Spike in positive cases prompt District Administration (SA) to take further steps

Imposes restriction on certain activities to avoid unnecessary movement; Essential shops & establishments to remain open on all days from 6 am to 1 pm from May 2

- Provision stores, vegetable shops, shops dealing with food, groceries, fruits, dairy and milk booth/shop, meat and fish, bakeries, mechanical workshops shall be permitted.
- Home delivery/ take away by restaurant permitted.
- Hospitals, medical labs, pharmaceuticals stores, opticals, medicines & medical equipments, all medical emergency cases shall be permitted.
- Construction activities permitted with no movement of labourers out of the work site.
- Social/Political/sports/entertainment/academic/cultural/religious/ festival related and other gatherings shall be prohibited.

Port Blair, April 30

In view of the recent surge in the positive cases of COVID-19 in the Islands, the District Administration, South Andaman has been taking various proactive steps to contain the spread of the virus in the District. It is closely monitoring the situation and noticed that there is a steep increase in positive cases in the past few days. In order to place strict measures of isolation and social distancing in the South Andaman District and to prevent any disturbance to the peace and tranquility, Shri Suneel Anchipaka, District Magistrate, South Andaman, in exercise of the powers vested U/s 144 of Cr.P.C. has ordered implementation of various restrictions to contain the spread of the disease which shall come into force in the South Andaman District including the active Containment Zones from 2nd May, 2021 and shall be effective till further orders.

As per the order, in addition to Night Curfew Order, the following restriction shall be in force. All shops and establishments will remain shut except the following as per terms and conditions herein as under: -

- Provision Stores, Vegetable Shops, shops dealing with food, groceries, fruits, dairy and milk booth/shop, meat and fish, animal feed/fodder, bakeries, mechanical workshops shall be permitted.
- Only delivery of foods by way of home delivery/take away by restaurants is permitted. Food shall be served to the guests in Hotels and Lodges in their rooms only and guests shall not be permitted to dine in the restaurants attached to the hotels and lodges. Dine in facilities at Restaurants, Hotels, mess shall not be permitted. Likewise, tea shops and eateries shall not be permitted.

Preventing spread of COVID-19 among PVTGs

DC (SA) issues prohibitory orders restricting fishermen & general public from venturing into certain areas or anywhere close to tribal buffer zones

No contact should be made with PVTGs at any cost

Port Blair, April 30

In view of the second wave of COVID-19 cases in A&N Islands and to prevent the spread of infections among the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs), the District Magistrate, South Andaman District, Shri Suneel Anchipaka has issued

prohibitory orders for the fishermen as well as the general public not to venture into the certain areas or anywhere close to the tribal buffer zones and not to come in contact with the PVTGs at any cost.

As per the Order released by the Deputy Commissioner, the entire area in South

Andaman as notified vide Section 1 (a) in the ANPATR/3(1)/1 dated 02nd April 1957 published in the Official Gazette vide No.3 dated 02nd April 1957. The entire area comprised in and enclosed within the coastal lines of the Islands viz. Rutland,

North Sentinel, Cinque Passage, Sisters, Brothers and South Sentinel and other Islands situated southward the territory of the A&N Islands upto and including Little Andaman.

Anybody violating the above direction shall be liable for strict penal

Vaccination drive for 18 to 44 age group will begin once the vaccine arrives; Secretary (IP&T)

Port Blair, April 30

The Secretary, IP&T, Shri Sunil Kumar Singh while briefing the media persons in the conference hall of IP&T today informed that the massive surge in COVID cases and deaths taking place all over the Country is a matter of great concern. The COVID situation is also not good in these Islands too. Altogether, 40 people were found positive during RAT conducted at Airport and Bus Stand today. The Secretary informed that 7 flights with 576 passengers arrived in



Port Blair. Out of this, 10 passengers were tested positive. Altogether, 476 stranded persons who were bound for North and Middle Andaman were tested, out of which, 30 people were found positive.

The Secretary informed the scribes that the Administration is slowly putting

restrictions to control the movement of people and closure of all religious institutions was one such step in this direction. He said as the situation is not improving, the Administration is compelled to impose some more restrictions to protect and save the lives of the people of

As the country reels under severe COVID pandemic, it is important to keep oneself safe from this dreaded disease. To boost ones immunity, age old home remedies comes handy, especially in this challenging times. Sharing some tips on how to keep the disease at bay, the DD

AYUSH, Dr. Kalyan Khadbane said, to boost immunity one can use ingredients and spices available at home.

He advised people to take steam inhalation thrice a day and consume warm water at regular intervals as per individual needs as this will help keep the trachea clean. Food should be freshly cooked, warm and

easily digestible and in suitable quantity as per individual need. Spices like Haldi (Turmeric), Jeera (Cumin), Dhanya (Coriander), Lahsun (Garlic), Adrak (Ginger), Pippali (Pepper) are recommended in cooking. Warm soups of lentils/pulses/meat can be taken as per preference and avoid

pharmaceutical stores, opticals, medicines and medical equipments, distribution of newspapers, ambulance and hearse vehicle services, medical and its allied activities, all medical emergency cases shall be permitted.

In-situ constructional activities shall be permitted, but no movement of labourers is permitted out of the work site. Contractor/Manager will be held responsible for any deviation.

The establishments listed above shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of at least one meter from a person and not allowing more than 5 persons at a time inside the premises. The said premises shall remain open on all days from 6 am to 1 pm.

Persons intending to buy essential commodities shall procure the same from the local market nearest to their residence. Unnecessary travel to be avoided in this regard. Goods transport, vehicles carrying agricultural produce of farmers, Agriculture & its allied activities shall be permitted. Social / Political / sports / entertainment / academic / cultural / religious / festival related and other gathering and congregations shall be prohibited.

All religious places/places of worship shall be closed for public worship. Further, religious congregations/gatherings are strictly prohibited. Any person/organisation violating the above directions shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs. 10,000/- which shall be payable by the Management Committee. The operations of the Government Departments shall be on the basis of directions issued by General Administration Department from time to time. All Government Departments shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of at least one meter from a person.

Officers/officials involved in essential and emergency services such as Health and Family Welfare and all related medical establishments, Police Home Guards, Civil Defence, Fire and emergency services District Administration, Pay & Accounts Office, Shipping Services, Electricity, Water Supply and Sanitation, Public Transport, Disaster Management and related services, all print and electronic media persons, private security services, Defence personnel on duty, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/Godown, Insurance Office and ATMs, Telecommunication, Internet services, Broadcasting and Cable services, Fishing activities, Cold Storages and ware houses, courts as per orders of High Court and E-commerce activities are permitted on production of valid Identity card.

All Banks functioning in the District shall only provide essential services to the customers and shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of at least one meter from a person and also maintain a proper queue system and thereby not allowing more than 5 customers at a time inside the premises.

Persons engaged for essential activities, including operation of industrial units in multiple shifts, movement of goods on Andaman Trunk road, loading and unloading of essential cargo and travel of persons to their destinations after disembarking on production of valid travel tickets. Movement of passengers availing boat/ship services for travel to different Islands shall be permitted.

All private medical personnel such as Doctors, nursing staff, paramedical etc. and other hospitals services (such as hospitals, diagnostic centres, clinics, pharmacies, pharmaceutical companies and other medical & health services), on production of valid Identity cards. Pregnant women and patients availing medical services are permitted.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services.

Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s) and also fines shall also be imposed as per Order No.580 dt. 26th April 2021, the order issued to this effect added.

UT Administration to provide subsidized sugar for AAY & PHH beneficiaries under PDS

Port Blair, April 30
As per the directions of the Government of India, the A&N Administration has conveyed the willingness of this UT to extend the benefit of sugar subsidy to Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) households under Sugar Subsidy Scheme. The benefit of this scheme has also been extended to Priority Households (PHH) and the applicable subsidy component is borne by the UT Budget to cover

the entire NFSA beneficiaries of this UT. The subsidized sugar will be distributed to all PDS beneficiaries i.e. PHH & AAY households @ 1 kg per card/month for twelve months in one go (April, 2020 to March, 2021) @ Rs. 30/- (PHH) & Rs. 15/- (AAY) per kg w.e.f 1st May, 2021 onwards. The NFSA beneficiaries can avail this Scheme within two months i.e. upto 30th June, 2021. All Ration Card Holders & FPS dealers are required to

follow COVID appropriate behaviors such as proper wearing of face mask, hand hygiene, regular sanitization, physical distancing (Do Gaj Door) etc. at FPS premises for the safety of all. these Islands from this fatal virus.

He said people at large are supporting the Administration by following all the COVID protocols but some people are yet to understand the gravity of the situation and are flouting the COVID appropriate behavior risking not only their lives but of their family members and the society as a whole.

The Secretary said that the vaccination drive for persons above 45 is continuing. He informed that the Govt. of India will be launching the vaccination drive for the persons aged 18 to 44 and the Administration has placed orders with the Serum Institute of India for sufficient doses of COVISHIELD vaccines to cover the eligible persons. However, he said, the order placed to administer vaccines to persons in the age group of 18-44 years has not yet been received. In view of this, he urged the eligible persons in the age group of 18-44 years not to visit the Vaccination Centres tomorrow (May1). The Administration will chalk out a plan for vaccination for the new age group (18-44 years) and the eligible persons will be communicated without fail, as soon as the vaccine is received from Serum Institute of India, the Secretary informed. The Secretary clarified that sufficient stock of vaccine is available for the eligible persons above 45 and for those who are waiting for their second jab.

The Director, ANIIMS, Dr. AK Mandal and the Deputy Director, GB Pant Hospital, Dr. Amitabh De replied to the queries raised by media persons on COVID -19.

The Director (IP&T), Shri Alok Kumar and the Deputy Director, IP, Shri RS Meena also attended the press conference.

overeating.

Avoid foods/drinks like curd,banana, cold drinks, ice-cream, refrigerated items; and cold air which may trigger respiratory symptoms. Elaborating on the preparation method of AYUSH Kaadha, he said drink 150 ml of herbal tea / decoction made by boiling tulsi (basil), dalchini (cinnamon), kalimirch (black pepper), shunthi (ginger), munakka, (raisin) in water once or twice a day. Jaggery and fresh lemon juice may be added for taste.

Gargle with warm water twice a day (a teaspoon full of sesame oil, half tea spoon haldi and pinch of common salt may be added to water). Steam inhalation thrice a day (Mint leaves or pinch of ajwain (carom seed) may be added to the water in case of congestion). Half tea spoon of clove powder may be used once or twice a day along with honey for dry cough/sore throat. Have adequate sleep, preferably during night hours.

Centre enhances supply of anti viral drug Remdesivir to states to combat COVID-19

New Delhi, April 30

The Centre has started importing the vital drug Remdesivir from other countries to ease out the shortage of it in the country. The first Consignment of 75 thousand vials will reach India today. The Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers said, HLL Lifecare Limited, a Government of India owned company has ordered 4 lakh 50 thousand vials of Remdesivir from M/s Gilead Sciences Inc, USA and Egyptian Pharma Company, M/s Eva Pharma.

It is expected that Gilead Sciences Inc. USA will dispatch 75 thousand to one lakh vials in the next one or two days. Further one hundred thousand quantities will also be supplied before or by the 15th of May. EVA pharma will supply approximately 10 thousand vials initially followed by 50 thousand vials every 15 days or till July.

The Ministry said, the Government has ramped up the production capacity of Remdesivir in the country. As on 27th April, the production capacity of the seven licensed domestic manufacturers increased from 38 lakh vials per month to one crore three lakh vials per month. Total 13.73 lakh vials have been supplied across the country by the Drug companies in the last seven days. The daily supply has gone up from 67 thousand 900 vials on the 11th of April to 2.09 lakh vials on the 28th of April this year. An advisory was issued by Home Ministry to states and Union Territories to facilitate smooth movement of Remdesivir supplies.

Government also prohibited the export of Remdesivir to enhance its availability in the country. To ensure affordability of the injection among the masses, National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority on 17th of this month released the revised maximum retail price thus bringing down the cost of all the major brands to below 3 thousand 500 rupees per vial.

In order to facilitate higher production and availability of Remdesivir, the Department of Revenue has exempted the whole of the duty of Customs on Remdesivir injection, its API and Beta cyclodextrin used in manufacture of Remdesivir, till 31st October this year. The National Treatment Protocol was updated through the Clinical guidance for Management of Adult COVID 19 patients by AAIMS, ICMR- COVID-19 National Task Force and Joint Monitoring group of Health Ministry on the 22nd of this month. The updated protocol will encourage Judicious use of Drugs and is expected to contribute to rationalising demand. (Source:india.gov.in)

New Delhi, April 30

The number of total active cases of COVID-19 in the country further swelled up today to comprise nearly 16.90 per cent of the total reported cases. The Health Ministry has informed that currently over 31 lakh 70 thousand people are reported to be suffering from the viral pandemic and are either hospitalised or are under home isolation.

In the last 24 hours, the nation registered nearly 3 lakh 86 thousand new COVID cases. With this, the recovery rate has further slipped to stand at 81.99 per cent. Over 2 lakh 97 thousand people have been discharged from hospitals or are reported to have been completely cured since yesterday. So far, over 1 crore 53 lakh people have recovered from

the COVID-19 infection in the country.

Ten States including Maharashtra, Karnataka, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat & Kerala continue to be the major hotspots of the viral pandemic. Nearly 75 per cent of the new cases are reported from these 10 states. The Health Ministry has informed that three thousand 498 COVID related deaths were reported in the last 24 hours taking the cumulative toll to 2 lakh 8 thousand 330.

With a special focus on the 5-point principle of 'Test, Track, Treat, Isolate & Vaccinate', the number of cumulative COVID-19 testing reported by Indian Council of Medical Research, ICMR has surpassed the figure of 28 crore

63 lakh. The apex medical research body has informed that in the past 24 hours more than 19 lakh 20 thousand samples were tested in the country.

As of today, two thousand 498 laboratories are engaged in the work of testing COVID samples across the country which includes one thousand 239 government and one thousand 259 private labs. (Source:india.gov.in)

The Office of the Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government of India has released home care tips for managing mild symptoms of COVID-19. It has advised people not to panic if they experience any COVID-19 symptoms, as the majority of

people can manage their infections at home by following self-care measures. They have been recommended that at the first sign of experiencing the symptoms, people should isolate at home and begin following self-care measures.

It is important to isolate, rest

and keep hydrated, and regularly monitor the patient's blood oxygen levels and temperature. The patient has to consult a doctor if the fever persists or if SpO2 levels fall below 92 per cent. The guidance also highlights the importance of keeping the patient's doors and windows open to keep the room

well ventilated.

The guidance outlines the importance of getting vaccinated to reduce the spread of the virus. It also reminds people that even after being vaccinated, it is essential to continue to follow COVID appropriate behaviour. (Source: india.gov.in)


