Governors play important role as bridge between Centre & states under co-operative federalism: President

New Delhi, Oct 12 President Shri Ram Nath Kovind has said, Governors play an important role as the bridge between the Centre and the states under co-operative federalism. Addressing the two-day Conference of Governors at Rashtrapati Bhavan today, Shri Kovind stressed the need for New India by 2022 where there will be no place for corruption, poverty and illiteracy. The theme of the opening session was 'New India-2022'.

Vice President Shri M Venkaiah Naidu, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh were also present on the occasion.

Shri Kovind said, being an intrinsic part of the legislative system in their States, Governors can provide a new dimension to the development of their States by communicating

with legislators, and inviting them to Raj Bhavan to deliberate on subjects related to public well-being. The President said that in today's digital era, people

expect public services to be simple, transparent and there should be appropriate provisions for accountability. He called for embracing new technology and

innovation to adapt to the changing global scenario. Shri Kovind said, it is essential to link youth with the process of nation building. He said, the future of the country depends on the capacities, moral values and compassion of the younger generation. The President said, special attention needs to be paid to higher education and skill development at the level of States.

The President pointed out that 69 per cent of Universities in the country fall under the purview of State Governments, and 94 per cent of all college and university students study in these institutions. He said, Governors can also

Himachal Pradesh to go to polls on November 9, Gujarat before Dec 18: EC

New Delhi, Oct 12 Himachal Pradesh will go to polls on 9th of next month in a single phase. Announcing the poll schedule in New Delhi this evening, Chief Election Commissioner Shri A K Joti said, the notification for the Assembly polls will be issued on 16th of this month and the last date for nomination is 26th October. He said, counting of votes will take place on 18th December. Shri Joti said, the model code of conduct for the Himalayan state has come

into force with immediate effect. He said, Electronic Voting Machines with VVPAT will be used in all the constituencies and voters will be able to see to whom they have cast their votes. The CEC said, Election Commission has made elaborate arrangement for conduct of free and fair polls. As many as 7521 polling booths will be set up for voting in 68 assembly constituencies. Election Commission has also made arrangement of all women polling booths.

Two polling booths in every constituency will be manned by women. On pilot basis, voter turn out will be matched with VVPAT slips in one polling booth in every constituency of the State. Three tier monitoring system will be put in place to check the menace of paid news. The term of Himachal Pradesh Assembly is ending on 7th January next year. Replying to media query, the Chief Election Commissioner said, the poll

Direct tax collections in the first half of the current financial year rise 15.8 percent

New Delhi, Oct 12 The Direct Tax Collections in the first half of the current fiscal shows growth of 15.8 per cent. Finance Ministry said, the provisional figures of Direct Tax collections up to September, 2017 show that net collections are at 3.86 lakh crore rupees which is higher than the corresponding period of

last year. Net Direct Tax collections represent 39.4 per cent of the total budget estimates of Direct Taxes for Financial year 2017-18. The Ministry said, an amount of 1.77 lakh crore rupees has been received as Advance Tax up to 30th of September this year, reflecting a growth of 11.5 per cent over the corresponding period of last year.

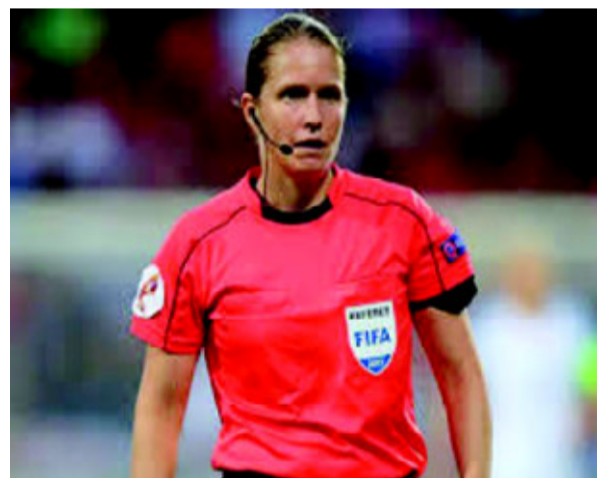

Kolkata, Oct 12 Switzerland's Esther Staubli is set to become the first female referee to officiate a match at the FIFA U-17 World Cup when Japan takes on New Caledonia in the final round group E match on October 14. This is in line with FIFA's objective to further develop women's football as the 38-year-old is one of seven women referees invited to the tournament in India where all the male and female match officials, nominated by FIFA's Referees Committee, have completed a host of activities together in a series of seminars, including



theoretical sessions in the classroom and practical sessions on the field of play. The benefits of joining forces are mutual when men and women team up to hone their interpretation, positioning and decision-making abilities. Another positive aspect is that the women referees have an opportunity to gain more experience.

Sunil Chhetri determined to perform at 2019 Asian Cup

Bengaluru, Oct 12 Having missed out on the 2015 Asian Cup, India captain Sunil Chhetri is determined to prove himself at the 2019 edition of the continent's premier football tournament. India qualified for the 2019 Asian Cup after thrashing Macau 4-1 in their qualifier at the Sree Kanteerava Stadium here on Wednesday evening. India had failed to qualify for the 2014 AFC Challenge Cup and thus also failed to qualify for the 2015 AFC Asian Cup. "I was there when we missed out in 2015 and that still hurts me," Chhetri said after the match. "This is the tournament we play for. We get to rub our shoulders against best in Asia which we don't get many times," he added. Rowlin Borges (28th minute)



put India ahead in the first half before Sunil Chhetri (60th) and Jeje Lalpekhlua (90+2) found the net after the break. Macau defender Man Fai Ho scored an own goal in the 70th minute while trying to clear a pass into the penalty box by India's Halicharan Narzary. Nicholas Mário de Almeida Torrão scored the lone goal for the visitors in the 37th minute. The Indians have been in impressive form, winning all the four group matches they have played so far to ensure qualification in style. Chhetri praised his teammates for their performance, but admitted that the Indians will have to be at the top of their game and cut out the mistakes when they travel to the United Arab Emirates in 2019 for the tournament proper.
