Need to change ratio of distribution of funds amongst tiers stressed

Port Blair, Feb 15

The adjourned special meeting of Zilla Parishad, South Andaman was held in the conference hall of Zilla Parishad, South Andaman under the Chairmanship of Smt. Minati Biswas, Adhyaksha, Zilla Parishad, SA today to discuss various issues relating to developmental works, additional staffs requirements, Court cases and other issues. The meeting was attended by Shri. Ramesh

Verma, Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad, sixteen Zilla Parishad Members, two Pramukhs and Officers/Officials. At the outset, the ZP Chief Executive Officer welcomed the gathering and called for healthy and valuable suggestions for speedy progress of developmental activities undertaken by Zilla Parishad. The ZP Adhyaksha, Smt. Minati Biswas, in her address informed the house

that the funds provided under various sectors is very less and also due to existing heavy backlog of expenditure, progress made under developmental activities is slow and there is an immediate need to change the ratio of distribution of funds amongst the tiers (i.e. equally 33:33:33) as against the existing ratio i.e. 15:15:70 (ZP:PS:GPs). The house also unanimously resolved that the assets created by the Zilla Parishad and handed over to Panchayats/Samities have to be recouped back as the income earned on such assets are not shared by the tiers concerned. INS Viraat bids farewell visit to Chennai port

India's oldest serving aircraft carrier INS Viraat bid a farewell visit to Chennai port as the last port of call in the Eastern Command. It is set to be decommissioned by this year end, after a saga of 28 years of glorious service since May 1987. INS Viraat is the only serving steam-propelled aircraft carrier. Its commanding officer Captain Puneet Chadha told newsmen on board the ship, the more sophisticated aircraft

carrier INS Vikrant, under construction at the Cochin Shipyard, is expected to be commissioned into the Indian Navy by 2018. INS Viraat was involved in the Operation Parakram and Operation Jupiter and also participated in the recent International Fleet Review held at Vishakapattinam.

Efforts to popularise science in rural areas District Level Science Centre to come up at Devpur, Mayabunder

Ministry of Culture sanctions Rs. 6 crore for the project

A district level Science Centre will come up at Devpur, Mayabunder, the District Headquarter of North & Middle Andaman. The new District Science Centre at Mayabunder has been planned by the Administration to ensure that the children of rural areas are adequately covered in the activities of Science Centre on a regular basis. A land measuring 3 acres alongside the Andaman Trunk Road (ATR) has been earmarked for this project.

The new Science Centre will have two science galleries surrounded by Science Park, Orchid Garden, Medicinal Garden, initially, while 'Time Machine (Simulator), 3-D Theatre, Activity Corner and Garden Exhibits will be included in future, Science Centre sources informed 'The Daily Telegrams' here recently.

The National Council for Science Museum (NCSM), Kolkata is the Nodal Agency for creating new Science Centres all over the country under the Ministry of Culture. Accordingly, the NCSM has been entrusted with the task of establishing of Sub Regional Science Centre at Mayabunder for which the Ministry of

Culture has sanctioned Rs. 6 crore to be shared in the ratio of 90:10 between Govt of India and UT Administration.

Sources further added that the 10 percent share amount of Rs. 60 lakh has been paid and the plan & estimate for the project is under preparation by NCSM Kolkata. The NCSM has been requested to consider providing a Mini Planetarium in the upcoming Science Centre at Mayabunder similar to the recently established Science Centre & Planetarium at Puduicherry.

The NCSM has already selected Architect for the upcoming Centre at Mayabunder and other states in mainland. The architect, whose visit is



awaited, will visit the site at Mayabunder and collect soil sample for testing and other formalities, sources added. Provision for roof top solar panels for running some of the

gadgets on solar energy and proper water harvesting system has also been kept in the proposed Science Centre building at Mayabunder, sources added.

Gurpreet, Sweta win gold as India signs off with record haul

Guwahati, Feb 15
Indian shooters made yet another clean sweep on the final day to sign off with a staggering 25 out of 26 gold medals on offer in the 12th South Asian Games in Guwahati on Monday.
Rio Olympics bound Gurpreet Singh shot down the gold in men's individual 25m rapid fire pistol with a total of 28 hits on target, while Sweta Singh grabbed another yellow metal in women's individual 10m air pistol event with a total score of 194.4 even though she was shooting with her spare gun at the Kahilipara Shooting Range in Guwahati.
Sweta said her gun got problems in the trigger and she had to shoot with her spare gun on Monday.
Another Olympics quota holder Heena Sidhu had to be content with the silver in the women's 10m air pistol event with a total score of 192.5, while 18-year-old Chandigarh shooter Yashaswini Singh Deswal took the bronze.



India also took gold each in both the team events to sweep aside any competition from other countries in the discipline.
India gave away just one gold — to Bangladesh — in the discipline. The home shooters ended the competition with 25 gold, 10 silver and 10 bronze. Bangladesh is at a distant second with one gold, three silver and three bronze.

Gurpreet made up for his disappointing sixth-place finish in the 10m air pistol event on Saturday by winning the gold in 25m rapid fire pistol event on Monday.
Bashir Ghulam Mustafa of Pakistan took the silver with 24 hits on target while another Indian Vijay Kumar, who had won a silver in this event in 2012 London Olympics, bagged the bronze.

South Asian Games: India continue domination in Kabaddi

Guwahati, Feb 15
Defending champions India on Monday maintained their supremacy in kabaddi by clinching gold in both men's and women's events at the 12th South Asian Games, in Guwahati. Indian men beat arch rivals Pakistan 9-7 in a closely fought thrilling summit clash, while their women counterparts hardly broke a sweat in defending their gold medal which they had won in the previous edition by thrashing Bangladesh 36-12 in the final. It was a repeat of the 2010 summit clash in

both the finals and Pakistan and Bangladesh had to be content with a silver in men's and women's events for second time in a row. It was tough fight in the men's final at the R G Baruah Sports Complex with both sides refusing to give in to their opponents. Both sides were locked 5-5 at the end of the first half before India showed in the second half why they are the

reigning Asian Games champions. As usual, captain Anup Kumar played a big role in the win as he gave India a lead of 6-5 just as the second half began. Another raider Rohit Kumar stretched the home side's lead to 7-5 by dismissing a Pakistani player before Anup yet again got his man by his outstretched hands to give India a 8-5 lead.

The top seeded Indo-Swiss pair hardly broke sweat on their way to a 6-3, 6-1 victory over the Russian-Czech team of Vera Dushevina and Barbora Krejckikova in the women's doubles final that lasted for an hour.
