New Delhi, June 15
The Union Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh will chair the meeting of Home Ministers, Chief Secretaries and Directors General of Police (DGPs) of Coastal States and Union Territories on June 16, 2016 at Mumbai. Minister of State for Home Affairs, Shri Kiren Rijiju and

senior officers of the Ministry will be attending the meeting organized by the Department of Border Management, Ministry of Home Affairs. Dignitaries from the nine coastal states (West Bengal, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka, Goa, Maharashtra and

Gujarat) and four Union Territories, (Daman & Diu, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Lakshadweep and Andaman and Nicobar Islands), Inter-State Council Secretariat (ISCS), Registrar General of India, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Shipping, Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries and Indian Coast Guard are participating in the meeting.

During the pre-lunch session of the meeting, there will be discussions on expeditious implementation of coastal security scheme, institutional set up in States/UTs to review coastal security, constitution of State Maritime Boards, security of non-major ports and single point mooring, coastal mapping, security of islands, distribution of

LG reviews progress of pending issues with Environment & Forests Department

Port Blair, June 15
The Lt. Governor reviewed the progress of the pending issues with Environment & Forests Department in a meeting convened at Raj Niwas today, which was attended by PCCF(ANI) and other senior officers of the Department. The PCCF (ANI) informed that the Chairman and Amicus curie of the Central Empowered Committee (CEC) during their visit to these Islands had inspected the Naval Air Station(NAS), Shibpur, Diglipur in connection with the clearance required for the development of infrastructure with the Representatives of INS Utkrosh of Andaman Nicobar Command. During the said visit, the CEC had also called for certain information pertaining to the Defence Project of Extension of the Runway and NAS, Shibpur for meeting the operational requirement of

the Command for its consideration. The PCCF(ANI) also apprised the Lt. Governor of the action taken by the Department in regard to the declaration of Eco-sensitive Zone (ESZ) in respect of 96 Islands Protected Areas (IPAs) and that of Cuthbert Bay Wildlife Sanctuary and Saddle Peak National Park.

As regards the release of balance quantity of sea sand, it was informed that the requisite permission was likely to be granted by the Ministry shortly.

In so far as the opening of Tarmugli and preparation of Integrated Island Management Plan (IIMP) and Island Coastal Regulation Zone Plan (ICRZP) of Andaman & Nicobar Islands was concerned, the Lt. Governor desired that the issues may be attended to with the utmost promptitude and cadastral maps required from the Revenue Department by the Deputy Commissioners be sent to the National Centre for

LG directs Electricity Deptt to minimize power cuts

Port Blair, June 15

Managing Director Captain B.B.Sinha were also present for the review.

Whilst reiterating the need to make the shipping services more efficient, cost effective and passenger comfort oriented, the Lt. Towards this end the Commissioner-cum-Secretary Shipping informed that the A&N Administration is already in the process of concluding an MOU with Cochin Shipyard (CSL) for repairs/refitting of all the major ships of the Mainland and Inter-Island sector. This would streamline the repairs/refitting procedures and also help in speedy

turn around of ships under refit. On the behest of the MoS the CSL is also preparing a detailed report towards up-gradation/modernisation of the Marine Dockyard at Port Blair to help make repairs/refitting of smaller ships at Port Blair more efficient. The MoS has also approved the extension of the existing Dry dock at Marine Dockyard by 90 Mtrs at a total cost of Rs. 96 crores, the work for which is likely to commence by September 2016.

Dhoni's boys outclass Zimbabwe; clinches series 3-0



Harare, June 15
A dominant India predictably completed a 3-0 whitewash by bulldozing a sub-par Zimbabwe by 10 wickets in the final ODI cricket match here today in what turned out to be one of the most one-sided series in recent times. Mahendra Singh Dhoni's boys outclassed the hosts in all departments by first bowling them out for their lowest total of 123 in the series with Jasprit

Bumrah grabbing 4/22 and then romping home in 21.5 overs. Openers KL Rahul (63 not out) and debutant Faiz Fazal (55 not out) flayed with what seemed like a club-level bowling attack to guide India home. India also completed a hat-trick of whitewashes against the hosts, having won earlier ODI series by 5-0 and 3-0 margin in 2013 and 2015

when Virat Kohli and Ajinkya Rahane led the sides respectively. For Dhoni, there were two milestones that he achieved from the series. With 107 wins as captain, he equalled Allan Border for the second highest number of wins in ODI history behind Ricky Ponting (165). Also he became the first Indian wicketkeeper-batsman to complete 350 dismissals in 50-overs cricket.

India stun South Korea; to face Australia on Thursday



London, Jun 15
India muffed chances galore, before a deft deflection from Nikkin Thimmaiah enabled them to pip South Korea 2-1, in the 36th Hero Champions Trophy Hockey tournament. At the Lee Valley Hockey Centre, India's domination

earned them the lead, through day's captain SV Sunil's 39th minute goal. South Korea equalised through brisk counter in the 57th minute, only for Thimmaiah to reclaim the lead within 30 seconds with a fine deflection, on Talwinder Singh's diagonal cross from left. The narrow victory ensured India stayed in the hunt for a medal in the Champions Trophy. India now have seven points from four matches going into the last league fixture against world champions Australia on Thursday.

Dhoni becomes 4th in world to reach 350 dismissals in ODIs

Harare, Jun 15
Mahendra Singh Dhoni today became the fourth wicketkeeper in the world to reach 350 dismissals in One-day Internationals, while widening the gap further with his India predecessors. The limited overs skipper achieved the feat during the ongoing third and final ODI against Zimbabwe, when he caught Elton Chigumbura off medium pacer Jasprit Bumrah in the 33rd over of the innings at the Harare Sports Club. Dhoni has so far taken 261 catches and effected 89



stumpings in 278 matches. Sri Lankan Kumar Sangakkara leads the list with 482 dismissals followed by Australian Adam Gilchrist and South Africa's Mark Boucher with 472 and 424 dismissals respectively. As far as dismissals in the 50-over format are concerned, Dhoni is the only Indian in the 300-club, which he scaled during an ODI against New Zealand in January 2014.

Russia given suspended disqualification from Euro 2016: UEFA

London, Jun 15
European football's governing body Uefa says that Russia will be thrown out of Euro 2016 if their fans cause further trouble. The Russians have also been fined 1 lakh 50 thousands euros following violent scenes at the game against England

in Marseille on Saturday. The suspended disqualification and fine relate only to incidents that happened inside the stadium. There were reports of minor disturbances between rival fans in Lille yesterday. Russia play Group B rivals Slovakia in the

city today, while England fans are congregating there before tomorrow's match against Wales in the nearby town of Lens. Meanwhile, groups of Russian fans are being deported from France as a result of trouble at the tournament.

RBI eases guidelines for lenders

Mumbai, June 15
The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) relaxed guidelines for lenders restructuring large stressed loans, in a move that could allow banks to more effectively manage bad loans. Under a new 'Scheme for Sustainable Structuring of Stressed Assets' (S4A), RBI allowed banks to take equity in debt laden firms permitting them to split

total loans of struggling companies into sustainable and unsustainable based on the cash flows of the projects. The latest guidelines are aimed at helping some troubled borrowers restructure and turn around quickly, by easing the interest burden on them, and in turn also speed up the asset recovery process for banks.

decommissioning the ships which have outlived their life and are no longer useful. He stated that whilst maintaining the minimum essential number of ships in the inventory, options for outsourcing the "add on" shipping services during peak season must be looked at to reduce overall expenditure. The issue of employment of the local CDC holders onboard the A&N Administration ships MV Akbar, MV Nicobar and MV Harshavardhana was also taken up with the SCI. The CMD, SCI in this regard stated that, whilst it may not be immediately possible to replace all the crew members in one go, they would look to do this in a phased manner. The CMD also offered to enroll the local CDC holders in the SCI roster on priority, if they so wished. The Lt. Governor directed the Commissioner-cum-Secretary Shipping and the DSS to discuss the matter with the local CDC holders and also convey the SCI offer to them. In the end the Lt. Governor thanked the CMD and senior Officers of the SCI for being present for the review meeting and urged that such interactions should be more frequent, a communication from the Director Shipping Services said here today.
