RBI to launch public awareness campaign through SMSes

New Delhi, Nov 12

Reserve Bank of India (RBI) will soon launch a public awareness campaign through SMSes to educate public about various banking regulations and facilities available. In an official release RBI said, to begin with, it will send messages cautioning the people against falling prey to unsolicited and fictitious offers received through emails, SMSes and phone calls. The caution messages will be sent from 'RBISAY' sender id. The apex bank has been alerting members of the public against such offers through press releases issued from time to time. This is the first time it will use the same media - SMS and emails - as those used

by the fraudsters. Public can give a missed call to 86919-60000 to get more information through Interactive Voice Response System (IVRS) on fake

calls and emails as well as investing wisely and cautiously in chit funds. They can also send their feedback on the campaign by email.

One killed in crocodile attack; LG expresses grief

Port Blair, Nov 12.

In a tragic incident, a 21 yr old youth named Bishnu Hari Mondal was killed in a crocodile attack at Wandoor beach at around 12noon today. Sources from the Wildlife Unit of Forest Department informed that the incident occurred when Bishnu was swimming along with his friends at Wandoor beach. The crocodile attacked him from behind and pulled him into water. Bishnu, a

resident of Dhanikari area, belonged to Midnapur District, West Bengal, and was working as labour in Andaman. The Lt Governor, Admiral DK Joshi PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NSM, VSM (Retd.) has expressed his grief over the tragic incident.

Meanwhile, following this incident, the beaches of New Wandoor, North Wandoor and Collinpur have been declared as no swimming zone until further orders.

More than 1.3 lakh Indians submit names to NASA to be carried to Mars

New Delhi, Nov 12

More than 1.3 lakh Indian space enthusiasts have submitted their names to NASA to be carried to Mars onboard the US space agency's mission to the red planet next year.

Last month, NASA invited members of the public to send their names which will be carried on the InSight (Interior Exploration using Seismic Investigations, Geodesy and Heat Transport) mission to Mars.

Those who submitted their names were provided online 'boarding passes' for the mission. The names are being etched on a silicon wafer microchip using an electron beam to form letters with lines one-thousandth the diameter of a human hair. The chip is affixed to the InSight lander deck and will remain on Mars forever.

PBMC intensifies drive to impose fines for not maintaining cleanliness 139 persons/firms fined so far

Port Blair, Nov. 12

The Port Blair Municipal Council has intensified its drive to impose fines for not maintaining cleanliness recently. The Sanitary Inspectors of the Port Blair Municipal Council imposed fine on 95 more persons/firms for littering or failure to keep the area in around their premises clean. The 95 fines imposed yesterday were spread in different

areas like Haddo, Delanipur, Phoenix Bay, Middle Point, Sea Shore road, Mohanpura, Bathu Basti, Prothrapur, Austinabad and Garacharma etc. Earlier a day before i.e. on Nov 10, the PBMC officials led by the Secretary, PBMC imposed fines on 44 persons/firms in the Aberdeen Bazar area.

In a press release received here, the PBMC Secretary, Shri. Yashpal Garg,

informed that on Nov 11, all the persons/firms paid the fines at the spot while on the previous day, three firms refused to pay the fine; and were served with notices. Actions have been initiated for prosecution of these three persons/firms and they shall be liable on conviction to a fine or to imprisonment, or to both such fine and imprisonment

Sufficient LPG stock available in Isles

More distributors added for supplying LPG to far flung Islands

Sufficient LPG stock is available in the Islands to meet the requirements of the consumers. With the arrival of the ship tanker carrying LPG a fortnight ago, the distribution of LPG cylinders, area wise, is being done smoothly, in Port Blair and elsewhere, said the Secretary, CCS Ltd. Shri Parmasivam while speaking to 'The Daily Telegrams' here recently. Explaining the recent LPG crisis in the Islands, the Secy. CCS said, due to delay in the arrival of the ship carrying LPG coupled with festivities; there was a huge demand for LPG,



which led to its shortage last month. However, the problem has been tide over.

Similarly, Shri Subir Chander, from Priya Indane also informed that there is sufficient stock of LPG for the consumers for the next two months. He further added that in addition to the existing two trucks which supplies

LPG to the consumers of North & Middle Andaman, two more trucks have been added, enabling timely distribution of LPG to the consumers of those areas.

Life imprisonment to Sanil Kumar for committing murder of wife

Port Blair, Nov 12

The Sessions Judge, Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Shri Siddhartha Kanjilal recently pronounced a verdict convicting and sentencing accused Sanil Kumar to imprisonment for life and to pay a fine of Rs. 50,000

in default to suffer rigorous imprisonment for a further period of three years for having committed murder by intentionally causing the death of his wife Sharmista Roy, daughter of Jeevan Krishna Roy, a resident of Manjery.

According to a communication, Shri Jeevan Krishna Roy, a resident of Manjery on September 16, 2015, got the news that his daughter Sharmista Roy was murdered by her husband. As there was no eye

Minister says decision to exempt imported sports goods from IGST will be big boost for sportspersons

New Delhi, Nov 12 Sports Minister Col Rajyavardhan Rathore has said that the government's decision to exempt imported sports goods of specific nature from the Integrated Goods and Services Tax (IGST) ambit will be a big boost for the country's sportspersons of outstanding eminence.

He yesterday thanked Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, Finance Minister, Shri Minister Arun Jaitley and the GST Council for the decision. The Sports Minister added that the move is a major institutional

Sushil Kumar set for Senior National Wrestling Championship comeback

New Delhi, Nov 12 Two-time Olympic medallist Sushil Kumar is all set to make a comeback to the mat after three long years, but Yogeshwar Dutt will continue his absence from competitive fold when the National Wrestling Championship starts in Indore from November 15.

Sushil, who was having a training stint in Tbilisi, Georgia, rushed back to the country to take part in the selection trial against Dinesh in the 74kg category. Another wrestler in 74kg, Praveen Rana, did not turn up for the trials. Sushil hardly had to



break a sweat as Dinesh, the national junior champion, gave him a walk over. "I am currently in my best shape mentally and physically and

have started enjoying wrestling on competitive level," Sushil, who will be representing Railways in the upcoming championship, said.

Samson's 128 frustrates Sri Lanka, tour match ends in draw

Kolkata, Nov 12 Skipper Sanju Samson stood out with a sublime 128 to lead Board President's XI fightback against visiting Sri Lanka as their two-day tour match ended in a draw on Sunday.

In reply to Sri Lanka's 411/9 declared, the Board President's XI were struggling at 31/2 after lunch on the second day, but Samson patiently built his innings and helped his side reach 287/5 when both captains agreed on a stalemate after 75 overs.

During his 143-ball knock, Samson hit 19 fours and one six. Appointed skipper on the eve of the match after Naman Ojha was ruled out with an injury, the Kerala youngster showed big match temperament as he took on the Sri Lankan Test attack with ease. Samson anchored the Board innings with three useful partnerships of 68, 71 and 85 runs with Jiwant Singh (35), Rohan Prem (39) and Bavanaka Sandeep (33) respectively. On a track that offered little help to bowlers, Sri

Lanka ended up using 10 bowlers, including regular wicketkeeper Niroshan Dickwella, who bowled the last over of the match. Ace allrounder Angelo Mathews, who is recovering from a calf injury that forced him out of the entire Pakistan series, however was not seen bowling his medium pacers. Bowling coach Rumesh Ratnayake said Mathews would not bowl in the upcoming three Test series beginning at Eden Gardens on November 16.

witness who witnessed the offence, the entire case of the prosecution was hinging on circumstantial evidence. On the other hand, the defence of the accused was that he is innocent, he did not commit murder of his wife. The prosecution paraded as many as 17 witnesses through the witness box and exhibited as many as 11 documents and produced four material objects in order to substantiate the prosecution case. Neither witness nor any material has been produced on behalf of the accused in support of his defence of innocence.

On an overall consideration of the facts and circumstances of the case, the Sessions Judge came to the conclusion that the chain of circumstances established by the prosecution are so well knit that those are conclusive in nature, consistent with each other and point towards the one and only result that it is Sanil Kumar who committed murder by intentionally causing the death of Sharmista by strangulation and that the chain of circumstances established by the prosecution excludes all other hypothesis of innocence of the accused. Accordingly, the Sessions Judge passed the order of conviction on October 30, 2017 finding the accused guilty of the offence punishable under section 302 of the Indian Penal Code. Since the offence under section 302 IPC is visited with the alternative punishment of death or imprisonment for life and fine, the Sessions Judge gave the convict opportunity of making his submissions on the quantum of sentence till October 31, 2017 and kept the accused in custody for reflection of mind.

On October 31, 2017, when the convict was produced, he prayed for mercy whereas the Public Prosecutor submitted that the brutality of the offence was so heinous that the convict does not deserve any mercy and prayed for extreme penalty upon the accused. The Sessions Judge in the penultimate line of judgement observed that this is not a rarest of rare case where the extreme penalty of death sentence may be passed and accordingly, the accused was sentenced to imprisonment for life and to a fine of Rs. 50,000 and in default, to suffer rigorous imprisonment for a further period of three years for the offence under section 302 IPC. The Sessions Judge further directed that the fine amount, if realized, be paid to the two minor daughters of the convict and the deceased in equal proportion towards compensation.

The Sessions Judge also directed the District Legal Services Authority to provide free legal aid to the convict so as to enable him to prefer appeal against the order of conviction and sentence. Shri Santosh Kumar Mondal, Public Prosecutor and Shri N.A. Khan, Additional Public Prosecutor conducted prosecution in the case, the communication added.

Hockey India name 33 players for junior men's national coaching camp



New Delhi, Nov 12 Hockey India (HI) on Sunday named 33 players for the junior men's national camp, commencing on Sunday in Bengaluru. The players will train till December 23 under the watchful eyes of coach Jude Felix. Among the national campers Mandeep Mor, Pratap Lakra, Pankaj Rajak, Harmanjit Singh, Vishal Singh, Raushan Kumar, Dilpreet Singh, Maninder Singh, Sanjay, Senthamizh Shankar, Abhishek, Vishal Antil, Varinder Singh, Vivek Prasad, Suman Beck, Sukhjeet Singh, Rabichandra Moirangthem and Shilanand Lakra were part of the 18-member Indian junior men's hockey team, which won the bronze medal at the recent Sultan of Johor Cup in Malaysia. The team had a promising tournament as they ended with a total of 35 goals.

"I think it was a promising performance by the team considering it was only the first time that they were all playing together for the Indian Junior squad. I see a lot of potential in this group of 33 players," said coach Felix. "We have identified the mistakes we made in the Sultan of Johor Cup and will focus on improving those areas during this camp," he added. This chip will be carried on InSight mission to the red planet, which launches on May 5, next year. A lot of Indians responded to NASA's call for names for the Mars mission. The total number of names received by NASA from all over the world was 2,429,807. Space enthusiasts who signed up shared their downloadable "boarding passes" on social media, complete with the total number of flight miles they have collected by participating in engagement initiatives for other Mars missions. InSight, scheduled to land on Mars on November 26, next year, will be the first mission to look deep beneath the Martian surface, studying the planet's interior by listening for marsquakes. InSight's role is not only to study Mars, but also to gain broader insight into the formation of rocky planets in the entire solar system.
