PM hails India's exemplary COVID-19 Vaccination programme

New Delhi, Jan. 31 Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has said that India's fight against Corona and its vaccination programme has turned out to be exemplary for the world. He said India is undertaking the biggest COVID Vaccine Programme as well as vaccinating citizens faster than anywhere in the world. Addressing

the nation in his 'Mann Ki Baat' programme on All India Radio, the Prime Minister expressed pride that in just 15 days, India has vaccinated over 30 lakh corona warriors. The US took 18 days to get it done while Britain took 36 days. He hailed the Indian cricket team for winning the series in Australia after initial setbacks. He said the

hard work and teamwork of players is inspirational. The Prime Minister recounted how Priyanka Pandey, a student of Hindi literature from Siwan in Bihar, drew inspiration from his suggestion to visit 15 domestic tourist places. On 1st of January, she started for a destination 15 kilometers away from her home - it was the

ancestral residence of the country's first President, Dr. Rajendra Prasad. Priyanka came across many books written by Dr. Rajendra Prasad and many historical photographs as well. Prime Minister said India is going to commence the celebration of 75 years of Independence - Amrit Mahotsav. He termed it an excellent time to

scheme, 2413 accounts were opened and a loan amount of Rs 5.68 crores was disbursed. Similarly, under the Kishor Loan scheme, 2725 accounts were opened and a loan amount of Rs. 58.9 crores was disbursed. Under the Tarun Loan Scheme, 5930 accounts were opened and a loan amount of Rs. 123.3 crore was disbursed till January 25, 2021, Lead Bank Sources informed here.

Vehicle owners of mainland registration advised to furnish details to Transport Deptt.

Port Blair, Jan. 31
It has been observed by the Directorate of Transport that many vehicle owners whose vehicles are registered in others States are plying in the A&N Islands without furnishing any intimation to the Transport Department, which is violation of the provisions of M.V. Act. Data of such vehicles are not available with the agencies in the UT which makes it difficult to trace the details in the event of any accident or other untoward incident.
Section 49 of the said Act makes it mandatory for the owners of the motor vehicles to inform the change of residence or place of business to the registering authority having jurisdiction over the new place. In case of failure to do so, the owners of such motor vehicles are liable to be penalized under MVA Act 2019. As per Rule 39 of ANIMVR'2006 if any motor vehicle which is not registered in the UT has been kept for a period exceeding 14 days, the owner of the vehicle shall inform the same to Registering Authority, A&N Islands with details like his name, address, registration mark, description of vehicle and in case of transport vehicle the date on which the permit has been issued. This has been brought to the notice of all concerned on earlier occasion by publishing it in the local newspapers but it is observed that such vehicles continue to ply on the road violating the legal provisions.
All the vehicle owners of mainland registration vehicle are therefore once again advised to intimate the Transport Department of their vehicle details alongwith complete information of the owner with phone number. If any person/ vehicle owners whose vehicles registered in others States are found plying on the roads in A&N Islands without intimation and permission from this Department, strict action will be taken against them. All the owners of the motor vehicles registered in other States but brought to the UT of A&N Islands have been directed to intimate the details of such change in address to the Office of Transport Department within 14 days as prescribed above to avoid legal action as per law. Such owners are also advised to keep documents related to transportation of their vehicles to this UT for verification.
Transport and Police Department is conducting stringent enforcement drives to regulate such practices and defaulters/violators is being booked under relevant MV Act/Rule for penal action, a press release from Directorate of Transport said.

hearing impairment, loss of teeth and locomotor disability requiring use of wheelchair by Medical officers/Specialists at the camps.
The eligibility for availing services are senior citizens belonging to BPL or having a monthly income less than Rs. 15,000 (If monthly income certificate not available, the same shall be provided by the Administration); having a proof of receiving Old Age Pension under Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme (IGNOAPS) or any other Pension Scheme of the State/UT Government for Senior Citizens belonging to BPL category
The person should not have received the same device(s) free of cost from any Government source including local bodies and public undertakings controlled by the Government during the last 3 years. However, replacement of faulty/non-functional device(s) may be allowed as an exception to this condition.
The scheme aims to address low vision, hearing impairment, loss of teeth and locomotor disability/infirmary. Eligible elderly beneficiaries, depending upon their physical impairment will be provided generic items such as walking sticks, elbow crutches, walkers / crutches, tripods / quadpods, hearing aids, artificial dentures, spectacles.
Therefore, all Senior Citizens (Divyangjans) have been urged to avail the opportunity, a press release from Assistant Commissioner (HQ) said.

The farmers exclusively dealing with Animal Husbandry and Fisheries may contact their nearest Office of Animal Husbandry and Fisheries respectively, a press release from Agriculture Deptt. said.

approval of layout plan for housing colony is obtained from the competent authority, there is no need for the individual buyer to apply separately for conversion & sub-division of their plots as only the individual plots can be registered in the name of buyer individually in place of joint registration of the land and conversion & sub-division etc. as being done now. This will save the time & energy of the individual plot buyers and also they need not approach the Gram Panchayats for laying of roads, drains etc. which is the responsibility of the promoter to provide the same. The registration of the projects under RERA will safeguard the interest of the promoter as well as buyer.
Similarly, while purchasing the apartments/group housing, the general public have been requested to ensure that the promoter has obtained the necessary planning permission & approval of building plan and registration of the projects under RERA. This will facilitate the buyers to get the apartments as advertised/promised by the Promoter at the time of booking of apartments.
There are penal provisions available in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Town and Country Planning Regulation, 1994 to take action against the promoters for development of housing colonies without approval of layouts. In addition, there are penal provisions under RERA also for non-registration of the project before it is being advertised/marketed.
It is therefore informed that the promoters who wish to develop housing colonies in their plots in Port Blair and Swaraj & Shaheed Dweep planning areas shall apply in the prescribed performa along with the necessary layout plans and documents and submit the same in the PBMC or Gram Panchayats as the case maybe. After obtaining the necessary approval of layout of housing colonies and register their project with RERA, before it is marketed. The cooperation of the promoters is highly solicited and they are hereby informed to follow the above procedure for development of Housing colonies. Similarly, the apartment/group housing promoters have been requested to obtain necessary planning permission & approval of building plan for development of apartments and register the projects with RERA. The general public have also been requested to report the development of housing colonies without permission if any, they notice in their locality to either the PBMC/Gram Panchayats concerned/ Town & Country Planning Unit CE's Office, APWD for initiating and necessary action, a press release from Chief Engineer & Town Planner said.

No. 169/2020/F.No.34-13/2020-MPH- In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 30 of the Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1969 read with Section 2(f) thereof and in pursuance of letter No.1/2/(Rule)/2012-VS(CRS) dated 10.11.2020 of GOI, Ministry of Home Affairs, the Lieutenant Governor (Administrator), Andaman and Nicobar Islands hereby makes the following rules to amend the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Registration of Births and Deaths Rules, 1999 notified vide Gazette No.130 of 1999, namely :-

1. Short Title and Commencement :-
i. These Rules may be called the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Registration of Births and Deaths (Amendment) Rules, 2020.
ii. They shall come into force on the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.

AMENDMENT

2. Rule 10(1) of The Andaman and Nicobar Islands Registration of Births and Deaths Rules, 1999 (hereinafter called Principle Rules) shall be substituted as under :-

"Rule 10. Period for the purpose of Section 14:- (1) Where the birth of any child had been registered without a name, the parent or guardian of such child shall, within 12 months from the date of registration of the birth of child, give information regarding the name of the child to the Registrar either orally or in writing :

Provided that if the information is given after the aforesaid period of 12 months, which shall be reckoned:

- (i) (a) In case where the registration had been made prior to the date of commencement of the Principle Rule, further 5 years period from the date of commencement of this Rule (i.e. Registration of Births and Deaths (Amendment) Rules, 2020), shall be given. Or
(b) In case where the registration is made after the date of commencement of the Principle Rule and 15 years period from the date of registration has already been lapsed, they shall also be given 5 years period from the date of commencement of this rule (i.e. Registration of Births and Deaths (Amendment) Rules, 2020). In respect of those cases, where 15 years period from the date of registration has not yet been lapsed, they shall be allowed to avail the 15 years period. Or
(ii) In cases where the registration is made after the date of commencement of the Registration of Births and Deaths (Amendment) Rules, 2020, the period of 15 years from the date such registration, subject to the provisions of Sub-section (4) of Section 23.

The registrar shall-

- (a) If the register is in the possession forthwith enter the name in the relevant column of the concerned form in the both register on payment of a late fee on rupees five.
- (b) If the register is not in his possession and if the information is given orally, make a report giving necessary particulars, and if the information is given in writing, forward the same to the officer specified by the State Government in this behalf for making the necessary entry on payment of a late fee of rupees five."

3. There will be no change in the provision of Sub-rule (2) of Rule 10.

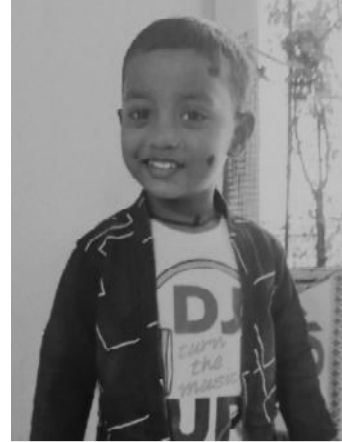

F. No. 09/2021/F.No. 1-116/2020-21.Guidelines/TW/34 SCHEME FOR GRANT OF ADDITIONAL SCHOLARSHIP TO THE STUDENTS BELONGING TO SCHEDULED TRIBES (ST) OF ANDAMAN AND NICOBAR ISLANDS FOR PURSUING HIGHER STUDIES ANYWHERE IN INDIA POST-SENIOR SECONDARY COURSES (POST 10+2 COURSES).

- 1) Objective:
The objective of the scheme is to provide additional financial assistance (scholarship) to the ST students pursuing higher education after Senior Secondary i.e. 12th Standard in the Colleges/Universities anywhere in India, as an incentive to supplement the cost of their education.
- 2) Scope:
This additional scholarship shall be provided by the Directorate of Tribal Welfare, A & N Administration to the students belonging to Scheduled Tribes of Andaman and Nicobar Islands for undertaking studies anywhere in India and shall be in addition to the Scholarship/maintenance cost being awarded to the ST students by the Department of Education, Andaman and Nicobar Administration and Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt of India.
- 3) Criteria of Eligibility:
a) The additional scholarship shall be open to all students of Scheduled Tribes of Andaman and Nicobar Islands as notified by the President of India under Article 342 (1) of the Constitution of India vide the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Scheduled Tribes Order No. 58, dated 31.03.1959.
b) The additional scholarship shall be given for pursuing higher studies for all recognized regular and full-time Post-Senior Secondary courses (post 10+2 courses), Graduate/Post Graduate courses (leading to Diploma/ Degree), Doctoral and Post-Doctoral courses, in any of the Government recognized Institutions and/or AICTE/UGC approved, or equivalent Institutions, anywhere in the country, such as:
(i) All courses leading to a Graduate Degree, e.g. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. etc.
(ii) All Post-Graduate Courses, e.g. M.A./M.Sc./M.Com./M.Ed./M. Pharma. etc.
(iii) Degree and Post-Graduate level courses including M. Phil, Ph.D. and Post-Doctoral Research in Medicine (Allopathy, Indian and other recognized systems of medicines), Engineering, Technology, Planning, Architecture, Design, Fashion Technology, Agriculture, Veterinary & Allied Sciences, Management, Business Finance / Administration, Computer Science / Applications etc.
(iv) Post-Graduate Diploma courses in various branches of Management & Medicine, Commercial Pilot License (including Helicopter Pilot and Multiengine Rating) course etc.
(v) C.A./I.C.W.A./C.S./I.C.F.A. etc.
(vi) M. Phil., Ph.D. and Post-Doctoral Programmes (D.Litt., D.Sc. etc.)
(vii) Graduate/Post-Graduate Courses leading to Degree, Diploma, Certificate in areas like Pharmacy (B. Pharm.), Nursing (B. Nursing), LLB, BFS, other Para Medical branches like Rehabilitation Diagnostics etc., Mass Communication, Hotel Management & Catering, Travel / Tourism / Hospitality Management, Interior Decoration, Nutrition & Dietetics, Commercial Art, Financial Services (e.g. Banking, Insurance, Taxation etc.) for which educational qualification is minimum Sr. Secondary (10+2).
(viii) All post matriculation level non-degree courses for which educational qualification is vocational stream, ITI Course, 3 year Diploma Course in Polytechnic etc.
c) Only those students who belong to STs so specified and notified in relation to Andaman and Nicobar Islands and are domicile of A & N Islands and who have passed Senior Secondary (10+2) from a recognized Board of Senior Secondary Education or any other higher examination from a recognized University shall be eligible for additional scholarship.
d) Students, who fail to clear Bachelor Courses in Arts/Science/Commerce for which they had been awarded this additional scholarship, and join any other recognized Professional or Technical Certificate/Diploma / Degree Courses, shall be awarded additional scholarship, if they are otherwise eligible.
e) Students studying in Class XI of the Higher Secondary School Courses or the XII Class of the Multipurpose High School shall not be eligible for this additional scholarship, because of its not being a higher/ professional course. However, in cases, where tenth class examination of such courses is treated as equivalent to Matriculation and students who after passing Tenth class join other recognized professional / technical courses, such students shall be treated as Post-Matric students and therefore, shall be eligible for the award of this additional scholarship.
f) Students who, after passing one stage of education are studying in the same stage of education in different subject, e.g. B.Sc. after B.A. or B.Com. after B.A. or, M.A. in a subject after pursuing M.A. or its equivalent in another subject, etc., shall not be eligible.
g) Students who, after having completed their educational career in one professional course, apply for another professional course, e.g. LLB after B.T./B. Ed. etc. shall also not be eligible for this scholarship.
h) Students pursuing Post-Graduate Courses in Medicine shall be eligible for this scholarship provided they are not allowed to practice during the period of their course.
- 4) Value of additional Scholarship:
Under this scheme of additional scholarship for Scheduled Tribes Students, an amount of Rs. 1000/- (Rupees one thousand only) per month shall be given to the eligible students.
- 5) Payment and mode of disbursement of additional Scholarship:
a) The additional scholarship shall be payable for ten months in an academic session.
b) The additional scholarship shall be normally admissible to the pass-out students of previous academic session.
c) The additional scholarship money shall be directly released to the bank account of the beneficiaries by the Directorate of Tribal Welfare.
- 6) Sanctioning Authority:
The Secretary (Tribal Welfare) shall be the sanctioning authority of this additional scholarship under this scheme.
- 7) Duration and Renewal of Scholarship:
a) The award of additional scholarship once made shall be tenable from the stage at which it is given to student till the completion of course, subject to good conduct and regularity in attendance, as certified by the Head of the Institution. It will be renewed from year to year provided that within a course, which is continuous for a number of years, the beneficiary secures promotion to the next higher class irrespective of the fact whether such examinations are conducted by a University or Institution.
b) If a ST beneficiary pursuing a course fails in the yearly examination for the first time, the scholarship may be renewed. For second and subsequent failures in any class, the student shall bear his/her own expenses until he/she secures promotion to the next higher class.
c) If a beneficiary is unable to appear in the annual examination owing to illness and / or on account of any other unforeseen event, the award may be renewed for the next academic year on submission of medical certificate and / or other required sufficient proof to the satisfaction of Head of the Institution and his / her certifying that the beneficiary would have passed the examination had he appeared in it.
d) If according to the Regulations of a University/Institution, a student is promoted to the next higher examination of the junior class again after sometime, he / she will be entitled to additional scholarship for the class to which he / she is promoted, if the student is otherwise eligible for additional scholarship.
- 8) Other Criteria for award of the additional Scholarship:
a) The additional scholarship is dependent on the satisfactory progress of the beneficiary. If it is reported by the Head of the Institution at any time that a beneficiary has, by reasons of his/her own act or default, failed to make satisfactory progress or has been found guilty of misconduct such as resorting to or participating in strikes, irregularity in attendance without the permission of the authorities concerned etc., the authority sanctioning the additional scholarship may either cancel the additional scholarship or stop or withhold further payment for such period as he/she may deem fit by recording the reasons for such denial in writing.
b) If a student is found to have obtained an additional scholarship by false statement, his / her additional scholarship can be cancelled forthwith and the amount of the additional scholarship paid shall be recovered, at the discretion of the sanctioning authority. The student concerned shall be blacklisted and debarred from applying for additional scholarship under any scheme of the Directorate of Tribal Welfare, thereafter.
c) An additional scholarship awarded may be cancelled if the beneficiary changes the subject of the course of study for which the additional scholarship was originally awarded or changes the Institution of study, without prior approval of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration. The Head of the Institution shall report such cases to the Director (TW), Directorate of Tribal Welfare, Andaman & Nicobar Administration and stop payment of the additional scholarship, till the time due approval of the Competent Authority is received. The amount already paid may also be recovered at the discretion of the sanctioning authority.
d) A beneficiary is liable to refund the additional scholarship amount at the discretion of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration, if during the course of the year, the studies for which the additional scholarship has been awarded, is discontinued by him / her.
e) The provisions of the scheme can be changed at any time at the discretion of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration.
- 9) Announcement of the Scheme:
The UT Administration may announce the details of the scheme and invite applications every year, through National Scholarship Portal (NSP) by issuing advertisements in the leading newspaper and through other suitable media.
- 10) Student / Applicant
The student / applicant is to register and submit the application at National Scholarship Portal (NSP). The student / applicant who is applying for the first time on NSP Portal, is referred to as Fresh students, and the students who have been granted additional scholarship in any of the scheme on-boarded at NSP in the immediately preceding Academic Year, are referred to as Renewal students. The student / applicant using the NSP must adhere to the conditions stipulated therein.
- 11) Selection of Candidates:
All the eligible Scheduled Tribes Students will be given additional scholarship subject to fulfilment of instructions prescribed in this scheme.
- 12) Funding pattern of the Scheme:
The scheme shall be implemented by the Directorate of Tribal Welfare, Andaman and Nicobar Administration through the funds made available under UT Budget.
- 13) Powers:
The Lieutenant Governor (Administrator), Andaman and Nicobar Islands, may however, relax / modify any or all the eligibility criteria for the purpose of grant of additional scholarship to a deserving, meritorious and needy applicant not fulfilling the eligibility criteria otherwise.
- 14) Monitoring and Evaluation:
The Monitoring and Evaluation of the financial and physical performance of the scheme shall be done periodically by the Secretary (Tribal Welfare). The Directorate shall furnish Quarterly Progress Report regarding the number of beneficiaries receiving award of additional scholarship under the scheme, both class-wise and gender-wise. On the financial side, details of the actual expenditure incurred during the last financial year and expenditure proposed for the present financial year shall be submitted by the Department.

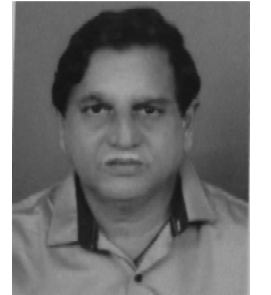

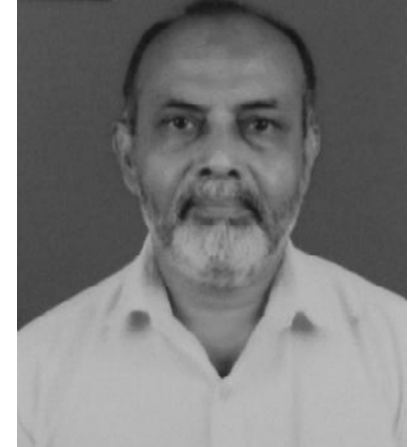
