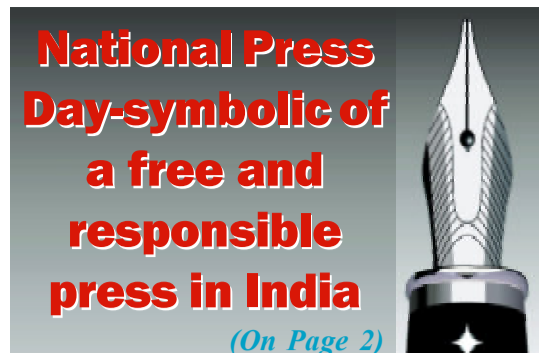

## UIDAI approves blueprint on new SIM re-verification modes

New Delhi, Nov 15  
The Unique Identification Authority of India has approved the blueprint to operationalise new modes like OTP for Aadhaar-based SIM re-verification of existing subscribers from 1st of next month. An official in the UIDAI said, the blueprint presented by telecom operators have been approved and will be implemented from 1st of December. Last month, the government had announced three new ways to complete the process of linking mobile phone numbers with Aadhaar to enable existing subscribers to undergo SIM re-



verification exercise from the comfort of their home. As per the new rules, there will be three new methods to link the registered mobile number with Aadhaar. They are OTP (One Time Password), App based and the IVRS facility. These new methods will help subscribers to get their mobile number linked to Aadhaar without visiting the stores of the telecom companies. For the ease of senior citizens and the people with disability and chronic illness, Department of Telecommunications has also recommended for the re-verification at their doorstep.

**India ready to inflict more humiliation on Sri Lanka**

Kolkata, Nov 15  
India would look to continue their ruthless streak while Sri Lanka would want to forget the annihilation suffered at home and chase what has been an improbable dream of winning a Test here when the two teams clash in a three-match series, starting here tomorrow.

There is a possibility of rain threat after home team's morning practice session was called off after a spell of shower. India had inflicted on Sri Lanka, a humiliating 9-0 whitewash across three formats even as they bounced back to secure a surprise 2-0 win against Pakistan in the UAE. There will be no let up from Team India, who are taking this series as a preparation for the gruelling two-month long South Africa tour where they play three Tests, six ODIs and three T20Is beginning with Cape Town Test on January 5. India look supremely confident at home barring a couple of selection dilemma looking at the Eden's seemingly greentop strip which may pave the way for the return



of Bhuvneshwar Kumar in a likely three-plus-two bowling combination. Opener Dimuth Karunaratne is fresh from a career-best 196 against Pakistan in the Dubai Test and the sputter would look to carry forward his form. The team think tank has made it clear that Mathews, the seniormost member in their batting group, will not be used in bowling and the onus would be on him to return among runs.

**Saina Nehwal advances to second round of Chinese Open Super Series Premier**

Japan, Nov 15  
Saina Nehwal beat Singapore Beiweng Zhang 21-12, 21-13 to advance to the second round of the Chinese Open Super Series Premier. Saina, who had recently won the National Badminton Championships beating PV Sindhu in the final, won her women's singles opener in half an hour in Fuzhou. Saina had won the tournament in 2014. She will next face fifth seed Akane Yamaguchi of Japan. Saina, who is currently ranked 11th in the BWF rankings for women's singles players, has a 1-3 win-loss record against fourth ranked Yamaguchi. All three losses have come in meetings



this year. Saina, who won the tournament in 2014 and reached the women's singles final the next year, will next take on Japanese fifth seed Akane Yamaguchi, in the next round. The World No.4 has a 3-1 advantage over the Hyderabad in career meetings and has beaten Saina the three times the two faced each other

this year. Saina is looking to book a place in the BWF Super Series finals next month with a decent showing in China. Earlier in the day, the campaign for Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty got over in the opener as Chinese fifth seeds Liu Cheng and Zhang Nan won 21-13, 21-13 in 36 minutes.

**Aditi is first Indian to qualify for LPGA Tour Championships**

Naples (Florida), Nov 14  
Aditi Ashok has qualified for the season-ending CME Group Tour Championship on the LPGA, becoming the first from the country to play in the prestigious meet. The 19-year-old prodigy is one of the eight rookies to make it to the Tour Championships in what is one of the strongest fields in women's golf. Meanwhile, Aditi has succeeded in keeping her LPGA card for 2018 after a sterling rookie season. With a string of creditable performances, including a Top-10 and starts at all five Majors, it has been a landmark year for the Bengaluru golfer, who won two LET events in 2016 and one in 2017. Aditi got the news of her getting a spot soon after finishing the Hero Women's Indian Open. She has now rushed to Florida for the season-ending Finale. The 2016 Hero Women's Indian Open champion, was tied 13 in 2017. This year Aditi has played 20 events on the LPGA and made cut in 13 of them with tied 8th at the Marathon Classic



as her best result. She also had creditable results at Cambia Portland, where she was T-15 and Walmart, Arkansas, where she tied 25th. The top 10 on the Rolex Women's World Golf Rankings and 18 of the top 20

**Denmark qualify for 2018 World Cup with 5-1 rout of Ireland**

Ireland, Nov 15  
Christian Eriksen scored a superb hat trick as Denmark qualified for next year's World Cup with an emphatic 5-1 victory over Ireland in their playoff on Tuesday. With last week's first leg having finished 0-0, Ireland made an ideal start to the return match by taking the lead in the sixth minute through defender Shane Duffy.

when Andreas Christensen's effort went into the net off Ireland's Cyrus Christie in the 29th minute. Eriksen then stole the show, putting the visitors ahead in the 32nd minute, and scoring two more after the break. Nicklas Bendtner turned a deserved victory into a rout when he converted a penalty in the 90th minute. Next year's tournament in Russia will be Denmark's fifth World Cup appearance and first since 2010.

**Federer downs Alexander Zverev, reaches semi-finals at ATP Finals**

London, Nov 15  
A day after the ATP Finals lost Rafael Nadal to injury, Roger Federer lifted spirits at the O2 Arena by extending his stay to the weekend. The 19-time Grand Slam champion guaranteed his place in Saturday's semifinals by defeating Alexander Zverev 7-6 (6), 5-7, 6-1 on Tuesday. With Novak Djokovic and Andy Murray also absent due to injuries, the top-ranked Nadal's withdrawal on Monday left Federer as the only member of men's tennis' 'big-four' in the

tournament. "It was nice to be able to show maybe that quality of mine, that I can dig out these matches, these points time and time again, stay mentally tough," Federer said. "In the third, I started to play better. It was a tough match from the beginning till the end." Zverev, who won his opening match against Marin Cilic, will face Jack Sock on Thursday to decide who will join Federer in the final four. Sock defeated Cilic in the early match, with Federer's victory eliminating the Croat.

themselves. Shri Yashpal Garg, Secretary, PBMC has expressed satisfaction about the co-operation of public by suo-moto removing illegal extensions/encroachments voluntarily. He said that the demolition drive was about to resume on Nov. 14 but considering the visible co-operation; it has been deferred for a day or two. He said that prime objective is to clear the public areas so that there is no hindrance in circulation and there is no effect on evacuation plan and movement of emergency services like Fire, Police and Medical Ambulance etc and most importantly during any natural disaster. Shri Garg made an appeal to clear the hindrances from the public places otherwise their property/items may get damaged during the process of clearance by PBMC. He said that in case of voluntary removal of the illegal extensions/encroachments within two days, the PBMC may go soft with regard to other consequential actions like imposition of damage charges, registering cases with the Police and initiation of proceedings to cancel the allotments. However, it has been made clear that demolition of remaining illegal extensions/encroachments will resume shortly and will be a continuing process, a communication said.
