## Victory in war comes through jointness among forces: President

Wellington (Tamil Nadu), Apr 15  
President, Shri Pranab Mukherjee today stressed on "jointness" among the three armed forces to ensure ultimate victory in conflicts and effectively uphold sovereignty of the country. Addressing the convocation of the 71st Staff Course at the prestigious Defence Services Staff College (DSSC) here, he said such a synergy ensured victory in 1971 war for India as a result of which Bangladesh

was liberated. "Army, Navy and Air Force are the military instruments of state power. The history of warfare bears testimony that ultimate victory in war will be achieved through jointness among the three services. The foremost example, in contemporary history, of excellent synergy and jointmanship exhibited in military history was during the 1971 war. No strategic military victory has ever been so preceded by any armed

force in the world, such as the liberation of Bangladesh which culminated with the birth of a nation, in termination of the war, he said. Shri Mukherjee said DSSC's curriculum was institutionalised to empower jointness among the armed forces. Apart from officers of the three defence services and paramilitary forces, 35 officers from 25 friendly countries also graduated from the portals of the college today.

The President gave away medals and parchments to them. He asked the graduating officers to be well versed about the history of various conflicts and latest technology available in the modern world for successful military operations.

### Petrol price cut by 74 paise, diesel by Rs 1.30 a litre

New Delhi, Apr 15  
Petrol price was today slashed by 74 paise and diesel by Rs 1.30 a litre including VAT. The new rate will come into effect from midnight tonight. With this now, petrol will cost Rs 61.13 in Delhi, Rs 64.90 in Kolkata, Rs 65.63 in Mumbai and Rs 60.58 in Chennai. For diesel, the consumer will have to pay Rs 48.01 per litre in Delhi, Rs 50.48 in Kolkata, Rs 53.49 in Mumbai and Rs 48.76 in Chennai.

## Avoid protectionism, competitive devaluation: FM to G20

Washington, Apr 15  
Pitching for more coordinated effort by G20 to boost global growth, Finance Minister, Shri Arun Jaitley has said that countries must avoid trade protectionist measures and refrain from competitive devaluations of currency as greater focus must be on public investment. The efficacy of monetary policy instruments has reached its limits and its pass through has not been seamless, he said in an intervention yesterday at the G20 Finance Ministers' and Central Bank Governors'

meeting here. "The time is ripe for a re-evaluation of the fiscal policy space, with a greater focus placed on public investment," he said. Stating that declines in both imports and exports were recorded in all G20 economies in 2015, he said there is a need to articulate an effective and tangible policy response to revive the trade engine of the global economy.

## Drivers advised to take insurance policy as precautionary measure

Section 146 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 states that "no person shall use, except as a passenger, or cause or allow any other person to use a motor vehicle in the public place, unless there is in force in relation to the use of vehicles by that person or that other person, as the case may be, a policy of insurance complying with the requirement of the Act. It has come to the notice that vehicles are normally covered under an insurance policy and in case of an accident, the vehicle owners, companies and affected third parties get compensation from the insurance company but the drivers are not covered under the insurance policy and as such do not receive compensation under the insurance policy. In the wake of the above

all drivers holding and intending to take transport class driving licence have been advised to take an insurance policy such as Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna, Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima

Yojana etc. to cater for any unfortunate accident. Any clarification in this regard can be obtained from any nationalized bank, a communication from the Registering Authority, A & N Administration said.

# Mary Kom named AIBA ambassador for Women's World Championships

New Delhi, Apr 15  
Iconic Indian woman boxer M.C. Mary Kom today added another honour to her list of accolades as she was named one of the eight ambassadors for the upcoming World Championships by the International Boxing Association (AIBA). An elated Mary Kom (51kg), who has five World Championship gold medals to her credit, said she feels honoured by the AIBA's gesture.

"It's a great honour for me as an Indian. This title means that I will be representing international boxing and this is an honour which is not given to everybody," Mary Kom, a bronze-medallist of the 2012 London Olympics, told PTI. Mary Kom is aiming to secure her second successive Olympic appearance through the world event which is scheduled from May 19 to 27 in Astana, Kazakhstan. The Manipuri is a tournament legend and AIBA had dubbed her 'Magnificent Mary' for her unprecedented gold medal count in it. The 33-year-old, who missed out on an Olympic berth in last month's Asian Qualifiers, is currently training for the world event trials slated here on April 18 and 19. "There is always pressure but I know how to handle it because this is what I have been doing for the last many years. Whether I qualify or not, what matters is that I am giving it my best shot," she said.

# India slams China's hidden veto at UN in sanctioning terrorists

New York, Apr 15  
Days after China blocked its bid at the United Nations to ban Jaish-e-Mohammad Chief Masood Azhar, India has slammed the use of hidden veto and demanded accountability. India's Permanent Representative to the UN, Shri Syed Akbaruddin told the UN Security Council in New York that the world body's general members are never informed of the reason for not acceding to requests for sanctioning terrorists. Shri Akbaruddin said this in an open debate on 'Threats to International Peace and Security Caused by Terrorist Acts'. He said, the procedures of unanimity and anonymity of the Al Qaeda, Taliban and Islamic State Sanctions Committees need to be revisited.



Shri Akbaruddin said, counter terror mechanisms such as the Sanctions Committees that act on behalf of the international community need to build trust not engender impunity by the use of this form of a hidden veto. After the attack on the airbase in Pathankot in January, India had in February written to the UN calling for immediate action to list Masood Azhar under the UN Sanctions Committee. All were told that if there are no objections, the designation will be announced after the expiry of the deadline, but just hours before the deadline, China requested the UN committee to keep on hold the designation. China had said, any listing would have to meet the requirements, stressing that it was the Council members' responsibility to ensure that the criteria were followed.
