16 play fields to be developed under RURBAN Scheme in 1st phase Flood light facility to facilitate sporting activities at night

Port Blair, July 11 The Department of Sports and Youth Affairs aims to encourage sports activities throughout A&N Islands. To give further impetus to this, the Department of Sports aims to provide basic sports infrastructures such as playfields in all the Panchayats in A&N Islands. Altogether, 39 play fields have been identified for development.

In the 1st Phase, out of the 39 play fields, 16 play fields of Ferrargunj Tehsil have been selected to be developed under RURBAN Scheme. Out of 16 play fields, estimate of 12 play fields have been

received and the approval has already been conveyed to APWD and the same are in the Tender stage. Flood Light facilities have also been proposed in all the selected play fields under this scheme and for which, an amount of Rs. 2 Crore have been sanctioned for

the aforesaid project by the Directorate of RD & PRI. With the completion of development of the playfields in different villages, the youth of rural areas can avail the facilities in honing their sporting talents. Apart from this, various sports events at village level can also be organized from time to time. This will also encourage community participation in sports awareness and health and fitness; besides physical fitness programme can be conducted on regular basis for the youth and villagers. In addition to this, community programmes etc. can be organized with mass gathering. Up gradation of such playfields can be done in near future by availing Khelo India Schemes of GOI. Humanitarian assistance to persons in distress Coast Guard ship rescues six Sri Lankan fishermen from high seas



Port Blair, July 11 Coast Guard Dornier while undertaking EEZ surveillance of A&N Islands on 10th July, 2020, located one fishing boat adrift approximately 190 nm North-West of Port Blair. The Dornier crew with their experience and knowledge identified the boat to be Sri Lankan and the same was corroborated with MRCC Colombo. The Sri Lankan boat was reportedly in distress due to technical snag. On receipt of information, MRCC, Port Blair immediately launched multifarious swift rescue mission. Undertaking sea-air coordinated operation,

Indian Coast Guard Ship Rajkamal rescued six Sri Lankan fishermen alongwith the boat in the early morning hours of 11th July, 2020, braving the rough sea and bad weather. All precautions towards COVID-19 pandemic were undertaken. The crew were supplied with basic necessities and their condition was observed to be stable. The boat is being towed to Port Blair. 2011) to 20 (SRS 2018) while the Total Fertility Rate (TFR) has declined from 2.4 (SRS 2011) to 2.2 (SRS 2018). And the teenage fertility has halved from 16 (NFHS III) to 7.9 (NFHS IV)." He noted that these efforts have taken India closer to reaching the replacement fertility level of 2.1 and 25 out of 36 States/UTs have already achieved replacement level fertility.

Referring to the Hon. Prime Minister's commitment to Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, which transformed into a social movement, he urged everyone to make the population stabilization mission an equally powerful people's movement. He emphasized that Family Planning provides dignity to women, especially who are poor and marginalized. This needs to therefore be the cornerstone of our efforts for gender equality, maternal and child health, poverty alleviation and propagation of human rights.

a trigger for transformational improvement in India's citizen service delivery framework.

The CEO, NITI Aayog, briefed the participants about various background activities carried out by NITI Aayog, NIC, DPIIT, MoSPI and other Ministries in relation to monitoring of these Global Indices. He also stressed on the need for close and regular coordination between Central and State Governments, Publishing Agencies, and Civil Society Organizations on improving performance on these Indices as a trigger for reforms.

It has long been felt that there is a need to measure and monitor India's performance on various important social, economic and other parameters through internationally recognized Indices. The goal of the exercise is to use these Indices as tools for self-improvement, and bring about reforms in policies, while improving last-mile implementation of government schemes. Simultaneously, it is equally important to present an accurate image of India to the world. The large-scale reforms initiated by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade and India's improvement in the Ease of Doing Business rankings (India jumped to the 63rd position in 2020 report) were felt to be the right template for driving this process.

The 29 global indices, published by 19 International Agencies, have been assigned to 18 Nodal Ministries and Departments of the Government of India.

India's Tiger Census sets a New ... (Contd. from page 1)

fulfilled its resolve to double the tiger numbers four years before the target. The country now has an estimated 2967 tigers as per the latest census. With this number, India is home to nearly 75% of the global tiger population and has already fulfilled its resolve of doubling tiger numbers, made at St. Petersburg in 2010, much before the target year of 2022.

The citation at the Guinness World Record website reads- "The fourth iteration of the survey - conducted in 2018-19 - was the most comprehensive to date, in terms of both resource and data amassed. Camera traps (outdoor photographic devices fitted with motion sensors that start recording when an animal passes by) were placed in 26,838 locations across 141 different sites and surveyed an effective area of 121,337 square kilometres (46,848 square miles). In total, the camera traps captured 34,858,623 photographs of wildlife (76,651 of which were tigers and 51,777 were leopards; the remainder were other native fauna). From these photographs, 2,461 individual tigers (excluding cubs) were identified using stripe-pattern-recognition software. As well as unprecedented camera trap usage, the 2018 "Status of Tigers in India" assessment also conducted extensive foot surveys that covered 522,996 km (324,975 mi) of trails and sampled 317,958 habitat plots for vegetation and prey dung. It's estimated that the total area of forest studied was 381,200 km² (147,181 sq mi) and cumulatively the collection and review of data equated to some 620,795 labour-days."
