PM Modi to review employment creation scenario in country

New Delhi, Jun 14

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will review of employment scenario in the country on Sunday and will take a stock of data collection on jobs.

The meeting comes at a time when top policy-makers feel there is a lack of credible and timely job data that makes it difficult to assess job creation.

Vice Chairman of NITI Aayog Shri Arvind Panagariya had said that India will soon have new job data that should be able to help policy-makers get a better sense of the employment scenario.

Shri Panagariya is heading a task force set up by the government to assess the creation of jobs based on credible data and the panel has been mandated to formulate a methodology for timely and reliable statistics.

DRDO successfully test fires 'Nag' missile



Jaipur, Jun 14

The Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) on Tuesday successfully test fired anti-tank missile 'Nag' in a desert in the western sector of Rajasthan. "The missile successfully destroyed the target in today's mission," defence sources said. The "fire and forget" third generation anti-tank guided missile 'Nag' is equipped with the highly advanced Imaging Infrared

Radar (IRR) seeker with integrated avionics, technology which is possessed by very few nations, sources said.

The tests, which were witnessed by scientists from the DRDO, Defence Lab, Jodhpur, senior officials from armed forces among others, concluded Tuesday.

RBI identifies 12 loan accounts constituting 25% of gross NPAs for immediate resolution under bankruptcy law

New Delhi, Jun 14

The RBI's Internal Advisory Committee has identified 12 accounts each having more than 5,000 crore rupees of outstanding loans. It accounts for 25 percent of the current gross Non Performing Assets for immediate referral and resolution under the bankruptcy law.

The Reserve Bank, in a press release yesterday said its Committee has agreed to focus on large stressed accounts which were classified partly or wholly as non-performing from amongst the top 500 exposures in the banking system. The Committee has, in particular recommended that all

accounts having more than five thousand crore rupees as outstanding loan as of 31st March 2016 should be immediately taken up for resolution. Without naming the defaulters, the apex bank has said the lenders will be asked to initiate insolvency proceedings to recover the loan.

Massive fire at 27-storey apartment in West London

London, Jun 14

In Britain, several people have died after a huge fire, which engulfed a 24-story block of flats in central London early today. Commissioner of the London Fire Brigade, Dany Cotton said in a televised briefing that there have been a number of fatalities and the number cannot be confirmed at this time due to the size and complexity of the building. She said at least 200 firefighters are battling the blaze, and evacuating residents from the building. A statement from the Fire brigade said the blaze started around 1 a.m. London time, from the second floor of the Grenfell Tower on the Lancaster West Estate. It said the fire engulfed all floors from the second to the top of the block which contained 120 apartments.

A new system that can predict heart attack

Washington, Jun 14

Scientists are developing a new system that can predict if a car driver is about to have a heart attack. This new system would help avoid road accidents due to an unexpected cardiac event, said Shri Kayvan Najarian, a researcher from University of Michigan in the US. Researchers are creating a system that could be placed in the vehicle to monitor and predict the adverse event.

dealers and PDS beneficiaries as well.

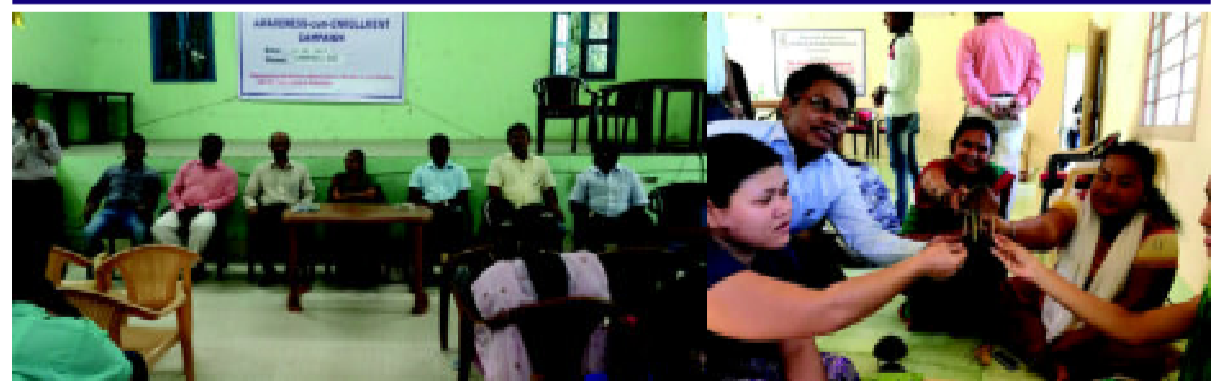
Further, the PDS beneficiaries have been advised to insist for a copy of the bill generated by the PoS machine while

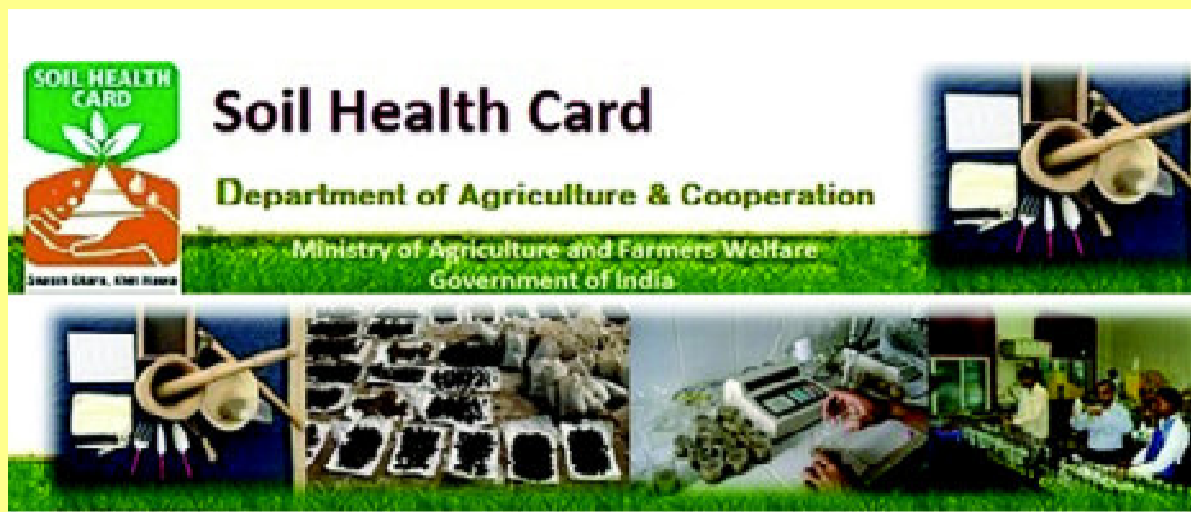

Soil Health Card Scheme

Soil Health Card Scheme is a scheme launched by the Government of India in February 2015. Under the scheme, the government plans to issue soil cards to farmers which will carry crop-wise recommendations of nutrients and fertilisers required for the individual farms to help farmers to improve productivity through judicious use of inputs. All soil samples are to be tested in various soil testing labs across the country. Thereafter the experts will analyse the strength and weaknesses (micro-nutrients deficiency) of the soil and suggest measures to deal with it. The result and suggestion will be displayed in the cards. The government plans to issue the cards to 14 crore farmers.

Scheme

The scheme aims at promoting soil test based and balanced use of fertilisers to enable farmers realise higher yields at lower cost.

India vs Bangladesh semi-final 2017

No surprise anymore to anyone that Bangladesh are doing well, says Kohli

Birmingham, June 14

In a repeat of 2015 World Cup quarter-final, India will be facing Bangladesh in the semi-final of the ICC Champions Trophy in Birmingham on Thursday and India captain Virat Kohli has said that they are not taking their opposition for granted. India beat Bangladesh in the World Cup semi-final two years ago but Kohli says that they have taken huge strides in the

last couple of years and will pose a big challenge. "They already are (a challenge). It's no surprise anymore to anyone that they are doing really well. They have really improved their cricket and credit to their set-up and the kind of players they have now who are taking more responsibility. They are very dangerous side on their day. Everyone realises that," Kohli said.

Remembering the 2015 World Cup, Kohli said that Bangladesh were very good in that tournament as well and they are looking good here as well. "No one take the opposition for granted. Bangladesh have taken huge strides in the last of years. Even in the 2015 World Cup they were really good. Credit goes to them for what they are doing with their cricket in the last two years," he said.

Virat Kohli reclaims top spot in ICC ODI rankings for batsmen

Dubai, Jun 14

India captain Virat Kohli has reclaimed the top spot in the latest ICC ODI rankings for batsmen. With brilliant knocks of 81 not out against Pakistan and 76 not out against South Africa in the Champions Trophy, Kohli leapfrogged de Villiers and Warner into the number one spot. Kohli had earlier held the top spot for four days in January this year. Opener Shikhar Dhawan has returned in the top 10. The left-hander vaulted five places to 10th following scores of 68 against Pakistan, 125 against Sri Lanka and 78 against South Africa. Rohit Sharma and Mahendra Singh Dhoni have



slipped one place each to 13th and 14th, respectively, while Yuvraj Singh has gained six places to be at 88th spot. Fast bowler Bhuvneshwar Kumar has led the charge of India's bowlers by vaulting 13 places to share 23rd spot with Afghanistan's Hamza Hotak. Umesh Yadav has gained two

places to be at 41st position, while Jasprit Bumrah is at 43rd after climbing up three spots. However, Indian spinners have slipped in the latest rankings with Ravichandran Ashwin dropping two places to 20th and Ravindra Jadeja falling three places to 29th.

AFC Asian Cup Qualifiers: Sunil Chhetri Strike Seals India's 1-0 Win Over Kyrgyzstan

Bengaluru, June 14

Captain Sunil Chhetri stamped his class yet again as he scored the match-winner to fire India to a 1-0 win over Kyrgyzstan in a fast-paced and entertaining AFC Asian Cup qualifier match in Bengaluru on Tuesday. Chhetri drilled a lot shot with his right foot off a fine pass from Jeje Lalpekhlua in the 69th minute to lead India to a crucial win in the home leg tie of the Group A third round qualifiers of the 2019 Asian Cup. Chhetri, who scored his 54th goal in his 94th match, led from the front throughout the match. Playing behind the lone striker Jeje, he was in the thick of things, at times falling back deep



to help the defenders, setting up his team-mates and also taking shots on his own. With the win, India sat atop the group with six points - from two wins - ahead of Kyrgyzstan and Myanmar who both have three points from two matches. Macau are yet to open account from their two matches. All the four

teams will play home and away matches and the two top sides will qualify for the 2019 AFC Asian Cup to be held in United Arab Emirates. The hosts, who had beaten Myanmar 1-0 in their first match of the qualifiers, notched up their seventh official international match on the trot.

Sangakkara's 100th ton powers Surrey into semis

Yorkshire, June 14

A hundred 100s in List A and first-class cricket combined is what the 39-year-old Kumar Sangakkara achieved when he registered a run-a-ball 121 for Surrey against Yorkshire in the Royal London One-Day Cup quarter-final on Tuesday (June 13) to power his side to a sizeable total of 313 for 7 at

Headingley in Leeds. This was followed by a disciplined performance with the ball that helped Surrey overcome the hosts by 24 runs to book a semis berth against Worcestershire on Saturday. Coming to the crease at 8 for 1, following the early departure of Mark Stoneman, Sangakkara combined with

Scott Borthwick for a 61-run stand for the second wicket that steadied the proceedings for Surrey after they had opted to bat. However, they were left in a spot when Borthwick and Rory Burns departed in quick succession, leaving their side at 70 for 3 in the 15th over.
