Chief Secretary extensively reviews performance of all Departments

Port Blair, June 12

In its endeavor towards bringing more transparency and efficiency in governance, the Chief Secretary, A & N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain in a paradigm shift has introduced an innovative and objective system of monitoring expenditure of the Govt. Departments functioning under A&N Administration. This system has been devised to bring transparency and accountability in the governance.

The Chief Secretary in the past few days comprehensively reviewed the performance of various Departments on BCSS (Beneficiary, Contractors, Suppliers, Source) parameters. This initiative of Chief Secretary is likely to bring in a mechanism whereby a transparent system is evolved to monitor major spending patterns on developmental projects as well as procurements. It effectively controls the cartelling by contractors, purchase rates. He also noticed that some Departments are not adhering to financial discipline and stressed upon the need to bring in more transparency and accountability in the system. The Chief Secretary also directed the Departments to ensure that benefits of various Govt. schemes reaches out to genuine targeted beneficiaries. This initiative will definitely prove to be a paradigm shift in governance which makes the Administration not only financially more efficient but also responsive.

has sternly warned the Secretaries and other officers of the Departments to make procurements through GeM as it was noted under 'Source', some Departments have made huge procurements without adhering to the Order of GoI to purchase

through GeM. It has also been seen that some Departments are doing large percentage of spending without GeM which has been mandated by the Government.

While reviewing, he also observed that some of the projects which were initiated long back in 2015 by APWD have not been completed within the stipulated time period. Expressing concern over such delays, the Chief Secretary said it results in cost overrun.

Apart from this, the Chief Secretary also devised a new mechanism of project monitoring which enables monitoring of projects in terms of Project Completion Status (PCS), Project Start Status (PSS) and Tender Criticality Status (TCS).

The Chief Secretary also vigorously reviewed vigilance cases, court cases, audit paras, applications under RTI, CPGRAMS etc.

It may be recalled that the Chief Secretary has devised this unique system the first of its kind in the country, which enables tracking for BCSS- 'B' stands for Govt. Departments that spend money on various Beneficiaries; 'C' implies various Contractors who are given contracts by the Department for various works and the method of their contract given and whether they have had a history of involving Govt. in arbitration cases and extracting more money; 'S' refers to the Suppliers to various Govt. Departments while the other 'S' is the Source, whether on Gem, open tender, limited

12, 029 persons of 18 to 44 years vaccinated

Port Blair, June 12

The safety of the citizens is the foremost priority of the Administration, especially during this pandemic time. To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries is being initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands. Accordingly, the vaccination began with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine for Health Care Workers followed by frontline



workers and vulnerable population with comorbidities. Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44 years which is currently underway.

Meanwhile, the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in

A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 1,31,428 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2,81,603 (approx.). A total of 12, 029 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date. A

total of 804 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 505 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 451 were in the age group of 18-44 years. In N&M Andaman, 299 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which 285 were in the age group of 18-44 years while the remaining were above 45.

The Secretary (IP&T), Shri Sunil Kumar Singh addressing the media persons on COVID-19 status in the Islands held in the conference hall of IP&T here this evening once again urged the people to avoid inter-island movement and help A&N Administration in bringing down the number of corona positive cases. It is a pandemic time and we should restrict our movement to curb the



transmission of the virus. He further reiterated the need for strictly adhering to COVID Appropriate Behavior for their own safety and that of their family members and the society at large.

The Secretary further disclosed that during the RT-PCR conducted on 350 incoming passengers who arrived here yesterday by flight, the test report of all the passengers were

negative. He further informed that 3 flights with 536 passengers arrived today and the RT-PCR reports are awaited. He also stated that during the RAT conducted on 111 passengers proceeding to N&M Andaman at Ferrargunj, 2 persons were found positive. He said, that today till 3 pm, 482 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 450 were in the age group of 18-44 and

information as mentioned at Part A & B of the Life Certificate format.

The format of the Life Certificate is available with all Anganwadi Workers, Office of the Assistant Commissioner (Campbell Bay, Nancowry, Mayabunder), Office of the CDPOs of Urban (Dollygunj), Ferrargunj, Rangat, Diglipur and Car Nicobar. Considering the COVID-19 pandemic scenario, the beneficiaries are further informed to submit Life Certificate and sign in presence of the nearby Anganwadi Worker and handover to the Anganwadi worker for onward submission to CDPO Office through the Mukhya Sevika of concerned area. Hence, the beneficiaries are not required to visit any of the offices other than the nearby Anganwadi Centre for submission of self signed Life Certificate alongwith the format.

The Care-givers/guardians of those who are bed-ridden or unable to visit the Anganwadi Centre due to locomotor disabilities may inform the same to Anganwadi Worker so that the representative of Department can visit the home of such persons to collect Life Certificate.

The last date for submission of Life Certificate to Anganwadi worker by the beneficiary is on or before June 30, 2021. Thereafter, the pension benefit will be stopped if Life Certificate is not received, a press release from Directorate of Social Welfare said.

Online National Chess Championship 2021 by AICF

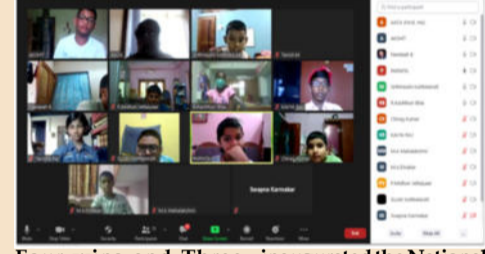
Kashthuri Bhai from A & N Islands scores 5.5 points in eleven rounds in U18 Girls section

New waste water treatment technology can reduce costs for low and medium scale enterprises

New Delhi, June 12 (PIB)

Soon automobile servicing industry, food industry, and other low and medium scale enterprises can have a smart, affordable electric field-assisted membrane separation device at their disposal for oily waste water treatment.

Low-income group users mostly cannot afford the high cost of treatment technologies available for handling oily wastewater generated at their source points. As a result, large amount of untreated oily wastewater is discharged into the aquatic bodies without following the guidelines of the Pollution Control Board.

The technology developed by Dr Chiranjib Bhattacharjee, Professor at the Chemical Engineering Department in Jadavpur University, Kolkata, uses a combination of Electrocoagulation and Electrofloatation Enhanced Membrane Module (ECEFMM) techniques for waste water treatment. Electrocoagulation is a waste water treatment technique that uses electrical charge for changing the particle surface charge, allowing suspended matter to form aggregates, and electrofloatation is the separation of suspended particles from water using hydrogen and oxygen bubbles generated by passing electricity through water.

In the developed module, electrocoagulation and electrofloatation are adjoined with membrane in a single indigenous setup. The turbulence created because of the hydrogen bubbling through the feed medium or the waste-water resists the deposition of oil over the membrane. The synergistic effect of hydrogen bubbling and rotation of the membrane module creates substantial turbulence within the solution and on membrane surface. On application of electric field during membrane separation, membrane fouling is substantially reduced, and membrane longevity is also enhanced by restricting the membrane ageing for prolonged time period. Thus, it requires less frequent membrane replacement, thereby reducing the maintenance costs to a great extent. The innovation being an economically feasible wastewater treatment

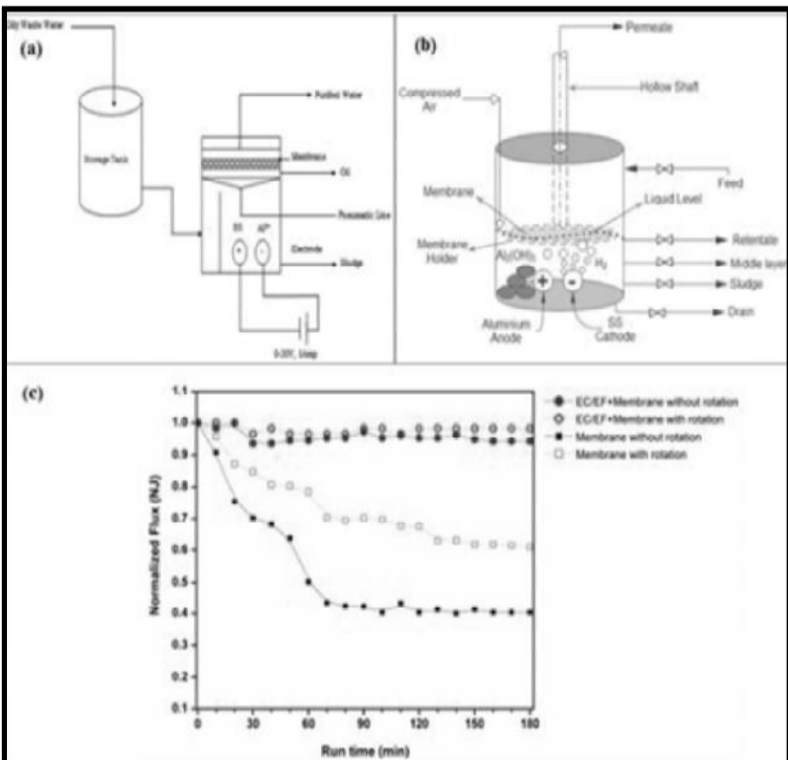


Fig. 2: (a) Schematic process flow diagram for the operation of ECEFMM; (b) Schematic diagram for the working principle of ECEFMM; (c): Comparative analysis of variation of normalized permeate flux (NJ) with time at different modes of operation.

Recommendations of 44th GST Council Meeting

Change in GST Rates on goods being used in Covid-19 relief and management

New Delhi, June 12 (PIB)

The 44th GST Council met under the Chairmanship of Union Finance & Corporate Affairs Minister, Smt Nirmala Sitharaman through video conferencing here today. The Council in its meeting has decided to reduce the GST rates on the specified items being used in Covid-19 relief and management till 30th September, 2021.

The meeting was also attended by Union Minister of State for Finance & Corporate Affairs, Shri Anurag Thakur besides Finance Ministers of States & UTs and senior officers of the Ministry of Finance & States/ UTs.

MALARIA

Diagnosis & Treatment
Blood test, Take medicine on time, Blood transfusion (in severe cases)

Prevention
Sleep under mosquito nets, Spray insecticides and use mosquito repellents, Do not allow water to stagnate and keep the surrounding clean. Keep the water tanks covered.

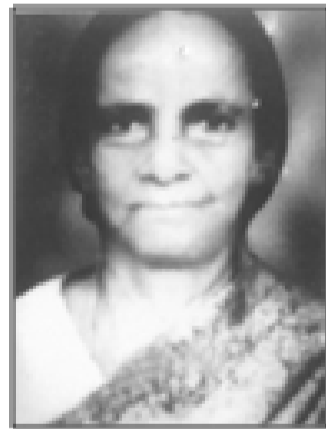

New Delhi, June 12

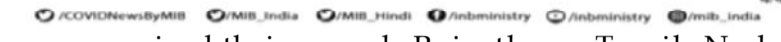
India has administered more than 24 crore 93 lakh doses of COVID-19 vaccine in the country so far. Health Ministry said, more than 31 lakh 50 thousand vaccine doses were administered yesterday. Out of which more than 28 lakh 48 thousand beneficiaries were vaccinated for 1st dose and more than three lakh beneficiaries received 2nd dose of the vaccine.

capital and recurring investment) for low-scale and medium enterprises, has a good market potential. Moreover, unlike other conventional treatment, it can break the highly stable oil-water emulsion through electric discharge and simultaneously separates oil from water with high efficiency. Besides, by integrating the electrochemical process setup with the membrane module in a single hybrid ECEFMM setup, one process has been eliminated. This significantly lowers the initial capital investment expense along with the additional advantage of reduced installation area requirement.

This technology developed with support from the Advanced Manufacturing Technologies programme of the Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India requires minimal manpower and does not need high-end technical adequacy for its operation, thus reducing the operational expense to a large extent. The recovered spent oil after oily wastewater treatment can be further used as an industrial burner oil, furnace oil, mould oil, hydraulic oil and so on. Thus, it creates a huge revenue generation scope for low-income groups by selling this collected spent oil. In a zone of densely concentrated garages, installation of one setup will serve the purpose of wastewater treatment and thereby extend the opportunity towards other low-income group users to control the water pollution level within PCB regulations. It is aligned with the 'Make in India' initiative. The validation and testing of the prototype have been successfully accomplished, and the pilot-scale validation and testing is on the verge of completion.

So far, the separation technology running in different sectors for treating such oily waste water involves the installation of an electrolytic cell or DAF followed by membrane unit. However, installing two separate units requires a high footprint area compared to the present unit, where two-unit operations are being assimilated in a single unit, said Dr. Bhattacharjee.

This prototype innovation has proceeded towards level 6 of the Technology Readiness Level, and Dr. Chiranjib Bhattacharjee has partnered with Concepts International for industrial collaboration and scale-up of the innovation. He plans to further carry out a field run with the pilot-scale module, networking and field installation, and Commercialization of the equipment through start-up.
