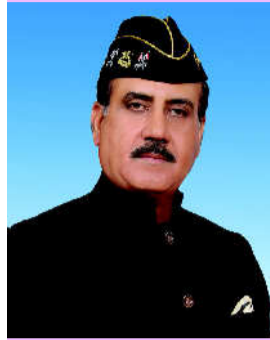


## Govt. revises time schedule for making payments under Income Declaration Scheme 2016

New Delhi, Jul 14  
The Government has revised the time schedule for making payments under Income Declaration Scheme 2016. As per the revised schedule, a minimum amount of 25 percent of the tax, surcharge and penalty can be paid by 30th of November this year and further amount of 25 percent by 31st of March

next year. A Finance Ministry release said, the balance amount can be paid on or before 30th of September 2017. The decision was taken following practical difficulties expressed by various stakeholders that the time period available under the Scheme up to 30th November, 2016 for making payment of tax, surcharge and penalty is very short. A notification to this effect will be issued shortly.

The scheme provides an opportunity to domestic black money holders to come clean by paying tax and penalty of 45 per cent on undisclosed assets.

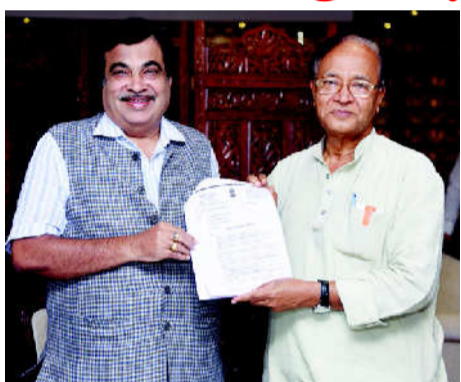

## Six State Highways of Isles declared as new 'National Highways': MP

Port Blair, July 14  
The Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has said that the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH) has approved 6 State Highways measuring a total length of 90.70 km of A&N Islands as new 'National Highways'. Sharing this information with the media persons during a press conference held at MP Bhawan on July 11, Shri Ray stated that this was decided in a meeting held at Transport Bhavan, New Delhi under the Chairmanship of Shri Nitin Gadakari, Hon'ble Minister, Road Transport & Highways, recently. During the meeting, the Minister mentioned that Hon'ble Prime Minister

## Taxes for providing various services at citizens' doorsteps proposed; paid parking services to start soon

Port Blair, July 14

Since inception, the Port Blair Municipal Council has been striving to execute its mandatory task of maintaining sanitation, providing safe drinking water, street light, roads, footpaths, drain and other amenities in the city.

The PBMC Chairperson, Smt Sheela Singh in a press release received here has stated that a massive pool of workers is engaged in all the 24 Wards of the city to

keep the city spick and span by collection of garbage and transferring them to the Dumping Yard. The PBMC incurs the major portion of its revenue generation/ collection towards committed liabilities viz. wages, fuel charges, electricity charges, hiring of vehicles etc. At present the main spring of revenue generation for the PBMC is Octroi, Property tax, Water charges, etc. keeping in view the urgent need to

add to the revenue generation capacity of the Council to ensure maximum utilization of manpower and machinery to keep every part of the city clean by way of regular garbage disposal and providing other basic amenities.

Without adding much financial burden to the Public, the present Council has decided on the idea of levying taxes such as Tourism taxes, increasing octroi rates on IMFL/POL/ Tobacco/Vehicle, paid

parking and service charges on various categories of traders in the city for providing services at their doorsteps. The revenue so generated will be utilized for effective implementation of the solid waste management system, door to door collection of garbage and other civic amenities in the city for the citizens.

The Council will soon embark on the paid parking services in the city by

# India hockey squad announced for Rio Olympics

New Delhi, July 14  
Four Odia girls found place in the Indian Women's hockey team for Rio Olympics which was declared today. Deep Grace Ekka, Namita Toppo, Lilima Minz, and Sunita Lakra from Odisha will represent the national team in the Olympics which will be played in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil from August 5 to 21. Meanwhile, the Sports minister Sudam Marandi announced 50 thousand rupees incentives each for the four Odia players for finding a place in the National team for Rio Olympics. The Indian women's team had last qualified for the Olympics in 1980 when they finished a commendable fourth. India become the 10th women's team to qualify for the Rio Games after South Korea, Argentina, Great Britain, China, Germany, Netherlands, Australia, New Zealand and US.

## All Rio-bound sportspersons are dope-free: NADA DG

New Delhi, July 14  
National Anti-Doping Agency Director General Navin Agarwal today said that all the Rio Olympics bound sportspersons are dope-free. He said they have undergone testing for banned substances. Mr. Agarwal said that for those training abroad, NADA have hired some agencies to collect samples there and have tested the samples of all these athletes. He said that he was quite confident that the Indian contingent at the Rio Olympics will have no doping violation by any of them this time. The Indian contingent at the 2004 Olympics was rocked by doping as two weightlifters -- Sanamacha Chanu and Pratima Kumari -- tested positive for banned substances

while another lifter Monika Devi was barred from leaving for 2008 Olympics just a day before she was to board the Beijing flight. There was, however, no such incident prior and during the 2012 London Olympics.

## R Ashwin placed second in ICC Test rankings

Dubai, July 14  
In the latest ICC Test rankings released in Dubai on Wednesday, India has held the second position while Australia remains on top. Ravichandran Ashwin topped the all-rounders list besides being placed second in bowling. In batting, Australia's Steve Smith leads the field and he is followed by Kane Williamson of New Zealand and South Africa's Hashim Amla. Trailing by a mere point, Pakistan could leapfrog India into second place

importance of maintaining clean and hygienic environment and urged ASHA workers, Anganwadi workers, Health workers & PRIs to work in tandem in combating diarrhoea. She also highlighted about the Prime Minister's vision for a clean and green India and the 'Shauchalya Mission', which is aimed at doing away with open defecation, which should be propagated far and wide. Parents residing in villages, poultry farms, fish markets and street hawkers needs to be sensitized about the importance of healthy habits and the dos and don'ts pertaining to diarrhoea, she said. In his key note address, the Dy. Director Health Education & Family Welfare, Dr.R.K.Haldar said it is important for the health fraternity to have knowledge about the causes and prevention of diarrhoea. Diarrhoea is preventable and if proper methods are adopted, we can achieve zero infant mortality due to diarrhoea among children below five, he remarked. Intensified awareness programmes will be carried out in every nook and corner of the Islands and Health workers will assist in disseminating information pertaining to prevention of diarrhoea and demonstration to the public, he said. He also said that diarrhoea is more prevalent in slums and clustered areas where hygienic environment is absent and urged one and all to practice healthy habits and keep diseases at bay. Speaking on the occasion, Prof. T. L. Ratnakumari, HoD, Department of Pediatric, ANIIMS said diarrhoea in children needs to be controlled as it is one of the most common diseases among children below five. She said diarrhoea has its own course to get cured and stated that ORS and Zinc tablets are the key factors in the management of diarrhoea. She also highlighted about the factors responsible for diarrhoea viz. lack of continuous breast feeding of the child for six months, malnutrition, unhygienic food and water consumption and urged parents to breast feed their child for six months continuously and also to ensure hygienic habits of the family. The programme, which was attended among others by Prof. Katpalia, HoD, Gynecology, Senior Doctors of GB Pant Hospital, Health workers, ASHA workers, Principal ANM School & Nursing school, ANM & Nursing students, concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by Health Worker, Smti Vasantha Devi.

with 2 sluice gates and some bridges along with 2 major Creek Bridges one at Middle Strait and another at Humphrey Strait for all purposes like new construction, maintenance etc. to National Highways Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd. (NHIDCL) (a PSU under MoRTH). The MD Shri Anand Kumar and Shri Dharmadhikar, Advisor to NHIDCL, will tour/survey along with MP to ensure the speedy implementation of the NH and Bridge project in A&N Islands, Shri Ray informed. The MP further informed that an amount of rupees 48 crore has been sanctioned under CRF (6 Nos. total length 40.7 kms ) with full power to make drawing, design, estimate, DPR, Approvals, tendering, execution of work, maintenance etc. by APWD. Hon'ble Minister also gave approval for all 21 bridges proposed by MP under CRF and asked the Secretary, PWD to personally ensure the execution and other formalities. For road repair under IRQP, the Hon'ble Minister instructed to hand over all these kinds of work like approval etc. to the "high-power Committee" and asked his officials to be people friendly. The MP further stated that regarding Chatham Bamboo Flat Bridge- it was informed by MD, NHIDCL that tender for selecting the Consultant for constructing bridge at Chatham Bamboo Flat is over and 2 consultants have applied for the work. However, Hon'ble Minister was of the opinion to call 25 more reputed Consultants to give DPR for making this bridge a world-class one. The MP, during the press meet, disclosed that HRD Ministry has conveyed that Navodaya Vidyalaya will be established in all the Districts of the A&N Islands and the Central Govt. will provide fund for the same.

which the citizen can avail parking facilities to regulate, automate and in an orderly manner to park the vehicle in the designated parking slots to avoid traffic congestion with watch and ward. Besides, the Council has taken few steps to augment the revenue collection a drive has been initiated to gather long pending shop rents, property tax and water charges. The Municipal Council is in a process to switch over to introduce Unit Area Method to assess property tax in the city in consultation with the stake holders. This will eliminate discretion and reduce corruption at all levels. The Council also initiated efforts to collect the taxes through online/CSC to make it user friendly and considering option of self-assessment for tax submission, the release added.

earlier. Consequently Kamsarat Nallah Dam was put into use to meet the water crisis w.e.f. 20th February 2016. Treated water from Kamsarat Nallah was supplied to Stewartgunj and adjoining villages including Ferrargunj, Tushnabad through water tankers. Due to inadequacy of water storage in the Bambooflat Dam, the requirement of water to Bambooflat and adjoining area was also supplemented through this Dam. However, there is an apprehension amongst a section of people that the Kamsarat Nallah Dam is yet to be commissioned. It is clarified that the Kamsarat Nallah Dam has started functioning and been put to use with effect from 20th February, 2016, an official communication received here said.
