## District Administration (SA) assures no disruption to normal public life

Sri Vijaya Puram, Feb. 15

It has come to the notice of the District Administration, South Andaman that a bandh has been called on 16.02.2026 by various organisations and groups.

It is informed that the Hon'ble Supreme Court, in the matter Bharat Kumar Vs-State of Kerala, has unequivocally upheld that the enforcement of a bandh is unconstitutional and illegal as it impinges on the fundamental rights of the people and disrupts public life.

In order to prohibit any disturbance to normal public life and prevent any disruption to movement of people within the District, the District Administration has issued orders under Section 163 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, wherein it is directed that;

► No person, association, or organization shall cause obstruction to:

- ♦ Public roads and highways;
- ♦ Bus and Shipping routes, depots, and terminals;
- ♦ Educational Institutes
- ♦ Tourist places.
- ♦ Public places.

► No person shall prevent or attempt to prevent the movement of:

- ♦ Public and private buses;
- ♦ Tourists and Passengers;
- ♦ Transport personnel;
- ♦ Taxis and Autos;
- ♦ Public and private vehicles/vessels.
- ♦ All transport operators shall operate services as per schedule.

► No person shall:

- ♦ Assemble in groups of five or more persons at any location;
- ♦ Carry weapons, sticks, stones, or inflammable materials;
- ♦ Block roads or public ways;
- ♦ Intimidate or coerce any person;
- ♦ Enforce closure of shops, offices, or institutions.

► No meeting, rally, procession, protest or demonstration shall be held without prior written permission.

► No person or group shall obstruct or interfere with:

- ♦ Conduct of examinations, tests, and evaluations;
- ♦ Movement of students, teachers, invigilators and staff;
- ♦ Entry and exit to educational institutions and hostels;
- ♦ Operation of school and college transport services.

► No intimidation, blockade, or protest shall be permitted in the vicinity of any educational institution.

► The Officers concerned with Government and Private educational institutes namely Director, School Education, Director, Higher Education, University Authorities, College and School Principals, Teaching Staff, Members of Educational Institutes etc. shall ensure smooth conduct of exams and academic activities.

The A&N Administration has made all necessary arrangements to ensure uninterrupted functioning of all scheduled public events, tourist activities and public life shall continue to function as normal.

To maintain peace and ensure smooth public movement, adequate police personnel and Executive Magistrates have been deployed at all sensitive and strategic locations. Preventive measures have already been initiated wherever necessary to uphold public order. Citizens who wish to carry on with their normal routine including opening shops, conducting business and attending work are free to do so. The A & N Administration assures full protection and support to all such individuals.

A meeting with representatives of various Trade Unions, Associations, Institutions, Joint Action Forum, all Political Parties was convened under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman on 15.02.2026 to discuss the issues relating to the proposed bandh on 16.02.2026 and they assured not to participate in the bandh.



With the upcoming examinations and keeping the academic interest of students in mind, the District Administration appeals to the teachers, parents and guardians to ensure that the students attend the classes and academic activities as per schedule to ensure no disruption to their education.

The District Administration, South Andaman earnestly appeals to all sections of society to uphold peace, harmony and public order in the larger interest of the District. Collective cooperation is essential to ensure the safety, wellbeing, and uninterrupted daily life of all residents.

#### ORDER NO. 168/2026

WHEREAS, as per the report received from the Superintendent of Police, South Andaman District vide Letter No. SP(D)SAR/2026/647 dated 15/02/2026 and other reliable sources that a bandh has been called on 16/02/2026 by certain organizations within the jurisdiction of this District;

AND WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of India in Bharat Kumar v. State of Kerala (1998) has declared that calling for and enforcing a "bandh" is unconstitutional and no political party or organization has the right to infringe the fundamental rights of other citizens under Article 19(1)(g) and Article 21 of the Constitution of India.

AND WHEREAS, present intelligence inputs indicate a strong likelihood of:

- Obstruction of public roads and highways;
- Disruption of public transport services;
- Disruption to Educational Institutions' exams and academic activities
- Forcible closure of establishments;
- Disturbance of public order;

AND WHEREAS, such acts are likely to result in public nuisance, danger to life, obstruction of lawful movement, and infringement of fundamental rights under Articles 19 and 21 of the Constitution of India;

AND WHEREAS, uninterrupted operation of educational institutes, transport, hospitals, offices, and essential services is necessary in public interest;

AND WHEREAS, examinations, academic activities and regular classes in schools, colleges, universities, and other educational institutions are scheduled during the said period, and disruption thereof would seriously prejudice the academic interests and future prospects of students;

AND WHEREAS, immediate preventive action is necessary to avert imminent danger and maintain public tranquility;

AND WHEREAS, after careful consideration of Police reports and intelligence inputs, prevailing law and order situation, likely impact on public life and students, Constitutional and legal obligations, I am satisfied that there are sufficient grounds for proceeding under Section 163 BNSS, 2023, for prevention of disturbance of public tranquility and maintaining public order;

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred under, Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, I, PURVA GARG, IAS, DISTRICT MAGISTRATE, SOUTH ANDAMAN DISTRICT hereby order as follows:

1. No person, association, or organization shall cause obstruction to:

- Public roads and highways;
- Bus and Shipping routes, depots, and terminals;
- Educational Institutes
- Tourist places.
- Public places.

2. No person shall prevent or attempt to prevent the movement of:

- Public and private buses;
- Tourists and Passengers;
- Transport personnel;
- Taxis and Autos;
- Public and private vehicles/vessels.

3. All transport operators shall operate services as per schedule.

4. No person shall:

- Assemble in groups of five or more persons at any location;
- Carry weapons, sticks, stones, or inflammable materials;
- Block roads or public ways;
- Intimidate or coerce any person;
- Enforce closure of shops, offices, or institutions.

5. No meeting, rally, procession, protest or demonstration shall be held without prior written permission.

6. No person or group shall obstruct or interfere with:

- Conduct of examinations, tests, and evaluations;
- Movement of students, teachers, invigilators and staff;
- Entry and exit to educational institutions and hostels;
- Operation of school and college transport services.

7. No intimidation, blockade, or protest shall be permitted in the vicinity of any educational institution.

8. The Officers concerned with Government and Private educational institutes namely Director School Education, Director Higher Education, University Authorities, College and School Principals, Teaching Staff, Members of Educational Institutes etc shall ensure smooth conduct of exams and academic activities.

9. The Superintendent of Police shall ensure:

- Adequate deployment at vulnerable points;
- Special security at examination centers and campuses;
- Escort for buses where required;
- Continuous patrolling.

10. The Director Transport shall ensure operation of all scheduled public and private transport services.

11. The Director Shipping shall ensure operation of all scheduled public and private ferry services.

Any violation of this order shall attract action under Section 223 BNS, 2023 and relevant provisions of BNSS and other applicable laws.

This Order shall remain in force on 16/02/2026 within the entire South Andaman District unless withdrawn earlier.

This Order shall not apply to the Executive Magistrates, Police Personnel and other Public servants on duty.

In view of imminent threat to public order, essential services, conduct of examinations and keeping in mind the interest of students this order is being passed ex parte in exercise of emergency powers.

This order shall be announced through public address systems, Press, Media, displayed at prominent public places, circulated to all departments, uploaded on the official websites of A&N Administration.

## ICC Men's T20 World Cup: India defeats Pakistan by 61 Runs

Colombo, Feb. 15

Pakistan crumbled against India in their T20 World Cup game at the R Premadasa Stadium in Colombo, losing by 61 runs. India extended their dominance over arch-rivals Pakistan to 8-1 in T20 World Cups as they bowled out Pakistan for 114 runs in 18 overs. Regular wickets kept Pakistan struggling and never appeared to be in control of the chase. Having stumbled early in their chase, losing three wickets within the first two overs, it was an impossible task for the Pakistan team. Jasprit Bumrah, Axar Patel, Hardik Pandya and Varun Chakravarthy took two wickets each.

Earlier, India posted 175 for 7 in their allotted 20 overs after being put in to bat.

The innings was anchored by a dominant knock from Ishan Kishan, who smashed 77 runs off 40 balls to give India a flying start. Pakistan relied heavily on spin, deploying as many as six spinners, who found assistance from the surface and managed to rein in the scoring during the middle overs. Some late flourish from Shivam Dube and Rinku Singh took India to 175 runs for the loss of 7 wickets. Ishan Kishan was declared Player of the Match.

The Hon'ble Minister noted that this will reduce costs for local fishermen and encourage deep-sea fishing in EEZ, especially high-value tuna fishing. This is in tune with the Rules for "Sustainable Harnessing of Fisheries in the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ)" recently notified by the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Government of India.

The Budget also allows fish landed at foreign ports to be treated as exports. This will help Andaman-based fishing vessels offload catch at nearby international ports, saving fuel and transport costs.

In addition, the limit for duty-free import of inputs used in seafood processing has been increased from 1% to 3%, which will benefit seafood processing units in Sri Vijaya Puram and support exports.

### Support for Coconut Farmers

Pointing that this budget provides support for coconut farmers, Shri George Kurian highlighted that coconut is a major cash crop in the Islands. The Budget has announced a Coconut Promotion Scheme to replace old and unproductive coconut trees with new, high-yielding varieties. This will help island farmers increase production and income. The scheme also focuses on promoting high-value crops like coconut in coastal areas, which directly benefits the entire Union Territory. Many coconut plantations in the Islands are aged. This scheme provides direct support to replace senile trees with high-yielding varieties, directly increasing the income of island farmers.

### Improved Inter-Island Connectivity

Mentioning about the improved Inter-Island connectivity, the Hon'ble Minister said that to improve connectivity between the Islands (e.g. Sri Vijaya Puram to Swaraj Dweep, Shaheed Dweep, Diglipur), the Budget has proposed a Seaplane Viability Gap Funding (VGF) Scheme. Seaplanes are well suited for the A&N Islands and will help improve inter-Island travel, boost tourism and provide faster connectivity for residents, especially for emergency situations. The Budget has also announced a Coastal Cargo Promotion Scheme to modal shift to coastal shipping. This is expected to help reduce logistics costs and stabilize prices of essential commodities brought from the mainland.

### Tourism and Cultural Promotion

Turning to the Tourism and Cultural Promotion, the Hon'ble Minister said that a National Destination Digital Knowledge Grid will be set up to digitally document important cultural and heritage sites. This will benefit heritage locations such as the Cellular Jail and Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Dweep, while also creating employment opportunities for local youth, especially researchers and historians. The Budget has also proposed a pilot scheme to train tourist guides at iconic destinations. This will help local guides in the Islands improve skills and service quality, strengthening the tourism sector.

### Focus on Tribal Welfare

The Budget has reiterated the Government's commitment to ensuring that the benefits of development reach Scheduled Tribes. These measures will support the welfare and development of indigenous tribal communities, including Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups residing in the Nicobar district and other areas of the islands, the Minister said.

Constitution of India.

She stated that any disruption restricting the movement of the general public, school students or stopping of vehicles will invite strict action on the spot under the relevant laws in force.

The Deputy Commissioner further stated that the Andaman & Nicobar Administration has already agreed to the demands raised by the protesting students. Referring to a Press Release issued on Feb. 13 and published in media, she said it has been decided that there will be no change in the existing fee structure, as the institutions continue to be funded by the Union Territory Administration. On the issue of affiliation of six colleges - Jawaharlal Nehru Rajkeeya Mahavidyalaya, Mahatma Gandhi Government College, Andaman College, Tagore Government College of Education, Andaman Law College and Andaman & Nicobar Islands Institute of Medical Sciences - with Pondicherry University for the Academic Year 2025-26, she informed that the Administration has requested the Ministry of Education, Government of India, for continuation of affiliation for 2025-26. Examinations in these six colleges during the Academic Year 2025-26 will be conducted by Pondicherry University as per the agreement and students will be awarded degrees by the Pondicherry University.

"This decision has been taken to ensure academic continuity, avoid disruption to students and facilitate a smooth transition in the higher education framework of the Islands," she said.

The Deputy Commissioner added that despite meetings held by senior officials of the Education Department and the Administration with the students and assurances that their demands have been accepted, the continuation of agitation is uncalled for, particularly in view of the ensuing school Board examinations and college examinations which are fast approaching.

She once again appealed to agitating students to focus on their studies and upcoming examinations and to call off the agitation.

Meanwhile, the SP (District), Ms Shweta K. Sugathan, informed that elaborate police bandobast has been put in place across South Andaman District to maintain law and order and ensure smooth functioning of all services on Feb. 16.

The event also saw the presence of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, A&N Islands, Shri. Sanjay Kumar Sinha, IFS, along with senior officials from the A&N Forest Department and other line Departments.

In his address, the Chief Secretary highlighted the ecological importance of the islands, which are home to a rich diversity of endemic and migratory bird species. He emphasized the role of such festivals in fostering conservation awareness, encouraging responsible tourism, and engaging local communities in protecting natural heritage.

The four-day bird festival will feature bird watching trails, expert talks, photography sessions, and interactive programs aimed at educating participants about avian diversity and conservation. 31 participants from mainland India, along with 7 local islanders, are taking part, creating a platform for knowledge exchange and community participation.
