Govt to go after 'Benami' property: Prime Minister

Panaji, Nov 13
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi says Govt is gearing up to go after Benami property next. He said, people voted in 2014 to free nation from corruption and the govt has taken a key step to defeat menace of black money through demonetization. Prime Minister Shri Modi said that the people of India voted against corruption in 2014 general elections to bring the NDA to power. Addressing the gathering in Goa's capital Panaji after attending the foundation stone laying ceremony of development projects, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said that those who had stashed away black money were not



able to sleep after the demonetisation of large denomination currency notes was announced on 8th November. Prime Minister also said that those who have carried out pseudo property transactions are the next target to unearth black money.

The Prime Minister urged people of the country to support the decision of the government to curb black money. Earlier, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi remotely laid the foundation stone of two projects including international airport in Mopa and Tuem Electronic

City both in North Goa. The Prime Minister also unveiled two plaques for Goa Shipyard Limited. Goa Shipyard has completed phase 3A of the modernization programme as it prepared to indigenously build 12 minesweeper vessels for the Indian Navy.

FM asks RBI to set up special cell to monitor circulation of fake currency

New Delhi, Nov 13
Finance Ministry has asked the Reserve Bank of India to set up a special cell to monitor circulation of fake currency in the country and further advised RBI to monitor the receipt of fake currency notes and inform such instances to the law enforcement and investigative agencies. Finance Ministry said in a statement that the central bank has been asked to

inform such matters to Economic Offence Wing of the State Police, Intelligence/Enforcement Agencies of the Central Government and also to the Ministry. The statement also said that the receipt of fake currency notes in Banks and Post Offices are being monitored very closely and a special watch is being kept on receipt of such fake notes in the States bordering neighbour countries.

EU welcomes India's decision to withdraw high-value bank notes

New Delhi, Nov 13
The European Union, EU has welcomed India's decision to withdraw high-value banknotes as part of its fight to root out black money. Registration for unique ID All NGOs receiving grants from Central Ministries/ Departments urged to register in Niti Ayog's Portal

Port Blair, Nov. 13
An NGO Partnership System (NGO PS) Portal (<http://ngo.india.gov.in/auth/default.php>) has been developed by the NITI Aayog to facilitate the sign-up of VOs/NGOs receiving financial grants under various welfare schemes administered by the Ministries/ Departments of the Central Government. The portal generates a unique ID for the VOs/NGOs on successful sign-up. This unique ID would be used as a mandatory requirement when VOs/NGOs approach the Central Government for Grants. The PAN of VOs/NGOs has been made

mandatory for registration with the portal. It has been decided with the approval of the competent authority that henceforth the processing of all proposals by the various divisions in this Ministry shall be regulated strictly with immediate effect. Accordingly, the grant should be released to only those VOs/NGOs who have registered on the NITI Aayog Portal. In case the VOs/NGOs have not registered on the NITI Aayog Portal, the SO/ASO while processing their grant should first send an e-mail to the VOs/NGOs asking them to register in

the NGO PS Portal and to communicate their registration number pending which grants shall not be released. However, their case may be processed but the sanction order should be issued only after the receipt of the registration details from the organization. The NIC shall place a pop-up on the website "ngograntsje.gov.in" requesting NGOs to provide registration number obtained from the NGO Partnership System (NGO PS) Portal site of NITI Aayog. A mandatory field may also be created in the online portal for processing of grant to VOs/

NGOs for furnishing the registration number obtained from NITI Aayog Portal. Hence, all the NGOs intending to implement Ujjawala Scheme in Andaman & Nicobar Islands have been directed to get their respective organizations registered on **(Contd. on last page)**

Interactive session on 'quality education' held

RBI says currency printing presses are running at full capacity to sustain demand

New Delhi, Nov 13 RBI has said that currency printing presses are running at full capacity to sustain demand for new notes, it asked people to switch to other modes of payment such as debit and credit cards to reduce strain on bank branches. The central bank said in a statement

that adequate stock of all currency notes has been kept ready at more than 4,000 locations across the country, and bank branches are linked to them for sourcing their requirements. It said, to sustain the demand, Printing Presses are printing the currency

notes at full capacity so that adequate quantum of notes is available. The statement further said that the scrapping of 500 and 1,000 rupee notes cast a huge responsibility on the banking system to swiftly withdraw the currency in a smooth and non-disruptive way and to

provide new notes of other denominations. RBI said it also involved recalibrating ATMs for issuance of other legal tender notes and reloading them in a matter of two days and providing the exchange facility, just after a day from the announcement.

India to preside next edition of COP in Geneva in 2018

New Delhi, Nov 13 India will preside the eighth edition of the Conference of Parties (COP) to WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC) which will be held in Switzerland's Geneva in 2018.

A senior official said, Health Secretary CK Mishra has

been chosen as the President of the COP Bureau, for the next two years, after a unanimous decision by the COP7 Plenary session yesterday. The World Health Organisations Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC) is the world's biggest convention

to frame the anti-tobacco policies. COP Bureau is the main administrative body of WHO FCTC that decides on strategies on how to implement the decisions taken in the COP session, which happens every two years. It also monitors implementation by the

party countries. According to FCTC website, the COP elects at each regular session its President as well as five vice-presidents. These officers, each representing a WHO region, constitute the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties.

Water detected on metallic asteroid Psyche

New Delhi, Nov 13 Scientists have detected the presence of water on Psyche, the largest metallic asteroid in our solar system and the target of a proposed NASA mission. Previous observations of Psyche had shown no evidence of water-rich minerals on its surface. However, the new observations from

the NASA Infrared Telescope Facility in Hawaii show evidence of water or hydroxyl on its surface. While the source of these molecules on Psyche remains a mystery, scientists propose a few possible mechanisms for its formation. The study was published in the Astronomical journal.
