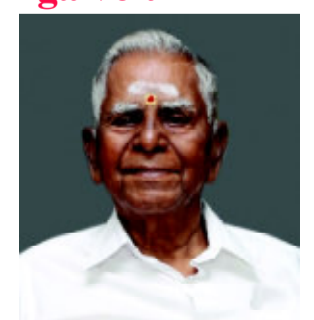

The Food Business Operators have also been asked to inform the Department about the arrival of khoa, so that the enforcement officials could inspect & determine the quality of khoa being sold in A&N Islands. Further, the Department

India's Anupama Ramachandran has clinched the World Open Under-16 Snooker Championship title at St. Petersburg in Russia. In the girls category, second seed Anupama knocked out her compatriot and top seed Keerthana Pandian 3-1 to become World Open Under-16 champion on Sunday. Earlier, she defeated Albina Leschuk of Belarus 3-0 in the semifinals and Aleksandra Riabinina of Russia in the quarterfinals with an identical 3-0 scoreline.

Open championships for Under-16 boys and girls. Total 73 cueists from across the world have participated in this championship.

**Hockey: India open Asia Cup campaign hammering Japan 5-1**

New Delhi, Oct 11  
India missed a number of chances but still managed to hammer Japan 5-1 in their first match of Pool A at the 10th men's hockey Asia Cup in Dhaka on Wednesday. SV Sunil opened the scoring for India as early as the 3rd minute. However, Kenji Kitazato equalised for Japan in the very next minute. The circle penetrations by India continued to outnumber that of Japan's who relied more on counter attacks. While India's repeated forays resulted in some frustrating misses, especially off the sticks of Sunil and Ramandeep Singh, the World No. 6 Indians restored their lead in the 22nd minute through Lalit Upadhyay's brilliance. The teams went into half-time with India leading 2-1. The third quarter saw two more goals from Manpreet Singh's boys when Ramandeep (33rd



minute finally found his mark from a narrow-angle to breach the net. Drag-flicker Harmanpreet scored the first of his two goals in the 35th minute by sounding the board off India's first penalty corner. Harmanpreet, who was also part of the Junior World Cup-

winning squad last year, scored again in the fourth quarter through a 48th-minute PC, where the Indian formation went for a variation played by Varun Kumar and converted by Harmanpreet. India next play hosts Bangladesh on Friday.

**Ashish Nehra to retire after New Zealand T20 at Kotla**

New Delhi, Oct 11  
It seems Ashish Nehra has reached the finishing point of his international career. TOI has learnt that the 38-year-old left-arm pacer has picked the T20i against New Zealand, to be played at the Ferozeshah Kotla in the Capital on November 1, to be his final international match for India.

**Pakistan suspended from international football by FIFA**

Zurich, Oct 11  
Pakistan has been suspended from international football because of what global soccer body FIFA described as undue third-party interference in the country's football federation (PFF). FIFA said in a statement that the suspension would prevent Pakistani teams, including the national side, from playing in international competition and the PFF from benefiting from FIFA development and training programmes. "The PFF offices and its accounts remain in control of a court-appointed administrator, which constitutes a violation of the

PFF obligations to manage its affairs independently and without influence from any third parties in accordance with the FIFA Statutes," said FIFA. "The suspension will be lifted once the PFF offices and access to the PFF accounts are returned to the PFF."

**Portugal & France book spots at 2018 World Cup finals**

Paris, Oct 11  
Cristiano Ronaldo's Portugal and Antoine Griezmann's France booked spots at the 2018 World Cup finals on Tuesday while the Netherlands crashed out. Portugal defeated Switzerland 2-0 in Lisbon. After a stuttering campaign, France's achievement in defeating Bulgaria and Belarus in their final two qualifiers means they avoid the playoffs having had to go through that route for the last two

**Sixteen Indian weightlifters qualify for Commonwealth Games 2018**

New Delhi, Oct 11  
Sixteen Indian weightlifters have qualified for next year's Commonwealth Games in Australia after International Weightlifting Federation published the Commonwealth rankings. S Sathish Kumar and Kh Sanjita Chanu will be looking to repeat their gold medal performances of the last edition's Commonwealth Games during the 2018 event in Gold Coast to be held in April. In the last edition of the Games in Glasgow in 2014, Indians had bagged as many as 12 medals, including three gold. Apart from Sanjita and Sathish, Sukhen Dey (men's 56kg) had also won a yellow metal but

he has failed to qualify this time around. In 56kg category, India will be represented by Gururaja. Sanjita, who had won the gold in women's 48kg, has climbed up a weight division and will be competing in 53kg, while Satish would be defending his title in men's 77kg. In the men's category, Sathish and Vikas Thakur are the only two lifters, who were also there in the squad in the last edition, to have made the cut again. Thakur had bagged a silver medal in 85kg but this time he would be taking part in 94kg. As far as women are concerned, Sanjita, Saikhom Mirabai Chanu, Punam Yadav and Vandna Gupta are the

known faces from the last edition. Mirabai Chanu had won a silver in 48kg, Punam finished with a bronze in 69kg, while Vandna was fourth.
