New Delhi, Aug 13

### Don't grant bail if higher courts give pre-arrest relief: SC to trial courts

New Delhi, Aug 13  
The Supreme Court has asked trial courts to immediately discontinue with the practice of granting regular bail in cases that are pending in higher courts. It said that copies of its order be sent to directors of all judicial academies in the country for bringing to the notice

of all judicial officers exercising criminal jurisdiction in their respective states. A bench of justices Ranjan Gogoi and Navin Sinha took note of an incident in which a trial court in Jharkhand had granted regular bail to an accused, who had already managed

# India in a commanding position in Kandy test; forces follow-on on hosts Sri Lanka

Pallekele, Aug 13  
Hardik Pandya smashed his maiden Test century before Chinaman Kuldeep Yadav routed the Sri Lankan middle order, setting India up for a series whitewash on the second day of the third and final match, here. Pandya's aggressive batting powered India to 487 all out after starting the day at 329 for six. The memorable knock was also Pandya's first ever hundred in first class cricket. Pandya's knock, which was embellished with seven powerful sixes, punctured whatever hopes Sri Lanka had to make it a contest after ending the opening day on a high. Kuldeep, who replaced the suspended Ravindra Jadeja in the side, scalped four Lankan batsmen after Mohammed



Shami sent back both the openers to help India bundle out the hosts for a paltry 135. With a massive 352-run lead in hand, Virat Kohli had no hesitation in enforcing the follow-on and inflict more

## Hardik Pandya leaves several records shattered with counter-punching knock

Pallekele, Aug 13  
India all-rounder Hardik Pandya scored a brilliant maiden Test century off just 96 balls to propel the visitors to 487 in their first innings in the third and final Test at Pallekele on Sunday. In his innings of 108 runs, Hardik hit eight boundaries and seven maximums. While doing so, Hardik equaled the record of Virender Sehwag who hit seven sixes against Sri Lanka at Brabourne in 2009. The record is held by Navjot Sidhu who hit eight against the same opposition in Lucknow in 1994. The right-handed batsman became the first Indian batsman to score 26 runs in an over and surpassed the previous record of 24 runs which was scored by Sandeep Patil off Bob Willis in Manchester in 1982 and by Kapil Dev off Eddie Hemmings at Lord's in



1990. Hardik, who scored 107 runs at lunch on Day 2, is the most by an Indian batsman before lunch on any day of a Test. Previously, the record was held by Virender Sehwag who scored 99 runs against West Indies in Gros Islet in 2006. Along with these, Hardik only took 86 balls to reach his century is the second fastest for an Indian player away from home, after the 78-ball hundred by Virender Sehwag against West Indies in Gros Islet in 2006. The 86-ball hundred by Hardik, is also the joint-fastest hundred by a visiting player in Sri Lanka alongside Wasim Akram's 86-ball effort against the hosts in 2000. Hardik's 108 is the third-highest score by any player batting at number eight or below against Sri Lanka and also the second-highest against them in Sri Lanka. Daniel Vettori scored 140 at the SSC in 2009. The previous highest for India was 82 by Irfan Pathan in Ahmedabad in 2005.

## Bolt collapses during his final race



London, Aug 13  
Sprint superstar Usain Bolt ended his illustrious career in agony as he injured himself while running the last lap of the 4x100m relay race at the World Championships in London on Saturday. On Saturday, he had just begun his stint for Jamaica in the men's relay, looking for a final gold medal, when he pulled up in agony and tumbled over onto the track. The muscle injury has put him and his team out of the race. However, host the Great Britain raced on to win gold ahead of the USA team, Bolt was tended where he fell but refused to leave the track in a wheelchair. The official result recorded that the Jamaicans 'Did Not Finish' but Bolt had been absolutely determined to ensure he completed the last race after a matchless career in which he won 19 major championship gold medals. Earlier in the IAAF World Athletic Championships, Bolt was beaten into third place in the men's 100m sprint race.
