## India, Nepal agree to expand their partnership for socio-economic development

New Delhi, May 13  
India and Nepal have agreed to expand their partnership for socio-economic development on the basis of principles of equality, trust, respect and mutual benefit.

In a joint statement issued after Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's two-day visit to Nepal yesterday, Shri Modi and his Nepalese counterpart Mr KP Sharma Oli emphasised the need for regular convening of bilateral mechanisms to review the overall state of bilateral relations and for expeditious implementation of the economic and development



co-operation projects. The two Prime Ministers also underscored the importance of trade and economic ties between India and Nepal. They underlined the catalytic role of connectivity in stimulating economic growth and promoting

movement of people. Both the Prime Ministers also agreed to take further steps to enhance economic and physical connectivity by air, land and water. The two Prime Ministers also agreed that the landmark third visit of Shri

Modi to Nepal has further strengthened the age-old friendly relations between the two countries and has injected a fresh impetus to the growing partnership. In a tweet, Shri Modi termed his Nepal visit as historic. He said, it was a great opportunity to connect with the people of the Himalayan Nation. The Prime Minister said, the talks with his Nepali counterpart were productive and through the visit, a new vigour has been added to the India-Nepal relations. Shri Modi returned home last evening after concluding his two-day visit.

## Army Chief General Bipin Rawat has been pushing for fast-tracking the procurement of weapons and ammunition

New Delhi, May 13  
After years of deliberations, the Army has finalised a mega Rs 15,000-crore project under which a range of ammunition for its critical weapons and tanks will be produced indigenously to overcome long delays in imports and address the problem of a dwindling stockpile. Official sources told PTI that 11 private firms would be involved in the ambitious project, the implementation of which is being monitored by the top brass of the Army and the Defence Ministry. The immediate aim of the closely guarded project - said to be the biggest ever

initiative for the indigenisation of ammunition - is to create an inventory for all major weapons to enable the forces to fight a 30-day war while the long-term objective is to cut dependence on imports. "The overall cost of the project has been pegged at Rs 15,000 crore and we have set a specific target for the next 10 years in terms of the volume of ammunition to be produced," a senior government official involved in the project said, refusing to elaborate further. Initially, ammunition for a range of rockets, air defence system, artillery

guns, infantry combat vehicles, grenade launchers and various other field weapons would be produced under "strict timelines", a source said. The production targets would be revised based on the result of the first phase of the implementation of the programme. The sources indicated the broad contours of the project were discussed at a conference of the Army's top commanders here in April 2018. The initiative is seen as the first serious attempt by the government to address growing concerns voiced over the last many years by defence forces over the fast dwindling stockpile of

key ammunition when China has been significantly ramping up its military capability, an issue that has been discussed by successive governments. Army Chief General Bipin Rawat has been pushing for fast-tracking the procurement of weapons and ammunition for the world's second-largest standing Army, considering the evolving security threats in the region. "The indigenisation of the ammunition project will be biggest such programme in decades," said the official. In July 2017, the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (CAG), in (Contd. on last page)

### Overcrowding prisons a violation of human rights, says Supreme Court

New Delhi, May 13  
The Supreme Court has expressed concern about overcrowding in prisons across the country, in some cases beyond 150% of the capacity, and asked all the High Courts to consider the issue as it involves "violation of human rights". The apex court requested the Chief Justices of the High Courts to take up the matter as a suo motu (on its own) writ petition and referred to a note given by an advocate, assisting the court as an amicus curiae, in this regard.

"It appears from the note given by amicus curiae that the issue of overcrowding in prisons is not being taken seriously by the prison authorities. There are several prisons where the overcrowding is well beyond 100% and in some cases it exceeds 150%," a Bench of justices Madan B. Lokur and Deepak Gupta said. "In our opinion, this matter should be considered by each High Court independently with the assistance of the State Legal Services Authority/ High Court Legal Services

Committee so that there is some sanity in the overcrowding in prisons since it involves violation of human rights," it said. The Bench asked the apex court's Secretary-General to send a copy of its order to the Registrar-General of every High Court for necessary steps and report back to it. The apex court also dealt with the issue of vacancy of staff in jails and observed that "little interest" was being shown by the authorities and State governments in recruiting staff in prisons.

### STA cautions against parking of vehicles on road, roadsides

Port Blair, May 13  
All the vehicle owners in Port Blair Municipal area have been advised not to park their vehicles on roads or on the roadside and to refrain from parking their vehicles on roads of Port Blair Municipal area. Any vehicle found parked in an unauthorized manner on a public place will warrant action under section 201 of the MV Act, 1988 and penalty would be levied as per the Rules. A Joint enforcement drive

shall be conducted by officials of Police, Transport and PBMC during day as well night against obstructive and unauthorized. Parking and penal action will be taken against the violators, an STA press release received here said. The release further said that vehicles are parked on the road side and on the road even during day time instead of parking the vehicles on the designated parking slots maintained

by PBMC, which are lying vacant nearby. The roads and footpaths are meant exclusively for free flow of vehicular traffic and pedestrians and capturing of roads, footpaths, pavements and way side amenities by illegal unauthorized parking of vehicles is strict violation of Section 126 & 127 of the MV Act 1988, which will be treated as obstructive/un-authorized Parking, the release added.

The Directorate of Social Welfare, A&N Administration in collaboration with NIEPMD Chennai will be distributing mobility aids viz. hearing aids, TLM kit, walker, CP chair, Abacus, Braille slate with stylus, stand Magnifier, Taylors frame, Aditory ball to persons with special needs, whose monthly income does not exceed Rs.15,000/- per month and who is having a 40% disability certificate. The specially abled persons, who intend to get the aforesaid appliances

may collect the ADIP form, which is available in the Directorate of Social Welfare at Goalghar, Offices of the CDPOs and Mukhya Sevikas in various Islands. The form has to be filled-up, duly signed by the Tehsildar for certifying the monthly income which should not exceed Rs.15,000/- per month and by the Medical Officer (for certifying the type of mobility aid required) and submit the same at Directorate of Social Welfare or CDPO Office by June 7, 2018, a communication from Social Welfare said.

**Lewis Hamilton ends Sebastian Vettel's pole run at Spanish Grand Prix**

Barcelona, May 13  
Formula One world champion Lewis Hamilton seized pole position at the Spanish Grand Prix on Saturday in a Mercedes one-two that ended Sebastian Vettel's bid for a fourth in a row. The Briton, leading his Ferrari rival by four points after four races, put in two blistering final laps at an overcast Circuit de Catalunya to take the top slot in a track record one minute 16.173 seconds. Finnish team mate Valtteri Bottas was second, in 1:16.213, with Vettel third and 0.132 off the pace. "I needed this pole, I haven't had a pole for a while. It's a Mercedes one-two," said Hamilton, whose last pole was in the Australian season-opener in March. The four times world champion's time, on a track that has been smoothed and

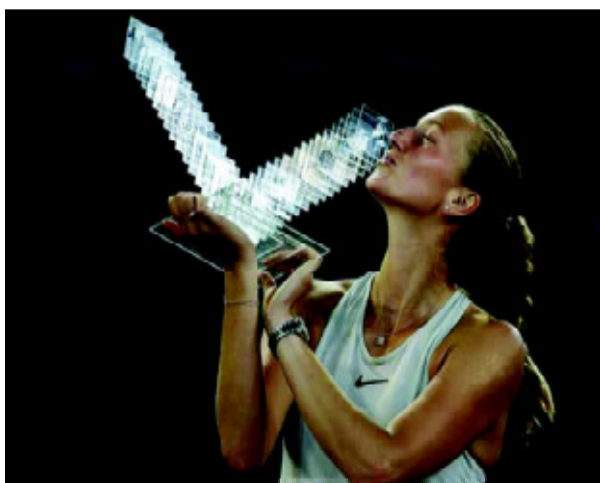


resurfaced since last year, was nearly three seconds quicker than his 2017 time of 1:19.149. The Briton has now been on pole in Spain for three years in a row and four of the last five. Saturday's was the record 74th of his career and came at a track that has historically favoured the top qualifier. Ferrari's Kimi Raikkonen qualified fourth with the Red Bull pairing of Max Verstappen and Daniel Ricciardo lining up fifth and sixth for their first race

since they collided in Azerbaijan two weekends ago. Vettel said: "I was happy with the lap... I was feeling good. I looked at the tower and I saw my name didn't go up, but we expected Mercedes to be strong so we will see what happens tomorrow." Danish driver Kevin Magnussen qualified seventh for Haas, ahead of Spaniards Fernando Alonso and Carlos Sainz for McLaren and Renault respectively.

**Petra Kvitova outlasts Kiki Bertens to clinch 3rd Madrid Open title**

Madrid, May 13  
When Petra Kvitova thought she couldn't go on, the Czech hit the critical shots to finally edge Kiki Bertens and claim a record third Madrid Open title on Saturday. Kvitova outlasted Bertens 7-6 (6), 4-6, 6-3 in a grueling final decided when the unseeded Dutch player hit a backhand long on the final point after nearly three hours. "Everything that I had in my body, I just tried to put it out, even if it was very, very tough today," said Kvitova, who was playing her 11th match in 13 days after also winning the Prague Open last weekend. "In the third set (.) I was really thinking that I can't do it anymore. But then when you step (into) the shot again, you are just trying to hit the return, you play the rally, the serves, whatever. "We both should be very proud of this beautiful final we played." Kvitova previously won on the Madrid clay in 2011 and 2015. This third win took the Czech's



career total to 24 titles, including four in the first five months of 2018. She and Bertens achieved three breaks each while saving many more chances. The key moment came when Bertens appeared to have swung the momentum in her favor by pulling back a break in the third set, only for Kvitova to strike right back and recover the advantage for a 5-3 lead. She served out for the championship. "It was pretty difficult for me to have a break in the third set and lose my

serve," Kvitova said. "Mentally it was very difficult because I know how tough it is to break her. Luckily, the chance came for the second time." Bertens' appearance in the final meant she will rise to a career-high 15th in the rankings. But that was little solace after having come so close to the title. "It really hurts right now," Bertens said. "Maybe tomorrow or next week or in a few weeks I can really look back on a great week and know I'm on the right way."

**India beat Japan 4-1 in Women's Asian Champions Trophy Hockey**

Donghae, May 13  
Navneet Kaur scored a hat-trick as India got off to a rollicking start with a 4-1 win over Japan in their opening match of the 5th Women's Asian Champions Trophy hockey tournament on Monday. Young forward Navneet scored in the 7th, 25th and 55th minute while Anupa Barla (53rd) got the other goal for India at the Sunrise Stadium. The Indian team was dominant right from the start as it displayed well-strategised attack to break the a strong Japanese defence. An early chance came by when forward Vandana Katariya and Lilima Minz worked in tandem to create space in the striking circle. Navneet picked up an assist from Vandana to send the ball past Korean goalkeeper to give defending champions India 1-0 lead in the 7th minute. India played with speed, kept the ball possession and stayed consistent as they kept up the pressure on Japan. Good defence led by Skipper Sunita Lakra ensured Japan did not find too many chances in the circle. Navneet showcased her abilities with the stick as she drove into the 25-yard



mark and assisted experienced forward Vandana drive into the circle. Vandana's clever return of ball from the right flank to an unmarked Navneet at the top of the circle saw her score a splendid goal, doubling India's lead to 2-0 in the 25th minute. India continued to keep up the momentum into

the third quarter which was disrupted by rain. Three minutes into the third quarter, India won back-to-back penalty corners but both Deep Grace Ekka and Gurjit Kuar could not convert. Japan too won three back-to-back PCs this quarter but could not beat the experienced India goalkeeper Savita.

**Federer to reclaim ATP world number one spot**

Madrid, May 13  
Switzerland's Roger Federer will reclaim the world number one spot on Monday when the revised ATP rankings are released after nearest rival Rafael Nadal suffered a shock defeat by Dominic Thiem in the Madrid Open quarter-finals on Friday. The 36-year-old Federer became the oldest ATP world number one in February when he beat Dutchman Robin Haase in the quarter-finals of the

ABN AMRO World Tennis event. But in March, Spaniard Nadal overtook him in the rankings when he missed the Miami Open. In January, Federer defeated Marin Cilic of Croatia to clinch his sixth Australian Open title and his 20th grand slam title. Federer first became world number one in February 2004 at the age of 22 after his straight-sets victory over Marat Safin in the final of Australian Open.

**Top Indian and foreign players for one-off women's T20**

New Delhi, May 13  
The BCCI sanctioned women's T20 exhibition match ahead of the IPL play-off in Mumbai on May 22 will feature top Indian and foreign players. A total of 30 players, 20 Indians and 10 foreigners, will train at the Cricket Club of India in Mumbai ahead of the one-off game. The teams will be called IPL XI and BCCI XI and the game will be broadcast live on Star Sports from 2.30 pm local time. The IPL Governing Council recently approved the initiative amid calls for a women's IPL, following the Indian team's final appearance in the World Cup last year.



Like the IPL, seven Indians and four overseas players will make the playing eleven. It has been learnt that all players will be paid match fees and a daily allowance while a business class return ticket will be provided to the overseas cricketers. "This is another important step in the promotion of women's cricket. I am confident that this experiment

will lead to a women's IPL in the near future," CoA member and former India captain Diana Edulji told PTI. The BCCI has approached the boards from Australia, South Africa and England, and the names of the foreign players will be announced soon. The Indian women's selection committee will name the players later this week.

**IPL 2018 Playoff matches and final to begin at 7 pm IST**

New Delhi, May 13  
IPL 2018 Playoff games and the final of the tournament have been scheduled for an early start. This has come into effect after a number of matches this IPL season having extended beyond the midnight hour. The BCCI has confirmed in a media release that the playoff games and final will begin at 7 pm IST and not the original 8 pm IST. IPL Governing Council is keen to get the matches to start an hour earlier than 8 pm, which has been the traditional opening time in the IPL since its inception. The Qualifier 1 of IPL 2018 will be played on May 22 in Mumbai and Kolkata will host the Eliminator and Qualifier 2



on May 23 and 25 respectively. The IPL final will be played on May 27 at the Wankhede Stadium in Mumbai. "What happens is that the night games get over by midnight. We wanted to start the games early from the beginning, but some of the franchises didn't agree to it. They especially had

a problem with them on weekends which generally have a double-header scheduled. The playoff stage has a single game on the day and we can start by 7pm so that the people who come to the ground can enjoy the match and also reach home on time," Shukla told.

a report tabled in Parliament, said a stock of only 61 types of ammunition out of 152 varieties was available, and these would only last for 10 days in the event of a war. According to laid down security protocol, the stockpile should be adequate for a month-long war. The sources said long delays in negotiations and subsequent procedural hurdles in the import of ammunition had adversely impacted the country's defence preparedness and that was why the indigenisation programme had been initiated. Last year, the government had empowered the Army to directly procure ammunition and spares for 10 types of weapon systems and equipment after an internal review found the optimum level of "war stores" was not being maintained. Considering the Army's demand, the government has already finalised one of the biggest procurement plans for infantry modernisation under which large numbers of light machine guns, battle carbines and assault rifles are being purchased at a cost of nearly Rs 40,000 crore.
