Terrorism must be eradicated by collective efforts of civilised world: President

Ghana, Jun 13
President Shri Pranab Mukherjee has said that the current world order demands international organisations that are consistent with the new challenges confronting the global community. In his address at the banquet hosted by Ghanaian President Mr John Mahama at the President house in Accra last night, Shri Mukherjee made a strong pitch for reforms in United Nations Security Council. He termed non inclusion of India and Africa in the council as a serious anomaly. Shri Mukherjee



called for collective efforts of the international community to curb terrorism which he termed as global menace. He said India has been its victim for over three decades

Stating that trade and investment between both the countries have seen rapid growth in recent past, the President sought better opportunities for Indian companies to invest in the mineral and gas rich country. The President reached Accra yesterday on a two-day visit to Ghana. Shri Mukherjee's is the first visit by an Indian President to Ghana and is a part of India's outreach to Africa.

Vaishno Devi shrine sets new record, over 51,000 pilgrims visit in single day

Srinagar, Jun 13
In Jammu and Kashmir, Mata Vaishno Devi pilgrimage yesterday set a new record when the number of pilgrims performing darshans of the holy cave crossed 51 thousand. Sources said, it was, so far, the highest figure of pilgrims on a single day. They said, despite such a large number of pilgrims, the yatra was progressing smoothly at all places

including Adh Kunwari, Sanji Chat and shrine area from both the tracks. During normal days 25,000 to 30,000 pilgrims pay obeisance to the Goddess while the number goes up to 35,000 or 40,000 in the weekends. It may be mentioned here that after witnessing slump during 2014 and 2015, the pilgrimage to holy cave shrine in Trikuta Hills of Katra, has started witnessing rise this year.

Solar-powered airplane on globe-circling voyage lands in New York

New York, Jun 13
The solar-powered aeroplane on a globe circling voyage that began more than a year ago in the UAE reached a milestone on Saturday, completing a trip across the US with a Statue of Liberty fly-by before landing in New York. The Swiss-made Solar Impulse 2 landed at International Airport after a 4-hour 41-minute flight of about 165 miles from Lehigh Valley International Airport in

Pennsylvania. Its trip across the US began on April 24th, when Solar Impulse landed in San Francisco from Hawaii. The Solar Impulse 2's wings, which stretch wider than those of a Boeing 747, are equipped with 17,000 solar cells that power propellers and charge batteries. The plane runs on stored energy at night. The trip began in March 2015 from Abu Dhabi and made stops in Oman, Myanmar, China and Japan.

2nd ODI: India bundle out Zimbabwe for 126

Harare, June 13
Leg-spinner Yuzvendra Chahal scalped three wickets as India produced another professional bowling effort to dismiss a fragile Zimbabwe batting line-up for 126 in the second One-day International of the three-match series in Harare today.
Zimbabwe lost their last seven wickets for 20 runs to be bundled out in 34.3 overs. Indian pacers Barinder Sran (2/17) and Dhawal Kulkarni (2/31) performed their duties early on before leggie Chahal (3/25) joined the party in his second ODI.
The visitors chased down the modest target with ease to take an unassailable lead in the series. India had won the opening ODI comfortably here

on Saturday.
It was another chilly morning at the Harare Sports Club and Mahendra Singh Dhoni, winning the toss for the second time in succession, expectedly put the opposition in. Sran and Kulkarni got the ball to swing from the world go.
Zimbabwe chose to open with Hamilton Masakadza (9) and Chamu Chibhabha (21) this time but the move did not work as lack of application from the top-order left them struggling at 39/3 in 10 overs.
The experienced Vusi Sibanda gave the innings some momentum with a fighting 53 off 69 balls, but his



fall led to a batting collapse. He shared a handy 67-run stand with Sikandar Raza (16 off 41) to take his side past the 100-run mark.
Chahal triggered off the collapse by removing Raza and Elton Chigumbura (0) to be on a hat-trick.
Thirteen balls later, the spinner sent back Sibanda to have Zimbabwe in further trouble at 107 for six. Sibanda was the lone warhorse for Zimbabwe as he completed his 21st ODI

More than 80 % of world's population lives under light-polluted skies

Berlin, Jun 13
A study suggests that more than 80 per cent of the world's population lives under light-polluted skies. German scientists explain in Science Advance how ground measurements and satellite data were used to create an atlas of a world brightened by artificial lights. It reveals that the

population of Singapore, Kuwait and Qatar experience the brightest night skies. Conversely, people living in Chad, Central African Republic and Madagascar are least affected by light pollution. Scientists in Potsdam say that the artificial light in our environment is coming from a lot of different things.

NHAI to offer FASTag for quicker pass-through at toll booths

New Delhi, Jun 13
National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has decided to offer FASTag, an electronic toll collection system at select toll plazas to facilitate seamless traffic on highways. In a statement, the agency today decided to provide FASTag to existing monthly pass holders by absorbing their one-time cost.
The statement added that to facilitate its purchase by road users, points of sale will be made available at select toll plazas on these corridors.



The development assumes significance, given that India incurs a huge loss of over 21 billion US dollars annually

on account of delays due to frequent halts at toll plazas and poor roads, according to a report by IIM-Kolkata.

years of its establishment. The resolution said, India's GDP had grown to 7.2 percent in 2014-15 and 7.6 percent in 2015-16. It also noted GDP growth rate of 7.9 percent in the last quarter. The resolution mentioned that despite severe resource constraints, the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government achieved fiscal deficit target of 4.1 percent in 2014-15 and 3.9 percent in 2015-16. According to the resolution, India received an unprecedented amount of Foreign Direct Investment in 2015 and this helped in increasing surplus in balance of payment on capital account. It said, the government kept inflation at reasonable levels through judicious fiscal management strategies and also introduced tax reform measures and bankruptcy law. The trust of investors increased manifold due to increased transparency and accountability in governance, scam free administration and prudent fiscal management policies. It said, the government also improved ease of doing business, which attracted more investments.

India-Mauritius DTAA: Govt sets up working group

New Delhi, Jun 13
The government has constituted a working group to examine consequential issues arising out of amendments to India-Mauritius Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement and related issues.
According to the Finance Ministry, the working group to be headed by Joint

Secretary in the Central Board of Direct Taxes, CBDT will be comprised of departmental officers and representatives of SEBI, custodians, brokerage firms and fund managers. The Group has been asked to submit its report to the CBDT within 3 months, after examining the relevant issues.

Brazil crash out of Copa America after Peru upset

Brazil, Jun 13
Brazil crashed out of the Copa America football tournament following their 1-0 defeat to Peru after a controversial goal by Raul Ruidiaz. Multiple replays showed Raul used his arm to score. But the referee ruled the goal should

stand, despite Brazil's players furious protest. The defeat left Brazil struggling to digest their worst performance in the Copa America since 1987, the last occasion the five-time world champions failed to make it past the group stage.

UEFA warns England, Russia could be kicked out of Euro 2016

London, Jun 13
Union of European Football Association, UEFA, has threatened to disqualify England and Russia from Euro 2016 if there is any further violence by fans. It has begun disciplinary proceedings against Russia but not England, after totally unacceptable scenes at Saturday's England-Russia game. The Russian Football Union today expressed regret over the disturbances and urged its fans to behave at Euro 2016 matches. The UK government said it had offered to send extra British police to France ahead of



England's next match in Lens on Thursday. Another video also emerged last night where German and Ukraine supporters were seen clashing in Lille before the game. Three times champion Germany beat Ukraine 2-0. In another decision, the French government has urged cities hosting Euro 2016 matches to ban alcohol near venues and fan zones.

Govt-to-govt contract plan to import pulses: Minister

Bengaluru, Jun 13
Union Food and Consumer Affairs Minister Shri Ram Vilas Paswan today said, government is planning to import pulses by entering into contracts with other governments

to bridge the supply-demand gap and maintain stability of prices. He said, the situation of pulses is now under control and their prices have gone down in recent months. Talking to reporters in Bengaluru today, the Minister said, there is a gap between demand and supply. This year's

production is 170 lakh tonnes, while the demand will be around 246 lakh tonnes. Shri Paswan said, the government has maintained a buffer stock, for which it has already purchased 1,13,000 tonnes of pulses. State governments have also been asked to purchase pulses for retail distribution.

While interacting with the media persons, the Deputy Commissioner stated that generally, the tenants approach the Revenue Department for issuance of copies of Record of Rights and map. The District Administration has digitized all the available record of rights and the same has been hosted on the website and started issuing from the Common Service Centers, so that the tenants need not approach the office for issuance of ROR and map. Schedule has also been prepared for updation of the village maps, the DC added.

With the help of National Informatics Centre, the Revenue Administration has successfully launched e-IRIS software which is being utilized for registration of documents. The software has linked the registration process with Record of Rights and e-challan is also being generated. Now, the e-IRIS software has been upgraded and a new module has been prepared for seeking appointment with the Sub-Registrar, South Andaman District online.

By incorporating this salient feature in the software, the citizens can approach the Sub-Registrar on their own convenient date and time. Interested persons can register their appointment by giving authenticated details viz. e-mail or telephone number. Once appointment is fixed, the person is required to submit Deed either physically or to upload in the software at least 2 (Two) days before the time of appointment.
