Chief Secretary holds inter-departmental coordination meeting

All Departments directed to make a track history of assets

Stresses on inter-departmental coordination in implementation of various projects

Port Blair, June 14
 The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain today held an inter-departmental review meeting with the Secretaries and Heads of Department in the conference hall of Secretariat here. During the meeting, he stressed on the need for inter-departmental coordination in implementation of various projects.



He said, Departments should coordinate on all issues and issues pertaining to APWD have been taken up

earlier and now issues concerning Forest Department are being taken up. He asked the Departments to do internal study of various projects and things they have done in the past. In

this direction, he directed all Departments to make a track history of the assets they have built over the past 25 years.

The Chief Secretary also directed the Departments to interact

on implementation of various projects and sort out the impediments and focus on the interest of the projects through better coordination among each other whether it is APWD,

Forest or Defence. Many developmental projects are held up and not taking off due to inter-departmental issues, Chief Secretary observed. He further mentioned that the Govt. assets should not go waste, which have been approved over years and the Department should address their audited legal cases. He stated that the hiring of vehicle as far as possible should be reduced. The Chief Secretary also mentioned that the coordination meeting shall be held every Monday. During the

Chief Secretary directs all Departments to plant saplings of fruit bearing trees

Intensive tree plantation drive carried out by PBMC

Port Blair, June 14

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain has asked all the Departments to plant saplings of fruit bearing trees which will help the people in difficult times. He urged the Departments to plant saplings such as sapota, guava, jackfruit, drumstick etc. which are conducive to the agro climatic condition of the Islands. Fruit trees keep people connected with its growing process besides providing nutritious food source and food security during challenging times. Planting fruit trees also has many helpful environmental benefits.

Meanwhile, the PBMC has undertaken intensive tree plantation drive in Port Blair. During the drive, over 100 saplings which include fruit bearing sapling were planted. Various green patches were identified and plantation was carried out at these areas viz. near Model School, Link Road, Goalghar, Hawaghar junction, Nayagaon etc. The Secretary, PBMC said that tree plantation is aimed not only at improving the environment, it also helps in beautifying the city, transforming garbage dumps and also helps citizens to connect with their urban local body as they can also participate in tree plantation and their maintenance. It is notable that, road side dustbin sites have been converted as green by PBMC after the initiation of door to door collection of household generated wastes.



It is also to mention that on World Environment Day, plantation was also done at Capt. Ashim Bhattacharya Park in which various types of plants and trees were planted like fruit plants, flowering plants, large shade, herbs etc.

The general public have also been urged to participate with the protection/conservation of these plants and not to dispose of the waste at roadside and at green patches. More planting will be taken up by covering all the locations of dismantled dustbin areas within the city's municipal limits.

District Administration extends lockdown in South Andaman District till June 21 with some relaxation

- Shops selling essential items to be open from 6 am to 10 am
- Commercial vehicles such as autos and taxis shall be permitted to ply between 6 am & 10 am with max. 2 persons
- Shops dealing with non essential items shall be allowed to open on Saturday, Sunday & Monday between 6 am & 10 am

Port Blair, June 14

In order to place stricter measures of isolation and social distancing in the South Andaman District to control the surge in the cases of COVID-19 and also to prevent any disturbance to the peace and tranquility, Shri Suneel Anchipaka, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, in exercise of the powers vested U/s 144 of Cr.P.C., has extended the lockdown in the entire District of South Andaman for a further period of one week

till June 21 which will come into effect from June 15.

As per the order, shops selling essential items such as Provision Stores, Vegetable shops, shops dealing with food, groceries, fruits, dairy and milk booth/shop, meat and fish, animal feed/fodder, bakeries shall be allowed to open between 6 am to 10 am by observing COVID appropriate behavior. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure

Administration gives some relaxation with caution

Past experience shows inter-island & mainland movement- a contributing factor in rise in COVID cases in Isles

Port Blair, June 14

The A&N Administration is proactively dealing with COVID-19 situation in A&N Islands and to deal with the pandemic it has imposed lockdown which has resulted in slight reduction in the number of active cases.

Taking into account the safety of the citizens, the Administration has adopted a cautious approach and has given some relaxation while further extending the lockdown upto June 21.

The past record shows that inter-island movement and movement from

mainland has grossly contributed in increase in the number of positive cases in A&N Islands. The opening of more flights and inter-island vessels will only add to the increase in the number of cases and so the Administration is very cautiously moving ahead.

It is to mention that for the convenience of the citizens, the lockdown has been extended with further relaxation pertaining to timing of opening of shops dealing with essential items from 6 am to 10 am besides shops dealing with non

1, 32, 542 doses of vaccine administered in A&N Islands so far; 13, 051 persons of 18 to 44 years vaccinated

Port Blair, June 14

The safety of the citizens is the foremost priority of the Administration, especially during this pandemic time. To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries is being initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands. Accordingly,



the vaccination began with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine for Health Care Workers followed by frontline workers and vulnerable population with comorbidities.

Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44 years which is currently underway.

About 276 Advocates and staff of High Court

and District Court were vaccinated today at the Court premises. The vaccination drive got underway in the presence of District and Sessions Judge, A&N Islands, Subash Kumar Kar, Additional District and Sessions Judge, Raja Chatterjee and Chief Judicial Magistrate, Port Blair, Dhiman Barman.

stores, vegetable shops, shops dealing with food, groceries, fruits, diary & milk booth/shop, meat and fish, animal feed/fodder, chemist/pharmaceutical stores, optical, bakery, mechanical workshop shall be permitted. Home delivery of items should be preferred. Any overcrowding on violation of social distancing will be responsibility of the shopkeepers and will invite fine of Rs.4000/- for violation of social distancing norms and Rs. 5000/- for overcrowding in shops/ establishments, along with sealing of shop for 7 days. The establishments listed above shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of atleast l(ome) meter from a person and not allowing more than 5 persons at a time inside the premises. The said premises shall remain open on all days between 06.00 AM to 10.00 AM.

All non-essential shops are permitted to open on all Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays between 06.00 AM to 10.00 AM. All shops shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of atleast l(ome) meter from a person and not allowing more than 03 persons at a time inside the premises. Any overcrowding on violation of social distancing will be responsibility of the shopkeepers and will invite fine of Rs.4000/- for violation of social distancing norms and Rs. 5000/- for overcrowding in shops/ establishments, along with sealing of shop for 7 days.

No movement of public beyond these timings will be allowed except for:
♦ Hospitals, medical labs, medicines and medical equipment, ambulance and hearse vehicle services, medical and its allied activities, all medical emergency cases shall be permitted.

♦ Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk Road, loading and unloading of essential cargo shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

♦ Goods transport, vehicles carrying agricultural produce of farmers, agriculture & its allied activities shall be permitted.

♦ Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, Home Guards, Electricity, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned departments.

♦ Movement of bare minimum number of Officers/officials, certified by the Head of Department, involved in providing essential and emergency services such as Pay & Accounts, Shipping Services, Forest, Banking, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication, Courts as per orders of High Court and E-commerce activities shall be permitted on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

♦ Persons going for COVID vaccination shall be permitted subject to production of acknowledgement slip/SMS.
♦ Movement of bare minimum personnel involved in providing Broadcasting and Cable services, Internet service providers, all print and electronic media persons, private security services, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/Godown, ATMs, Cold Storages and warehouses shall be allowed for which valid passes shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate based on the certification from the concerned organisation.

♦ All POL outlets shall be opened from 06.00 AM to 10.00 AM for general public and only for essential services and. vehicles carrying essential cargo shall be permitted up to 06.00 PM.

♦ No constructional activities shall be permitted, however construction activities of national importance and strategic projects shall be permitted with the permission of the District Magistrate.

♦ Godowns and allied establishments shall be permitted to operate beyond 10:00 AM till 06:00 PM for non-business purposes and shall not cater to any customers. Only internal operations, receiving/dispatching of stocks etc. shall be permitted. Establishments violating this provision shall be liable for fine of Rs.25,000/-.

♦ The movement passes issued by the District Administration from 22nd May, 2021 onwards shall remain valid.
♦ Social/Political/sports/entertainment/academic/cultural/religious/ festival related and other gathering and congregations shall be prohibited.

♦ All religious places/places of worship shall be closed for public worship. Further religious congregations/gatherings are strictly prohibited. Any person/organization violating the above directions shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs. 10,000/-, which shall be payable by the Management Committee.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services. Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s). This order shall come into force with effect from 15th June, 2021 till further orders.

essential items which has been allowed to open on Saturday, Sunday & Monday between 6 am & 10 am.

The rise in cases in the Islands has been primarily due to inter-island movement and people should restrict their movement unless it is of urgent nature, to reduce the number of cases. Public cooperation towards bringing down the number of active cases further is vital and the extension of lockdown with relaxation should be taken in the right spirit and see to it that the number of cases do not increase due to violation of COVID-Appropriate Behaviour. Non cooperation will take us back to the earlier situation and the Administration will be forced to adopt stricter measures. We should realize that it's a pandemic time and not a time for merry making, so we should be extra cautious in our activities ensuring it does not give rise to a challenging situation.

flights with 263 passengers arrived today and the RT-PCR reports are awaited. He also stated that during the RAT conducted on 61 passengers proceeding to N&M Andaman at Ferrargunj, one person was found positive. He said, that today till 3 pm, 447 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 407 were in the age group of 18-44 and the rest were above 45 plus age group.

He further urged the people to follow COVID appropriate behavior for their own safety, safety of their family members and the society at large. Following covid appropriate behavior in letter and spirit by every individual will help the A&N Administration to arrest the spread of corona virus and to minimize the positive cases in A&N Islands, the Secretary said.

The Director, ANIMS, Dr. A K Mandal disclosed that 23 COVID positive patients are presently undergoing treatment in the Hospital. Today, 4 COVID patients were discharged and 1 new patient was admitted. He said, out of the 23 patients, 16 patients are on Oxygen support and one patient is on ventilator.

The Deputy Director, G.B Pant Hospital, Dr. Amitabha De informed that in the three COVID Care Centres functioning in Port Blair, 1 new patient was admitted today and altogether, 10 patients are presently being taken care of in these three COVID Care Centres.

Meanwhile, the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 1,32,542 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2,81,603 (approx.). A total of 13,051 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date. A total of 1114 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 733 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 660 were in the age group of 18-44 years. In N&M Andaman, 309 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which 299 were in the age group of 18-44 years while the remaining were above 45. In Nicobar District, 72 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which 63 were in the age group of 18-44 years.

The online registration for the vaccination is done through CoWIN portal and Aarogya Setu App. Online registration is mandatory and no on-site registration will be done and people have been advised to reach the centres as per the time schedule provided to the beneficiaries through the App. The general public have been requested to follow COVID Appropriate Behaviour while going for vaccination, a press release from DHS said.

Nominations invited from registered NGOs for being members of Selection Committee for selection of Social Worker members of JJB & Chairperson and members of CWC

Port Blair, June 12

The Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 is an Act relating to children in need of care and protection and children in conflict with law. It takes care of the basic needs of children through proper care, protection, development, treatment and social re-integration by adopting a child-friendly approach in the adjudication and disposal of matters in the best interest of children and for their rehabilitation through processes provided, and institutions and bodies established.

In order to select the Chairperson and Members of Child Welfare Committee and Social Worker Members of Juvenile Justice Board for South Andaman, North & Middle Andaman and Nicobar District, a Selection Committee is proposed to be constituted as per Rule 87 of A & N Islands Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Rules, 2017. As per this Rule, two representatives from non-governmental organizations respectively working in the area of child development or child protection for a minimum period of 7 years but not running or managing any children's institution have to be Members of the Selection Committee.

Therefore, expression of interest is invited from representatives of eligible NGOs, fulfilling the above criteria for being nominated as Members of the Selection Committee. Centre relaxes electronic filing of I-T forms; Allows submission in manual format to authorized dealers till 30th June

New Delhi, June 14

In view of the difficulties reported by taxpayers in electronic filing of Income Tax Forms 15CA/15CB on the portal www.incometax.gov.in, it has been decided that taxpayers can submit the aforesaid Forms in manual format to the authorized dealers till June 30th, 2021. The Finance Ministry in a statement says that

authorized dealers are advised to accept such Forms till June 30th, 2021 for the purpose of foreign remittances. A facility will be provided on the e-filing portal to upload these forms at a later date for the purpose of generation of the Document Identification Number.

As per the Income-tax Act, 1961, there is a requirement

to furnish Form 15CA/15CB electronically.

Presently, taxpayers upload the Form 15CA, along with the Chartered Accountant Certificate in Form 15CB, wherever applicable, on the e-filing portal, before submitting the copy to the authorized dealer for any foreign remittance. (Source:india.gov.in)



its compliance and shall be held responsible for any violation and he shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/ establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate. No movement of men and material other than the time fixed for opening of shops between 6 am to 10 am shall be allowed. Movement shall be allowed for emergency cases, medical emergencies, pregnant women and patients availing medical services.

Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk road, loading and unloading of essential cargo shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Travel of persons after 10 am shall be allowed to proceed to their destinations at mainland on production of valid travel documents. However, the person (one person) who intend to pick/ drop after 10 am, should apply for e-pass well in advance with supporting documents and the same shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate on case to case basis.

Movement of officers/ officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, ICMR, PBMC, Home Guards, Civil Defence, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty after 10 am shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned departments.

Movement of bare minimum number of Officers/ Officials, involved in providing services such as Pay & Accounts, Shipping Services, Forest, Banking, Electricity, Water Supply & Sanitation in Rural Areas, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication shall be allowed after 10:00 AM on production of movement passes already issued by the Office of District Magistrate. The concerned department should also ensure that such officials are called on for duties on alternate days to maintain COVID appropriate behavior at workplaces.

Movement of persons going for COVID vaccination after 10 am shall be permitted subject to production of acknowledgment slip/SMS. Movement of personnel involved in providing Broadcasting, all print and electronic media persons after 10 am shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of bare minimum personnel involved in Private security services, Cable services, Internet service providers, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/ Godown, ATMs, e-commerce activities, Cold Storages and warehouses shall be allowed till 6 pm on production of e-passes already issued to such persons by the Office of District Magistrate. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/ In-Charge of the shop/ business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/ in-charge shall be held responsible and he shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty Five Thousand Only) and shall also be liable for action under DM Act. The concerned organization should also ensure that such officials are called on for duties on alternate days to maintain COVID appropriate behavior at workplaces.

All POL outlets shall be opened from 6 am to 1 pm. Movement of bare minimum private medical personnel such as Doctors, nursing staff, paramedics etc. attached with diagnostic centres and clinics, veterinary clinics shall be allowed after 10 am on production of e-passes already issued to such persons by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of persons from containment zones shall be strictly restricted and shall only be permitted on case to case basis upon approval from the Office of District Magistrate.

Godowns and allied establishments shall be permitted to operate beyond 10 am till 6 pm for non-business purposes and shall not cater to any customers. Only internal operations, receiving/ dispatching of stocks etc. shall be permitted. Establishments violating this provision shall be liable for fine of Rs.50,000/-.

Port services will continue to operate as usual and both essential and non-essential cargo can be moved in and out of port, as per requirement for loading/ unloading/ clearing of cargo and the same shall be permitted till 6 pm only.

Persons involved in distribution of milk shall be permitted till 06:00 PM on production of e-passes already issued/ to be issued by the Office of District Magistrate. No constructional activities shall be permitted, however construction activities of national importance and strategic projects shall be permitted with the permission of the District Magistrate.

Movement of persons involved with Hotels/ Restaurants and Mess to be certified by the firm/ organisation for home delivery of food shall be allowed between 8 am to 9 pm on production of e-passes already issued by the Office of District Magistrate. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/ In-Charge of the shop/ business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/ in-charge shall be held responsible and he shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/ establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

Shops dealing with non-essential items shall be allowed to open on Saturday, Sunday and Monday between 6 am to 10 am by observing COVID appropriate behavior. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/ In-Charge of the shop/ business establishment to ensure its compliance, the owner/ in-charge shall be held responsible and he shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/ establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

Commercial vehicles such as Autos and Taxis shall be permitted to ply between 6 am to 10 am only with maximum two passengers.

e-pass for emergency movement during restricted timings may be submitted online on <https://epass.andaman.gov.in>. The applicants/ organizations submitting applications for e-pass should invariably submit valid and clear supporting documents, failing which the application will be summarily rejected.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services.

Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s) and fine shall also be imposed as per Order issued by this office from time to time, the Order to this effect issued by District Magistrate, South Andaman District added.
