Govt's unclaimed funds to be used for health care of senior citizens: FM

Kochi, Sept 12
 Union Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley has said that unclaimed amount of government investments will be taken care of for the health care of senior citizens. He said in Kochi recently that the Government is currently working on this programme, which was approved in the Finance Bill last year.

Shri Jaitley was attending a function to announce distribution of 800 crore rupees to 1,11,111 beneficiaries under the Karunya Benevolent Fund, a social security programme of the Kerala government. He also pointed out that a new and definite vision is coming up before the whole country that the fruits of

developments should not be confined to a particular fortunate section of the people. Shri Jaitley said only 11 per cent of the total population of the country have the benefit of pension now. In this situation, states have to step in various forms of social security schemes, Shri Jaitley said.

US Open : Leander Paes, Martina Hingis lift mixed doubles title

New York, Sept 12
Fourth seeded pair of Leander Paes of India and Martina Hingis of Switzerland won the mixed doubles title after beating American pair of Bethanie Mattek-Sands and Sam Querrey 6-4, 3-6, 10-7 in the final at the Louis Armstrong Stadium in New York on Friday night. After sharing the first two sets, Paes-Martina were trailing 2-5 in match point tie-breaker. However, Paes and Martina went all out and levelling the score at 6-6. Thereafter, Paes and Martina did not allow their opponents to have any liberty and wrapped up the final at 10-7 for their third Grand Slam title this year. With this win, Paes and Hingis became the first team since 1969 to win three Grand Slam mixed doubles titles in the same season. The only other team to win three majors in the same year were Marty Riessen



and Margaret Court 46 years ago. Paes aged 42, has also passed his former doubles partner, Mahesh Bhupathi, as the most successful mixed doubles champion in the Open Era with nine Grand Slam titles. It was his 17th title in total at the majors while Hingis, 34, now has 19 from five singles, 10 women's doubles and four mixed.

Hingis can win another this weekend as she will team up with India's Sania Mirza in the women's doubles final.

Roger Federer sets up US Open final with Novak Djokovic

New York, Sept 12
Roger Federer served superbly once again as he beat Stan Wawrinka to set up a US Open final against Novak Djokovic. Second seed Federer defeated his fellow Swiss 6-4 6-3 6-1 to reach the final without losing a set, and having dropped serve just twice. Federer's swashbuckling form has been the talking point of the men's draw, and especially his new tactic of occasionally stepping in to return almost from the service line. Earlier, world number one Novak Djokovic thrashed defending champion Marin Cilic



for the loss of just three games to reach the US Open final. The 28-year-old from Serbia swept through 6-0 6-1 6-2 in 85 minutes at Flushing Meadows. It was the most one-sided men's semi-final in New York since the open era began in 1968. Cilic, seeded ninth, had been struggling with an ankle injury in recent days and the Croat had his serve broken eight times.

Serena Williams Grand Slam bid ends after shock semi-final defeat

New York, Sept 12
Serena Williams's hopes of securing a calendar Grand Slam were ended in stunning fashion by Italy's Roberta Vinci in the US Open semi-finals. Vinci, the world number 43 and playing her first Grand Slam semi-final, caused a huge upset with a 2-6 6-4 6-4 win. Williams had been two wins from completing a clean sweep of all four majors in 2015. Vinci aged 32, will play Flavia Pennetta in an all-Italian final at Flushing Meadows on Saturday. Earlier, Flavia Pennetta outplayed Romanian second seed Simona Halep in the first semi-final to win 6-1 6-3.



After dominating the first set, Pennetta broke Halep to start the second set. But the Romanian rallied, winning three straight games and appearing to find her game. But Pennetta recaptured momentum, winning the last five games of the second set to advance to the final. Saturday will see the first Grand Slam final between two Italian players since the Open era began in 1968.

Rathore further informed that the government has decided to organize mega credit camps across the country between September 25 to October 2 this year for Pradhan Mantri MUDRA Yojana (PMMY) loans so that maximum numbers of borrowers could get credit as per their requirements under the three categories of loans. The PMMY provide loans between Rs. 50 thousand to Rs 10 lakh to small entrepreneurs with a rate of 1% percent interest per month. The scheme was launched by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi in April this year. This MUDRA Bank scheme would benefit small manufacturing units, shopkeepers, vegetable sellers, hair salon, and hawkers.
