He described the submarine as an excellent illustration of the fast growing strategic partnership between India and France. He said, the INS Kalvari will add even more strength to the

That is why the Indian Ocean has a special place in the policies of the Government, he added. ## LG revises minimum wages for Andaman & Nicobar Islands

Port Blair, Dec 14 01.01.2018.  
The Administration had constituted Minimum Wages Advisory Committee on 25.07.2017. The Committee gave its recommendations which was put in public domain for inviting claims & suggestions for a period of 60 days after which the Lt. Governor, Andaman & Nicobar Islands approved the revised rate. The rate shall be uniform across all 3 Districts and all 6 Schedules of employment. The revised rates are:-

Category of employee	Minimum wage per day
Unskilled	Rs 437/-
Semi-Skilled/Unskilled supervisory	Rs 494/-
Skilled	Rs 579/-
Clerical	Rs 579/-
Highly Skilled	Rs 637/-

The Administration has been revising Minimum Wages every six months i.e., January and July. The last revision was on January 2017 whereas due to no change in Average All India Consumer Price Index, the Minimum Wages remained static in July 2017, hence, no revision took place in July 2017. This was as per the accepted calculation formula of 2010. The notification of Minimum Wages is available on the website www.and.nic.in as well as www.labour.and.nic.in and all the stakeholders like Govt. Departments and Private establishments have been requested to download the same, since Labour Department as part of 'Paperless Office' won't be circulating the hard copies of the same. All the establishments, private as well as govt., have been directed to comply with the revised rates failing which punitive action as per the Minimum Wages Act of 1948 shall be initiated, a communication from the Additional Secretary (Labour) / Labour Commissioner said.

## Waste from discarded electronics piling up UN urges for better recycling of hazardous rubbish

New York, Dec 14  
The United Nations has warned that waste from discarded electronics like mobile phones, laptops and refrigerators is piling up worldwide, and urged for better recycling of the hazardous rubbish. A report by UN's International Telecommunication Union, the UN University and the International Solid Waste Association said, full 44.7 million tonnes of e-waste was generated around the world in 2016 which was eight percent up from two years earlier. It said, by 2021, the world will likely be cluttered with a full 52.2 million tonnes of such waste. The report said, the waste, which can pose serious risks to human health and the environment, is rarely recycled or properly discarded. Ruediger Kuehr of UNU's Sustainable Cycles Programme said the most promising approach to reducing e-waste is a system where consumers no longer purchase devices, but instead only the services they provide.

**ICC lays down guidelines for four-day Test, each day to have minimum 98 overs**

Dubai, Dec 14  
South Africa and Zimbabwe will play the first ever four-day Test match and the International Cricket Council has laid down the template for the match. The board has decided that everyday, a minimum of 98 overs will be bowled that means a total of 392 overs in four days. In a five-day game, a total of 450 overs are bowled. Also, a five-day game has six-hours from start to finish but the four-day game will be stretched to six-and-a-half hours. Another big change is the playing rules is that follow-on was reduced from 200 runs to 150 runs. This gives a better chance to teams who play aggressive cricket to force a result.  
The breakdown of the day's play will include three sessions of two hours and fifteen minutes each. The Lunch time will be of 40 minutes while the Tea time

will be 20 minutes. This is similar to the five-day format. A 30-minute overtime will also be available just like the five-day game. South Africa and Zimbabwe are playing a day-night four-day Test so the Tea break will be of 20 minutes and the supper break, which will be the second break of the match, will be of 40 minutes. But both

intervals combine for only an hour. The match will begin at 3:30 pm IST on Boxing Day (December 26) in Port Elizabeth. The South Africa-Zimbabwe game will be the first four-day Test but ICC may go for more such matches in next couple of years as many have argued that five-day games are losing their popularity.

**Man City racks up record 15th straight league win**

Swansea, Dec 14  
Another win, another record for rampant Premier League leader Manchester City. And this one might be the most impressive of the lot. By beating Swansea 4-0 on Wednesday, City racked up its 15th straight victory a feat never achieved in the 129-year history of England's top division. Second-place Manchester United also won, beating

Bournemouth 1-0 through Romelu Lukaku's goal to keep the gap at the top to 11 points, but chasing down its cross-town rival looks to be a forlorn hope at this rate. City is unbeaten after 17 games and has now scored 52 goals, the latest coming at Liberty Stadium through David Silva (2), Kevin De Bruyne and Sergio Aguero against last-place Swansea.

**Siwach named ABC's best youth boxer**

New Delhi, Dec 14  
World youth champion Sachin Siwach was named the Asian Boxing Confederation's best youth boxer of the year after winning an online poll conducted by the continental body. Siwach polled 36.2 % votes in his category.  
Siwach, who won the world title last year, claimed the Asian youth championships silver this year besides a gold at the Youth Commonwealth Games.  
India also fetched the Best Asian International Technical Official (ITO) award with Lenny D'Gama winning the online poll. D'Gama polled 45.5%.  
D'Gama officiated at the ASBC Asian Confederation junior boxing championships in Puerto Princesa and also in the Asian Women's boxing championships in Ho Chi Minh City.



**India men's hockey team ends year on 6th, women 10th**

New Delhi, Dec 14  
The Indian men's and women's hockey teams remained static at sixth and 10th positions in the latest rankings released by the International Hockey Federation (FIH). The Indian men's team was at the sixth spot since the

beginning of this year and maintained its position throughout 2017.

India's third place finish at the recently-concluded Men's Hockey World League Final in Bhubaneswar though helped them reduce the gap with fifth place

Germany significantly, they failed to topple them. Meanwhile, the Indian women's team, who started the year at the 12th spot, jumped up two places to 10th. Their Asia Cup win last month helped them gain two positions, leapfrogging Spain and Japan.
