This was organised by the UT Commission for Protection of Child Rights, in collaboration with the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights, New Delhi. The programme witnessed the widespread participation of dignitaries, specialists and resources persons working in the field of child welfare. Speaking as the chief guest of the programme, the Director General of Police, A&N Islands, Smti Nuzhat



Hassan, asserted that the A&N Police is already sensitized towards women and children. Welcoming the proposal of the NCPDR for conducting awareness workshops for police personnel on child friendly infrastructure, the DGP expressed her happiness to collaborate with the Child Rights Commission in protecting the interests of children. Earlier, the Chairperson, UTCPCR, Smti Kiran Tigga, welcomed the gathering. The programme was divided into two technical sessions. During the first session, Smti Rupa Kapoor, Member, NCPDR spoke on the need for child friendly police station and child friendly policing. Police Stations should create a conducive environment for children, no matter the children are victims or in conflict with law, she said and informed the gathering that the NCPDR is in the process of drafting a comprehensive guideline for child friendly police stations in consultation with the Government, which will be released

Supreme Court extends deadline for Aadhaar linkage up to March 31

New Delhi, Dec 15

The Supreme Court has extended deadline up to March 31 next year for linking of Aadhaar with various schemes and welfare measures. The apex court gave its interim order today on mandatory linking of Aadhaar with

various welfare schemes. The deadline of February 6 for linking Aadhaar with mobile services also stands extended up to March 31. Supreme Court further said that new bank accounts can be opened without Aadhaar but applicant needs to submit proof that

he has applied for the card. The government on Wednesday issued a notification to extend till March 31 the deadline for mandatory quoting of Aadhaar and Permanent Account Number (PAN) for bank accounts and certain financial transactions.

PV Sindhu books semifinals spot, Kidambi Srikanth falters again in Dubai World Super Series Finals

Dubai, Dec 15
Indian shuttlers PV Sindhu and Kidambi Srikanth delivered contrasting results at the Dubai World Super Series Finals yet again on Thursday. While Sindhu defeated Japan's Sayaka Sato 21-13, 21-12 to book a place in the semifinals, Srikanth was knocked out of the tournament with a second consecutive defeat to Chou Tien Chen. Sindhu began confidently, going into the opening game mid-interval break with a three-point lead at 11-8. She then worked on her lead and extended it by eight points. The second game was no different. Sindhu dominated from the beginning to go into the break with 11-6 lead. The Hyderabad shuttler then seemed in a hurry to wrap-up the match and defeated the Japanese in 36 minutes.



Sindhu will now play another Japanese, Akane Yamaguchi, in her final group match on Friday. Yamaguchi, who is the top seed in the tournament, has already booked her spot in last four. The winner of the Sindhu-Yamaguchi match will, however, finish at the top of the group. Srikanth, on the other hand, went down 21-18, 21-18 against Chou Tien Chen of Chinese Taipei in a 43-minute encounter. With the second consecutive straight-game

defeat in the group stage, Srikanth is now out of the semifinals contention. He started on a slow note, losing the first three points in the opening game and moving into the mid-interval break with a 5-point difference at 11-6. Tien Chen further extended the lead to eight points before Srikanth took matters in his control. The Indian shuttler played some exceptional badminton in the dying moments of the game but ended up going down fighting 21-18.

Roger Federer named BBC overseas sports personality of the year

Liverpool, Dec 15
Roger Federer extended his tally of accumulating awards in the BBC Overseas Sports Personality of the Year by picking up a record fourth trophy. In the public vote, the 36-year-old Swiss came out ahead of five other nominees in what was a glorious year following time away in 2016 due to injury. Legend of the sport, Federer extended his Grand Slams tally to 19 with titles at the Australian Open and Wimbledon. In the way, he became the first man to win eight Wimbledon trophies after beating Croatia's Marin Cilic in a one-sided final. Earlier in the year, he had beaten long-time rival Rafael Nadal at Melbourne in an epic five-setter.



Adored by the London crowd at Wimbledon and at the ATP World Tour Finals, Federer said, "It makes me incredibly proud that the UK public have chosen me as the BBC Overseas Sports Personality of the Year. The support that the UK crowds give me whenever I'm here is amazing, and to be recognised on the shortlist alongside some of the greatest sportspeople of all time is

extremely humbling." Expert panel had shortlisted Federer alongside Tom Brady (American football), Katie Ledecky (swimming), Tatiana McFadden (Para-athletics), Sally Pearson (athletics) and Michael van Gerwen (darts). The BBC Overseas Award will be part of the BBC Sports Personality of the Year ceremony which takes place at the Echo Arena in Liverpool on Sunday.

Sushil all set to represent India in 2018 Commonwealth Wrestling Championship

New Delhi, Dec 15
Two-time Olympic medallist Sushil Kumar is all set to prove his mettle at the Commonwealth Wrestling Championship, to be held in Johannesburg from December 15-17. Sushil, winner of four gold medals and a bronze medal at the Commonwealth Championship, will be competing at an international event for the first time after three years. "Delighted to represent my country once again in #CommonwealthChampionShip All set to bring laurels for my land. Need blessings and good wishes. #JaiHind," Sushil wrote on his Twitter account. Sushil bagged a gold medal last month at the National Championship in Indore



following his return to the mat after three long years. Although Sushil hardly broke a sweat on his way to the yellow metal at the Nationals as three of his rivals gave him a walk over in men's 74kg freestyle competition. He just fought the

initial two round bouts where he battled for just 2 minutes and 33 seconds in total on the mat. Gearing up for next year's Commonwealth and Asian Games, the 34-year-old is also expected to participate at the Pro-Wrestling League (PWL).

All-Indian undercard for Vijender's fight night

New Delhi, Dec 15
Former Commonwealth Championships medallists Amandeep Singh and Sunil Siwach will be among the competitors in the six all-Indian undercard bouts of Vijender Singh's showdown against Ghana's Ernest Amuzu on December 23 in Jaipur. The undefeated Vijender will take on Amuzu in a double title fight in which his WBO Asia Pacific and Oriental Super Middleweight belts will be on the line. Amandeep (Bantamweight 55.5kg) will take on Manoj Kumar from Punjab and Kuldeep Singh (Heavyweight 93.4kg) will face Amrinder Singh from Haryana. The other boxers joining the fight card will be Pardeep Kharera, Kuldeep Dhandra, Dharmendra Grewal and Asad Asif Khan. The 27-year-old Amandeep made his professional debut in 2016 against Sunil Sharma in Delhi.
