Port Blair, May 11

The Andaman and Nicobar Administration in its efforts to contain the spread of corona virus in the UT have taken several precautionary steps. Since COVID-19 virus transmits from person to person, it can be established that the less we move, the more we can contain the virus. Unnecessary movement of people from Island to Island during such crucial time can give rise to

more transmission of the virus in areas which has so far been untouched by the virus. People must restrain from unnecessary travel. Data shows that the rise in number of positive cases in the Islands is more noticeable among

inter-island bound passengers. It reveals that 86 passengers arrived in 3 flights today and during the Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) conducted on these passengers, no passengers were found COVID positive while during the test conducted on 71 persons bound for Middle & North Andaman at Ferrargunj, 7 were found positive. Administration urges social media users to be responsible & report factual position

Misleading comments/tweets only demoralise Health Care Workers; their goal is to keep Islanders safe

Port Blair, May 11

It has come to the notice that there is news circulating in social media/ twitter that every day 4-5 patients are dying in different wards at GB Pant Hospital due to COVID. In this regard, the Health Department in a press release stated that COVID patient preliminary complaints of breathing difficulties, along with fever and other constitutional symptoms. In the present scenario, any

patient who is having breathing difficulties is admitted for medical management irrespective of whether he is COVID positive or COVID negative. It will be not out of the place to mention here that breathing difficulties can also occur in patient with cardiac, respiratory, kidney disease and also in malignancies.

The release further stated that on careful perusal and auditing of death, it is seen that either the

patients reported very late and died within 24-48 hours or some patients who had severe co-morbidity like Renal Transplant, uncontrolled Diabetes Mellitus, hypertension succumbed late in the course of disease. It was also seen that many patient who died in COVID wards, their reports of RT-PCR were negative. Further, it is to mention that many of the patients who died had not received vaccination. The

also mentioned that in the absence of any designated medicine or treatment of COVID infection, only symptomatic treatment is given. The oxygen supply at GB Pant Hospital is quite good. Sometime even 100 Jumbo cylinders are consumed in G.B Pant Hospital for less than 50 patients on oxygen in a day. There has been no report of interruption of oxygen supply.

The second consignment of 56 Oxygen Concentrators, out of the 100 Concentrators provided by Govt. of India reached here today. It may be recalled that 44 Oxygen Concentrators arrived here yesterday. The Concentrators received will immensely help the A&N Administration in treating COVID patients. One package of nasal cannula was

also received today.

Adequate arrangements will be made by the Administration to send the Oxygen Concentrators to far flung Islands for treatment of COVID patients in those places. Meanwhile, the Administration is also planning to purchase more Oxygen Concentrators, Health Department sources informed DT.

Simple Ayurvedic Procedures

1. Nasal application - Apply sesame oil / coconut oil or Ghee in both the nostrils (Pratimarsh Nasya) in morning and evening.
2. Oil pulling therapy - Take 1 table spoon sesame or coconut oil in mouth. Do not drink, Swish in the mouth for 2 to 3 minutes and spit it off followed by warm water rinse. This can be done once or twice a day.

During dry cough / sore throat

1. Steam inhalation with fresh Pudina (Mint) leaves or Ajwain (Caraway seeds) can be practiced once in a day.
2. Lavang (Clove) powder mixed with natural sugar / honey can be taken 2-3 times a day in case of cough or throat irritation.
3. These measures generally treat normal dry cough and sore throat. However, it is best to consult doctors if these symptoms persist.

decreased while more cases are detected among Inter-Island bound passengers.

About vaccination drive, the Secretary informed that it is continuing and till 4 pm today (May, 11) about 338 eligible beneficiaries above 45+ age were vaccinated. He once again requested the eligible persons above 45 age to come forward to get vaccinated at the earliest and help the Administration to restrict the spread of corona virus.

About the stranded passengers in Port Blair who wish to go to other Islands, the Secretary said they should contact the 'Rescue Cell' which has been created for this purpose. He further informed that the second batch of 56 Oxygen Concentrators received by Govt. of India from Switzerland has also reached here today. The first batch of 44 Oxygen Concentrators for A&N Islands reached yesterday. With this, these Islands received a total of 100 Oxygen Concentrators for its use in different Islands.

Regarding the RTPCR test report for the people travelling to mainland for medical emergency, the Secretary said at present the RTPCR test is not mandatory in Chennai. For Kolkata bound passengers where it is mandatory, he said, if anybody has to go on emergency for medical purposes, they can contact the 'Rescue Cell' or the Deputy Commissioner's Office. It will be addressed on 'case to case basis' depending upon the criticality of the case, he added.

The Director ANIIMS, Dr. AK Mandal, informed that 27 new corona positive patients were admitted today in the G. B Pant Hospital. He said 14 patients were discharged and at present 83 are admitted in the Hospital, of which 51 are on Oxygen support and 3 patients are on ventilator. The Deputy Director, G.B. Pant Hospital, Shri Amitabha De disclosed that altogether, 2 COVID patients have been admitted in Covid Care Centres. Further, 8 patients were discharged and at present 35 patients are still in Covid Care Centres in South Andaman District, he added.

The Director, IP&T, Shri Alok Kumar also attended the press conference.

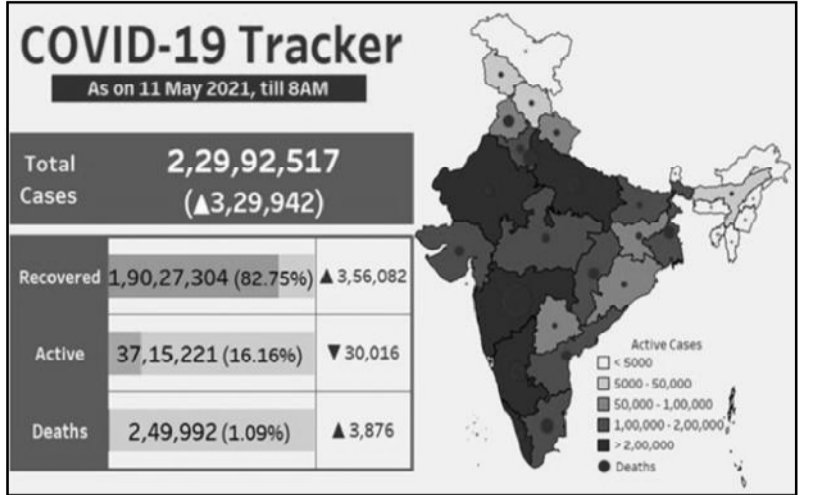
help the patients and the nurses of our country who are working as the backbone which drives our health care system today.

Three lakh 29 thousand new cases reported in the last 24 hours



New Delhi, May 11

The country has registered over three lakh 29 thousand new COVID cases in the last 24 hours. The Health Ministry has said, a total of three thousand 876 deaths have been reported in the country within 24 hours, taking the toll to over two lakh 49 thousand

across the country.

Meanwhile, the Indian Council of Medical Research has informed that over 18 lakh 50 thousand COVID tests were conducted within 24 hours in the country.

So far, over 30 crore 56 lakh tests have been conducted.

Concept of Mini Feed Mill-cum-Incubation Center for production of least cost balanced rural poultry feed in South Andaman

Port Blair, May 11

The total poultry population in Andaman and Nicobar Islands is 12,83,746. Out of which, 7,83,468 (61%) belong to desi poultry and 5,00,278 (39%) are of improved varieties. There are more than 35 numbers of small scale poultry farms of vanaraja poultry are present in South Andaman and rural poultry (25-30 numbers of unit size) is of integral part of farming system in these Islands. The capacity of poultry farm ranges from 50 to 500 numbers. This survey data shows the significant role of rural poultry with both desi and improved poultry in the economic and nutritional security of small scale rural poultry farmers of these Islands. However, scope for taking up small scale poultry farming with rural poultry and

vanaraja is declining in South Andaman due to constraint of feed. Poultry feeding is the major component in the management of poultry farming. Feeding attributes 70 to 75 per cent to the total production cost of poultry. Considering the number of farms and their capacity, a total of 2.0 to 2.5 tons of poultry feed is required per day to cater the need for rural poultry feed in South Andaman. The major constraint in scientific farming with rural and improved poultry such as vanaraja is the compound feed. There are few large scales feed manufacturer locally in South Andaman which caters the need of poultry farming and the feed cost is very high which in turn increases production cost.

Hence, need based specific program was taken by ICAR-

CIARI to meet out the feed requirements of rural poultry in South Andaman to improve the production of small scale poultry farming.

A standardized least cost feed including locally available feed ingredients has been formulated by Scientific team of Dr.T.Sujatha, Dr.P.A.Bala, Dr.D.Bhattacharya, Dr.Jai Sunder and Dr.A.K.De, Division of Animal Science, ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair for scientific feeding of vanaraja and rural poultry. Subsequently, mini feed mill, the resource for manufacturing rural poultry feed has been established at Livestock Farm Complex, ICAR-CIARI under funding of NABARD, Port Blair to establish small scale poultry feed production unit. This mini feed mill unit will empower farmer to

produce balanced poultry feed with locally available feed ingredients to augment rural poultry feed production on farmers participatory mode. This unit will also facilitate farmer to establish their own poultry feed production unit to augment their socio economic status. Many SHGs are invited to avail this facility as incubation centre to generate self employment through production of rural poultry feed and other livestock feed as well. If they are empowered in preparation of balanced rural poultry feed using mini feed mill, rural poultry farming will be the sustainable resource for livelihood security. There is a great potentiality of improving the rural poultry farming in South Andaman, a press release received from In-charge, PME Cell said.

Over three lakh COVID-19 patients recovering daily for past many days

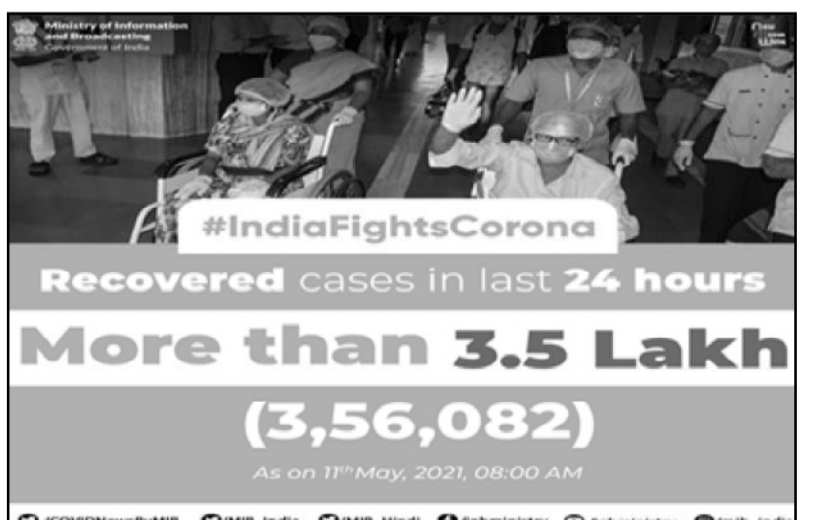
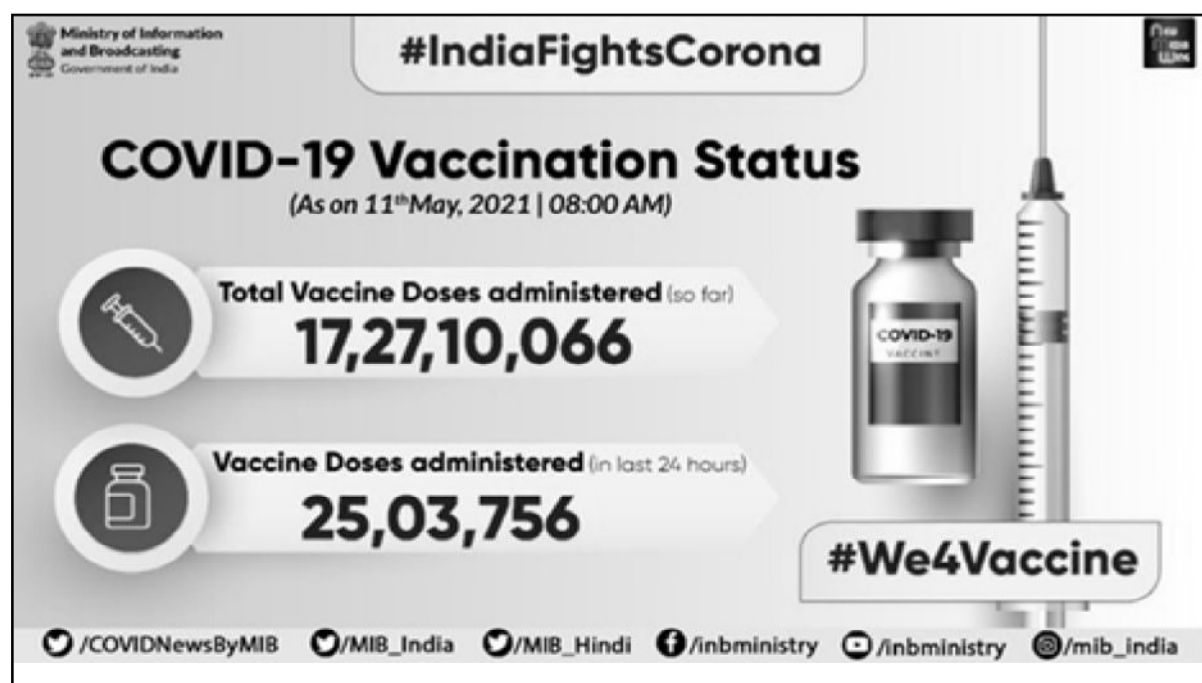
More than 17 crore 27 lakh Covid vaccine doses administered in the country

New Delhi, May 11

India has administered over 17 crore 27 lakh COVID vaccine doses to the beneficiaries so far. The Health and Family Welfare Ministry has said that over 25 lakh vaccine doses were administered to the beneficiaries within 24 hours.

As the third phase of vaccination drive is gaining momentum in the country, people are coming forward for inoculation of vaccine jabs.

The Health Ministry has said over 25 lakh 59 thousand beneficiaries belonging to the age group of 18 to 44 years have received the first dose of vaccine so far. More than five lakh 24 thousand beneficiaries



New Delhi, May 11

Amid the second wave of COVID-19 pandemic, India is registering declining trends in the number of active COVID cases. With this, the recovery rate is continuously improving. However, several States and Union Territories are still registering a high number of cases.

The Health and Family Welfare Ministry today said that the active cases comprise 16.15 per cent of the cumulative positive cases. It said, there are

over thirty seven lakh 15 thousand active cases in the country at present.

As the country is registering over three lakh recoveries daily from the past many days, the recovery rate has further improved to 82.75 per cent. The Health Ministry has said over three lakh 56 thousand patients have recovered from this infectious disease within 24 hours. So far, over one crore 90 lakh patients have already recovered from this disease.




