## Process of declassification of Netaji files to begin on Jan 23, 2016: PM



New Delhi, Oct 14  
 35 family members of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose today called on the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi at his residence, 7 Race Course Road. During the hour-long

interaction, the family members requested for declassification of the files relating to Netaji, available with the Government of India. They suggested that the Government of India initiate the process to get the files on

Netaji available with foreign Governments to also be declassified. The Prime Minister said that he finds the suggestions of the family members of Netaji to be similar to his own thinking and the view of the Union

Government. He said he sees no reason to strangle history. He declared that the process of declassification of files will begin on January 23rd, 2016, the birthday of Netaji. The Prime Minister also agreed to take up the suggestion to request foreign Governments to declassify files on Netaji available with them. He said he would not only write to them, but also take up the matter during his meetings with foreign leaders, beginning with Russia in December. The Prime Minister said that those nations who forget history also lose the power to create it. He also shared with the family members some instances of how he had recalled Netaji during his term as the Chief Minister of Gujarat.

"Consider me a part of your family," the Prime Minister said to the family members of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Union Ministers Shri Rajnath Singh, Smt. Sushma Swaraj, and Union MoS Shri Babul Supriyo were present on the occasion.

## India calls for intl. community to ensure life of dignity for all women

New York, Oct 14  
 India has called for the international community to strengthen political and financial commitments to ensure a life of dignity for all women who bear a disproportionate burden of poverty. First Secretary in the Indian Mission to the UN Shri Mayank Joshi has said this at UN General Assembly Third Committee session on

Advancement of Women last night. He said that in the challenging times of increasing armed conflict and economic crisis across the world, there is need to re-strategise and strengthen commitments, for achieving poverty-free and sustainable world, which will ensure a life of dignity for all women and girls. Shri Joshi also highlighted the number of legislations put in place in India

for the protection of women, including against all forms of violence, human trafficking, prohibition of child marriage and protection of children from sexual offences and exploitation. He mentioned that the Pradhan Mantri Jan-Dhan Yojana, is also proving to be an economic breakthrough for thousands of women who urgently required overcoming the vicious cycle of poverty and debt.

**Bangladesh will remain U-19  
World T20 hosts: ICC**

Dubai, Oct 14  
Despite recent security concerns that saw Australia postpone their travel to Bangladesh, the International Cricket Council (ICC), on Tuesday, confirmed that Bangladesh will remain the hosts of the upcoming Under-19 World Cup early next year. Following their Board and Committee meetings in Dubai, an official statement spoke of 'developing an appropriate security plan'.

"As part of this decision, the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB), working in conjunction with its government, will be developing an appropriate security plan that addresses all security risks to the satisfaction of the ICCs security advisor, working closely with the security advisors for the other Members," the statement said.

The official statement also mentions some of the other prominent outcomes of Tuesday's meetings. With respect to the Associate and Affiliate nations, the ICC has significantly bumped up the direct funding, in a bid to assist the development of more competitive teams.

The Indian posted a 9-11 11-5 3-11 11-1 11-6 victory over her English rival.
