tools and techniques for interacting with Government systems, banks and other institutions at all levels.

The leadership development training scheme shall be implemented by the Ministry of Minority Affairs through selected organizations. The selected organizations should implement the project directly through their organizational set-up in the locality/village/area. The Central Government and UT Administration training institutes including universities and institutes of higher learning can also implement the scheme. Organizations which would be eligible for applying for financial assistance under this scheme are Societies registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860; a public Trust registered under any law for the time being in force, a private limited non-profit company registered under Section 25 of the Indian Companies Act, 1956; Universities/Institutions of higher learning recognized by University Grants Commission (UGC), Training institutes of Central and State Government/UT Administration including Panchayati Raj Training institutes and duly registered Cooperative Societies of Women/Self Help Groups.

The selected organization would have the responsibility to motivate, identify and select women to be trained in accordance with the criteria of the scheme from villages/urban localities having a substantial minority population. The organizations will involve Head of the Gram Panchayat/Municipal Body/ Local Authority for identification/selection of women trainees.

The details of the trainees will be submitted by the organization before the start of training through the Online Application Management System (OAMS) for Nai Roshni, once the project is approved. Although there will be no annual income bar, a woman/parent or guardian of woman having annual income not exceeding Rs.2.50 lakh from all sources would be given preference in selection. They should be between the age group of 18 years to 65 years.

The proposal should be submitted in the prescribed format through Online Application Management System (OAMS). The link of OAMS is available on official website of Ministry of Minority Affairs i.e. www.minorityaffairs.gov.in. After filling up the complete proposal in the OAMS, a print of the same may be taken and submitted to the District Collector/District Magistrate for their recommendation in the prescribed format. The detailed guidelines of the scheme are available on the website www.minorityaffairs.gov.in, a press release from Director (Social Welfare) said.

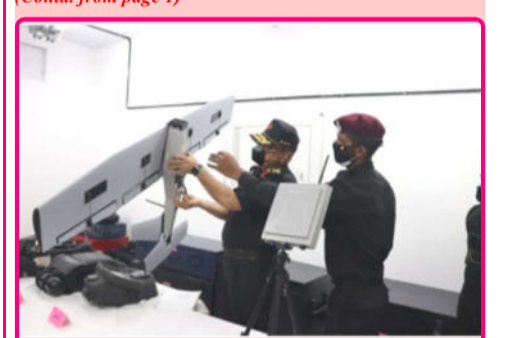

Andaman were tested at Ferrargunj and there too, no positive case was detected.

Presently, 2 corona positive patients are admitted in G. B Pant Hospital and one is on oxygen support. The Secretary has also urged the 45 plus left out beneficiaries, if any, to come forward and get themselves vaccinated as per their due date for vaccine.

He said, 41.05% population have been vaccinated with first dose of Covishield till yesterday, out of the total population of 4,00,000. He said, till yesterday, 2,25,809 doses of Covishield Vaccine have been administered in Isles against the target beneficiaries of 2,81,603. He said, the first dose have been given to 1,64,207 beneficiaries of the target population and the percentage of which stands at 58.31. The second dose has been given to 61,602 beneficiaries constituting 37.51 percent, the Secretary said adding that the number of second dose beneficiaries is also increasing day by day.

The number of eligible persons who have been inoculated with first dose in the age group of 45 plus are 1,05,655 which, he said, is moving towards saturation. He said that the number of target population in the age group of 18-44 is 1,75,000 and so far, 58,552 eligible beneficiaries of 18-44 have been vaccinated with first dose till yesterday.

The Director, ANIIMS, Dr. AK Mandal and Deputy Director, G.B Pant Hospital, Dr. Amitabha De were also present during the press briefing.

It is proposed to fill up two (02) post of Superintending Engineer (Civil), (General Central Service) Group 'A' Gazetted (Ministerial) carrying the Pay Level - 13 (123100-215900) in the Andaman Public Works Department under A&N Administration on deputation (ISTC) basis from the officers under the Central Govt./State Government/Public Sector undertakings/Semi Govt./autonomous or statutory organization and possessing the following experience and other eligibility conditions of appointment.

Deputation (Including short term contract):
Officers under the Central Government/State Govt./UT Administration/PSUs/ Universities/recognized Research Institutions/Semi-Government or Autonomous Bodies or Statutory Organization:-

- a. (i) holding analogous posts on regular basis in the parent cadre/department.
OR
(ii) with five years service in the grade rendered after appointment thereto on a regular basis in Level-12 (Rs.78800-209200) in the Pay Matrix or equivalent in the parent cadre or department; OR
(iii) with ten years service in the grade rendered after appointment thereto on a regular basis in Level-11 (Rs.67700-208700) in the Pay Matrix or equivalent in the parent cadre or department; AND

b. Possessing the following educational qualification and experience
(i) Degree in Civil Engineering of a recognized University/Institute
OR

Having passed Part 'A' & 'B' Examination of the institution of Engineers (India) in Civil Engineering
(ii) 10 years experience in Planning or Execution or Maintenance of Civil Engineering Projects.

The departmental officer in the feeder category who are in the direct line of Promotion will not be eligible for consideration for appointment on deputation. Similarly, Deputationist shall not be eligible for consideration for appointment by promotion.

(Period of Deputation (ISTC) including period of Deputation (ISTC) in another ex-cadre post held immediately preceding this appointment in the same or some other Organization/Department of the Central Govt. shall ordinarily not to exceed five years.
