Cabinet approves PMKVY to impart skill training to one crore people



New Delhi, Jul 13
Union Cabinet has approved the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) to impart skill training to one crore people over the next four years. Twelve thousand crore rupees has been allocated for it. Briefing reporters in New Delhi after the Cabinet meeting, Law Minister Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad said, the scheme will impart fresh training to 60

lakh youths and certify skills of 40 lakh persons acquired non-formally. In addition to catering to domestic skill needs, the scheme will also focus on skill training aligned to international standards for overseas employment in Gulf countries, Europe and other overseas destinations. There will be scholarship for students undergoing training in high end

job roles. Skill training would be done based on industry led standards aligned to the National Skill Qualification Framework.

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs today also approved disinvestment of 15 per cent paid-up equity in National Building Construction Corporation Limited through the Offer for Sale route.

ICDS being completely revamped to address malnutrition: WCD Minister

New Delhi, July 13

The Integrated Child Development Scheme, ICDS, is being completely revamped to address the issue of malnutrition.

Women and Child Development Minister Smti Maneka Gandhi said this today at a conference to review the scheme. She said her Ministry is completely revamping the ICDS as the level of malnutrition in the country continues to be high.

She added that the Ministry is working with NITI Ayog, Ministries of Health and Education and

other stakeholders to deal with the problem.

The Minister informed that the digitization of anganwadis is being taken up. Both hardware and software are being provided for real time monitoring of every child and pregnant and lactating mother.

The meeting was attended by representatives of Women and Child Development departments of 29 states and Union Territories.

Lahiri, Chawrasia, Aditi excited to represent India

Kolkata, July 13

Three leading professional golfers of the country — Anirban Lahiri, S.S.P. Chawrasia and woman golfer Aditi Ashok — were thrilled after qualifying for the Rio Olympics, for which the cut-off date was Monday. "Olympian Anirban Lahiri sounds good, but Olympic medalist Anirban Lahiri would sound way better," said Lahiri, who won a team silver medal in the 2006 Asian Games. Lahiri's good friend Chawrasia was equally excited on getting the rare chance of representing the country at the highest level. "I am excited about having the honour to represent my country at the Olympics. It's a major milestone for me. I am looking forward to teaming up with my good friend Anirban in Rio. My total focus for the next three weeks is to practice and prepare for the Olympics as I want to give it my best shot," said Chawrasia, who was not sure whether he would play the Asian Tour event in Thailand in the last week of this month.



"So happy to make it," tweeted Aditi, a full member of the Ladies European Tour. Current Asia No. 1 Lahiri (world ranking 62) and reigning Indian Open champion Chawrasia (world ranking 207) were placed 20th and 45th respectively in the latest International Golf Federation (IGF) qualification list updated late on Monday. Lahiri, a winner of seven international titles, had a fine 2015 during which he earned two European Tour wins and a tied-fifth place in the prestigious PGA Championship. The 29-year-old Bengaluru-based golfer's

PGA performance was the best by an Indian in a Major till date. Lahiri, who made history by becoming the first Indian to be a part of the International Team at the Presidents Cup, is competing on the PGA Tour this season and was among the top-50 in the world for most part of the year so far and will compete in his ninth successive Major when he tees up at the British Open this week. Chawrasia, who has tasted four international wins including three on the European Tour, notched up a long-awaited Indian Open victory earlier this year to be in contention for the Olympics.

The three-day match will more or less decide the final playing XI for India and both the batsmen and bowlers will look to make their performance count and earn a place when Kumble and Kohli sit down to select the team for the first Test at Antigua starting July 21. India were far from impressive in their last two-day warm-up game as their pace battery struggled with their inconsistent show and it will be the last chance for Kumble's boys to make an impression. Dhawan, whose form in the longer version has been pretty patchy, and Rahul will look for another good show before the team management finalise the opening slot with Murali Vijay being the other contender. Cheteshwar Pujara scored 34 runs in 102 balls before retiring out, while Rohit Sharma too was impressive as he came up with a fluent 54 not out in 109

balls. However, skipper Virat Kohli and Ajinkya Rahane were dismissed cheaply and the duo will look to find their 'A' game as they are an important cog in the India line-up.
