## I&B Minister asks media to refrain from sensationalism

New Delhi, Sep 15  
Information and Broadcasting Minister Shri M. Venkaiah Naidu has asked media to refrain from sensational reporting and focus on the truth. Addressing the 49th convocation of Indian Institute of Mass Communication in New Delhi, Shri Naidu said, sensationalism has unfortunately become order of the day in the hunt for headlines. He said journalists must ask hard questions but reporting should be based on facts. He said presently in Parliament and Assembly reporting, media is



headlining the ruckus and sloganeering in the Houses at the cost of real issues related to agriculture and villages. Shri Naidu said they project people who break law as heroes. Expressing

Indian languages in IIMC. Shri Naidu said communication skills are very important in a democracy and there is a need to understand how to communicate and influence people. He said information with confirmation is a great ammunition against war on poverty, untouchability, terrorism and attack on women. The Minister also stated how media scenario is changing rapidly due to social media and instant news is becoming the norm. On the occasion, Prasara Bharati Chairman Dr A Surya Prakash and other senior officials were also present.

## After Rio Olympics high, P.V. Sindhu pulls out of Japan Open

New Delhi, Sept 15  
Badminton fans will be deprived of the blockbuster PV Sindhu-Carolina Marin clash after the Indian pulled out of the next week's Japan Open Super Series.

The Rio Olympics silver medalist was set to clash with the World No. 1 in the quarter-finals in Tokyo.

According to a report in the Times of India, the 21-year-old will also skip the Korea Open Super Series starting September 27.

The good news for Indians fans is the fact Sindhu will feature in the Denmark Open Super Series Premier, which begins at Odense on October 18. "She will be back for the

Denmark Open. She will also compete in the French Open next month. We had to make some changes in her schedule," Gopichand said. Though the shuttler commenced training immediately after the Rio Games, multiple events and ceremonies meant she didn't get sufficient time to prepare herself.

I know that there will be a lot of focus on Sindhu now. Other teams will be working on strategies to dominate her. We also should be ready to beat them," Gopi further added.

The No.10 ranked Sindhu will compete in the China Open Premier and Hong Kong Super Series in November.

## India Blue wins Duleep Trophy; beats India Red by 355 runs

New Delhi, Sept 15  
Gautam Gambhir-led India Blue has clinched the inaugural day/night Duleep Trophy Cricket tournament played with a pink ball. In the Final, held in Greater Noida, they defeated India Red, captained by Yuvraj Singh, by a massive 355 runs.

After opting to bat in the 5-day game, the Blues had declared their first innings at 693 for 6 riding on Cheteshwar Pujara's unbeaten 256 and Sheldon Jackson's 134. They had, then, bundled out the Reds for 356. On the final day yesterday, India Blue had declared their second innings at 179 for 5 giving the Reds a mammoth 517 runs to chase. The Reds were, however, skilted out for just 161.

Ravinder Jadeja, who bagged 5 wickets in the second innings, finished the game with a 10-wicket haul. Pujara was named player of the match. India will begin its three-match Test series against New Zealand next Thursday with a game in Kanpur.

## Devendra Jhajharia wins gold medal, betters own world record



Rio Di Janerio, Sep 15  
India's Devendra Jhajharia has won gold in the men's javelin throw, F46 event at the 2016 Rio Paralympics. He becomes only the second gold medalist at the Paralympics for the country. Devender improved his own 2004 record of 62.15 metres, with a world-record throw of 63.97 metr. He had also secured the gold medal in the javelin event at the 2004 Athens Paralympics. Devendra took India's tally at this edition of the Paralympics to four medals - two golds, one silver and a bronze.

The 36-year-old athlete, with an amputated left hand, was awarded the Arjuna award in

2012, becoming the first Paralympian to receive the honour. He last participated in the Paralympics 12 years ago. The F46 event did not feature in the 2008 and the 2012 editions. On Monday, Shot putter Deepa Malik confirmed India's third medal at the Paralympic Games.

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has congratulated Devendra Jhajharia for winning the Gold medal at the Rio Paralympics. In a tweet, Shri Modi said, it is historic and well-deserved Gold. He said, the nation proud of him.

Speaking about Smart City Mission, the Chairperson informed that Smart City proposal of Port Blair city was selected and approved with a total cost of Rs. 777.65 crore for 42 projects and this, she said will be implemented by a company named Port Blair Smart Projects Ltd. (PBSPL) incorporated under Companies Act 2013, as per the directive of the Ministry. She also highlighted about various schemes of the Central Govt. which are being implemented by PBMC.

Regarding Swachh Bharat Mission, the Chairperson informed that there are 1610 households currently practicing open defecation out of which 384 are willing to construct individual household toilets. She further informed that 48 community toilets, 20 public toilets, 11 mobile toilets and 384 individual toilets are being proposed to make the city open defecation free. She said, land for 15 community toilets and 10 public toilets have been set apart from Revenue Department and tenders for 3 community toilets have been published. For 182 households, the 1st installment of Rs. 2000/- has been released, she said. Efforts are also being made to involve private sectors under CSR contribution for achieving open defecation free status, she said. Besides door to door collection and segregation of waste at source level has commenced in 18 wards and composite yards at Gandhi Park & Brookshabad are being made operational.

She also informed about CSR initiatives by PBMC which include felicitation of mothers of girl children on Women's Day, awareness on Swachh Bharat, felicitation of four municipal employees' children for their outstanding achievements in ANIIMS entrance exam. Implementation of e-Municipality Project in PBMC, online building plans approval and remedial measures, regularization of building violation as one time will be initiated, she said.
