

Centre launches IDCF to reduce child deaths due to diarrhoea

New Delhi, Jun 15
Union Health Ministry has launched an Intensified Diarrhea Control Fortnight (IDCF) across the country to reduce child deaths due to diarrhoea. Through this initiative, the Ministry will mobilize health personnel, State Governments and other stakeholders in controlling the disease which one of the most common childhood

illnesses. During the fortnight, awareness campaign on hygiene and promotion of ORS and Zinc therapy will be conducted at state, district and village levels. Nearly 12 crore under five children will be covered during the programme. Diarrhoea can be prevented with safe drinking water, sanitation, breastfeeding and

appropriate nutrition. An estimated 1.1 million children die every year in India out of which about one lakh death occur due to this disease. According to the Ministry there has been a consistent decline in the infant mortality rate and under-five mortality rate due to increased access to immunisation and child healthcare services.

Judicial appointments expedited in last three years: Law & Justice Minister

New Delhi, Jun 15
Law and Justice Minister Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad on Thursday said judicial appointments have been expedited in the last three years. Addressing media in New Delhi on the initiatives taken by his Ministry, he said, 17 judges have been appointed in the Supreme Court and 232 judges in High Courts during the period. He said, the digital

platform has been widely used to provide timely justice to people. Shri Prasad said, significant rise in e-Courts transactions shows government's move

towards digital judiciary. A high level committee has been constituted to develop India as an international arbitration hub. He said, 2249 crore rupees have been released in three years for infrastructure improvement in subordinate judiciary. Shri Prasad said, cyber coordination centre will be established soon to improve cyber security in the country.

Neurology & Neurosurgery facilities to be made available by Jan 1, 2018



Port Blair, June 15

The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi visited the GB Pant Hospital here this morning. He was accompanied by the Principal Secretary (Health) Shri S C L Das, Secretary to the Lt Governor Dr A. K. Singla, Senior Consultant Medical Specialist, GB Pant Hospital, Dr. Shiv Shankar Singh, DHS (i/c), Dr. Avijit Roy and other Senior doctors of GB Pant Hospital.

The Lt. Governor visited and inspected the OPD Registration Counter, Casualty Ward, Blood Bank, Laboratories, ICU/MICU, Dialysis Unit, Kitchen, Nursing Home, Pediatric Ward, OT complex along with the upcoming Cath Lab site, Sick Neonatal Care Unit (SNCU), Incinerator Unit for disposal of biomedical wastes, Psychiatric Ward,

ECT Room and De-addiction ward. The Lt. Governor also inspected the new building of Burns, Eye & Cancer Wards which are under construction.

During the visit, the Lt. Governor inspected various wards and enquired about the health facilities provided to the Islanders. He also interacted with the patients at the OPD and assured them that treatments of orthopedic ailments as well as super specialty services will be made available here in GB Pant hospital soon and the referral system will be done away with. He directed the Medical Superintendent, GB Pant Hospital to ensure that patients are guided properly to the concerned OPD to ensure smooth functioning of the hospital as well as to save time of the patients waiting to be examined by the physician.

While inspecting the cooked food at the Hospital's Kitchen, the Lt. Governor enquired about the quality of the food grains and issued directions to the concerned Medical Officers to ensure that quality food grains are purchased for preparing meals for the patients. He further directed that Senior Medical Officers must personally check the cooked food before it is served to the patients. He also desired that inclusive food packages be made available to all the patients and the same cooked food be made available to the patients in the Nursing Home as well.

Regarding the upcoming Cath Lab, the Lt. Governor expressed displeasure in the delay of the work and directed the concerned officials to speed up the process of work through inter-departmental cooperation. He directed that both civil

works as well as tendering process for equipments be done simultaneously in a time bound manner, so that the Cath Lab is made ready for inauguration and patients are facilitated with the required facility as soon as possible. The concerned officials assured to speed up the process and complete the work in a month's time.

The Lt. Governor also directed the Principal Secretary (Health) to plan accordingly with the Medical Officers for setting up Neurology and Neurosurgery facilities here at GB Pant Hospital by Jan 1, 2018 besides other required Super Specialty services. The Lt. Governor remarked that by Jan 1, 2018, the Islands must be in a position to cater to the needs of the patients in all aspects and the referral system should be done away with.

At the De-addiction Ward, the Lt. Governor

interacted with the patients and urged them to give up alcoholism and lead a happy & healthy life. He also interacted with patients at the Psychiatric Ward.

At Sick Neonatal Care Unit (SNCU), the Lt. Governor enquired about the functioning of the incubators and phototherapy. He directed the officials concerned to ensure that non functional phototherapy machines be repaired and the required facilities are put in places.

The Lt. Governor also visited the Tribal Ward and expressed the desire to know about ethno medicinal practices of the tribes of A&N Islands.

The Lt. Governor also inspected the Incinerator unit for disposal of biomedical wastes and enquired about the quantity of waste generated per day and its disposal process.

Digital India

Digital India is a campaign launched by the Government of India to ensure that Government services are made available to citizens electronically by improved online infrastructure and by increasing Internet connectivity or by making the country digitally empowered in the field of technology. It was launched on 2 July 2015 by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. The initiative includes plans to connect rural areas with high-speed internet networks. Digital India consists of three core components.

- They are:**
- * The creation of digital infrastructure
 - * Delivery of services digitally
 - * Digital literacy

History
Digital India was launched by the Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi with an objective of connecting rural areas with high-speed Internet networks and improving digital literacy. The vision of Digital India programme is inclusive growth in areas of electronic services, products, manufacturing and job opportunities etc. and it is centred on three key areas - Digital Infrastructure as a Utility to Every Citizen, Governance & Services on Demand and Digital Empowerment of Citizens.

The Government of India entity Bharat Broadband Network Limited (BBNL) which executes the National Optical Fibre Network project will be the custodian of Digital India (DI) project. BBNL had ordered United Telecoms Limited to connect 250,000 villages through GPON to ensure FTTH based broadband. This will provide the first basic setup to achieve towards Digital India and is expected to be completed by 2017.

The government is planning to create 28,000 seats of BPOs in various states and set up at least one Common Service Centre in each of the gram panchayats in the state. The 2016 Union budget of India announced 11 technology initiatives including the use data analytics to nab tax evaders, creating a substantial opportunity for IT companies to build out the systems that will be required. Digital Literacy mission will cover six crore rural households. It is planned to connect 550 farmer markets in the country through the use of technology. Out of



10% English speaking Indians, only 2% reside in rural areas. Rest everyone depends on their vernacular languages. However, as of now, email addresses can only be created in English language. To connect rural India with the Digital India, the Government of India impelled email services provider giants including Gmail, office and rediff to provide email address in regional Languages. The email provider companies have shown positive sign and is working in the same process. An Indian based company, Data Xgen Technologies Pvt Ltd, has launched world's first free linguistic email address under the name 'DATAMAIL' which allows to create email ids in 8 Indian languages, English; and 3 foreign languages - Arabic, Russian and Chinese. Over the period of time the email service in 22 languages will be offered by Data XGen Technologies.

India v West Indies: Rishabh Pant, Kuldeep Yadav make India squad for WI tour

New Delhi, June 15
India's selectors have named the uncapped pair of Delhi wicketkeeper-batsman Rishabh Pant and left-arm chinaman spinner Kuldeep Yadav in India's ODI squad for the West Indies tour, with Rohit Sharma and Jasprit Bumrah the men to be presumably be rested for the short limited-overs trip. Pant, 19, has had pundits talking of his India potential for a while now, and following a successful Under-19 World Cup and Ranji Trophy season for Delhi, he was ushered into India's T20I squad in January. He offers India an explosive batting option and also serves as reserve wicketkeeper to MS

Dhoni. During the IPL, he scored 366 runs at a strike-rate of 166 for Delhi Daredevils. Kuldeep, 22, has yet to play an ODI but enjoyed a successful domestic season for Uttar Pradesh and proved an inspired pick for the deciding Test match against Australia in Dharamsala in March where he stunned the visitors with a game-shifting four wickets on day one. Rohit returned to the Indian team for the ongoing ICC Champions Trophy after a six-month absence owing to injury, and scored 91, 78 and 12 back at the top of the innings. Bumrah was Man of the Match in India's victory over South Africa, which confirmed their

place in the semi-finals. Both players, incidentally, were part of the Mumbai Indians squad that won this year's IPL. India's tour of the West Indies comprises five ODIs and a T20I. The ODIs will be played from June 23 to July 6 followed by the T20I at Sabina Park on July 9.

Sunil Chhetri overtakes Wayne Rooney in active goal scorers list

New Delhi, June 15
India captain Sunil Chhetri became the fourth highest active international player on Sunday after his goal against Kyrgyzstan on Tuesday. He surpassed England football great Wayne Rooney with a goal to sit on the fourth position after Cristiano Ronaldo, Lionel Messi and Clint Dempsey. Chhetri's goal against Kyrgyzstan in Bangalore not only helped India win the crucial AFC Asian Cup Qualifier in Bangalore but also increased his greatness quotient for the cricket-crazy country. The Captain scored the only goal



in the qualifier in the 69th minute which ensured India sat at the top of the Group. He made a brilliant run, dribbled past the defence, returned it to a waiting Jeje who fed a decent ball for his skipper. Chhetri, who was waiting in the area, produced a spectacular goal to give India the lead. The goal was his 54th strike for India, while Rooney sits at 53. Only football legends Cristiano Ronaldo of Portugal, Argentina's Lionel Messi and American Clint Dempsey stand ahead of the 32-year-old Chhetri.

HS Prannoy stuns Lee Chong Wei, Kidambi Srikanth shocks Jan O Jorgensen to enter quarters

Jakarta, June 15
India's H S Prannoy stunned World No. 1 Lee Chong Wei of Malaysia in straight games to storm into the quarterfinals of the USD 1,000,000 Indonesia Super Series Premier here on Thursday. The World No. 25 Indian, who went into the match with a 0-2 head-to-head record, saw off three-time Olympic silver medalist Lee 21-10 21-18 in a 40-minute men's singles contest at the Jakarta Convention Center (JCC). "Lee looked ordinary today and I took my chances. I am very happy to have won," Prannoy said. K Srikanth also dug deep into his reservoir to notch up a stunning 21-15 20-22 21-16 victory over fourth seed



Denmark's Jan O Jorgensen to make the quarters too. "Tough match today but happy to be on the winning side," said Srikanth after the match. Prannoy will next face Olympic champion Chen Long of China, while Srikanth will meet the winner of the match between Chinese Taipei's Tzu Wei

Wang and Hong Kong's Ng Ka Long Angus. Prannoy looked in ominous form as he opened up a 6-0 lead in the opening game and then jumped up to a 10-3 advantage. After the break, the Indian continued to move ahead to eventually pocket the game without much ado.

knowledge in the form of skill development. Those who successfully complete this programme will have an opportunity to serve in forest and tourism sectors, he said.

The Director, Indian Council of Medial Research, Port Blair, Dr. P. Vijayachari in his felicitation address said ecology and health should be maintained in a balanced manner, otherwise, it will be reflecting in the form of diseases in plants and animals including human health. He also stressed the need for acquiring knowledge on skill development for implementing the same for the benefit of the society.

The Director, Central Island Agricultural Research Institute, Dr. S. Dam Roy while speaking said that taxonomy is endangered in global level and the ZSI has taken up an initiative to develop a para-taxonomists through green skill development programme, which is an appreciable effort. He further stated that in A&N Islands especially, it is very essential as these Islands fall under the biodiversity hotspots of Indo-Malayan realm with wide variety of fauna and flora.

The Chief Conservator of Forests, Department of Environment & Forests, Dr. K. Ravichandran highlighted that in the year 2022 India will need 10.4 crores of new workforce in various sectors and hence skill development is prerequisite to meet out the demand.

In his welcome address, the Officer-in-Charge, ZSI, Dr. C. Raghunathan highlighted about the significance of the programme. He said participants will be undergoing Foundation Course on Biodiversity Conservation through classroom sessions and field visits for the period of 3 months. On completion of this course, interested participants can further enroll for an advance course of Para-Taxonomists which will be conducted by ZSI and BSI. The successful candidates will also have the opportunity to get employed in these institutions. The syllabus of this 3 months course was shared by Scientist-D of ZSI, Dr. C. Sivaperuman. The programme concluded with the vote of thanks proposed by Scientist-B of BSI Dr. Sanjay Kumar Mishra.
