PM chairs high level meeting on J&K situation; appeals for peace and calm in valley

New Delhi, Jul 12 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has appealed for peace in the violence-hit Kashmir. He also extended every possible assistance to the state in maintaining law and order. His appeal came after he had a high level meeting in New Delhi with senior Union Ministers to take stock of the prevailing situation there. Briefing reporters after the meeting, Minister of State in Prime Minister's Office, Dr. Jitendra Singh said that Shri Modi was hopeful that innocent lives are not disturbed. He said the Prime Minister is keeping a close watch on events in the valley. The meeting was attended by Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley, External



Affairs Minister Smti Sushma Swaraj, Defence Minister Shri Manohar Parrikar, National Security Advisor Shri Ajit Doval and Foreign Secretary Shri S Jaishankar among others. The Centre is seized of the situation in the Kashmir valley which came for a thorough review this

afternoon. The Prime Minister himself took a high level meeting soon after his return from his foreign tour to take stock of the situation. He also made a firm appeal for calm in the valley. Before his arrival, Shri Modi had sent NSA Shri Ajit Doval cutting short his foreign visit by a day to review the

In order to get an Open Defecation Free status, the PBMC formulated a working plan on this assessment wherein it was determined to construct 48 community toilet and



procure 11 mobile toilets also to address the need of the targeted open defecation population, where land for construction of toilet with each individual was found not to be available and

Rio 2016: Sreejesh to lead men's hockey team



New Delhi, Jul 12 In one of the most significant decisions in recent times, Hockey India on Tuesday named senior goalkeeper PR Sreejesh as the captain of the national team for the Rio Olympics, removing long-time skipper Sardar Singh. Sreejesh, one of the finest custodians in world hockey at the moment, was rewarded after the team, under his leadership, ended up with a silver medal at the blue riband six-nation Champions Trophy hockey tournament in London. Sreejesh had a good tournament both as a player and captain as India had their best performance in the 38-year-history of the tournament. The team played a brilliant final where they held eventual champions Australia to a goalless draw in the

regulation time before losing in a controversial shoot-out. Playmaker SV Sunil, who is also a key component in the team, has been named vice-captain. Things fell in place for Sreejesh at the right time and went awry for Sardar, who has been going through a torrid time both on and off the field. Six more Indians qualify for Rio Olympics

New Delhi, Jul 12 Triple jumper Renjith Maheswary and golfer Anirban Lahiri are among the six Indians who yesterday qualified for the upcoming Rio Olympics. At the Indian Grand Prix in Bengaluru, Maheswary leaped with a national record of 17.30 metres bettering the Rio qualification mark of 16.85 metres. In 200 metres race, Dharambir Singh shattered national records by clocking 20.45 seconds to make the

cut for Rio and become the first Indian to run in an Olympics 200m race after 36 years. Jinson Johnson ran the second fastest ever 800 metres race to qualify. In Golf, which will make a return to the Olympics for the first time after the 1904 St. Louis Games, three Indians - Anirban Lahiri, Shiv Shankar Prasad Chawrasia and Aditi Ashok - sealed Rio berths. The cut off for Golf for the Games is 60 in the world ranking, and it officially closed yesterday.

(Contd. from page 1) The PBMC has also decided to provide an additional incentive of Rs. 10000/- to these Households (Rs. 5000/- after completion of digging of Septic Tank and Rs. 5000/- upon completion of foundation of superstructure). Till date 116 households out of 384 households have been sanctioned Rs. 2000/- as the first phase of incentive under "Swachh Bharat Mission (Urban)" as Central Government Incentive.

All these efforts of PBMC are now showing the results. Out of these identified households several households have started constructing their own sanitary individual household toilets.

It has come to the notice of the council that certain households are reluctant to construct their sanitary toilet and continue open defecation. In this connection, it is brought to the knowledge of these defaulters that as per "The Prohibition of Employment as manual Scavengers and the Rehabilitation Act, 2013", "insanitary latrines" means a latrine which requires human excreta to be cleaned or otherwise handled manually, either in situ or in open drain or pit into which the excreta is discharged or flushed out, before the excreta fully decomposes in such manner as may be prescribed." It is brought to the Knowledge of all concerned that in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 8 & 9 of "The Prohibition of Employment as manual Scavengers and the Rehabilitation Act, 2013," the Secretary, Port Blair Municipal Council has been conferred with the powers of Judicial Magistrate of the first class for the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 in order to take necessary action under the provision of Act. It is hereby appealed to the defaulters to construct Sanitary Toilets within 45 days from dates failing which under the provisions of section of "The Prohibition of Employment as manual Scavengers and the Rehabilitation Act, 2013". Penalty for contravention of section 7 of the said act shall be imposed leading to imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine which may extend to Rupees One Lakh or with both, a communication from the Secretary, PBMC said here today.
