Home Ministry sets up new divisions to deal with radicalization & cyber crime

New Delhi, Nov. 11
The Union Home Ministry has formed two new divisions to exclusively deal with emerging security challenges such as radicalization and cyber crime. An official said yesterday that the two divisions called Counter-Terrorism and Counter-Radicalisation (CTCR) and the Cyber and Information Security (CIS) also encompass merger of some of the Ministry's existing divisions.

The CTCR wing, which is basically modified version of the Home Ministry's internal security-II division, will focus on tracking and assessing the online reach of global terrorist outfits and devising strategies to counter their propaganda. The CIS division will monitor online crimes and threats, including cyber fraud and hacking, and suggest ways to minimize and fight them. An official said the need for a counter-radicalisation

division and policy was felt as Union Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh was keen that the problem should be solved from the base. The Ministry's judicial division and centre-state divisions are also being rolled into one, as are international cooperation and public grievance divisions. The Home Ministry will continue to have 18 divisions, each headed by a joint-secretary level officer.

GST Council reduces tax on 178 items from 28 to 18%

Guwahati, Nov 11
The Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council has announced major changes in the new national law, reducing tax rate on a wide range of products. After the Council's meeting in Guwahati yesterday, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said, tax on 178 items have been reduced to 18% from 28% and only 50 items now remain in the highest tax slab of 28%. Dining out



will also become cheaper, as the Finance Minister said that the Council has decided that food at all restaurants in the country, except those in starred hotels, will be taxed at 5% rather than 18%, without Input Tax Credit (ITC). The new rates will be effective from the 15th of this month.

New Delhi, Nov. 11
On GST Council's decision of slashing tax rates on daily items, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said, all the decision of the NDA government are people-inspired, people-friendly and people-centric. The actions will include summarily removal of the encroachment at their risk and cost with seizure of the items under Regulation 150 and 151 of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands (Municipal Regulation), 1994, filing FIR with the Police for encroachment on the public land, recovery of damage charges for illegal occupancy of public land and cost of demolition, levy of fine for violation of Term & conditions of allotment and cancellation of allotment and sealing of the allotted Shop(s).

On Nov 9, 2017, illegal extensions by proving huge tin shed on the public area were removed at Mohanpura Area. Virat Kohli consolidates top spot in ICC T-20 Rankings



Mumbai, Nov 11
In Cricket, Indian captain Virat Kohli has consolidated his position at the top of the latest ICC Twenty-20 Rankings for Batsmen released yesterday. Kohli scored 104 runs in the recent T20 series against New Zealand to guide India to a 2-1 win and that has helped him strengthen his number one position. He gained 13 points and increased the gap with Australia's Aaron Finch to 40 points. Openers Rohit Sharma and Shikhar Dhawan moved up in the rankings - Rohit to 21st and Dhawan to 45th. In the Bowlers rankings, paceman Bhuvneshwar Kumar moved up two places to 26th, while spinner Yuzvendra Chahal gained 22 places to 30th. In the Team Rankings, India gained three points from the New Zealand series but remained behind England in the fifth place. The Kiwis ceded the top spot to Pakistan.

Kidambi Srikanth pulls out of China Open Super Series

Nagpur, Nov 11
Star India shuttler Kidambi Srikanth has pulled out of the China Open Super Series tournament due to injury. However, he will be back in action after a week's rest at the Hong Kong Super Series where he will have the chance to reach the World No. 1 ranking. Srikanth, currently the second-ranked men's singles player, decided to take a week's rest after aggravating a leg injury

during the Senior National Badminton Championships in Nagpur. Srikanth said today that he was pulling out of China Open which begins next Tuesday. He said that it was a muscle strain and doctor advised him to take rest for one week. It happened in the Nationals, Srikanth said. The Badminton Association of India (BAI), however, said that it was just a coincidence that Srikanth sustained the injury at the Nationals, the dates for which were pre-fixed in consultation with all the top shuttlers of the country. The BAI official said the National Championship is an integral part of the annual calendar and the federation will continue to organise the event in consultation with the players. Srikanth, who lost to H S Prannoy in the final of the National Championship, has been playing non-stop badminton since October 18.

14, 2017, failing which the action will be initiated for prosecution and shall be liable on conviction to a fine or to imprisonment, or to both such fine and imprisonment or to such other penalty as determined by the Court of competent jurisdiction. The PBMC have taken photographs of these premises so that cases against them can be properly taken up. All the firms/persons have also been informed that in case of any repeat offence, penalty of double amount will be imposed. The Solid Waste (Handling & Management) Bye-Laws, 2017 provide that no person shall dump, deposit, discharge, spill or release waste, and no person shall place or cause to be placed rubbish or offensive matter on a public street. No person shall, while driving a vehicle, or while being conveyed in a vehicle, throw or deposit waste on any public road or on any private premises within the municipal area and no driver of a vehicle shall allow or permit any passenger in such vehicle to throw or deposit such waste in a like manner. There are many other provisions with regard to maintaining cleanliness and hygiene in the city. As per the Bye-Laws, in case of any contravention of these Byelaws, fine ranging from Rs. 500/- to Rs. 10,000/- as provided in the Schedule -1 of the Bye Laws shall be imposed for each occasion of offence. In case repetition of the offence, the fine amount will be doubled. The Secretary PBMC informed that there will zero tolerance against the persons/firms who litter on public streets or fail to maintain premises clean. The process of imposing fines will be further intensified in next few days. PBMC has already issued a Public Notice on Oct 24, 2017 that special drives will be started from Nov 1, and more than 250 persons have been fined so far. In next few days, the markets at Junglighat, Delanipur, Haddo and BathuBasti area will also be covered, a PBMC release said.
