## Trump-Modi meet to set forth vision to expand Indo-US ties says White House

Washington, Jun 13  
The maiden meeting between US President Mr Donald Trump and Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi would set forth a vision to expand the US-India partnership in an ambitious way, the White House has said. The leaders of the world's two largest countries will meet on June 26 to discuss a gamut of bilateral issues including terrorism and India's concerns over possible changes in H1B



visa rules. White House Press Secretary Mr Sean Spicer told reporters at his daily news conference that the two leaders are expected to set forth a

common vision on expanding the US-India partnership.

He cited fighting terrorism, promoting economic growth and

reforms and expanding security cooperation in the Indo-Pacific region as shared priorities. Spicer said US President Mr Trump and Prime Minister Shri Modi will look to outline a common vision for the United States-India partnership that is worthy of their 1.6 billion citizens.

Mr Trump invited Shri Modi to Washington after the Indian leader rang him in January to congratulate the new President.

## Defence Minister releases book on key achievements of DRDO

New Delhi, Jun 13

Defence Minister Shri Arun Jaitley today released a book on key achievements of Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) during the last three years in New Delhi. DRDO Chairman Dr. S. Christopher, Army Chief General Bipin Rawat, Vice Chief of the Navy Vice Admiral Karambir Singh, Vice Chief of the Air Force Air Marshal S B Deo and other senior officials were present on the occasion. A number of DRDO developed weapon systems, platforms, dual use equipment have been

accepted and inducted in the Indian Armed Forces and Paramilitary Forces. Some of the notable successful tests completed and inducted are Tejas fighters, Airborne Early Warning and Control System, Akash Weapon System, Varunastra Torpedo and Bharani Weapon Locating Radar. The production value of DRDO developed products, cleared by the Defence Acquisition Council has grown by 60 per cent in the last three years to approximately two lakh 57 thousand crore rupees from nearly one lakh 61 thousand crore rupees.

Briefing media in New Delhi on achievement of his Ministry this morning, Shri Gowda said, the Centre has formally adopted the UN Fundamental Principles of Statistics which reiterates its commitment to good governance.

He said, his Ministry has planned to revise the base year of National Accounts Statistics to 2017-18. The Ministry is exploring



Development of a Factsheet on Indian Economy which aims to provide a National Factsheet, wherein various source Ministries will provide quarterly data on 100 important indicators, he said.

Shri Gowda said, the factsheet will facilitate decision making at the senior levels of the government. He said, a robust statistical system

needs to be in place for collection, validation, compilation and dissemination of data. The Minister said, his Ministry has developed a new Integrated MPLADS Portal for use of all stakeholders which ensures transparency and efficiency.

He said, more than 90 per cent of MPLADS fund have been utilised.

## Centre to set up 100 AYUSH hospitals across country

Thanjavur, Jun 13

The Centre has approved proposals to set up 100 Ayurveda, Unani, Siddha, and Homeopathy (AYUSH) hospitals across the country. This was stated by Minister of State for AYUSH Shri Shripad Yesso Naik at Thanjavur in Tamil Nadu last night. He said, during the last three years, the Union government has approved posting of 4,000 AYUSH doctors in primary health centres across the country.



Shri Naik said, the salaries of these doctors are being paid by the Union government. He said, an AYUSH hospital equivalent to AIIMS will be opened within a month

in New Delhi. He said, the Ministry has approved setting up of two 50-bedded integrated AYUSH hospitals in Theni and Tiruvannamalai districts of Tamil Nadu.

## Management of crocodile related issues in Island Deptt of Environment & Forests to conduct crocodile census on June 23 & 24

Port Blair, June 13

The Department of Environment & Forests, A & N Administration will be conducting the 2nd phase of crocodile census in the territory of Andaman & Nicobar Islands on June 23 & 24, 2017 to estimate the population of Salt water crocodile in the coastal water during the monsoon season.

The population estimation studies will give an idea about the density, the

areas in which they inhabit, size classes viz. yearlings, juvenile, sub-adult and also their sex ratio including breeding females. The census detail will be used in management of crocodile related issues in the Island. Census will be conducted during day time on June 23 and during night hours on June 24, 2017.

Besides, Departmental staff/workers, students from colleges, general public, wildlife

enthusiasts, volunteers, NGOs, PRI members will be involved in the census operation. Those who are willing/interested to participate in the exercise voluntarily may contact to the nearest Divisional Forest Officer before June 20, 2017 and register their names.

## Govt to extend facility of EMRSs in all 672 Blocks in next 5-yrs

New Delhi, Jun 13

Government is planning to extend the facility of Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRSs) in all the 672 Blocks in next five years where ST population is more than 50 per cent of the total population. Tribal Affairs Ministry said, 51 new such residential schools were made functional during the last three years. 161 EMR Schools are functional right now and more than 52 thousand tribal students are taking education in these schools in 26 States.

## High wave forecast

Port Blair, June 13

High waves in the range of 3.0 - 3.3 meters are forecasted from 5.30 pm of Jun 13 to 11.30 pm of Jun 15, 2017 along the west coast of Andaman Islands between Ten Degree Channel and Coco Channel. Current speeds vary between 84 - 97 cm/sec. Fishermen have been advised to be cautious while venturing into the sea.

Port Blair, June 13

The Wildlife Division of Department of Environment and Forests conducted a sensitization programme for fishermen residing and using Junglighat jetty. In a programme organized at fish net mending centre at Junglighat jetty recently, the Assistant Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) Shri C.A. Majeed informed the gathering that Junglighat is a prime market location and the waste generated from a number of meat shops, fish centre and by-catches from fishermen dinghies are being dumped into the sea adjoining the jetty. He said, due to lack of awareness on waste



disposal and its consequences, the top predator crocodiles are being invited to this area, as free food source is available throughout the year, since this space is predominantly used by fishermen folks for their livelihood on day today basis. Thereby, putting their life at risks due to

## Make in India

Make in India is an initiative launched by the Government of India to encourage national, as well as multi-national companies to manufacture their products in India. It was launched by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on 25 September 2014. India emerged, after initiation of the programme in 2015, as the top destination globally for foreign direct investment (FDI), surpassing the United States of America as well as the People's Republic of China. In 2015, India received US\$63 billion in FDI.

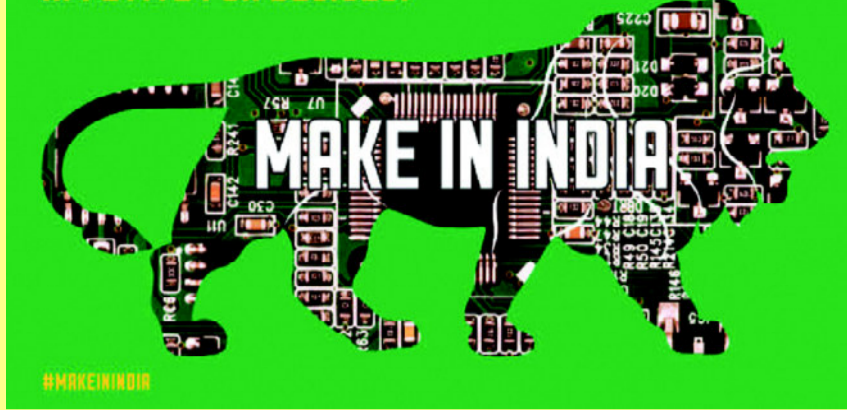
### History

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi launched "Make in India" on 25 September 2014 in a function at the Vigyan Bhavan. On 29 December 2014, a workshop was organised by the Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion which was attended by PM Shri Modi, his cabinet ministers and chief secretaries of states as well as various industry leaders. The major objective behind the initiative is to focus on job creation and skill enhancement in 25 sectors of the economy. The initiative also aims at high quality standards and minimising the impact on the environment. The initiative hopes to attract capital and technological investment in India.

The campaign was designed by Wieden+Kennedy. Under the initiative, brochures on the 25 sectors and a web portal were released. Before the initiative was launched, foreign equity caps in various sectors had been relaxed. The application for licenses was made available online and the validity of licenses was increased to three years. Various other norms and procedures were also relaxed.

In August 2014, the Cabinet of India allowed 49% foreign direct investment (FDI) in the defence sector and 100% in railways infrastructure. The defence sector previously allowed 26% FDI and FDI was not allowed in railways. This was in hope of bringing down the

France beat Iran by an identical score to win the bronze in the event. Earlier, on day four of the competitions at the rifle/pistol World Cup, both Jitu and Heena narrowly missed out on making the final of the individual men's and women's 10m air pistol event, finishing 12th and 9th in their respective qualification rounds. Only the top eight make



it through to the final. 430 athletes from 45 countries are competing for medals in the ongoing World Cup, which is the last chance for rifle and pistol shooters to qualify for the ISSF World Cup Finals.

### Saina Nehwal enters pre-quarterfinals of Indonesia Open
