## PM to hold interactive session with taxmen at Revenue 'Gyan Sangam'



New Delhi, Jun 12 with the top brass of the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi will hold an interactive session

during a first-of-its-kind 'Rajasva Gyan Sangam' to be held here on June 16. Officials said both the Boards have been asked to direct their officials to prepare suggestions on "important policy-level and innovative ideas of far reaching impact relating to the legislative and administrative framework of taxation in India" that they can be put forth to the Prime Minister during the conclave at Vigyan Bhavan here. They said similar ideas will also be put forth to Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley who will be holding a session with them during

the two-day conference. "Both Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) and Central Board of Excise and Customs (CBEC) have been asked to prepare a bank of good ideas and out-of-the-box solutions after talking to their officers who will participate in the June 16-17 Gyan Sangam," a senior Finance Ministry official said. The meet will be attended by about 250 officials and the top brass of the Income Tax department and Customs and Central Excise. The conclave will deliberate on a host of issues related to taxpayer services and effective implementation of fiscal laws and government policies, including measures to curb black money generation and circulation.

## Govt announces passenger friendly measures in civil aviation sector

New Delhi, Jun 12 Government has announced a few passenger friendly measures in the civil aviation sector including adequate compensation in case of flight cancellation. Addressing media persons in New Delhi yesterday, Minister for Civil Aviation Shri Ashok Gajapathi Raju said airlines will be made to offer ten thousand rupees as compensation in case of flight cancellation within 24 hours. He said regulations

are being made to improve facilities for the differently-abled people. Their compensation will be enhanced upto 20 thousand rupees in case of denied boarding. He said the airlines would also have to ensure that refunds are processed within 15 days for domestic passengers. Shri Raju said the rule will be applicable even in the case when the tickets are booked by the passengers through travel agents or online portals. He said that

the cancellation amount cannot exceed the basic fare and there shall be no additional charge to process the refund. The Minister said the refunds will be applicable on all fares including promotional and special fares. However, the onus will be on passenger to decide the amount to be received in cash or credit. Shri Raju also said excess baggage of upto 5 kg beyond 15 kg will not be charged more than 100 rupees per kg.

## Coast Guard's swift sea-air coordinated operation rescues 7 crew of sinking vessel



Port Blair, June 12 In a swift sea-air coordinated operation, Coast Guard helicopter rescued 7 crew members from a sinking vessel MSV Safina Al Ghelani, 40 miles South of Port Blair today. The vessel sailed from Port Blair

early morning on 11 Jun, carrying cargo for Hubbay. However, due to bad weather and rough sea, water started flooding the vessel's engine room and she started sinking at about 1030 hrs today. The distress message

raised by vessel was received by Coast Guard MRCC Port Blair, which immediately launched search and rescue operation. Coast Guard helicopter was launched in SAR configuration from Port Blair and two Coast Guard ships ICGS

Rajshree and C-428 were sailed from Port Blair. One DSS Ship MV Sentinel was also diverted towards the distressed vessel. Coast Guard helicopter sighted the distressed ship near North Brother Island. The vessel was badly damaged and

submerged near the Island. Despite strong winds and adverse weather, the helicopter rescued all the 07 crew from the vessel. Three of the rescued crew members were landed on Coast Guard ship C-428 (Contd. on last page)

# Saina Nehwal defeats China's Sun Yu to clinch second Australian Open title

New Delhi, June 12

Ace Indian shuttler Saina Nehwal on Sunday defeated Sun Yu of China 11-21, 21-14, 21-19 to win her second Australian Open title. In the summit clash, Saina had a poor start, as she lost the first game to her opponent, ranked 12 in the world. But the girl from Hyderabad soon gained her momentum and started to dominate the proceedings from second game onwards. With the win, Saina extended her head-to-head record against Yu to 6-1. Saina had advanced to the finals of Australian Open Super Series by beating World No. 2 Yihan Wang of China in the women's singles event on Saturday.

## Rampaging India to take on listless Zimbabwe in 2nd ODI today



Harare, Jun 12

Aresounding opening win setting the tone perfectly for them, the new-look Indian cricket team will look to continue in the same vein and take another step towards a potential whitewash of Zimbabwe when the two sides clash in the second cricket ODI here tomorrow. It was a clinical display by India as they outclassed Zimbabwe in all departments in a lop-sided opener of the three-ODI series and Mahendra Singh Dhoni's men will eye another fine outing on Monday.

If it was young seamer Jasprit Bumrah, who shone with the ball with a four-wicket haul to shoot out the hosts for a modest 168,

opener Lokesh Rahul helped the team chase down the target with an unbeaten century on his debut ODI. Rahul, who will also be boarding the flight to West Indies for the Test series in August, will look to accumulate as many runs as possible to boost his confidence ahead of the series.

Ambati Rayudu too did his job perfectly, playing second fiddle to Rahul with an unbeaten 120-ball 62 which was studded with five boundaries. The innings must have helped him regain his confidence, especially after being dropped from the team following the home series against South Africa last year and he will look to continue the good work.

## SEBI issues stricter KYC, disclosure norms for P-Notes

Mumbai, Jun 12

Markets regulator SEBI has put in place a stricter KYC norms and disclosure regime for Participatory Notes. The aim is to make it tougher to use these offshore instruments without disclosing the money-trail and details of their users. The measure comes after taking into account suggestions from SIIT on black money to ensure this route is not used for money laundering. Under the new norms, all the users of P-Notes would have to follow Indian KYC and Anti Money Laundering Regulations, irrespective of their jurisdictions. The P-Note issuers will be required to file suspicious transaction reports with the Indian Financial Intelligence Unit.

## Lokesh Rahul becomes first Indian batsman to hit century on ODI debut

New Delhi, June 12

Prodigious Lokesh Rahul on Saturday became the first Indian batsman to hit a century on One-Day International debut, as he helped Men in Blue thrash Zimbabwe by nine wickets at Harare. Chasing a modest target of 169 runs, India opted to open the innings with two debutants in Karun Nair and Rahul. For the record, last time two debutants opened for India in an ODI was in 1976, when Parthasarathi Sharma and Dilip Vengsarkar opened against New Zealand in Christchurch. But India soon lost Nair in the third ball of fourth over. After a slow start, Rahul with Ambati Rayudu batted as seasoned pros, producing an unbeaten 162-run second wicket partnership in 38 overs. Rahul, who has a good Indian Premier League season with Royal Challengers Bangalore
