## Cabinet approves Pradhan Mantri Fasal Beema Yojna aimed at ensuring farmers' welfare

New Delhi, Jan 13  
The Cabinet today approved Pradhan Mantri Fasal Beema Yojna, a crop insurance scheme aimed to ensure farmers' welfare. Briefing media after Cabinet meeting in New Delhi, Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh said the scheme will offer more insurance with less premium, and lead to rise of purchasing capacity of farmers. He termed Cabinet's decision

on crop insurance scheme as historic. The new scheme replaces the existing National Agricultural Insurance Scheme. Union Minister Shri Venkaiah Naidu elaborated on the scheme that farmer's share of premium has been substantially reduced and government will provide subsidy on premium. He said Government liability on premium subsidy will be

shared by central and state governments on fifty-fifty basis. The budget for Crop Insurance will be substantially increased from 2823 crore rupees in 2015-16 to 7750 crore rupees in 2018-19. Remote Sensing, smart phones and drones will be used for quick estimation of crop losses and early settlement of claims. Agriculture Minister Shri

Radha Mohan Singh said there will be a uniform premium of two per cent to be paid by farmers for all kharif crops and 1.5 per cent for all Rabi crops. This is a path-breaking scheme for farmers' welfare. While the nation celebrates Lohri and Makar Sankranti, the harvest festivals, this news could not have come at a better time for farmers.

In a major breakthrough towards development of these Islands, tenders for two Bridges at Middle Strait and Humphrey Strait on NH-223 (from Chidiyatapu to Diglipur) have been invited by Ministry of Road Transport & Highways. It was a long pending demand of Islanders for having these two Bridges along Andaman Trunk Road, which is a lifeline for remote Islanders. The consistent and continuous efforts of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration under the able guidance and support of Hon'ble Lt. Governor has made this yet another dream of Islanders of having

seamless connectivity between South Andaman and North & Middle Andaman to become a reality soon. The proposed Bridge at Middle Strait will have a length of 960.00 mtr. with a sanction amount of Rs.262.97 Crore, whereas the Humphrey Strait Bridge is of 1020.00 mtr. length with a sanction amount of Rs.277.17 Crore. Both these Bridges will have 10.50 mtr. carriageway and likely to be completed within 03 years. 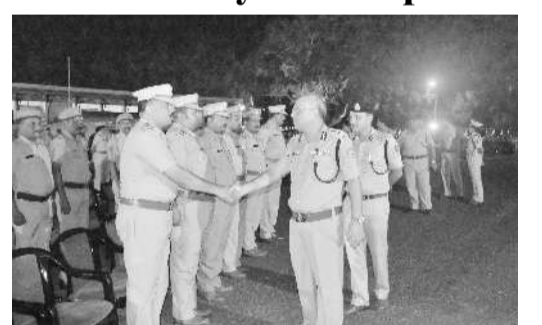

**Sania-Hingis pair equals record, enters Sydney semifinals**

Sydney, Jan 13  
Indian tennis ace Sania Mirza and her Swiss partner Martina Hingis on Wednesday equalled the record for the longest women's doubles winning streak by advancing to the WTA Sydney International semifinals with a straight set triumph in Sydney. Top seeds Mirza and Hingis got the better of China's Chen Liang and Shuai Peng 6-2 6-3 in less than an hour to enter the last-four stage and remain on course for a second successive title this year.



the opening set with ease. Liang and Peng's weak serve ensured that the second set followed a similar course. The Indo-Swiss combine frittered away seven chances but converted two, which was enough to give them the set

and the match without breaking much sweat. Mirza and Hingis will next be up against the winners of the match between Timea Babos and Katarina Srebotnik and Raluca Olaru and Yaroslava Shvedova.

With today's win, Mirza and Hingis won their 28th consecutive match to equal the record set by Puerto Rican Gigi Fernandez and Belarus' Natasha Zvereva in 1994. Starting last year, Mirza and Hingis have won 10 WTA doubles titles together — Indian Wells, Miami, Charleston, Wimbledon, U.S. Open, Guangzhou, Wuhan, Beijing and WTA Finals in 2015, and last week's Brisbane International.

India's only double Olympic medalist Sushil Kumar says he is raring to compete in his fourth Olympics in Rio de Janeiro later this year and wishes to remain fit for another four years to make the 2020 edition.

Sushil had earlier hinted that the Rio Olympics would be his last but now he is very much open to a fifth Olympic appearance in Tokyo 2020. The 32-year-old's long-time friend and fellow Yogeshwar Dutt has already made it clear that Rio will be his final Olympic appearance. "I don't remember saying that Rio will be my last Olympics. That is not my wish. My wish is to keep competing as long as I can and why not 2020 Olympics if I am able to maintain fitness. Jab taq body fit hain tab taq khelte rahenge (I will keep wrestling as long as my body holds)," Sushil told PTI after the launch of his brainchild

Sushil4Sports, an initiative aimed at supporting athletes from various disciplines. Sushil will have to beat Narsingh Yadav in the men's 74kg trials to reach Rio. Narsingh has already earned India an Olympic quota place by winning a bronze in the World Championship in Las Vegas in September last year.

Farmers will get full sum insured. The use of technology will be encouraged to a great extent. Smart phones will be used to capture and upload data of crop cutting to reduce the delays in claim payment to farmers. Remote sensing will also be used to reduce the number of crop cutting experiments. The cabinet has also approved Unified Package Insurance Scheme on pilot basis for 45 districts. It will cover activities like machinery, life, accident, house, and student safety in addition to crop insurance. These schemes will be implemented from Kharif season 2016.
