Towards Solid Waste Management

Construction of road using waste plastic in progress at PBMC premises

Port Blair, Aug 12
The Port Blair Municipal Council has taken an initiative to utilize the waste plastics up to 60 microns in road construction, which are serious concern and threat to the environment and health of the living organisms, in absence of its recycling and processing demands. A pilot project to utilize the waste plastics up to 60 microns in road construction is being executed at Municipal Head Quarter Road, Port Blair. As per the recommendations of Central Road Research Institute (CRRI), this saves 8-10% of Bitumen in construction of road as well as improves the strength, durability and the



life of road in many characteristics.

The PBMC has covered a stretch of 821 sqm. road, in which the quantity of shredded waste plastic used is 50 kgs and the same quantity of bitumen is

saved. This initiative was majorly targeted towards Solid Waste Management of Port Blair city to keep the environment hygiene said the SE, PBMC, Shri A. K. Paul and EE, SWM, PBMC, Shri Avinash Kumar Singh while giving information to

The Daily Telegrams today. They further stated that in future, Port Blair Municipal Council (PBMC) will implement the same technique in other urban roads falling under the jurisdiction of PBMC towards better road and solid waste management.

Kandy test: India off to a steady start scoring 329 for 6 on day one against Sri Lanka



Pallekele, Aug 12
Shikhar Dhawan continued his golden run but a rare flop show from the famed middle-order saw Sri Lanka restrict India to 329 for 6 here on the first day of third cricket Test. Courtesy Dhawan's (119) sixth Test hundred and a record 188-run opening stand with KL Rahul (85), India looked good for a score close to 400 after opting to bat. However, some fine bowling in the final two sessions by left-arm spinner Malinda Pushpakumara (3/40 in 18 overs) and chinaman Lakshan Sandakan (2/84 in 25 overs) helped Sri Lanka gain some foothold when stumps were drawn on the opening day. The in-form Cheteshwar Pujara (8), last Test's centurion Ajinkya Rahane (17) were dismissed cheaply while skipper Virat Kohli (42) was dismissed after getting set.

However, Kohli had been reaching out to play the spinners from his crease and ended up edging the ball to first slip off Sandakan in the 79th over. Ravichandran Ashwin (31) looked compact but became left-arm seamer Vishwa Fernando's scalp at the fag end of the day. Ashwin and Wriddhiman Saha (13 batting), who survived a DRS appeal for caught behind, then brought up India's 300 in the 81st over even as the visitors were in dire need of a partnership to make their morning advantage count. The duo added 26 runs for the 6th wicket and negotiated the second new ball properly as well. But Ashwin was caught behind off Fernando, two overs before stumps leaving India with more work to do on the second day.

Maheshwari bags memorable bronze at Asian Shotgun Championship



Astana, Aug 12
Shooter Maheshwari Chauhan bagged a bronze medal at the Asian Shotgun Championship to earn India's first women's skeet individual medal at a top international competition in Astana. Yesterday, Maheshwari

also led India to the team silver alongside compatriots Rashmi Rathore and Saniya Sheikh. The trio shot a total of 190, finishing behind Goldmedalists China, who shot 195. Hosts Kazakhstan won the bronze shooting 185.

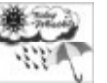
