Ban on paid news will reduce election cost at constituency level: EC

New Delhi, Dec 15
 Chief Election Commissioner Shri Nasim Zaidi has said that legal ban on paid news and adding party and third party expenses in the constituency to the candidates account, may bring down the election cost at constituency level. Delivering the inaugural address at the two day Regional Conference on the use of money in politics and its effect on People's Representation in New Delhi today, Shri Zaidi said, the legal ban should be followed by strong public disclosure and penalties. He said, candidates are spending huge amounts under the barb of paid news. He said, to curb the problem,

Election Commission has proposed a legislative sanction to make paid news an offence and many political parties and media houses have agreed on it. He said, at candidate level, law imposes ceiling on expenditure but there is no law on how much fund they can raise. He said, data with commission says that candidates are under reporting expenses within prescribed ceiling. He said, out of 535 winners in the last Parliamentary elections, expenses of majority of winners reported to commission were in the range of 40 per cent to 80 per cent only.

Serena Williams is Sports Illustrated's Sportsperson of the Year — the first female athlete honoured on her own by the magazine in more than 30 years. Williams came within two matches of tennis' first calendar-year Grand Slam since 1988, a bid that ended with a semifinal loss at the U.S. Open. In all, the 34-year-old American went 53-3 during 2015 with five titles, including at the Australian Open, French Open and Wimbledon. Williams was No. 1 in the WTA rankings all season. "She was the most deserving person for the award. She had an amazing year. The way she won her events; the fact that she's done this for so many years at such a high level," said Paul Fichtenbaum, editor of the Sports Illustrated Group. "She was a terrific candidate in a year of terrific candidates."

Replying to supplementaries in the Lok Sabha, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution Minister Shri Ram Vilas Paswan said only three complaints about supply of poor quality of foodgrains under Public Distribution System (PDS) have been received by his Ministry up to 1st December 2015 during 2015-16.
