## 1 lakh youth to get on job training for 3-5 years in Japan: Minister

New Delhi, Oct 13  
India will send one lakh youths to Japan for on-job training for three to five years as part of the government's skill development programme. In a series of tweets, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship Minister Shri Dharmendra Pradhan said, Japan will bear the financial cost of the skill training of Indian technical interns. The Minister said the Cabinet has approved signing of the Memorandum of Cooperation, MoC

The Government today launched the Sampoorna Bima Gram, SBG, Yojana and an initiative for expansion of clientele base of Postal Life Insurance, PLI. Talking to media after launching the schemes in New Delhi, Communications Minister Shri Manoj Sinha said, all villages under the Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana will be brought under SBG Yojana. Under the Yojana, at least one village with a minimum of 100 households will be identified in every revenue district of the country. Endeavour will be made to cover all households of that identified village with a minimum of one Rural Postal Life Insurance policy each. **New international Test and ODI leagues agreed in principle by ICC members**

Dubai, Oct 13  
The International Cricket Council (ICC) members have agreed in principle for new international Test and ODI leagues, according to an ICC media press release. The Test series league will see nine teams play six series over two years - three home and three away, while the ODI league will be a direct qualification pathway towards the ICC Cricket World Cup and will be contested by the 12 Full Members plus the winners of the current ICC World Cricket League Championship. Nine-team Test league and 13-team ODI league aims to bring context and meaning to bilateral cricket. Talking about the development, ICC Chairman Shashank Manohar said, "I would like to congratulate our Members on reaching this agreement and putting the

interests of the development of the game first. Bringing context to bilateral cricket is not a new challenge, but this is the first time a genuine solution has been agreed on. "This means fans around the world can enjoy international cricket knowing every game counts and in the case of the ODI league, it counts towards qualification to the ICC Cricket World Cup." ICC Chief Executive David Richardson added, "This is a significant point in time for ICC Members and our collective desire to secure a vibrant future for international bilateral cricket. The approval of both leagues is the conclusion of two years of work from the Members who have explored a whole range of options to bring context to every game." "The ICC Board decision today means we can now go and

finalise a playing schedule for the first edition as well as the points system, hosting arrangements and competition terms." The ODI league will be a direct qualification pathway towards the ICC Cricket World Cup and will be contested by the 12 Full Members plus the winners of the current ICC World Cricket League Championship. In the first edition of the league, each side will play four home and four away series each comprising of three ODIs moving to all teams playing each other from the second cycle onwards. The ICC Board approved a trial of four-day Tests matches to run through until the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019. Members will be able to schedule four-day games by bilateral agreement a set of standardised playing conditions will now be finalised.

**Asia Cup Hockey: India tutor Bangladesh to win 7-0 but disappoint on penalty corners**

New Delhi, Oct 13  
India's goals' tally touched 12 in two matches of the 2017 Hockey Asia Cup as the top-ranked team in the continent schooled hosts Bangladesh in Dhaka on Friday to win 7-0 and go through to the Super-4 stage. Gurjant Singh (7th minute), Akashdeep Singh (11th), Lalit Upadhyay (14th), Amit Rohidas (21st) and Ramandeep Singh (46th) scored once each in the goal-fest, while Harmanpreet Singh took his tournament tally to four goals with two strikes - off a penalty stroke in the 27th minute and penalty corner in the 50th. While the scorecard sounds overwhelming, India could have entered double figures but for their poor penalty-corner conversion of 2

out of 13. It even prompted a tweet from former India forward Jagbir Singh. "Come on team@TheHockeyIndia playing well#AsiaCup2017, score some penalty corner variations b'coz in crucial matches these chances will count," he tweeted.

India's only PC conversion came off a variation played between Harmanpreet the flicker and Ramandeep the pusher. After repeatedly getting blocked by the Bangladeshi defence, the Indian team decided to use a variation that worked. India will play Pakistan in their last Pool A match on Sunday at 5:30 pm IST.

**Shakib Al Hasan becomes first Bangladeshi to be inducted in MCC World Cricket Committee**

London, Oct 13  
Premier all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan became the first cricketer from Bangladesh to be inducted in the MCC World Cricket Committee under the chairmanship of Mike Gatting. Also added to the committee are Suzie Bates, Ian Bishop and Kumar Dharmasena.



According to media release uploaded on MCC's website, it states: "As approved at MCC's Annual General Meeting in May, former England and Middlesex captain Mike Gatting is the new chairman of the committee, taking over from another former England captain, Mike Brearley." Gatting, who ended an illustrious playing career in 1998, has spent much of the last decade in cricket administration with the England

& Wales Cricket Board, and also served as MCC President during the 2014 Lord's Bicentenary year. He was previously a member of the World Cricket committee from its inception in 2006 until 2012. Shakib Al Hasan is regarded as one of Bangladesh's finest players since they were awarded the Test status in 2000, with the all-rounder having played 51 Test matches

and 177 One-day Internationals. The 30-year-old also has vast global experience of domestic cricket, particularly in the T20 format. Former West Indies captain Jimmy Adams, and Charlotte Edwards, who led England women to back-to-back Ashes triumphs, have both now relinquished their roles on the committee, having first been appointed in 2012.

**New Zealand players arrive in India for limited overs series Ireland to make Test debut against Pakistan**

Mumbai, Oct 13  
A batch of New Zealand cricketers arrived on Friday for the limited overs tour of India, commencing October 22. Among the players, who arrived, senior batsman Ross Taylor tweeted the news of their arrival. Nine squad members of the Kiwi team had left for India on Thursday while the remaining six members will be picked from the Aside which is playing limited overs matches at Visakhapatnam. New Zealand, take on India in three ODI matches - Mumbai (October 22), Pune (October 25) and Kanpur (October 29), which will be followed by a three-match T20 series. New Zealand will have their first practice session at the CCI, on Saturday morning. Before the series starts, they will play two warm-up games against the Board President's XI, on October 17 and 19 at the CCI.

Auckland, Oct 13  
Ireland will play their first Test against Pakistan at home in May 2018, Cricket Ireland confirmed the news on Thursday. The announcement was made following an agreement between the two boards during the ICC meetings in Auckland this week. Ireland and Afghanistan had become 11th and 12th Full Members of the ICC which granted them Test status in June 2017. Incidentally, Ireland had record their first win against a Test playing nation against Pakistan back in 2007 during the World Cup. Later in 2013, they played out a tie in an ODI in Dublin. Cricket Ireland CEO Warren Deutrom welcomed the development. "We are excited to welcome Pakistan to Ireland for our inaugural Test match next year.
