## India and Kyrgyzstan signed four agreements in areas of defence, trade and culture

Bishkek, July 12  
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said both the countries can reinforce each others economic development. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, who arrived at Bishkek on Saturday night as part of his eight-day six-nation tour to Central Asia, emphasised the need to combat terrorism and extremism which he described as a threat without borders. "We both seek a peaceful and secure neighbourhood at a time of challenges in our region. And, we have shared interest in combating extremism and terrorism that has become a threat without borders," he said following his talks with President Almazbek Atambayev. The two countries signed four key agreements including on cooperation in defence and culture fields. Two MoU were also signed for cooperation between the Election Commissions of the two countries and on cooperation in the sphere of



Standards, a move that will help economic relations. Prime Minister Shri Modi underlined that his visit to the countries in the region "demonstrates the importance that we attach to a new level of relationship with Central Asia. Kyrgyzstan is a key part of that vision". Noting that the bilateral defence ties are strong, he said a joint exercise 'Khanjar 2015' has just been completed. "We have decided

to hold joint military exercises on an annual basis," he said. Shri Modi underlined that the new agreement on defence cooperation would provide a "framework to broaden bilateral engagement" which would also include defence technology. The defence agreement signed is aimed at deepening bilateral cooperation in defence, security, military education and training.

It also envisages conduct of joint military exercises, exchange of experience and information, and exchange of military observers and instructors besides others. Thanking Kyrgyzstan's strong support to India's candidature for permanent membership of an expanded United Nations Security Council, Prime Minister Shri Modi sought Atambayev's support for early completion of the UNSC reforms.

## Govt servants can file revised assets details by October 15

New Delhi, July 12  
All central government employees will have to file revised details of their assets and liabilities by October 15 this year under the provisions of the Lokpal Act. The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) has issued a notification asking all public servants, who have filed their annual property returns, to "file the revised declarations, information or as the case may be, annual returns as on the 31 day of March, 2015, to the competent authority on or before the 15th day of October, 2015."

The declarations under the Lokpal Act are in addition to the ones filed by the employees under various service rules applicable to them.

As per the rules notified under the Lokpal Act, every public servant shall file details of assets and liabilities, including those of their spouse, as on March 31 every year, on or before July 31 of that year.

For 2014, the last date for filing returns was September 15, which was later extended to December-end, then till April 30, and now up to October 15 this year. All Group A, B and C employees are supposed to file a declaration under the new rules. Employees need to give details like cash in hand, bank deposits, investment in bonds, debentures, shares and units in companies or mutual funds, insurance policies, provident fund, personal loans and advance given to any person or entity, among others.

## Indo-Myanmar border villages at mercy of insurgents: HM

New Delhi, July 12  
Union Home minister Shri Rajnath Singh has given stress on the development as well as the full proof security of people living along the international border. Addressing the conference of the Chief Ministers of the North East region in Guwahati yesterday, Shri Singh said that anti-social activities like smuggle of drugs and weapons along with movements of insurgents have been reported of late in Indo-Myanmar border. He said that over 2 lakh people are residing at around 240 villages within 10 kilometres of the Indo-Myanmar border. The Home minister said that these people are living at the mercy of the insurgents. Shri Singh added that similar situations also prevailed along the Indo-

Bhutan border. He said that a committee has been set up headed by Chairman of the Joint Intelligence Committee Shri R N Ravi to review how to effectively manage the Indo-Myanmar border. Shri Singh said that the committee will submit its report soon following which his Ministry will take needful action on it. Giving stress on development, Shri Singh announced to increase 10 percent share to the states, from earlier 30 percent to 40 percent, under Border Area Development Program in the North-East region. He emphasized to beef up vigil along the Indo-Bhutan border. Giving stress on strengthening police stations in the order areas, Shri Singh said that for the success of Act East policy, a sense of security at border areas should be prevailed.

## Indian Navy frigate on surveillance duty in South Indian Ocean

New Delhi: Indian Navy's stealth frigate INS Teg is on a two-month long deployment in the South Indian Ocean to provide surveillance support in the region, an official statement said on Saturday. "This is in keeping with India's national objective of ensuring a secure and stable regional environment to allow unhindered economic and social development, not just in India, but also in the entire Indian Ocean Region," a navy statement said. The ship is scheduled to visit Port Louis, Mauritius from July 13-17 and July 23-26, during which it will

undertake joint patrolling and surveillance operations with the Mauritian National Coast Guard ships. The joint patrolling is aimed at preventing piracy and illegal fishing and would help reinforce maritime security in the exclusive economic zone (EEZ) of Mauritius. In addition, INS Teg would also assist local authorities in providing assistance in terms of logistics and medical support to the outer islands of Agalega and St Brandon. The Indian navy has been deploying ships to Mauritius bi-annually since 2009 to assist in patrolling its vast EEZ. (Contd. on last page)

**Sports Ministry Set To Induct Jwala Gutta And Ashwini Ponnappa In TOP Scheme**

New Delhi, July 12  
The Sports Ministry is set to include shuttlers Jwala Gutta and Ashwini Ponnappa in the Target Olympic Podium (TOP) scheme even as it extended support to national coach Pullela Gopichand, who was accused of bias by the top women's doubles pair. A Ministry official confirmed that Jwala and Ashwini will be included in the next list of TOP athletes.  
"Since we have approved a doubles coach for the badminton players, we decided to include the top badminton players in the TOP scheme. And as there is no better pair than Jwala and Ashwini, they will soon enter the set of TOP players for Olympics," the official told PTI. Ashwini had recently joined Jwala in criticism of Ministry and Gopichand, who is also in the TOP committee, for not including them in the scheme.

The official insisted the Ministry would have included the two shuttlers even without the noise they made over their exclusion from the list. He also said that it was unbecoming of Jwala and Ashwini to level baseless allegations against Gopichand. "They should not have spoken against Gopichand. Not even once in the TOP meetings he spoke against Jwala and Ashwini. He is a man of huge stature and a role model for many Indians. In fact it is because of him we agreed on hiring a doubles coach," the official said. He added that financial assistance to the doubles specialists will be given out from Rs 10 crore contribution made by India Infrastructure Finance Company Limited (IIFCL). Besides Saina Nehwal, the other badminton players in the TOP program are Parupalli Kashyap,

Kidambi Srikanth, H S Prannoy, RMV Gurusaidutt and P V Sindhu. Following Jwala and Ashwini's controversial remarks on Gopichand, the player-turned-coach had outrightly rejected their claims saying they have been given full support. "It is too often that they (Jwala-Ashwini) have been saying this. They need to be specific about their issues. Whatever tournament they have been playing, they have been supported by SAI, BAI and the Government of India. Whatever support they have asked, has been given. "Under the TOP scheme, it was said that as a joint program for singles, we will support singles players as a group. So four players were picked then. Similarly, doubles as a group will be supported in the scheme," he had said.

The top seeded pair made a remarkable comeback to beat Russian second seeds Ekaterina Makarova and Elena Vesnina 5-7, 7-6(4), 7-5 in two hours and 25 minutes.

Stuart Broad led England to a 169-run victory in the first Test as Australia collapsed either side of lunch on the fourth day at Cardiff's Sophia Gardens on Saturday. Australia, well-placed at 97 for one in Cardiff on Saturday, slumped to 106 for five as four wickets fell for just nine runs in 36 balls. Chasing a record-breaking 412 for victory, the Ashes-holders were dismissed for 242 after tea. Fast-medium bowler Broad took three for 39 in 14 overs as England enjoyed an emphatic win in their first match under new Australian coach Trevor Bayliss. **Better monsoon would help check food inflation: FM**

New Delhi, July 12  
Government is working on a new agriculture insurance scheme that will cover all the inputs put by a farmer into his farm as also the loans taken by him. Speaking at the Nabard Foundation Day celebrations in Mumbai today, Finance Minister Arun Jaitley said, the present crop insurance schemes cover only the loans which a farmer has taken from banks. He noted that the agriculture sector presents its own set of challenges with successive low rate of growth over the years. Mr. Jaitley admitted that the country has been unable to ensure even a 4 per cent growth consistently in the field of agriculture. He said, with productivity levels reasonably low and 85 per cent farmers being small and marginal, the agriculture sector is afflicted by higher input costs, low level of irrigation, high indebtedness, absence of an effective insurance mechanism and adverse impacts of climate change.

Finance Minister said, a better monsoon would help check food inflation, including in pulses. He said, the Department of Agriculture expects a better rainfall in most parts of the country to result in higher production of oil seeds and pulses, which at the moment are a cause of concern in terms of inflation. Mr. Jaitley also said that rising tax revenues and improving fundamentals would take the Indian economy to an accelerated growth trajectory. He expressed hope that 8 to 10 per cent GDP growth rate is not out of reach. Mr. Jaitley stressed the need to control

deficit and said that Indian Economy presents a silver lining amidst challenges being faced by the global economy. Speaking at the function, RBI Deputy Governor H R Khan warned against frequent farm loan waivers. He said that debt burden is not the only reason for such tragic steps but there are other reasons like crop failures, social, cultural and ecological factors which have led to farmers suicides. He said that prevention is better than cure, while adding that there are occasions where loan waivers are needed, but in the long term it is important to ensure that such problems do not re-occur.

**India's longest road tunnel to open for traffic next year**

Port Blair, July 12

India's longest road tunnel, being built on Jammu-Srinagar National Highway, will be opened for general traffic in July next year and would reduce the distance between the two cities by 30 kms.

Shri. Vara Prasad, Malaria Inspector emphasised the importance of vector control for control of Dengue. Shri. Subrata Biswas, District Malaria Officer, Port Blair thanked the public for their cooperation in reducing the incidence of dengue in Andamans.

Udhampur with Nashri in Ramban district, is being completed at a cost of over Rs 2500 crore The state-of-the-art tunnel is simultaneously being built from the two ends and the NHAI teams will meet at the centre by drilling a hole through the final section. It will also reduce the existing road distance between two points on the highway from 41 km to 10.89 km. The statement said NHAI is also constructing a parallel escape tunnel along with the main tunnel for evacuation of commuters in case of eventualty. The two tubes of the tunnel will be internally connected through 29 "cross-passages" (each after a gap of 300 meters) and the escape tunnel will exclusively be used for pedestrians. There is a provision for ventilation keeping in view the distance of the tunnel. This state-of-the-art tunnel project will also have parking spots after a specific distance to tow away or shift vehicles in case of a breakdown. The four-lane project would go a long way in creating an all-weather road to the Kashmir valley.
