## ISRO embarks on launching first ever 'Made-in-India' space shuttle

Thiruvananthapuram,  
May 15

For the very first time in its history, the Indian Space Research Organisation (Isro) is actually growing wings as it embarks this month on a never before space flight that would make history. The Indian space agency is all set to undertake the maiden launch of its very own indigenously version of a 'space shuttle', a fully effort. Today, a sleek winged body almost the weight and size of a sports utility vehicle (SUV) is being given final touches at Sriharikota awaiting the final countdown. Yes, the big powers abandoned the idea of a winged reusable launch vehicle but India's frugal



engineers believe the solution to reducing cost of launching satellites into orbit is to recycle the rocket or make it reusable. Scientists at ISRO believe that they could reduce the cost of launching stuff into space by as much as 10

times if reusable technology succeeds, bringing it down to \$2,000 per kg. Very soon and if all goes well possibly before the monsoon sets in, India's space port at Sriharikota on the coast of the Bay of

Bengal in Andhra Pradesh will witness the launch of the indigenously made Reusable Launch Vehicle - Technology Demonstrator (RLV-TD). This will be the

## IMD forecast on monsoon onset Southwest monsoon advances over Andaman Sea

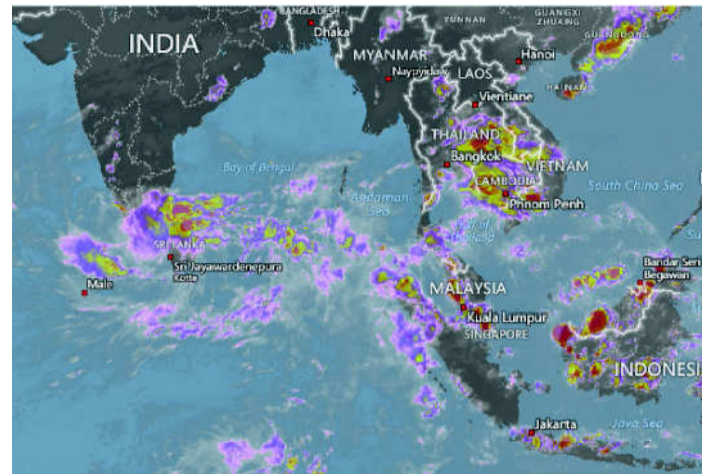
New Delhi, May 15

Monsoon onset over Kerala is likely to be slightly delayed this year. The India Meteorological Department has said, the southwest monsoon is likely to set over Kerala on 7th June. The normal monsoon onset date is June 1 when it reaches the state.

**The southwest monsoon advances over the Andaman Sea normally around 20th May with a standard deviation of about one week.**

**Conditions are becoming favorable for the onset of southwest monsoon over Nicobar Islands, South Andaman Sea and parts of South Bay of Bengal around 17th May and advancement over the entire Andaman sea close to its normal date.**

The Met Department have made a forecast of above normal monsoon this year.

## Easier to file tax returns in India, than in US: RBI Governor

Chicago, May 15

RBI Governor Dr. Raghuram Rajan has said that he finds it easier to file his tax returns in India, as compared to the US. During a discussion at the Chicago Booth School of Business in London, Dr Rajan asserted that developed nations must do their part in tackling the problem of corruption as money taken out illegally from developing countries often find its way to places like London.

Replying to a question on whether corruption in India remained a big issue, he said, it is an important tax on the system which impedes good decision



making and impedes economic growth. Stating that it has come down significantly in India, Dr Rajan gave examples of railway ticketing and the tax department. He said, there is a very strong upsurge against corruption in India. Indicating his interest in a

second term as RBI Governor, Dr. Rajan said, he has enjoyed every moment of the job but there is more to do. Dr Rajan's current three-year term as RBI Governor will end in September. The RBI Governor is currently on a visit to the UK for a series of lectures.

## Re-constructed berthing jetty at Strait Island paves way for berthing of speed boat

The re -construction of berthing head and extension of jetty approach at Strait Island in South Andaman is complete and has paved way for berthing of speed boats. This project was sanctioned and executed in order to strengthen existing jetty to extend the landing facilities to the utility of tribal population (Great Andamanese) and to accommodate the vessels having draft up to 3 mtr such as all Speed Boats, Inter Island Vessels.

The tribal populations have been benefitted from completion of this project. The project has been executed by the Andaman Lakshadweep Harbour Works and the fund



amounting Rs. 577.00 Lakhs for the work was provided by A & N Administration under State Sector Plan Scheme of Port Management Board, Sources from the Engineering Wing of ALHW informed. The new

jetty is having a solid approach of 17.00 x 5.00m length while the size of berthing jetty is 21.00 x10.00 & 21.00x5.60m. The new jetty can facilitate berthing of 75/100pax speed boats (40mtrs long), having a draught of 3mtr.

Due to the Earthquake and Tsunami waves, RCC Jetty at Strait Island Jetty suffered damaged and the jetty started shaking in wave action due to loss of skin friction which was due to liquefaction of soil sub strata.

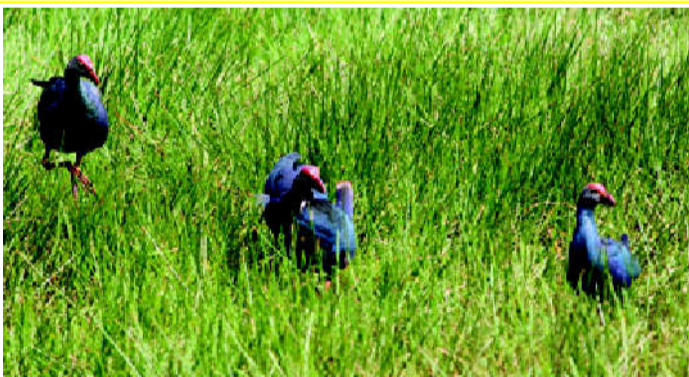
## A&N Islands home to over 284 species of birds

### Forests & Tourism Department to jointly conduct workshop for bird watching guides

Port Blair, May 15

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are home to over 284 species of birds including subspecies, of which 28 species and 105 subspecies are endemic. This attracts tourists and bird watchers from around the globe to add a 'lifer' or a new bird species to their list of birds spotted. Given the dense canopy of forests, the mangrove ecosystem and the wide array of tropical fruits, birds here are easy to spot even from the balcony. A trek, a pair of binoculars, some patience and a good guide will have one awestruck at the sheer beauty and uniqueness of the endemic species that have evolved on these stunning islands. There is a tremendous scope for promoting the Islands as one of the most preferred bird watching destinations.

The Department of Environment and Forests and the Tourism Department, Andaman & Nicobar Administration will be jointly conducting a 5 day training workshop for bird watching guides, introducing to the basics of bird identification with additional information on its various forms, behavior, calls and adaptation to various ecosystems. The participants (approximately

## Income Declaration Scheme for domestic black money to commence from June 1

Mumbai, May 15

The 'Income Declaration Scheme' or four month window for declaration of domestic black money will commence from 1st of next month. It will remain in force till 30th of September.

In a statement, Finance Ministry said, declarations can be filed online or with the Principal Commissioners of Income-tax. It said, surcharge and penalty must be made latest by 30th November, 2016.



Assets specified in the declaration will be exempted from Wealth tax. Non-payment of total taxes, surcharge and penalty in time or

declaration by misrepresentation or suppression of facts shall render the declaration void. It also said, other penal

Indian boxing going through toughest time, says Mary Kom

New Delhi, May 15  
It's a tournament she has dominated like none but for the first time in her career, M C Mary Kom feels a sense of "disadvantage" heading into the World Championships and the star Indian boxer has promised to double the aggression to counter it in what would be her swansong appearance at the big event. In an interview to PTI before leaving for Astana, Kazakhstan, where the World Championships will be held from May 19 to 27, the five-time gold-medallist spoke of her anxieties, preparation and goals heading into the tournament, where she would look to book a ticket for her last Olympic appearance.



The disadvantage she refers to is the absence of any Indian representation among referees and judges owing to the absence of a national federation here. "Officially there is no representation, so that plays on the mind. Even if we perform, we might end up on the losing side because there is no official to take up our case. Sometimes we feel very scared that who will support us. The countries which have proper federations protest strongly when they feel things have not been fair but we can't, there is no support," she lamented.

India plan 'Test disintegration' for tourists

New Delhi, May 15  
The Indian team management wants the BCCI to schedule the Test series first instead of ODIs or T20s when top sides like Australia, England and South Africa come for tours. It was the outcome of the South Africa series last year that made them think on these lines. The tour started with a T20 series which was followed by ODIs and India lost both. But the hosts won the Test series quite convincingly.

"South Africa were mentally disintegrated by the end of the Test series. If it can be done straight up when a touring team comes, it could be easier to beat them in the shorter versions as well," a source close to the developments said. The Board has also agreed with the proposal of the team management. "It's true that the team suggested this move. The Board has promised to do the needful when time comes," the source said.

New Delhi, May 15  
The new Bankruptcy Law will fast-track recovery of dues from defaulters and employees will be first in line to get their share from liquidation of assets if a company goes belly-up, says Minister of State for Finance Shri Jayant Sinha. He also said that besides, it would also bring down drastically the

time taken to wind up a sick company while making the entire process much easier. The Minister added that employees' rights and creditors' rights had been dramatically strengthened and as a result, if indeed there were a default event, employees are first in line to be able to secure their rights.

While it was end of Indo-Romanian pair Rohan Bopanna and Florin Mergea in the competition as they bowed out last night in the semi



finals. In men's single section, World number one Novak Djokovic overcame Japan's Kei Nishikori to reach the final 2-6, 6-4, 7-6 last night.

Suarez hat-trick fires Barca to La Liga title

Madrid, May 15  
Barcelona sealed its 24th La Liga title as Luis Suarez took his tally for the season to 59 goals with a hat-trick in a 3-0 win at Granada to hold off Real Madrid's late-season surge. Real registered its 12th consecutive La Liga win, 2-0 at Deportivo La Coruna, thanks to Cristiano Ronaldo's double, but finished a point behind its bitter rivals. Suarez's treble also sees him become the first player in seven years other than Ronaldo and Barca teammate Lionel Messi to win the Pichichi award for La Liga's top goalscorer with 40. Barca had seemed set to cruise to

the title until a run of three consecutive defeats for the first time in 13 years last month. However, they bounced back like . Barca was put under pressure early on as Ronaldo struck after just seven minutes to put Madrid in front in la Coruna. Gerard Pique was twice denied by Andres Fernandez from corners, whilst the Granada goalkeeper also tipped over Messi's driven effort from the edge of the area. Barca's nerves were settled by a brilliant team move on 22 minutes as Neymar freed Jordi Alba down the left and his low cross was turned into an empty net by Suarez at the back post.

India women's team beat Hong Kong 2-1 while the men's team lost to Pakistan 1-2 in the semifinals and settled for a bronze in the Asian team squash championship in Chinese Taipei on Saturday. India successfully test fires indigenously developed Advanced Air Defence interceptor missile

Bhubaneswar, May 15  
India today successfully test fired an indigenously developed Advanced Air Defence interceptor missile, capable of destroying any incoming hostile ballistic missile from the launch complex of Abdul Kalam Island in Bhadrak district of Odisha. The advanced version of low altitude supersonic ballistic interceptor missile was fired from the Integrated Test Range off the Odisha coast at a ballistic missile, a modified version of Prithvi weapon system.



long single stage solid rocket propelled guided missile equipped with a navigation system, a hit-tech computer and an electro-mechanical activator. It weighs around 1.2 tonnes and has a diameter of less than 0.5 meter.

Defence Research Development Organisation sources said the test was conducted at 11.18 a.m. from launch pad number-3 of the Integrated Test Range to validate various parameters of the interceptor in flight mode. The interceptor is a 7.5-meter
