Undersea Optical Fibre Cable between Chennai and Port Blair & six other Islands; advance work awarded

Port Blair, May 23

The work for laying Under-sea Optical Fibre Cable between Chennai and Port Blair and six islands has been finalized. The BSNL has issued the advance work order to Japanese firm yesterday May 22, 2018. The project will be completed within 24 months.

The laying of Under-sea Optical Fibre Cable project between Chennai and Port Blair and six islands (viz. Little Andaman, Car Nicobar, Havelock, Kamorta, Campbell Bay and Long Islands) is a long term solution recommended by TRAI. This was perused by A&N Administration at the highest level and accordingly Union Cabinet

under the Chairmanship of Prime Minister, approved the project in September 2016.

The project is anchored by BSNL. The total project cost is around Rs.1232 crores with CAPEX cost of around Rs.956.00 crores and OPEX cost for five years is around 276.00 crores. As a part of comprehensive plan, A&N Administration has also

been vigorously perusing following projects with DOT to improve the Telecom facilities within islands and between different islands. Inadequate internet bandwidth and inconsistent Telecom connectivity has been major challenge for A&N Administration to implement various developmental schemes apart from generating

avenues for employment for local youths.

In order to make a comprehensive Telecom Plan, A&N Administration approached Department of Telecommunication (DOT) and on its request, Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) carried out a detailed study for improving Telecom services in A&N Islands and recommended various

Implementation of National e-Governance Plan District Administration, N & M rolls out 12 services of Revenue Deptt.

Port Blair, May 23

The National e-Governance Plan of Indian Government seeks to lay the foundation and provide the impetus for long-term growth of e-Governance within the country. With the motto of creation of the right governance and integrated service levels, the District Administration, North & Middle Andaman has rolled out 12 services of Revenue Department, Mayabunder through CSCs. The process for applying the 12 services

is as follows:

The citizen has to visit the nearest Common Service Centre (CSC) and submit their application with all the necessary documents in original. The CSC operator shall scan only original of all the necessary documents as prescribed in the checklist for the concerned service and upload the same in the State Portal of Andaman & Nicobar Administration.

Once the uploading is completed, an SMS shall be forwarded to the concerned

applicant's mobile number stating that his/her application for concerned services has been submitted successfully and unique identification number viz. acknowledgement number consisting of 14 digits has been generated. This acknowledgement number shall be the reference number for the citizen for tracing their application online for the particular service. The same application shall be

Integrated Prog. for Senior Citizens Social Welfare Deptt. invites proposals for running & maintenance of projects

Port Blair, May 23

The Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment is implementing a Central Sector Scheme, 'Integrated Programme for Senior Citizens' under which, financial assistance in the form of grant in aid is released to implementing agencies such as NGOs, Voluntary Organizations, Panchayati Raj Institutions etc. for running and maintenance of various projects such as old age homes, physiotherapy clinics etc., for the welfare of senior citizens.

The Programmes admissible for assistance under the scheme include

maintenance of senior citizen's homes/senior citizen's homes for 50 elderly women including those under Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY) for which an amount of Rs. 23,24,375/- (all inclusive) will be provided, since A&N Islands has been classified as 'Y' class city. For the maintenance of continuous care home and homes for senior citizens afflicted with alzheimer's disease / dementia for a minimum of 20 senior citizens, an amount of Rs. 25,64,500/- will be provided. For mobile medicare unit for senior citizens, an amount of Rs. 11,20,800/- will be provided. Physiotherapy clinics for Senior Citizens,

for which, an amount of Rs. 16,66,000/- will be provided. For maintenance of regional resource and training centre, an amount of Rs. 13,89,800/- will be provided. Apart from this, upto 90% of the cost of the project indicated in the scheme will be provided by the Govt. of India while the remaining shall be borne by the organization/ institution concerned.

Minor irrigation schemes by Agriculture Deptt.; farmers urged to avail schemes benefit

Port Blair, May 23

The Department of Agriculture is implementing various schemes, which envisaged to meet the rising demand of water for irrigation and to adopt modern technology in irrigation to achieve "Per Drop More Crop" through Micro Irrigation. The schemes included Construction of Check Dam across the drainage/small stream, excavation of MI Pond, Construction of Dug well (RCC ring well), Purchase of Electric/ Diesel Pump set (0.5 to 5.0 Hp), Installation of Micro Irrigation System (Drip/Sprinkler),

Construction of Lined pond on hill top a) Size 15m x 10m x 2 m, Renovation of Existing (old) pond, Renovation of Existing Ring Well and Land shaping in coastal and low lying areas, for which subsidy is provided under these schemes.

According to a press release received here, the Department has so far created more than 1554 Nos. of minor irrigation ponds, 751 ring wells and about 144 Nos. check dams with a potential creation of 4769.2 ha. of land to facilitate irrigation facility to the islands farmers to enhance the crop productivity and to

increase the farmers economy. Prime Minister Shri. Narendra Modi has also emphasized more thrust to create small water harvesting structure to achieve 'Har Khet Ko Pani' under Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY).

Former South African Test captain AB de Villiers retires from international cricket

Johannesburg, May 23
Former South African Test captain Abraham Benjamin de Villiers, one of the most devastating batsmen of his generation, retired from all forms international cricket on Wednesday. De Villiers made the announcement of quitting on his Twitter handle in a short video after playing international cricket for 14 years.



"Hi, This is the Tuks cricket club at the high-performance center where 14 seasons ago, I arrived as a nervous youngster when I was first called into the Proteas squad. Today at the same place, I want to let you know that I have retired from all international cricket with immediate effect. Of the 114 Test matches, 228 One day Internationals, 78 T20 Internationals, it is time for others to take over, I have had my turn and to be honest I'm tired. This is a tough decision, I have thought long and hard about it and I would like to retire while still playing decent cricket. After

India and Australia, now feels the right time to step aside," he said. De Villiers is regarded as one of the greatest batsmen of all time. He batting records include the world's fastest ODI 50, 100 and 150 and the fastest Test century by a South African. De Villiers slammed the fastest T20I 50 by a South African. He currently plays for the Royal Challengers Bangalore team in the Indian Premier League (IPL). De Villiers started his career as a wicket-keeper/batsman, but played most often as a frontline batsman. He batted at various positions, but mainly in the middle-order.

unorthodox shots behind the wicket-keeper and slips, earning him the nickname 'Mr 360'. He made his international debut in a Test match against England in 2004 and first played an ODI in early 2005. De Villiers debut in Twenty20 International cricket came in 2006. He captained South Africa in all formats, but stepped down from Test captaincy after his injuries. De Villiers continued in limited over formats. However, with defeats in the 2017 ICC Champions Trophy and England series, he also stepped down from limited over the captaincy.

Asian Games 2018: IOA submits list of 906 athletes, up to 300 face the axe

New Delhi, May 23
Another selection controversy stares the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and Sports Ministry in the face, after the former, on Tuesday, submitted a jumbo list of 906 athletes in 40 sports for this year's Asian Games in Indonesia. In a high-level meeting between the ministry, IOA and Sports Authority of India (SAI) here, it was decided that at least 250 to 300 names will be removed before June 30, the deadline to submit the contingent list to the organisers. The Asian Games are scheduled to be held in Jakarta and Palembang from August 18 to September 2. A senior IOA official said the teams will be picked in accordance with the selection

criteria laid down by the government in 2015, which lay emphasis on performance. These norms have been relaxed in certain cases, but a ministry official insisted they will be strictly implemented for the upcoming Asiad. Curiously, this policy was enforced after the IOA had sent a bloated contingent list of 935 members, which included 662 athletes, four years ago for the Incheon Games. Back then, the issue reached the PMO, which eventually cleared most athletes. This year, however, the nomination of 906 athletes has raised a few eyebrows. "Right now, we have entries in all sports that will be played at the Asian Games. Of course, we won't be sending all of them. At

this stage, we have called for all potential competitors to ensure we do not miss out on any name, as was the case during the Commonwealth Games last month. By June 30, we will cut down the names to around 650," an IOA official said after the meeting. All entries will be vetted over the next one month and athletes who do not have a chance of a podium finish are likely to be on the chopping block. Fringe sports such as modern pentathlon, equestrian, roller sports, jet ski and paragliding, baseball and soft ball, soft tennis and a few forms of martial arts might be ignored altogether along with events like contract bridge, sailing and sport climbing.

100% cost of the projects indicated in the scheme shall be provided by the Govt. Under the Scheme, assistance will be sanctioned to the agencies mentioned, subject to the terms and conditions laid down by this Ministry. Priority would be given to the State Governments / UT Administrations for supporting the projects under the Scheme of IPSrC through registered societies/ Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) / local bodies, in the vicinity of hospitals, as far as possible, non-governmental/voluntary organizations, institutions or organizations set up by Government as autonomous/subordinate bodies and Government recognized educational institutions, charitable hospitals/ nursing homes, and recognized youth organizations such as Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS). The eligibility criteria for Non-Governmental Voluntary Organisations for assistance under the scheme are as below:
i) The NGO should be a registered body, under an appropriate Act, so that it gets a corporate status and a legal personality and a group liability is established for its activities.
ii) It should be registered either under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 or relevant State Societies Registration Act and should have already been working for at least two years; or a Public Trust registered under any law for the time being in force or a charitable company licensed under the Companies Act, 2013.
iii) The Organization shall have a properly constituted managing body with its powers, duties and responsibilities clearly defined and laid down in a written Constitution; It shall have an appropriate administrative structure and a duly constituted Managing/ Executive Committee;
iv) The organization should have been initiated and governed by its own members on democratic principles.
v) The aims and objects of the organization and its programmes in fulfillment of those aims and objects should be specifically laid down;
vi) The Organization should not be run for profit to any individual or a body of individuals; the Organization should possess proven credentials and capabilities to handle such projects.

Proposals for running / maintenance of the projects have been invited from Non Governmental/Voluntary Organizations, Government- recognised schools, colleges, educational institutions, Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan, NSS, Charitable Hospitals/ Nursing Homes, which are desirous of availing the Central Government assistance for running the projects under the Integrated Programme for Senior Citizens.

Hesson replaces Lehmann in Kumble-led ICC Cricket Committee

Dubai, May 23

New Zealand's Mike Hesson today replaced Australian Darren Lehmann as the coach representative in the ICC Cricket Committee led by former India captain Anil Kumble. Lehmann had stepped down as Australia coach in the wake of the ball-tampering controversy in South Africa in March, making him ineligible to be a part of the committee. Former

Australia women's captain and ICC Cricket Hall of Famer Belinda Clark and Scotland captain Kyle Coetzer have also been appointed to the committee, the ICC said in a statement. Andrew Strauss and Mahela Jayawardena are past player representatives. Clark has been appointed as the women's cricket representative and replaces Clare Connor (who has

completed her third and final three-year term). Coetzer has replaced Ireland's Kevin O'Brien as the Associate Members representative (Ireland is now a Full Member, which means O'Brien has become ineligible). Hesson, 43, has been New Zealand's coach since 2012. He masterminded the Black Caps' maiden appearance in the final of the World Cup in 2015.

MV Bharat Seema develops technical snag; halted at Hut Bay Port

MV Bharat Seema, which sailed to Car Nicobar via Hut Bay yesterday (May 22, 2018) from Port Blair had developed technical snag in her main engine and the vessel is halted at Hut Bay Port since 22nd May, 2018 pm. forwarded to the concerned Patwari circle for report/comments.

The Patwari shall fill up their report after field verification online through State Portal with their own user credential which has already been provided to all Patwaries under Mayabunder Tehsil and forward the application to the concerned Revenue Inspector for verification. The Revenue Inspector in turn using his own user credential, shall verify the report of Patwari and shall forward the application to Tehsildar with his remarks / report. Further, the Tehsildar, on verifying all the documents uploaded by the applicants and reports of Patwari and Revenue Inspector, shall approve / reject as per the case may be.

Once the services are approved or rejected by the Tehsildar, the applicant shall receive an SMS stating that their application for the particular services has been approved or rejected. After receiving the SMS, the citizen can visit the nearest Common Service Centre and get the hardcopy of the certificate as requested by the applicant. This certificate shall be considered as original certificate which can be used for any other purpose.

Similarly, citizen can also view the status of the application at any stages of the workflow through their nearest CSC's by providing the acknowledgement number received by SMS while submitting the application. The process adopted shall curtail the number of citizen visit to Tehsil Office for getting the status of the application and in turn benefit them by receiving the concerned certificate at their doorstep, which is one core objective of SP & SSDG Project, a communication said.

measures to improve Island-Mainland and Inter-islands connectivity both on short term and long term basis. Some of the projects are in advanced stage of implementation while few of them are at tendering stage.
(i) Laying additional Optical Fibre Cable between Port Blair and Diglipur for ensuring redundancy
(ii) Installation of additional 151 (4G/3G) Mobile Towers for connecting all the inhabited villages having population of more than 10 persons through competitive bidding by USOF.
(iii) Installation of additional 22 (4G/3G) mobile towers along National Highway and places of tourist importance / Historical importance by BSNL. The Undersea Optical Fibre Cable project connecting Islands with Mainland will provide abundant bandwidth which will help A&N Administration to implement e-Governance initiatives and Developmental schemes till last mile effectively. In addition, the outreach of quality Education and Healthcare will also improve substantially by using Tele-education and Tele-medicines for serving last mile. The A&N Administration has also taken initiatives to create conducive environment for establishing IT & ITeS Industry for employment generation once the Under-sea Fibre Cable project is implemented.
