India, Japan sign 16 deals including high-speed trains, defence, education & technology

New Delhi, Dec 12
India and Japan on Saturday signed 16 agreements in the fields of high-speed trains, defence equipment and technology, security, infrastructure, education and economy including civil nuclear energy.

The agreements were signed after the delegation-level talks between Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and his visiting Japanese counterpart Mr Shinzo Abe at Hyderabad House in New Delhi. Mr Shinzo Abe is on a three-day visit to India.

In a joint statement issued at the end of annual delegation-level talks, India and Japan reiterated their

District Administration simplifies procedure of availing various citizen-centric services

Port Blair, Dec.12
The Revenue Administration has taken initiatives to simplify the present procedure of availing various citizen-centric services. Efforts have also been put in place to ensure that the citizens approaching various revenue offices receive the services with ease. The present process has been re-structured/re-engineered so that existing cumbersome process is done away with by way of weeding out of redundant steps while processing the services.

As per the simplified procedure, the practice of submitting affidavit is replaced with self-certification. In addition to this, people can now apply directly to the Patwari concerned where report is required from the Patwari. This will save precious time as up till now for all certificates a person had to apply to the Tehsildar concerned and thereafter the application reaches the area Patwari through Revenue Inspector.

Apart from this, when the department has already issued Islander Card, the necessity of enquiry for Local Certificate can be done away with. Similarly, if family members or parents are issued certificate for a category then certificate can be issued expeditiously.

Cyclist Deborah Herold creates history; Becomes first Indian female cyclist to be ranked World Number Four

New Delhi, Dec 12

In a big boost to her Rio Olympics qualification bid, India's cycling star Deborah Herold jumped to a historic fourth spot in the world rankings. Deborah was 10th just before the recently concluded Track Asia Cup and had won one gold and two silver medal in that event which helped her improve rankings.

The 20-year-old Deborah, from Andaman and Nicobar Islands, collected 211 points in 500m time trial and secured fourth place in the World Elite UCI (International Cycling Union) ranking released by UCI.

With the brilliant performance by Deborah in the Track Asia Cup last month, the Indian team has also improved its world ranking to 13th. India is the highest ranking Asian country in 500m time trial as China is on 15th spot.

An elated Deborah said that she would work to improve her rankings further to world number one. "I am happy that my ranking has improved a lot and I am the first Indian cyclist to reach at this stage but I want to improve more in the coming days and aiming to be number one in the world. I would like to thank our federation and Government for their continuous support in our preparations. I am working hard to qualify for Olympics now," she said.

Deborah Herold's story is an inspirational one. When just nine years old, she spent a whole day on a tree when the tsunami struck the Car Nicobar base where her father was employed. Later she took up cycling, a sport which has few fans in this country and even fewer champions, and quickly went on to become a role model.

World T20 trophy to embark on global tour on Sunday

Mumbai, Dec 12
The 2016 ICC World Twenty20 trophy will embark on a global journey from Mumbai on Sunday before returning to New Delhi on February 1 next year.

As part of the Nissan Trophy Tour, the trophy will visit 12 countries taking part in the tournament which will be staged in the country from March 11 to April 3 next.

During its journey, the trophy will be on display at domestic and international matches, as well as at various public places which will enable the fans to capture a special moment with the most prestigious silverware in the shortest format of the world game, the ICC said in a statement.

Details of the trophy's public appearances will be announced by the host Boards closer to the time.

ICC Chief Executive David Richardson said: "The Nissan Trophy Tour has been designed to not only promote the tournament but also to engage with our fans and provide them the first opportunity to get close to the trophy, which will be lifted by the winning captain on 3 April in Mumbai."

"We would like to thank Nissan



for their sponsorship of the Trophy Tour and we are sure it will be a big success as it travels across the world ahead of the ICC World Twenty20 in India next year," he said.

Scotland will be the trophy's first port of call, before it travels to Ireland, England and the Netherlands at part of its European leg.

The trophy's African safari will be from January 2-7, during which it will make appearances in Harare (January 2 & 3 and Cape Town January 5-7).

Pakistan will be the trophy's first stop-over in the subcontinent

(January 11 & 12), before it moves to Bangladesh (January 14 & 15) and then Sri Lanka (January 17 & 18).

On the Trans-Tasman tour, the trophy will arrive in Wellington on January 21 and will then head to Australia on January 26 where it will be displayed in Adelaide, Melbourne and Sydney until January 31.

From Sydney, the trophy will return to New Delhi on February 1 and will then start its domestic tour by making appearances at each of the venues that will host the ICC World Twenty20 India 2016 matches.

Australia thrash Windies by innings and 121 runs

Hobart, Dec 12

Paceman James Pattinson took five for 27 to fire Australia to a thumping first test victory over West Indies by an innings and 121 runs with more than two days to spare at Hobart on Saturday. Australia enforced the follow-on after dismissing the tourists for 223 inside the first five overs of the third day at Bellerive Oval, and completed the rout by skittling West Indies for 148 in their second innings. It was Australia's second largest victory in 114 tests against the Caribbean islanders and gave the hosts a 1-0 lead in a three-match series, which concludes with tests in Melbourne and Sydney. Australia, who could return to the top of the test

rankings with a 3-0 series sweep, made 583 for four declared in their first innings on the back of a world record fourth wicket stand of 449 between Adam Voges and Shaun Marsh. Darren Bravo scored a fine 108 in the first innings and Kraigg Brathwaite notched 94 in the second but questions will continue to be asked about the long-term future of West Indies test cricket after an otherwise hapless display.

Despite the poverty of the opposition, Australia will take positives from the match-turning performance from their inexperienced middle order, as well as from Pattinson's fiery and productive spell in eight overs on Saturday.

Vikas Gowda Qualifies for 2016 Rio Olympics After Revision of Entry Standards

New Delhi, Dec 12

Ace Indian discus thrower Vikas Gowda has qualified for the Rio Olympics after the world athletics governing body, the IAAF, lowered the entry standards "to have more athletes" taking part in the track and field events in the 2016 Games. Under the qualification standards issued in April, the cut off mark for the men's discus throw for Rio Games was 66.00 meters but a few days back the

IAAF Council decided to lower it to 65.00 metres, which Gowda had crossed in the Jamaican Invitational Athletics Meet in May. Gowda, 32, the reigning Asian champion and 2014 Commonwealth Games gold medalist, had hurled the disc to a distance of 65.14 metres in Kingston while winning the IAAF-approved event on May 9. Athletics Federation of India secretary CK Valsan confirmed

that Gowda has qualified for the Rio Olympics.

"Since the Jamaican event was an IAAF-approved one and it was held after the qualification period starts, Gowda has now qualified for the Rio Olympics. He has crossed the 65.00m entry standard which was revised from the earlier 66.00m," Valsan told PTI. The qualification period of track and field events for Rio Olympics began on May 1.

Certificate, Residential Certificate, OBC Certificate, Family Details Certificate has been simplified on priority as the number of applicants seeking such services is relatively large in number. In all cases, incomplete applications or applications without required enclosure (s) shall be rejected out rightly and communicated accordingly.

A mechanism has been devised for the tenants who are in possession of landed property by way of inheritance or transfer of interest for issuance of Record of Rights/Map and also for revenue survey of the landed property. To facilitate and to dispose off the pending cases, a well structured demarcation drive has been launched in Port Blair Tehsil wherein survey and settlement staff has been deployed in all areas. The mass demarcation drive has started from November 30 onwards and will continue till January 9, 2016. The area wise dates of demarcation have already been notified for information of the citizens.
