PM to chair Inter-State Council meeting today

New Delhi, Jul 15

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi will chair the eleventh meeting of the Inter-State Council in New Delhi tomorrow. Union Ministers and Chief Ministers of all states are expected to attend the meeting.

Issues of use of Aadhaar as an identifier and use of Direct Benefit Transfer for providing subsidies, benefits and public services are on the agenda.

Home Ministry said, internal



security and improving the quality of school education with a special focus on improving learning outcomes, will also be discussed. The last meeting of the Council was held in December 2006 in New Delhi.

Rakesh Kumar Chaturvedi new CBSE Chairman

New Delhi, Jul 15

Shri Rakesh Kumar Chaturvedi has been appointed as the new Chairman of the Central Board of Secondary Education, CBSE. His appointment was made by the Prime Minister-headed Appointment Committee of the Cabinet.

An official order yesterday said, Shri Chaturvedi, a 1987 batch IAS officer of Madhya Pradesh, has been appointed for a period of five years. The post was lying vacant since December 2014.

LG takes up issue relating to development of Container Transhipment Port/Free Port with NITI Aayog

Port Blair, July 15

The Lt Governor, Lt Gen A K Singh (Retd), met Vice Chairman NITI Aayog and discussed the issue of development of Container Transhipment Port/Free Port in A & N Islands.

In a follow up letter to Shri Arvind Panagariya, Vice Chairperson, NITI Aayog, Lt Governor has said that the A&N Administration in 2009-2010 conducted a study through Water and Power Consultancy Services (WAPCOS) to evaluate the techno-economic feasibility of establishing a Container Transhipment Terminal (CTT) at South Bay in Great Nicobar, which is nearest to the East-West Corridor and the busy shipping route of the Malacca Strait. But the project was not pursued further due to the lack of basic civic infrastructure required for a transhipment hub, as also environmental hazards prevalent in that

area, the LG stated.

Similarly another site near Port Blair in South Andaman has been identified considering the technical viability and availability of basic infrastructure at Port Blair. This site can be considered as an alternative to Great Nicobar where CTT can come up alongwith Free Trade Warehousing Zone (FTWZ). However, further studies need to be taken up and economic viability of these options may have to be examined in detail, along with related environmental issues, before taking a final decision, he stated.

He further stated that the CTT project is beyond the capacity of A&N Islands and the UT Administration would be privileged to partner with the Govt. of India to take this project forward.

NHIDCL to take up development of Isles NH-223; expert team to tour entire stretch soon: MP

Port Blair, July 15

The National Highways and Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd (NHIDCL) is all set to take up maintenance and development of entire National Highway-223 (0-333 km) and 2 Creek Bridges, one at Middle Strait and another at Humphrey Strait for all purposes like new construction, maintenance etc.

This was stated by the MD of National Highways and Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd (NHIDCL), Shri Anand Kumar, during his meeting with the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray at Press Trust of India (PTI) Building, New Delhi on 12th July 2016.

NHIDCL, a PSU under Ministry of Road Transport and Highways,



Govt of India is developing roads and bridges in 13 states (such as Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, J&K, Manipur, Meghalaya, Sikkim and Uttarakhand and newly entrusted Andaman and Nicobar islands) worth Rs 89449 crores.

The MD informed that he has got a communication from MoRTH in which NHIDCL has been entrusted with

maintenance and development of entire NH-223 (0-333 km) and 2 Creek Bridges, one at Middle Strait and another at Humphrey Strait for all purposes like new construction, maintenance etc.

Rajkot to host first Test vs England on November 9

New Delhi, July 15
Rajkot and Visakhapatnam will host their first ever Test respectively when India play their five-Test series against England starting November 9. The BCCI today announced the dates of the series comprising five Tests, three ODIs and as many T20 Internationals from November to February. Rajkot will host the first Test of the series from November 9-13, followed by the second Test in Visakhapatnam from November 17-21. The teams then travel up north for the third Test at Mohali from November 26-30. The remaining two games will be played in Mumbai and Chennai, from December 8-12 and 16-20 respectively. Significantly as per the timings of the Test matches released in the BCCI website, there would not be any Day/Night Test matches against England also. As per timings, all matches will

be starting at 9:30 am. BCCI, released a video of new Head Coach Anil Kumble with Indian Test skipper Virat Kohli, where they describe, how in past India had many tussles with

the England team and how important this series will be. England are expected to go back home for Christmas before returning for the limiter overs leg of the tour.

"Soil Stabilization Technique". In order to explain about the technique, experts were also invited during the meeting who opined that "Soil Stabilization Technique" is 30-35 % cheaper and can be easily implemented anywhere and at any time. Soil Stabilization Solution comprises 50% pulverized cement, soil and polymers. Life of road built under the technique is 15 years and the life of wearing coat on the top surface of road is around 5 years which, according to NHIDCL, is easily maintainable.

For two-lanning of NH-223 and construction of Creek Bridges, the MD NHIDCL, Shri Anand Kumar informed that a new Divisional Office under DGM/GM will be set up to ensure the speedy implementation of the NH and Bridge projects in Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

He also informed the MP that next week onwards teams comprising of soil stabilization experts will tour to entire stretch of NH-223 and submit their report in which they will give generic solution so that transparency can be ensured.

The MD NHIDCL will also have separate meetings with Chief Secretary, Andaman & Nicobar Islands & Secretary (PWD) at Port Blair in a fortnight's time.

Shri Anand Kumar also gave tentative schedule for development of NH-223 km 12-45 and km 240-298 in packages which will be awarded to 3 different contractors. Central Road Institute will review the reports of expert teams on NH-223.

According to the MD, NHIDCL, the tender for the NH - 223 is to be floated on 1.08.2016. The closing date of tender has been fixed on 15.09.2016 and the work will be awarded on 01.10.2016, a communication from the office of the MP said here.
