PM interacts with Google CEO

Indians are adjusting to and adopting technology at a rapid pace: PM

PM briefed on Google's large investment plans in India

New Delhi, July 13 (PIB) Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi interacted with Google CEO, Shri Sundar Pichai via video conferencing earlier today. Shri Pichai briefed the Prime Minister about the efforts undertaken by Google to help spread awareness and provide reliable information about COVID-19. He said that the strong step of Lockdown initiated by the Prime Minister set up a very strong foundation of India's battle against the pandemic. Prime Minister appreciated the proactive role played by Google in battling misinformation and conveying information about necessary precautions. He also



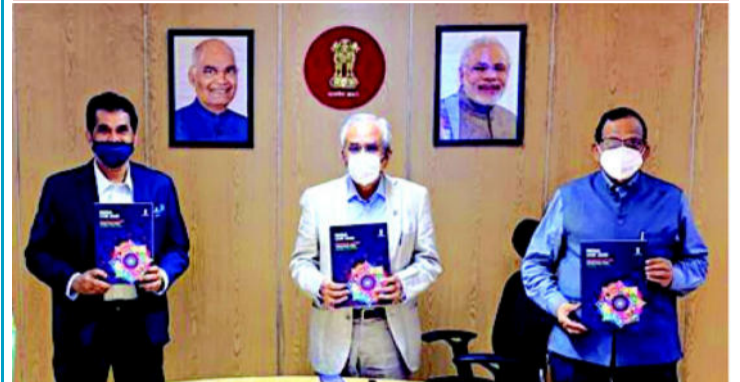
talked about further leveraging technology in providing healthcare services. Prime Minister said that Indians are adjusting to and adopting technology at a rapid pace. He talked about farmers benefiting from technology and the possible wide-ranging benefits of AI in agriculture. Prime

Minister explored the idea of virtual labs that can be used by students as well as farmers. Sundar Pichai briefed the PM about new products and initiatives by Google in the country. He mentioned about the launch of AI Research Lab in Bengaluru, while also highlighting the benefits of Google's flood forecasting efforts.

Prime Minister was briefed about Google's plan to launch a large investment fund and develop strategic partnerships in India. Prime Minister remarked that India is amongst the most open economies in the world. He also spoke about recent steps taken by the government towards reforming agriculture

and about the campaign to create new jobs, while also highlighting the importance of re-skilling. Prime Minister discussed the issue of data security and concerns around privacy. He said that tech companies need to put in efforts to bridge the trust deficit. He also talked about cyber crimes and threats in the form of cyber attacks. Other areas of discussion included technological solutions to expand the scope of online education, access to technology in native language, use of AR/VR to give a stadium-like viewing experience in the field of sports, and progress in the area of digital payments.

New Delhi, July 13 (PIB) NITI Aayog presented India's second Voluntary National Review (VNR) at the United Nations High-Level Political Forum (HLPF) on Sustainable Development, 2020. The HLPF is the foremost international platform for follow-up and review of progress on the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Dr. Rajiv Kumar, Vice Chairman, NITI Aayog, presented

the VNR. The India VNR 2020 report titled 'Decade of Action: Taking SDGs from Global to Local' was released by Dr. Rajiv Kumar, Vice Chairman, NITI Aayog, Dr. V.K Paul, Member, NITI Aayog, Shri Amitabh Kant, CEO, NITI Aayog, and Smt. Sanyukta Samaddar, Adviser (SDGs), NITI Aayog. At the HLPF this year, which is being hosted virtually in the aftermath of the

COVID-19 pandemic, 47 Member States are set to present their VNRs between 10th-16th July 2020. The HLPF meets annually in July for eight days under the auspices of the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) of the UN. New Delhi, July 13 (PIB) COVID-19 has changed the world but Indian people, businesses and industries did not succumb to the crisis, and stood out with a unique trait of resilience and constantly evolving the new ways to deal with the situation and turning the crisis into opportunity, said Union Minister for Commerce and Industry & Railways, Shri Piyush Goyal in New Delhi today. Shri Goyal was delivering the keynote address at the 184th AGM of Bombay Chamber of Commerce & Industry via video conferencing with the office bearers and members of one of oldest chambers of the country.



Speaking on the occasion, Shri Goyal acknowledged the role of industries and trade bodies of India for coming forward to make India self-sufficient and ready to fight COVID situation in India by producing PPEs, providing infrastructure for ICU beds, isolation facilities and manufacturing masks and other PPEs to the level that India is now capable to export PPEs. As the Unlock has started, Indian economy

is improving, as indicated by fright movement, increased electricity consumption. Manufacturing has started with reasonable level of operation. The exports are showing upward trend. He added that before COVID and after COVID worlds will be different and we are preparing moving for the better post-COVID world. As a country, Shri

Goyal added that, India should focus on Investment, Infrastructure, and Innovation in the post-COVID world, by increasing the production, improving quality of products, trying higher economies of scale, smooth logistics channels, competitive pricing and using innovative practices. The Government and trade bodies must work together to boost the growth, to bringing more employment, jobs to youth and engaging with the world with strength and not closing the door for the world but being self-sufficient "Aatma Nirbhar Bharat".

CBSE announces result of Class 12th examination

Overall pass percentage stood at 88.78; girls outshine boys

New Delhi, July 13 (PIB) The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) declared Class XII results today. Trivandrum performed best amongst all regions with 97.67% pass percentage followed by Bengaluru region with 97.05 % while Chennai stands at third position with 96.17% pass percentage. Total 11, 92,961 students appeared in the exam out of which 10, 59,080 students passed the exam. Overall pass percentage of this year is 88.78% which is 5.38 % higher than previous year.



The CBSE Class XII Board Examinations were scheduled to be conducted from 15.02.2020 till 30.03.2020. Due to spread of COVID-19 pandemic, CBSE was forced to cancel examinations scheduled from 19.03.2020 to 30.03.2020 in 12 subjects along with examinations in 11 subjects for students of North-Eastern Delhi. These exams were re-scheduled to be held from 01 to 15 July 2020. Looking at the uncertainties and unprecedented situation and keeping in mind the health and well-being of students, the Supreme Court of India passed orders on 26.06.2020, approving the assessment scheme of CBSE to compute results on the following criteria:

ASSESSMENT SCHEME

- For the students of both classes X and XII, who have completed all their examinations, their results declared based on their performance in the examinations.
- For students who have appeared in the examinations in more than 3 subjects, the average of the marks obtained in best three performing subjects have been awarded in the subjects whose examinations have not been conducted.
- For students who have appeared in the examinations in only 3 subjects, the average of the marks obtained in the best two performing subjects have been awarded in the subjects whose examinations have not been conducted.

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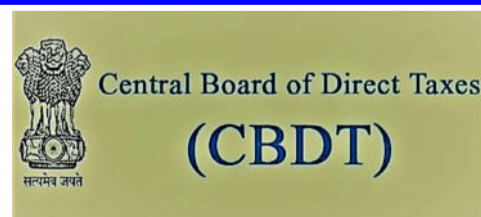

New Delhi, July 13 (PIB) The Income Tax Department has facilitated a new functionality for Banks and Post Offices through which they can ascertain the TDS applicability rates on cash withdrawal of above Rs.20 lakh in case of a non-filer of the income-tax return and

Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports to hold 2-day video conference with Sports and Youth Affairs Ministers of all States/ UTs

New Delhi, July 13 (PIB)

Union Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports, Shri Kiren Rijiju will be meeting Sports and Youth Affairs Ministers of all States and Union Territories in a two-day video conference on July 14 and July 15, to chart out the roadmap for grassroots-level sports development as well as the activities of Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS) and National Service Scheme (NSS), across the country.

Speaking about the decision to hold this meeting, Shri Rijiju said, "The country is in the second phase of unlock now and it is important to have a dialogue with the states to align the way

forward for sports and youth related activities. During the lockdown both the Sports and Youth Affairs Departments have been active and continued to pursue the larger goals that have been set. Despite closure of on-field training, online training athletes of all levels as well as for coaches, so that athletes and coaches could remain close to the sport. Similarly, our NYKS and NSS volunteers have worked relentlessly alongside District Administration to help in the fight against COVID 19. About 75 lakh volunteers have been involved in creating awareness about safety

and health guidelines, distribution of masks, helping the elderly among many other things. We want to assess the impact of all these activities and also plan the way forward, in collaboration with the States."

The agenda of the meeting includes review of action taken during COVID 19, as well as discussions on restarting sporting activities at the state-level and identification of budding sports talent through competitions at block and district levels in States and UTs. Inclusion of fitness and sports as part of the curriculum in all schools across the country will also be discussed.

2030 Agenda and the SDGs. The reviews are voluntary and state-led and are aimed at facilitating the sharing of experiences, including successes, challenges and lessons learned. The process of preparation of a country's VNR provides a platform for partnerships, including through the participation of various relevant stakeholders. NITI Aayog prepared and presented India's first VNR in 2017.

India presented its VNR along with other second time presenters like Bangladesh, Georgia, Kenya, Morocco, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria and Uganda. The presentation also included a short film which encapsulated the processual aspects of the second VNR and captured some of India's major progress areas on the SDGs.

In his opening remarks, Dr. Rajiv Kumar expressed his solidarity with all the countries which were grappling with challenges brought about by the pandemic, while highlighting the key features of India's response to the pandemic under the AtmaNirbhar Bharat campaign. "We should all obliterate all divisions and distinctions amongst us and come together to try and convert the prevailing situation into an opportunity for accelerating our progress towards achieving the SDG targets", said the Vice Chairman in his statement.

solution.

Explaining the details of this facility, CDBT said that now the Bank/Post Office has to only enter the PAN of the person who is withdrawing cash for ascertaining the applicable rate of TDS. On entering PAN, a message will be instantly displayed on the departmental utility: "TDS is deductible at the rate of 2% if cash withdrawal exceeds Rs. 1 crore" [if the person withdrawing cash is a filer of the income-tax return] and "TDS is deductible at the rate 2% if cash withdrawal exceeds Rs. 20 lakh and at the rate of 5% if it exceeds Rs. 1 Crore" [if the person withdrawing cash is a non-filer of the income-tax return]. CDBT said that the data on cash withdrawal indicated that huge amount of cash is being withdrawn by the persons who have never filed income-tax returns. To ensure filing of return by these persons and to keep track on cash withdrawals by the non-filers, and to curb black money, the Finance Act, 2020 w.e.f. 1st July, 2020 further amended Income-tax Act to lower threshold of cash withdrawal to Rs. 20 lakh for the applicability of this TDS for the non-filers and also mandated TDS at the higher rate of 5% on cash withdrawal exceeding Rs. 1 crore by the non-filers.

d. There are very few students of class-XII, mainly from Delhi, who have appeared in the examinations in only 1 or 2 subjects. Their results have been declared based on performance in the appeared subjects and performance in internal/practical/projects assessment. These students will also be allowed to appear in the optional examinations conducted by CBSE to improve their performance, if they desire to do so. Result of these students will also be declared along with other students. CHANCE FOR OPTIONAL EXAMINATION

> CBSE will conduct an optional examination in the subjects whose examinations were scheduled to be conducted from 01st July to 15th July 2020 as soon as conditions are conducive as assessed and decided by the Central Government.

> Candidates whose results have been declared based on the assessment scheme will be allowed to appear in these optional examinations to improve their performance, if they wish so. Marks obtained by a candidate in these optional examinations will be treated as final for those who had opted to take these examinations.

> However, even based on above criteria, the results of 400 students could not be computed and hence, their results could not be announced today.

CONDUCT OF OPTIONAL EXAMINATIONS

The schedule for taking options from the students who are eligible and the dates of the optional examinations will be announced subsequently in consultation with the Government of India.

CONDUCT OF COMPARTMENT EXAMINATION

CBSE will announce the schedule of these examinations subsequently in consultation with the Government of India.

The terms and conditions of the e-auction are given below :-

1. Each prospective bidder shall be required to deposit an earnest money, which shall be 10% of the Minimum Reserve Price for the quarry areas with the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman before participating in the e-auction (drawn in favour of Assistant Commissioner, Settlement).

(a) The Minimum Reserve Price has been fixed as **Rs.23.50 Lakhs** for **explosive** quarry for quarry block of 0.25 hectares for one year.

(b) The earnest money should reach to the Cashier, Office of the Assistant Commissioner, Settlement on or before **28th July, 2020 up to 05.00pm**.

2. The EMD should be in the form of A/c Payee Demand Draft, FDR, Bankers Cheque or Bank Guarantee from any of the commercial banks drawn in favour of the Assistant Commissioner, Settlement and should be uploaded in <http://eauction.gov.in>. No prospective bidder shall be allowed to participate in the e-auction process, if the EMD is not deposited within the stipulated time in the office.

3. The earnest money deposited, except in case of declared highest bidder, shall be refunded to other bidders after the completion of the e-auction unless forfeited by the Deputy Commissioner/ Presiding Officer, for reasons to be recorded in writing. In case of the declared highest bidder, however, the earnest money will be adjusted against the highest bid amount to be deposited within the period specified in the award letter i.e. before execution of lease deed. In the event of failure to do so, the earnest money and the security amount shall be forfeited and the quarry area shall be assigned to the next highest bidder at declared highest bid.

4. Any quarry areas can be withdrawn from the e-auction without assigning any reason thereof.

5. Only one quarry lease shall be permitted to a successful bidder in the District.

6. No sub-lease of the quarry shall be permitted.

7. No bid which is below the minimum reserve price fixed for the quarry area shall be accepted.

8. The period of lease shall be only for **one year** from the date of executing the lease deed.

9. The successful bidder should adhere to the guidelines laid down by the Committee headed by the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman, members from Pollution Control Committee, DHS, APWD and PCCF in respect of environmental aspects. Copy of the guidelines annexed herewith.

10. No person shall be entitled to participate in the e-auction unless he furnishes:

a. An affidavit sworn before any Magistrate to the effect that no amount of contract money, royalty or dead rent in respect of any quarry lease/permit held by him earlier, is outstanding against him/her.

NOTE: The above documents are to be submitted along with the EMD.

11. The prospective bidder shall produce proof of submission of EMD and the documents as above at the e-auction site (<http://eauction.gov.in>) prior to commencement of e-auction process. He/She shall upload identity proof to establish his/her identity in the e-auction site (<http://eauction.gov.in>) failing which he/she shall not be allowed to take part in the e-auction.

12. The Deputy Commissioner(SA) may direct the bidders at the end of e-auction to produce the amount considered reasonable by him or a bank instrument of such amount in case he feels that the amount of bid has gone unreasonably high and there is a possibility of the bidders trying to skip away or refuse to deposit the due bid amount as per terms and conditions of the e-auction notice.

13. The highest bid received in the e-auction shall become a successful bid only after the approval of the Competent Authority.

14. The Successful bidder shall be liable to deposit 25% of his bid amount as security of the highest bid with the Deputy Commissioner(SA) at the end of e-auction in the form of A/c Payee Demand Draft, Bankers Cheque from any of the commercial banks drawn in favour of Assistant Commissioner, Settlement failing which the earnest money deposited by the successful bidders for participating in the e-auction shall be forfeited.

15. The lessee shall pay 10% of the bid amount as performance security in the form of A/c Payee Demand Draft, FDR, Bankers Cheque or Bank Guarantee from any of the commercial banks, which shall remain valid for a period of 60 days beyond the expiry of the lease deed and subject to compliance of other terms and conditions of the lease deed/quarry plan, which shall be released after the expiry of lease deed.

16. The prospective bidder shall have minimum level of experience, past performance, technical capability, manufacturing facilities and financial position.

17. The lessee shall pay residual bid amount before executing the lessee deed.

18. The lease holder shall be liable to pay advance income tax as per provisions of section 206(c) of income tax act in addition to bid amount, payable as per terms and condition of contract agreement.

19. The lease holder shall be liable to pay the rent for the quarry area, royalty or deed rent (as the case may be) as notified from time to time.

20. The lease holder shall undertake the quarrying in the quarry area in terms of the quarry plan notified and in accordance with the responsibilities as laid down under Rule 13 of the A & N Islands Minor Minerals Rules, 2012.

21. No lease holder shall be entitled to raise any dispute with the reference to the survey and demarcation of the quarry permitted out to him after execution of the quarry lease deed.

22. The lease holder shall be permitted to extract maximum of **12,000 cbm** of minor mineral per annum from the Quarry area leased out to him and he is expected to satisfy himself of the availability of minor mineral to this extent prior to participating in the e-auction. It is reiterated that it is for the prospective bidders to do the estimation with regard to the potential of quarry site prior to the bidding which shall be the sole responsibility of prospective bidders.

23. **Site inspection may be carried out** by the prospective bidders for physical verification of the site of his interest. The quarry sites as shown in the annexure are easily identifiable on the field. However, assistance may be obtained from the district office, if required.

24. **NO quarrying shall be permitted in a depression or below mean sea level.**

25. **Quarrying operation should not involve destruction of any tree and also should not violate other prohibited areas norms.**

26. That the lease holder shall abide by the provisions of the Mines and Minerals (Regulation and development) Act, 1957, A & N Islands Minor Minerals Rules, 2012 and the Rules and Regulations regarding Employment and Conditions of Service as for the time being in force and also the provisions of other labour laws as are applicable to the workmen engaged in the quarries and any other relevant laws for the time being in force.

27. **In case of any tree/ plantation is removed during quarrying activity**, the lease holder will plant a minimum of twice the number of such plants, which will be in addition to the plantation to be done otherwise as per quarry plan. Before removal of any tree permission of competent authority shall be obtained.

28. **Over burden** and other waste if any, should be dumped at identified sites using proper techniques and precautions. Dumps the stabilised suitably by formation of retaining wall/ check dams at outer periphery of dumping sites followed by plantation. Inactive dumps should be covered under the plantation wherever required as proposed under quarry plan. Garland drain should be constructed around the waste dump site inside area to prevent run off from the waste dump to arrest siltation.

29. Regular sprinkling of water be carried out to ensure that the suspended particulate matter level does not exceed the ambient air quality standards, within the entire quarry leased area and the pathways leading to quarry area.

30. Sampling Of ambient air quality in the core zone for suspended particulate matter, respirable particulate matter sulphur dioxide, oxides of nitrogen should be carried out once in every six months in the consultation with the pollution control committee, Port Blair.

31. The overall noise level in and around the quarry area will be kept well within prescribed limits of noise emissions as per Environment Protection Act, 1986 and rules framed there under.

32. That the lease holder shall carry out quarrying in accordance with all other provisions applicable for undertaking quarrying including the provisions of Forest(Conservation) Act,1980 and Environment(Protection) Act,1986 and the rules made there under.

33. The Environment Clearance shall be obtained from the competent authority before the commencement of the quarrying operation by the lease holder and the lease holder shall comply/abide with any additional terms/conditions if any stipulated at time of consideration of case of Environmental Clearance and all environmental concerns and the safety of the workers are to be addressed by the lease holders.

34. Apart from above, the provisions of Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules and regulation under Public liability insurance act, 1991 shall also be enforced.

35. That the lease holder shall without delay send a report of any accident, causing loss of life or serious bodily injuries or endangering life or property which may at any time occur at or in the said land during the course of operations undertaken under the lease, to the Tehsildar concerned and the deputy commissioner.

36. That the lease holder shall submit returns and maintain requisite register and memorandums as prescribed under the A & N Islands Minor Minerals Rules, 2012.

37. That on expiry or premature termination of the lease, the quarried materials, lying on the land from which they are extracted, shall become the absolute property of the administration.

38. Force Majeure means such of the following factors which substantially affect the performance of the agreement, such as: natural phenomena, including but not limited to floods, draughts, earthquakes, Cyclones and Epidemics; acts of any Government, domestic or foreign, including but not limited to war, declared or undeclared, quarantines, embargoes. Either party shall within fifteen (15) days from the occurrence of such a cause notify the other in writing of such causes.

39. The Lessee or the Deputy Commissioner(South Andaman) shall not be liable for delays in performing their obligations resulting from any Force Majeure cause as referred to and/or defined above.

40. However if such an event lasts for a period of 90 days or more then either party shall have an option to terminate this Agreement forthwith without any liability after intimating the other party of the same and such event shall be governed by Rule 46 of ANIMMR, 2012.

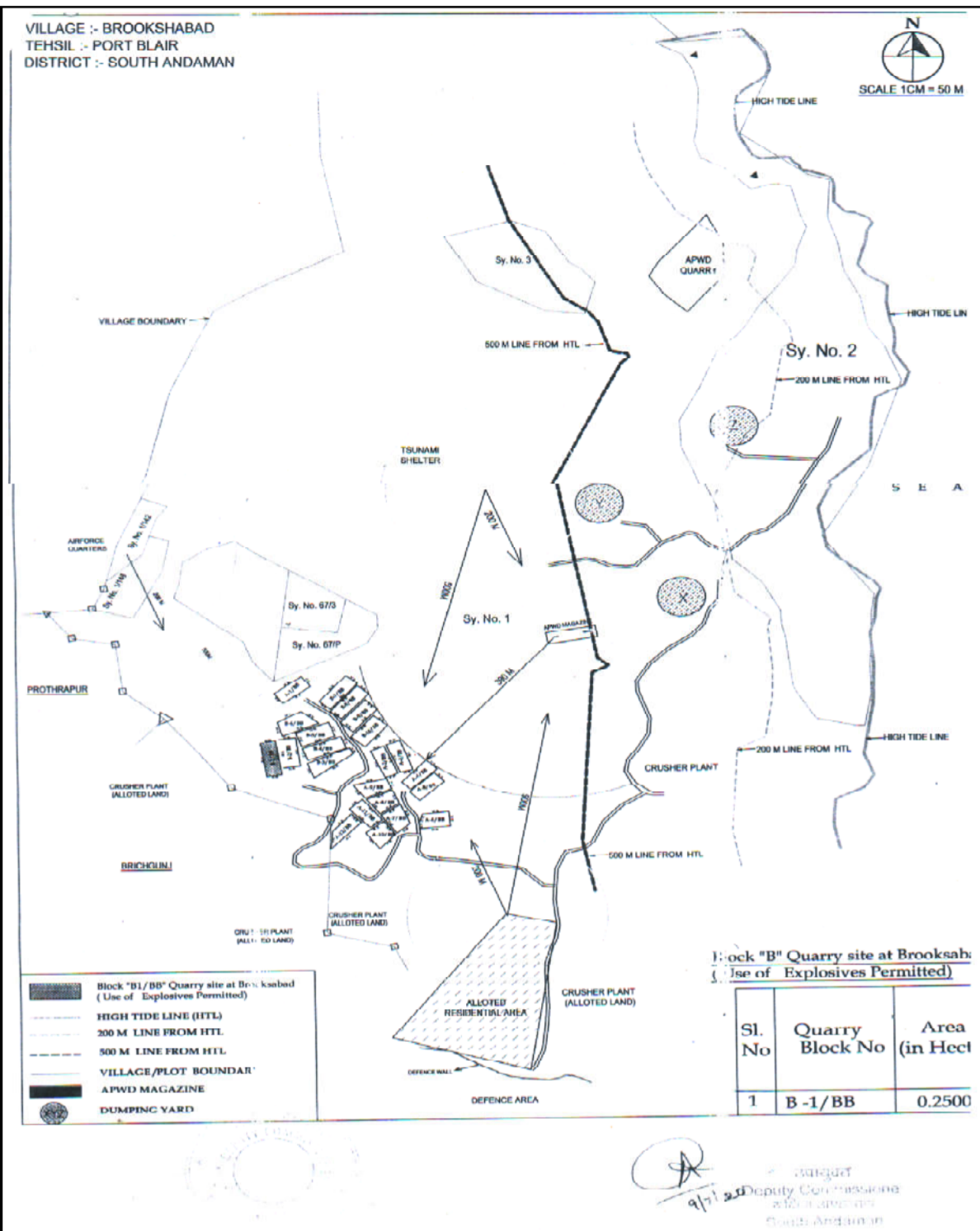

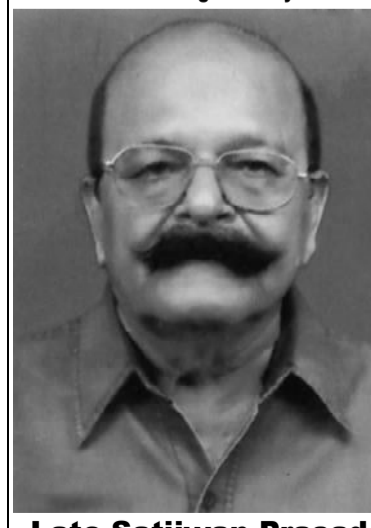
