or on the line of control as is being (Contd. on last page)

Centre considers proposal to allow girls at Sainik Schools

New Delhi, Aug 11
The Centre is considering a proposal to allow girls at Sainik Schools and girl cadets at National Defence Academy. This was stated by the Minister of State for Defence Shri Subhash Ramarao Bhamre in Lok Sabha today. During Question hour, Shri Bhamre said that there are 26 Sainik Schools covering 22 states in the country and the remaining 7 states have been requested to indicate their requirement for establishment of Sainik

Schools in their states. Replying to supplementaries he said at present 21 proposals for establishing Sainik Schools from various states and Union Territories have been received. The objectives behind opening Sainik schools include removing regional imbalance in the officer cadre of the defence services. The Minister said the financial allocation to Sainik Schools by Defence Ministry during 2017-18 was 80 crore rupees.

No time frame fixed to complete Aadhaar-PAN linkage: FM

New Delhi, Aug 11
Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley today informed the Lok Sabha that the government has not fixed any time frame to complete the linking of Aadhaar with Permanent Account Number (PAN). Shri Jaitley said this in parliament while replying

to a query whether the government has fixed any time frame to complete the linking of the 12-digit biometric Aadhaar with PAN. As on June 28, there were over 25 crore PAN card holders in the country while Aadhaar has been issued to 111 crore people.

Amendment in RTE Act

Education Department issues directives for untrained in-service teachers

Port Blair, Aug 11

The Section 23(2) of RTE Act 2009 has been amended to extend the period to acquire the requisite professional qualification by the untrained in-service teachers by 31st March 2019.

The untrained in-service teachers teaching in Govt. / Govt. Aided / Local Body / Unaided Private schools, shall have to now undertake D.El.Ed. through ODL on NIOS by registering themselves on NIOS portal between August 16 and September 15, 2017. Those untrained teachers who do not have 50% aggregate marks in class XII, have to now mandatorily secure admission in class XII through NIOS concurrent to D.El.Ed programme. The teachers will be awarded with D.El.Ed. Certificate only if they score at least 50% aggregate marks in class XII.

The Principal, Tagore Government College of Education, Shri. J.D.Singh, (Contact No.03192-232695,239688& Fax No.244045), will be the State Coordinator to facilitate the conduct of this programme and for continuous engagement with MHRD and NIOS. The Principal of each Govt. / Govt. Aided / Local Body / Unaided Private schools will create database of untrained Elementary teachers for D.El.Ed. employing the facilities available in the online portal of NIOS and a copy of the database must be forwarded to the State Coordinator, Principal, TGCE, Port Blair. Further, it has been reiterated that this shall be the last chance to acquire the requisite minimum professional qualifications.

Last Cricket Test between India, Sri Lanka to begin today

Colombo, Aug 11
The third and final Cricket Test between India and Sri Lanka will begin in Kandy tomorrow. The match, to be played at Pallekele International Cricket Stadium, is slated to start at 10 a.m. IST.
Holding a two-nil lead after winning the first two matches by comprehensive margins, Virat Kohli and his men stand on the cusp of history, aiming to become the first Indian team to complete a whitewash in an overseas three-Test series. India won the first Test by 304 runs in Galle and the second match in Colombo by an innings and 53 runs.



India have never won a full Test series abroad, 85 years since their debut in 1932. At home, India have played only four series where they have won all Test matches. Two such series were under Mohammed Azharuddin's captaincy when they won 3-0 against England in 1993 and an identical margin versus Sri Lanka in 1994. Under Mahendra Singh Dhoni, India outplayed Australia 4-0 in the 2013 home series while Kohli led the side during the 3-0 rout of New Zealand, last year.

World Athletics Championships: India's Davinder Singh Kang becomes 1st Indian to qualify for javelin throw final

London, Aug 11
Davinder Singh Kang has become the first Indian to qualify for the final round of the javelin throw at the IAAF World Athletics Championships in London. Competing in the qualification round Group B yesterday, Kang, who was carrying a shoulder injury, cleared the automatic qualification mark of 83 meter in his third and final throw as he sent the iron spear to a distance of 84.22 meter. He had a 82.22m in his opening throw and then came up with 82.14m in his second. The 26-year-old athlete from



Punjab was under pressure to touch the 83m in his final attempt and he was the last man to take the throw. He did it in style by sending the spear beyond the qualification mark to the huge relief of the Indian camp. Kang's best effort of 84.22m put him in the seventh position among the final round qualifiers. Another Indian javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra could not succeed as he crashed out in the qualification round.

BWF Rankings Prannoy jumps to world no 15 in badminton ranking

New Delhi, Aug 10
Indian shuttler HS Prannoy today improved two places to reach the 15th spot in the latest BWF rankings. Prannoy, who clinched the US Open title last month, had reached the quarterfinals at New Zealand Grand Prix Gold at Auckland last week. Sourabh Verma, who also reached the quarters at New Zealand, also jumped five places to reach the 32nd spot while Parupalli Kashyap jumped one place to be 46th. Ajay Jayaram and Sameer Verma dropped a spot each. Ajay is now placed at world no 17 while Verma is at the 29th position. Kidambi Srikanth, who clinched



successive titles at Indonesia and Australia, remained at the eighth spot. In women's singles, Olympics silver medalist PV Sindhu and London Games bronze winner Saina Nehwal continue in their same places. Sindhu is in the 5th spot while Saina remains at the 16th spot. In women's doubles, Ashwini Ponnappa and N Sikki Reddy are placed at the 25th spot. In mixed doubles, Pranaav Jerry Chopra and Sikki are steady at world no 20.

Indian men's compound team enters bronze play-offs

Berlin, Aug 11
The Indian men's compound team remained in fray for a bronze medal at the World Cup Stage 4 competition in Berlin today. In the bronze medal play-offs, India will take on lower ranked Germany tomorrow. The fifth seeded Indian trio of Abhishek Verma, Aman Saini and Amanjeet Singh started their campaign by defeating Spain 228-222 before getting the better of 13th seeded Sweden team 231-229 in quarterfinals. However, they failed to overcome the top seed USA and lost 228-233 in the semi-finals to make it to the third-fourth place play-off match. In the women's section, third seeded India's compound team



of Jyothi Surekha Vennam, Trisha Deb and Snehal Mandhare, got a bye to reach the quarterfinals. But they lost to 11th seed South Africa 28-29 in a nail-biting finish in the shoot-off. The compound mixed pair team also went down in the quarterfinals, against Mexico 149-156. In the compound individual section, only Verma and Jyothi could reach the last-eight rounds, while all others made early exits. Meanwhile, Indian recurve archers came up with dismal performance once again with both men and women's teams making quarterfinal exits.

Denis Shapovalov stuns Nadal to reach quarter-finals of ATP tournament

Switzerland, Aug 11
Canadian teenager Denis Shapovalov shocked top seeded Rafael Nadal to reach the quarter-finals of the ATP Montreal Masters tournament. The Canadian's win spoiled the Spaniard's chances of returning to world number one. Nadal would have returned to No. 1 in the world, if he had defeated Shapovalov yesterday, and then Chung Hyeon or Adrian Panarino today.



The 18-year-old Shapovalov, who needed a wild card to get into the hard court tournament, beat Nadal in three sets 3-6 6-4 7-6. Meanwhile, Roger Federer maintained his career-long winning streak over David Ferrer to advance to the quarter-finals after a three-set battle with the veteran Spaniard. Federer won with scores of 4-6, 6-4, 6-2. Federer will play another Spaniard, Roberto Bautista Agut, in the quarter-finals. Bautista Agut defeated France's Gael Monfils in a gruelling slugfest, winning 4-6 7-6 7-6.

Indian men's hockey team loses 1-3 to Belgium in Boom

Boom, Aug 11
The Indian men's hockey team suffered their second defeat when they lost 1-3 to hosts Belgium in Boom last night, in the ongoing five-match tour of Europe. India lost their opening game of the tour on Wednesday by a solitary goal to Belgium. The Indians will now head to Waalwijk, Netherlands to face the home team on Sunday and



Monday before winding up their five-match Europe tour with a game against Austria in Amstelveen on 16th August.

Unusual deposits of Rs 1.7 crore made in banks during demonetisation

New Delhi, Aug 11
A research report published by the RBI has claimed that unusual cash deposits of over 1.6 lakh crore rupees were made during the demonetisation period. According to the report, 'Demonetisation and Bank Deposit Growth', excess deposits accrued to the banking system due to demonetisation are estimated to be in the range of 2.8-4.3 lakh crore rupees.

The report further informs that aggregate deposits grew by 14.5 percent on a 'year-on-year' basis during the note ban period as against 10.3 percent during the corresponding period of 2015. A separate research paper titled 'Financialisation of savings into non-banking Financial Intermediaries' has said that demonetisation has accelerated the formalisation of economy. It adds that introduction of Goods and Services Tax and regulations such as the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016 are likely to incentivise greater shift from physical to financial savings.
