Capacity building workshop for disaster management functionaries held LG calls for channelizing strategies in management of disaster in Isles

Port Blair, Dec. 13

With a view to create disaster awareness amongst the stakeholders, so that they can respond to any disaster, the Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration, in coordination with Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS), Hyderabad organized a day long workshop for capacity building of all Disaster Management Functionaries of this Union Territory. The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Admiral DK Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) inaugurated the workshop as the chief guest by lighting the traditional oil lamp in the conference hall of Megapode Resort here this morning. The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar, DGP, Smti Nuzhat Hassan, Principal Secretary (DM&RR), Shri SCL Das, Head, Tsunami Warning Center (INCOIS), Shri E. Pattabhi, stakeholders from various Departments, Senior Officers of the Administration and Scientists from INCOIS, Hyderabad were present on this occasion.

Addressing the gathering, the Lt. Governor expressed happiness on the conduct of such an important workshop for capacity building of disaster management functionaries of A&N Islands. Mentioning about the topography of A&N Islands, the Lt. Governor said, as the Islands are located at the confluence of two trenches and three tectonic plates, we are living in a very vulnerable location, particularly the Southern group of Islands; and hence, we must take a



serious view on disaster management and capacity building to deal with any eventuality. He said, the interplay of these three tectonic plates can give rise to unpredictable disaster, hence we must be well prepared. Though the lessons learnt from the devastating Tsunami of 2004 has led to deliberations on disaster management through participation in international workshops and conferences, yet there is a need for identifying the

areas where more preparations are needed, said the Lt. Governor. "We cannot prevent disaster from occurring, but its management is very important. Hence, our strategies have to be channelized in management of disaster by strengthening the capacity building of all stakeholders, minimizing the impact on life

and property besides several other components", he said. The 2004 Tsunami has led to various deliberations and this has provided us with regulatory framework and special emphasis has been laid on disaster preparedness and mitigation. As part of the efforts for better disaster preparedness and management, six Emergency Operation Centres have been established one each at Port Blair, Mayabunder, Hutbay, Car Nicobar, Kamorta and Campbell Bay, which are functional 24 x 7, monitoring, analyzing and timely disseminating information for all types of disaster

Govt keeps window open on PAN, Aadhaar for financial dealings



New Delhi, Dec 13

The Government has amended rules requiring the mandatory quoting of Aadhaar and PAN for certain financial transactions like the opening of a bank account by keeping the deadline

open-ended in place of the current 31st December. A new rule modifying the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) 2002 has been notified to replace the requirement of submitting the Aadhaar number and Permanent

Account Number by 31st December, 2017 with the Aadhaar number, and Permanent Account Number or Form No. 60 by the date to be notified by the Central Government. The notification by the Department of Revenue in the Finance Ministry effectively paves the way for extending the deadline for mandatory quoting of Aadhaar for activities like the opening of a bank account. called an all party meeting tomorrow evening to discuss smooth functioning of the House. Winter Session of Parliament will begin on Friday. 25 bills have been listed for consideration and passing, while, 14 bills are listed for introduction, consideration and passing.

Indian economy likely to grow by 7.2% in 2018 & 7.4% in 2019: UN report

New Delhi, Dec 13

Indian economy is likely to grow by 7.2 per cent in 2018 and go up further to 7.4 per cent in the following year on the back of strong private consumption, public investment and the ongoing structural reforms, says a UN report. The 'World Economic Situation and Prospects 2018' report unveiled last night by United Nations Department of Economic

and Social Affairs (UN DESA) said overall, economic outlook for South Asia is seen largely favourable and steady for the short term, notwithstanding significant medium-term challenges. On India, the report has projected a positive outlook despite the slowdown early this year. The UN DESA report said the GDP growth is projected to accelerate

from 6.7 per cent in 2017 to 7.2 per cent in 2018 and 7.4 per cent in 2019. Prof. NR Bhanumurthy of National Institute of Public Finance and Policy told reporters while presenting the report in New Delhi that though the credit growth is subdued despite monetary easing, but bank recapitalisation and the Indian Bankruptcy Code (IBC) have the potential to revive credit growth.

Rohit Sharma scores 208*, first batsman to hit three ODI double hundreds

Mohali, Dec 13
Rohit Sharma hit his third double hundred in ODI cricket as he scored unbeaten 208 runs in the second ODI against Sri Lanka in Mohali. Opening the batting, Rohit took 153 balls to reach his double century and hit 13 fours and 12 sixes in the inning. He is the only cricketer to score three double centuries in ODIs and two of them have come against the same opponent — Sri Lanka. He had scored 264 runs against Sri Lanka in Kolkata in 2014. The opener's feat helped India reach 392 for 4 in 50 overs. Sharma ended his innings on an unbeaten 208, thereby becoming the first captain to score a double ton in the history of cricket. The 300-plus total on Wednesday was India's 100th in ODIs, the first team to reach the feat.

The Mumbai right-hander, who began his innings cautiously, accelerated the innings in a brilliant fashion. He scored his 50 off 65 balls and scored his

'Gaylestorm' hits Dhaka: Chris Gayle smashes record 18 sixes in BPL match

Dhaka, Dec 13
Explosive Caribbean Chris Gayle smashed 18 sixes in the title clash of Bangladesh Premier League on Tuesday. In the process, he broke close to half a dozen batting records. Known for his unconventionally aggressive batting style, Gayle - a member of Rangpur Riders in BPL - hit 146 off 69 balls with a record number of 18 sixes. The previous record for the maximum number of sixes in a T20 match was also held by Gayle, when he had smashed 17 sixes for Royal Challengers Bangalore against Pune Warriors during Indian Premier League 2013. On Tuesday



night, Gayle lit up the Dhaka night sky with an innings that helped his team set a target of 207. En route, Gayle - who had a lightning strike rate of 211.59 in the innings - became the first to register 20 T20 centuries. He

also crossed 11,000-run milestone in T20 cricket. Rangpur Riders' 206/1 is the highest score in a T20 final. They won the match by 57 runs, and got hold of their first BPL title.

linking PAN with Aadhaar was extended by three months to 31st of March next year.

Under the PMLA, Aadhaar, PAN and other official documents are required to be obtained by banks and financial institutions from anyone opening a bank account as well as for any financial transaction of 50 thousand rupees and above.

The notification issued yesterday stated that accounts, where Aadhaar and PAN are not furnished by the date notified by the government, will cease to be operational till the time the Aadhaar number and Permanent Account Number is submitted by the client.

The PMLA and its rules impose an obligation on reporting entities like banks, financial institutions and intermediaries to verify the identity of clients, maintain records and furnish information to the Financial Intelligence Unit of India.

India hammer Sri Lanka by 141 runs to level series

Mohali, Dec 13

A classy record double ton by stand-in skipper Rohit Sharma followed with some fine bowling helped India beat Sri Lanka by 141 runs in a must-win second ODI of the three-match series at the PCA Stadium in Mohali on Wednesday. The series, leveled at 1-1, will now be decided in the third and final ODI at Visakhapatnam on Sunday. Chasing a mammoth 393, Sri Lanka could all score 251/8 as they lost wickets at regular intervals. Sri Lanka had a dismal start to their chase as they lost both the openers Upul Tharanga and Danushka Gunathilaka at the score of 30. The lone fight came from the bat of seasoned Angelo Mathews (111*), who scored his second ODI century off 122 balls with the help of nine fours and two sixes, but that was not enough at the end as no Lankan player gave him the required support he needed in the middle. For India, leggie Yuzvendra Chahal returned

figures of 3/60 while paceman Jasprit Bumrah picked up 2/43 in his quota of 10 overs. Earlier, Rohit Sharma smashed his third double hundred in one-day internationals to fire India to a mammoth 392 for four. Such was the pace of Rohit's unbeaten 153-ball 208-run innings that after completing his

100 off 115 balls, he blasted his next 100 off just 36 balls. A host of records were broken on the day that saw Rohit reach his 16th ODI hundred en route to a double hundred. His last double hundred also came against Sri Lanka while the first one was recorded against Australia.

Sports Minister approves 5L aid for boxer who fought Ali

Chandigarh, Dec 13

The Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports has approved Rs 5 lakh aid from the National Welfare Fund for Sports persons for Indian boxing icon, 69-year-old Kaur Singh, who was struggling to repay Rs 2 lakh he had borrowed from a private financier to fund his treatment for cardiac problems. In a tweet, Sports Minister Col. Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore stated that the Ministry is privileged to approve 5 lakh for Singh's immediate use from

the National Welfare Fund for Sports persons.

Singh was the only boxer in India to have entered the ring against boxing legend Muhammad Ali and gave him a tough fight during an exhibition match in New Delhi in 1980. He won gold in Asian Games in 1982, got the Arjuna Award in 1982 and the Padmashri in 1983. He hung up his gloves after representing India in the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics where he won two consecutive bouts.

mitigation, informed the Lt. Governor. A State Control Room in Port Blair and District Control Rooms in all the three Districts have been set up, he said.

The Lt. Governor also informed that in addition to these, an Early Warning & Communication System has also been set up, which is linked up with four VSATs of Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services, Ministry of Home Affairs, Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited and National Disaster Management Authority. VHF connectivity of State Control Room with the network of all other major stakeholders has been established, he said, adding that this has enabled us to establish network with four major channels in carrying out real time communication and sharing of data on timely basis.

The Lt. Governor further stated that there is a need to harness technology in order to get early warnings and prevent loss of time. He expressed happiness that a number of other steps have also been initiated to strengthen the disaster management and preparedness in the Islands to improve the Tsunami Early Warning System by setting up permanent GPS Observatories across the Islands which will record the activity of different parameters round the clock and uplink it through satellites. This, he said, will trigger immediate warning alert of any disaster in the Islands.

The Lt. Governor further stated that PRIs and other citizens in the Islands have been actively participating in the disaster management and response efforts. In addition to this, the Disaster Management Department has also integrated students and teachers of various schools and colleges across the Islands to volunteer during Disaster management/preparedness exercises, which would further require exposure training and workshops like this to understand the process of disaster preparedness and mitigation in the most efficient manner.

In his key note address, the Chief Secretary, Shri Anindo Majumdar said, the workshop is a part of the ongoing efforts of the Administration for capacity building of all stakeholders and has been organized after the recent visit to INCOIS wherein representatives from A&N Administration were informed about the measures taken by INCOIS and steps that need to be taken by the Administration in Disaster preparedness and capacity building. The Chief Secretary remarked that since we are situated in a vulnerable location, we must be better prepared by involving various stakeholders besides the rural communities in Disaster Management. He also informed about the visit of the representative of A&N Islands to Japan for a 40 day course on disaster management and preparedness. The representatives have carried back very important information which needs to be incorporated in disaster management in Isles viz. involvement of stakeholders, people likely to be affected etc.; while incorporating strong traditional knowledge along with systematic and scientific knowledge is also important, he said. The Chief Secretary also highlighted the roles of first responders and other stakeholders who need to work in close coordination during disaster and also post disaster. The need to assess vulnerability of the location, population, rehabilitation post disaster, has to be mainstreamed into all plans, especially building plans, said the Chief Secretary adding that disaster reduction needs to be addressed with great urgency. The Chief Secretary said, this workshop will certainly enrich the officers and stakeholders to deal with any disaster in the most efficient manner and should be a continuous process.

Welcoming the gathering, the Principal Secretary (DM&RR), Shri SCL Das said, this workshop is a sequel to the visit of the Chief Secretary and Director, Disaster Management to INCOIS recently. The Principal Secretary also lauded INCOIS for being a great partner for A&N Administration in Disaster Management by giving valuable suggestions and guidance in terms of infrastructure development, disaster preparedness and warnings. He said, multi agency efforts and participation is required for disaster management. He also expressed hope that the workshop would yield beneficial outputs for all stakeholders which will be disseminated to all the Departments; which in turn, will be carried to the public at large. He further said that Disaster Management in India has not been traditionally mainstreamed; it is a relatively recent phenomenon. He said, during the last 12 years, lot of learning, capacity addition have taken place and A&N Islands have been one of the active entities in terms of participation, capacity building. However, he said, there are areas where more works need to be done viz. disaster reduction and prevention.

Speaking on the occasion, the Director, Disaster Management, Shri Govind Ram said, in hospitality nature is most beautiful and lovely but in hostility the very same nature is most brutal and ugly. It is pertinent to make our disaster management preparedness foolproof so that we become disaster resilient, he said.

A video presentation by INCOIS on Indian Ocean Tsunami Mock 2016 was screened on the occasion followed by presentation on Indian Tsunami Early Warning System (components, Standard Operation Procedure (SOP), bulletins and dissemination) and presentation on end to end Tsunami Warning (Stakeholders, roles & responsibilities, SOP, guidelines and linkage).

Later, a technical session was held in which experts from various Departments spoke on topics related to Standard Operating Procedures and roles of State Control Room, role of ANC, NDRF, Police, Health Department, District Administrations of South Andaman, N&M Andaman and Nicobar District. This was followed by suggestions/modifications for Mock Tsunami Drill by stakeholders.

A tabletop exercise was also presented by INCOIS on the occasion. The workshop concluded with the summing up of the deliberations by the Director, Disaster Management, Shri Govind Ram.
