 Indian Coast Guard completes 43 years of yeoman service to the Nation on Feb 1, 2020. Since inception, the service has continued to register all round growth and is presently the fourth largest Coast Guard in the world. On the occasion of the 44th Raising Day of Indian Coast Guard, the Lt Governor, A&N Islands & Vice Chairman, Islands Development Agency, Admiral DK Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) has greeted all Coast Guard personnel. In his message, the Lt Governor said, "the sustained and concerted efforts of Indian Coast Guard in A&N Islands has thwarted nefarious designs of poaching and smuggling and has also saved numerous lives in the year beyond making the Isles more secure and safe and reassuring the immense confidence of the Islanders in capabilities of this fine organization."

To commemorate the Raising Day, Coast Guard Region (A&N) has been conducting various activities/events across the Islands. In year gone past, the proactive and prompt response of the service resulted in rescue of 33 lives at sea including 11 medical evacuations, apprehension of 75 thwarted poachers and seizure of 1527.6 Kg of contraband in Maritime Zones of these pristine Islands.

After evaluation, qualified applicants will be issued Request for Proposal (RFP) for submission of financial bids.

These projects have been steered by the Islands Development Agency (IDA) with the support of NITI Aayog. A&N Administration has already obtained upfront CRZ/Environment Clearance for the above projects, as applicable subject to terms & conditions. These projects will be based on development standards such as GRIHA/LEED/Green Globe and Star Categorization by Ministry of Tourism, Govt. of India. Under these projects, upto 60 percent jobs will be made available to the qualified local youth of the Islands.

Andaman & Nicobar Administration, with an objective of development of sustainable eco-tourism in the Islands, had on 24.10.2019 invited Request for Qualification (RFQ) application for setting up of Eco Tourism Resorts on PPP mode at Long Island, Aves Island, Smith Island and Shaheed Dweep. Pre - application conferences were held at Delhi and Kochi on 13.11.2019 and 20.11.2019 respectively which were attended by large number of prospective bidders, a communication from the Managing Director, ANIIDCO, Shri Kulanand Joshi said here today.

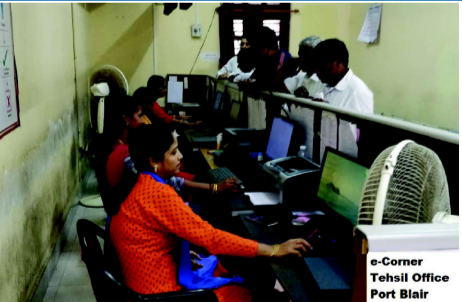

2 Super Overs, 2 wins- India script history with victory against New Zealand in 4th T20I

Wellington, Jan 31
India have made a habit of winning the Super Over against New Zealand in the ongoing T20 international series. After winning the 3rd T20I in a Super Over, India again restricted New Zealand in the final over of the match to propel the match into another Super Over. The Kiwis needed 7 runs off 6 balls in the final over but Shardul Thakur tightened the noose around the hosts as the hosts lost 4 wickets. The match went into a Super Over where Jasprit Bumrah gave away 13 runs off 6 balls. KL Rahul made a blistering start for India and smashed 10 runs off just 2 balls. It was easy pickings for skipper Virat Kohli as he kept his calm to take India



to victory. This was the first instance of two successive tied matches in a tournament. India had never played a Super Over before in their history but they proved their mettle in New Zealand after becoming the first team to win two consecutive Super Overs in a series. New Zealand also created an unfortunate record as they became the first team to be involved in 15 tied matches in all formats. Thakur bowled a brilliant last over in which India got 4 wickets - 2 via run out - to stretch the match into another Super Over. Colin Munro and Tim Seifert struck impressive fifties but India hung in their and Saini, Bumrah and Thakur bowled three brilliant overs to hold New Zealand on level terms.

Mladenovic, Babos reclaim Australian Open doubles title

Melbourne, Jan 31
France's Kristina Mladenovic and Timea Babos of Hungary upset top seeds Hsieh Su-wei and Barbora Strycova to win their second Australian Open women's doubles title in three years on Friday. The pair beat the reigning Wimbledon champions 6-2, 6-1 in 1hr 12mins to claim their third Grand Slam title together and 10th overall. Mladenovic, who won the Fed Cup with France in Perth in November, also reached last year's Melbourne doubles final with Babos, going down to Sam Stosur and Zhang Shuai.



"There's just something about Australia -- we love coming back," said Babos. "Our performance becomes better and better each time." Mladenovic and Babos, the second seeds, had lost their only previous meeting with Hsieh and Strycova in the Wimbledon semi-finals last year. Hsieh and Strycova warmed up for the Australian Open by winning in Brisbane and did not drop a set in their run to the final.

Parliament. The survey called for more reforms for making it easier to do business in country. The survey said for India to achieve a five trillion US dollar economy depends on promoting pro-business policies, strengthening the invisible hand of the market and ease of doing business. The survey has given emphasis on entrepreneurship and Wealth Creation at the Grassroots. It said, about 1.24 lakh new firms were created in 2018, which is an increase of about 80 per cent from about 70,000 in 2014. Talking about Creation of Jobs and boosting growth, the Survey said, India has unprecedented opportunity to chart a China-like labour-intensive, export trajectory. The survey emphasizes on creating jobs and growth by specialization in network products. It said, the industrial sector as per Index of Industrial Production registered a growth of 0.6 per cent in 2019-20 (April-November) as compared to 5.0 per cent during 2018-19 (April-November).

Campbell Bay is being planned which will facilitate export of goods from the Islands. Besides, with the laying of undersea optical fibre cable, the internet connectivity will improve, which will also be of immense use for exporters, she said and expressed hope that the programme will come out with solution to the problems of export in the Islands. Briefing about APEDA activities, its General Manager, Shri Upendra Kumar Vats informed that APEDA is working towards promotion of export in the country. The objective of this awareness programme is to encourage export in the Islands as also to promote and develop export products, he said. APEDA is facilitating exporters and coordinating with export agencies involved in export activities like airlines, ports, airports etc. he said urging the participants to make best use of the programme. Speaking on the occasion, the Director (CIARI), Dr. B Augustine Jerard termed the programme as a new beginning of promoting export in the Islands. He urged the Islands' farmers to promote the cultivation of unique crops, which are common in the Islands and make them available for exports. Cultivation of medicinal plants, flower and tropical fruits should be given priority for export purpose, he said and informed the farmers that CIARI is always available for assistance in providing modern technology. The General Manager, NABARD, Shri V Meshar while speaking on the occasion stressed the need for improving the quality and quantity of agriculture products and to start exporting them from the Islands. APEDA is supporting and facilitating in export process, he said.

In his welcome address, the Director of Industries, Shri Ajit Anand informed about the initiatives being taken by the Administration in promoting export in the Islands. He said that the Administration has planned to establish transshipment ports which will promote direct export from the Islands to neighboring countries. The inaugural function concluded with the vote of thanks, proposed by Shri R K Mondal, DGM, APEDA. It was followed by technical session wherein representative from APEDA, Directorate of Industries and Spice Development Board made their power point presentations and informed the gathering about the investment opportunities in A&N Islands. Representative from Spice Development Board emphasized that Cinnamon & pepper should be the focused area and the farmers should focus on integrated farming. Representative from APEDA stated that the product selection should be done as per the need of the client country with proper packaging and quality, and explained about the various registration formalities for getting export license and obtain export code.

The exporters from M/s All Season Farm fresh, Jamshedpur, Jharkhand and M/s Ramesh Flowers, Chennai shared their experiences with the gathering and assured for providing linkages to the exporters of these Islands.

Rani Rampal first-ever hockey player to win 'World Games Athlete of the Year' award

New Delhi, Jan 31
Indian women's team captain Rani Rampal became the first-ever hockey player to win the prestigious 'World Games Athlete of the Year' award. The World Games announced the winner last night after 20 days of polling in January this year by sports fans worldwide. Congratulating Rani, the World Games said with 1,99,477 votes, she is the clear winner of the Athlete of the Year race. All in all, over 7,05,610 votes were cast during the poll. Last year, India won the FIH Series Finals, and Rani was named Player of the Tournament. Under Rani's leadership, the Indian women's team qualified for just the third Olympic Games in its history.



Rani, who was recently named among the Padma Shri awardees, dedicated the award to the entire hockey fraternity, her team and the country. Rani further said after a successful 2019, she is now looking forward to achieving greater heights with the national team for the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games. She has been a member of the national team since she was a 15-years-old, and has more than 240 caps for India. International World Games Association President Jose Perurena, International Hockey Federation CEO Thierry Weil, and Hockey India President Mohammad Mushtaque Ahmad also congratulated Rani over her achievement.
