Lt. Governor to flag off Make MY Trip Andaman Marathon 2016 today

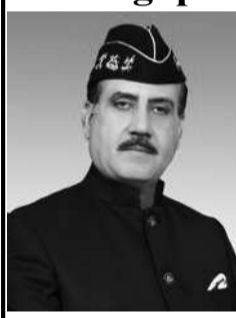
Port Blair, Feb 13
All arrangements for conducting the Make MY Trip Andaman Marathon 2016 on Feb 14, 2016 have been completed. The Lt. Governor, Lt. Gen AK Singh (Retd.) will flag off the race from National Memorial Cellular Jail at 5.15 am. This year over 800 people have registered for the event under various categories viz. Half marathon male - 75, female - 25; 10 K open male - 600, female - 80 and 10 K senior male - 15, female - 10.
International athletes from Kenya have already reached and are hopeful of sweeping the Half Marathon Open category. This year, however, there is much interest in the Half Marathon category from Islanders and local Defence personnel as separate category has been introduced.
The 10 K is expected to be very competitive with personnel from the Defence and Police both confident of winning. Celebrity guest Ms Mandira Bedi will be participating in the flag off at 5.15 am as well as the award function to be held at Netaji Stadium at 8 am. The Lt. Governor will distribute the prizes to the winners. There is tremendous interest in the one and half kilometre run for fun which is open to all and no

West Indies to meet India in Under-19 WC final

Dhaka, Feb 13
The West Indies have set up a title clash with India in the ICC Under-19 Cricket World Cup at Mirpur in Bangladesh on Sunday. In the second semifinal played today, the West Indies broke the Bangladeshi hearts with a thrilling three-wicket victory. Having bundled out Bangladesh for 226, West Indies reached 230 for seven in 48.4 overs. India entered the final with a 97-run win over Sri Lanka in the first semifinal on Tuesday.



India eye to be first nation to win ICC Under-19 Cricket World Cup for 4th time

3rd T20: India eye series win in Vizag

Visakhapatnam, Feb 13
Buoyed by an overwhelming victory in the previous game, a resilient India would look to continue the momentum and seal off their second successive T20 series win when they take on Sri Lanka in the third and final Twenty20 International, here Sunday.



India shrugged off their embarrassing defeat in opening T20 match in Pune with a commanding show in Ranchi, where they outclassed the island nation by 69 runs to level the series. The Indian batsmen had struggled to cope with the 'green' track in Pune but adjusted well on a slow strip at Ranchi, where they did not put a foot wrong. The bowlers, too, were in complete control, never letting the Sri Lankan batsmen dominate. Moreover, skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni's captaincy was impressive and all his experiments, be it reshuffling of the batting order or bowling tactics, paid off. India not only mastered the conditions but also executed their plans to perfection. The flying start that opens Shikhar Dhawan and Rohit Sharma provided India, gave Dhoni a chance to experiment with the batting order. The move to send Hardik Pandya ahead of himself and

Yuvraj Singh worked well as the young batsman came up with a fiery cameo. In Australia, Pandya did not get an opportunity to show his batting prowess but he certainly made an impression in Ranchi last night. It required a lot of muscle power and accurate shot selection to get runs and Pandya did a decent job.

Indian shooters continue to dominate in 12th SAG

Guwahati, Feb 13
Indian shooters continued their dominance in the 12th South Asian Games today. They bagged 6 Gold, 2 Silver and 3 Bronze medals. The Gold each came in Individual and Team events of Women's 50-metre Rifle 3 Position, Women's 25-metre Pistol and Men's 10-metre Air Pistol events. The Women's 50-metre Rifle 3 Position team comprised of



Anjum Moudgil, Elizabeth Susan Koshy and Lajja Gauswami. In the Individual section, Anjum

claimed the coveted yellow metal, with Elizabeth taking the Silver and Lajja settling for a Bronze. In the Women's 25-metre Pistol, the trio of Rahi Sarnobat, Anisa Sayyed and Annuraj Singh won the Gold in the team event. In the Individual section, Rahi clinched top honours, while Silver went to Annuraj and Bronze to Anisa. The third Gold came in the Men's 10-metre Air Pistol team which featured Omkar Singh, Gurpreet Singh and Jitendra Vibhute. In the Individual section, Omkar took the Gold, with Jitendra winning the Bronze. Earlier in the day, India won 2 Gold and 2 Silver medals in Triathlon. Triathlon is an event involving Swimming, Cycling and Running in immediate succession over various distances. India now have 154 Gold, 84 Silver and 26 Bronze. Sri Lanka is second while Pakistan is third.

Kavita Raut wins SAG marathon gold

Guwahati, Feb 13
Indian long-distance runner Kavita Raut booked her spot for the Rio Olympics in women's marathon after winning the event in the 12th South Asian Games. The 30-year-old Raut easily clinched the marathon gold in 2 hours 38 minutes and 38 seconds to become the fourth Indian woman to have qualified for Rio Games women's marathon. The Rio Games women's marathon qualification standard stands at 2



hours 42 minutes. OP Jaisha, Lalita Babbar and Sudha Singh have already qualified for women's marathon in Rio Olympics.

Training prog. on management & rejuvenation of senile orchards concludes

ICAR- Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Central Island Agricultural Research Institute, Port Blair conducted a four days in service training programme on 'Management and rejuvenation of senile orchards' at Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Sippighat. Altogether 17 Agricultural field staffs from Agricultural Technological

Management Agency (ATMA), project Coordinator, Field Assistants and Lady Mobilizer from ACANI, NCUI attended the training programme. Dr S Dam Roy, Director, CIARI, Port Blair was the chief guest on the inaugural and valedictory function of the training programme. Speaking on the occasion, he said the decline productivity of orchards has been attributed to various factors that is unsuitable site and climate, cultivation of intercrops, inadequate nutrition's, improper planting, undesirable planting materials, incidence of insect pest and diseases and biotic stresses. Dr Nagesh Ram, Senior Scientist and Head of this Krishi Vigyan Kendra explained the role of this Kendra and its mandates for the farming community of this Islands and relation with the line Dept. like ATMA, Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, NCUI, ACANI. At the end of the day, trainees visited two farmers field of Port Mout (Shri Sohan Prasad) and Badmash Pahad (Shri Kashinath Sahah) villages of South Andaman.
