The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray and the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar were also present on the occasion. The Lt. Governor laid the foundation stone for the road at Krishnapuri and D.B.Gram, Diglipur. He also held a meeting with the PRIs, general public and HODs at APWD Guest House, Diglipur wherein, he heard the grievances of PRIs and general public and issued on the spot directions to the concerned officials.



While interacting with the general public at Krishnapuri and D.B.Gram, the Lt. Governor stated that development of the Islands is his highest priority and appreciated the Administration for providing services even in the remotest areas. He further directed the local officials to interact with local public more often through PRIs and resolve the local issues. The Lt. Sports Ministry issues NSFs warning, disclose info online or risk getting derecognised

New Delhi, Nov 11
National Sports Federations which do not disclose details of their events, selection criteria and audited accounts among other things on their website by November 30 risk being derecognised, the Sports Ministry has warned today.

The Ministry has asked the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and NSFs to suo-moto disclose, on their websites, the details of various activities carried out by them such as events conducted, selection criteria, core probables, audited accounts and constitution. "The Ministry has



noticed that only a few NSFs have fully complied with the directions. Some NSFs and IOA have partly complied, as all the information has not been placed by them on their website. Some NSFs have either not placed any information or do not have websites," the Ministry said in a statement. "IOA and NSFs have again been advised by the Ministry to take necessary

steps to fully comply with the instructions on suo-moto disclosure. Last date for completion of the task is 30.11.2016 failing which renewal of recognition of the concerned NSFs for the year 2017 may be reviewed by the Ministry," it added. Sports Minister Shri Vijay Goel has said that this will bring transparency in working of sports federations.

VR Raghunath to lead India in Australia tour, PR Sreejesh out with injury

Bangaluru, Nov 11
Goalkeeper P R Sreejesh has been left out due to an injury and in his place experienced drag-flicker VR Raghunath will return to the squad to lead the Indian men's hockey team in the four-nation tournament in Australia later this month.

Raghunath, who was rested in last month's Asian Champions Trophy, will captain the 18-member squad in the absence of Sreejesh, who is recuperating from a knee injury sustained during the semi-final of the ACT against Korea in Kuantan, Malaysia.

Defender and drag-flicker colleague Rupinder Pal Singh, who was the top scorer in ACT, will be Raghunath's deputy in the tour Down Under.

Akash Chikte will shoulder the responsibility of goalkeeping in Sreejesh's absence while Uttar Pradesh's Abhinav Kumar Pandey will be the second custodian in the squad.

Chikte came up with an outstanding performance in the final of ACT to help India clinch the title by beating arch-rivals Pakistan.

"Abhinav has been in and out of the camps. He has had a knee injury for a while but has made a strong comeback and we are pleased with his performance in this camp," said India's chief coach Roelant Oltmans.

Besides Sreejesh, senior strikers SV Sunil and Ramandeep Singh too will miss the tournament due to injuries.

India 319/4 at stumps in reply to England's score of 537

Rajkot, Nov 11
India fought back well against England on Day 3 of the first test in Rajkot today. At stumps, the hosts were 319 for 4 in their first innings in reply to England's score of 537. India are now 218 runs behind England with 6 wickets remaining.

Murali Vijay and Cheteshwar Pujara led India's response to England's massive total. The duo were involved in a 209-run stand for the second wicket. Opener Murali Vijay ended his one year wait for a ton as he scored 126. This was his seventh Test century. Cheteshwar Pujara scored 124, his ninth Test century.

Earlier, England got overnight opener Gautam Gambhir with the 7th ball of the day with individual score of 29 and after tea, Pujara, Murali Vijay and Amit Mishra were out. Skipper Virat Kohli remained unbeaten with 26. This is the first match of the 5 match series. It will be followed by 3 ODIs and 3 T-20 matches.
