## Newly constructed hostel building of FTI inaugurated Forest & Tourism should work in tandem for sustainable development of Islands: LG

Sustainable development of the Islands without disturbing the ecological balance is the focus of the Administration and the Foresters should ensure that along with conservation and preservation of the forests, they should also see to it that the common man's life is not put at stake. "There should be a balanced approach towards development of the Islands and people should be guided and educated about the Islands ecology", observed the Lt. Governor, Lt. Gen. A. K. Singh (Retd) addressing the gathering after inaugurating the newly constructed Hostel Building of Forest Training Institute (FTI) at Wimberlygunj here today. The Lt. Governor remarked that Andaman and Nicobar Islands have a unique ecology whereby 94% of the land is Forest covered and in this direction, the Environment & Forest Department has a catalytic role to play in conserving and preserving the rich

biodiversity of the Islands. Lauding the facilities provided for the trainees in the newly built hostel, after inspecting the building, the Lt. Governor stated that it reflects the progressive mind set of the Foresters by taking into account the needs and requirements of the trainees and ensuring their well being. He urged the trainees and Officers to ensure proper maintenance of the building. Calling upon the Forest Department to render services to the common man, the Lt. Governor said, "Forest Officials should also be approachable and available for guiding the common man". He stated that Forest Service is a very good service and the Foresters should take great pride in their service. The Lt. Governor urged that Andaman and Nicobar Islands have a unique ecology whereby 94% of the land is Forest covered and in this direction, the Environment & Forest Department has a catalytic role to play in conserving and preserving the rich

## Isles to celebrate completion of two years of Modi Govt. LG lauds Modi Government for sanctioning several development projects for A & N Islands

Port Blair, May 13  
Shri Narendra Modi led Government will be completing two years in Office on May 26. Plans are underway to celebrate the occasion in a befitting manner in the Islands, said the Lt. Governor addressing the gathering at Forest Training Institute at Wimberlygunj today. He said various programmes have been chalked out which include Swachhhta Abhiyan and distribution of around 4 lakh LED bulbs etc. The Lt. Governor also highlighted some of the major initiatives made by the Central Government for the development of the Islands in the last two years. Praising the number of developmental projects which will take the Islands to the path of progress and prosperity, he outlined the major projects which were sanctioned by the Government viz. widening of ATR Road, construction of two bridges, laying of undersea optical fibre cable, commencement of Medical College and ANCOL. He further added that apart from these major projects, the approval for starting a Law College and a Professional College has been obtained from the Central Government. The Lt. Governor also disclosed that to improve the Islands Shipping Sector, the Administration has placed an order for procuring two 1500 pax capacity vessels and two 500 pax capacity vessels, 10 harbour crafts and is expected to join the existing fleet in a couple of years. He also stated that the vessels are purchased from Central fund.

## LG reviews status of water supply in Isles Directs departments to immediately fix timeline for completion of all priority water projects



Port Blair, May 13:  
Hon'ble Lt Governor, Lt Gen A K Singh (Retd), today reviewed the present status of water supply at Port Blair and rural areas of the A&N Islands in view of the long dry spell and unprecedented prolonged summer season prevailing in the Islands, in a meeting held at the conference hall of Raj Niwas. A presentation on comprehensive plan for preservation, conservation and augmentation of water resources, tapping local possibilities and implementing new projects was made before the Lt Governor. Chief Secretary, Chairperson (PBMC) and senior officers of APWD and PBMC were present. Hon'ble Lt Governor expressed satisfaction over the water management plan being implemented by APWD, PBMC, Rural Engineering Department and PRIs to tackle the situation. He directed all departments to take due care for implementation of future augmentation plans in each place to ensure prolonged water security in rural and urban areas. He directed APWD to make

Rutland Water Supply scheme as top priority. Directions were given to APWD to start the Khudirampur Dam in Diglipur at the earliest so that the drinking water scarcity due to reduction of discharge in Kalpong river during lean period could be eliminated. APWD was directed to complete RO plants at Chowra and Mayabunder within this season to ensure non-occurrence of hardship to the public in these places from next summer season onwards. Department should try to add desalination capacity in various locations in phased manner in future to ensure coverage of potential scarcity area by desalination plants of suitable capacity, he said.

The Lt Governor further asked PBMC to prepare a long-term plan to upgrade the water distribution system in the city to stop loss of water during distribution. PBMC and APWD were asked to apply innovative methods in public buildings and public places for use of rainwater and recycling of waste water for use in non-domestic purpose such as gardening, flushing and other purpose to minimize (Contd. on last page)

India must focus on few sports to win medals: Jaitley

New Delhi, May 13 Finance Minister Arun Jaitley has stressed the need to focus on a few identified sports so that the country can win more medals at international events like Olympics. Speaking at a private event in New Delhi, the minister said it is necessary to identify 10-12 sports and acquire competitive advantage in them. He also emphasised that India is slowly making its mark in international events. In the last London Olympics, India won 6 medals and the country is sending largest ever contingent this year for



Rio Olympics, he said. Praising efforts of PSUs, Mr. Jaitley said, the companies besides being socially responsible have also been promoting sports in the country. India's history suggests that PSUs have always encouraged sports and provided jobs to sports persons of eminence, the minister added.

Djokovic progresses to Italian Open quarter finals

Rome, May 13 Andy Murray also went through to the quarter finals at Rome on Thursday. Roger Federer was the lone upset as he lost to world number 15 Dominic Thiem. The top seed Novak Djokovic failed to win a game in the first set, winning just eight points and looked all set to lose before he came back to win 0-6 6-3 6-2 against the unseeded Brazilian Thomaz Bellucci. Djokovic sets up a meeting with fifth seed Rafael Nadal who also needed 3 sets to reach the last 8. Rafael Nadal and the seven time champion on Rome's



clay - had to come from a set down to Australian Nick Kyrgios but eventually won 6-7(3) 6-2 6-4. Second seed Andy Murray had less trouble against

Jeremy Chardy of France, the Briton winning 6-0 6-4. Murray will face David Goffin in the next round after the Belgian beat eighth seed Thomas Berdych 6-0 6-0.

Anil Kumble retained ICC Cricket Committee head, Rahul Dravid made member

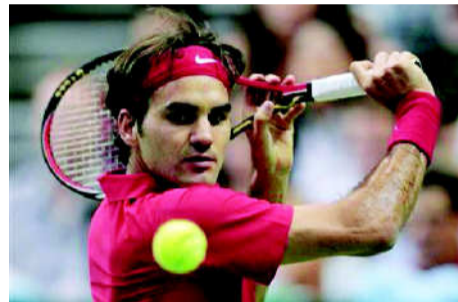
Mumbai, May 13 Former India captain Anil Kumble has been re-appointed ICC Cricket Committee chairman for a second term of three years while his one-time team-mate Rahul Dravid was named member of the top panel. Kumble, the all-time highest wicket-taker for India, was appointed as the chairman for his first term in 2012 and will now continue to head the panel until 2018. Another former India captain Dravid and ex-Sri Lanka skipper Mahela Jayawardene have been appointed to the ICC Cricket Committee, adding even more cricketing experience to the list of eminent people already on the panel.



The two have played 1,161 international matches between them from 1996 to 2015, and each has been appointed for a three-year term. Former Australia off-spinner has been elected as current player representative, replacing Laxman Sivaramakrishnan, who has completed his three-year term. Richard Kettleborough, three-time ICC Umpire of the Year, has been appointed as umpires' representative in the committee. The ICC Cricket Committee is representative of all stakeholders in the game, including players and umpires. It is empowered to make recommendations on cricket playing issues.

Roger Federer in doubt for French Open

Rome, May 13 Federer lost early on clay in Rome to rising Austrian Dominic Thiem 7-6, 6-4 in the third round of the Italian Open on Thursday. The 34-year-old's record of 65 successive grand slam appearances could be ended by the back injury that not only threatens his place at Roland Garros later this month but reminds us he cannot carry on playing for ever. The former world number one Roger Federer still looks way short of his best after knee and back injuries and struggled to get to grips with the 22-year-old Dominic Thiem at the Foro Italico, a week after withdrawing from the Madrid Open. Thiem, ranked 15th, recovered from an early break and



streaked into a 6-2 lead in the tiebreak before taking the opening set with a backhand winner. He broke 34-year-old Federer's serve again midway through the second set as he claimed the 32nd victory of a breakthrough season that saw him rise to a career-high 13th. Seventeen-times major champion Federer, who has missed 10 weeks of the season through knee surgery, shrugged off the defeat, saying his immediate priority was the French Open that begins on May 22. Federer, a four-times finalist in Rome, missed last week's Madrid Open with a back problem but said there had been some encouraging signs this week.
