RBI enhances cash withdrawal limit from ATMs to Rs 10000 per day

New Delhi, Jan 16

The Reserve Bank of India has raised the daily cash withdrawal limit of 4500 rupees from ATMs to ten thousand rupees per card with immediate effect. However, the overall withdrawal limit from saving accounts will remain unchanged at 24 thousand rupees per week.

The limit on withdrawal from current accounts has also been enhanced from 50,000 rupees per week to one lakh rupees. It extends to overdraft and cash credit accounts also.

In its notification, the RBI said, the ceilings were raised following review of the current withdrawal



limits. Earlier, the RBI had raised the ATM withdrawal limit from 2500 rupees to 4500 rupees from 1st of this month.

Co-op sector must promote use of digital currency: Agriculture Minister

Pune, Jan 16 Urging the cooperative institutions to adopt modern technology and systems, Union Agriculture Minister Shri Radha Mohan Singh today said this sector must promote the use of digital currency and cashless transactions.

Shri Singh said the cooperative sector has to upgrade its overall activities to compete with the private sector. Products of cooperative

sector, their quality, packaging, storage, marketing, etc, have to be done as per the latest trends, he added. The Minister was addressing the foundation day of the city-based Vaikunth Mehta National Institute of Cooperative Management (VAMNICOM) in Pune today. He said that use of electronic currency and cashless transactions have to be promoted by the cooperative sector.

Panel recommends reservation for girl students in IITs to address issue of slump

New Delhi, Jan 16

A panel has recommended reservation for girl students in IITs to address the issue of slump in the number of female students entering the prestigious institutes. The committee is learnt to have suggested creating up to 20 per cent supernumerary seats for girls out of the total number of seats.

The recommendation of the committee will be taken up in the meeting of the Joint Admission Board, JAB for a final decision,

which will decide whether the reservation will come in effect from this year or from 2018. The number of seats for male candidates will not be affected and this will help IITs achieve the one lakh target by 2020.

GST roll-out deferred to July 1: Finance Minister

New Delhi, Jan 16

Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley today said the GST roll-out has been deferred to 1st July this year as it seems to be a more realistic date. He also said, GST Council has arrived at a decision on dual control issue. Briefing media in New Delhi this evening, Finance Minister Shri Arun Jaitley said the entire taxation base will be shared

between the assessment machinery of states and centre.

He also said tax regime for the power sector will be decided by power committee. Shri Jaitley said GST turnover of above 1.5 crore rupees will be assessed in the ratio of 50:50 by States and Centre. He also said assesses with GST turnover of 1.5 crore

The new Adoption Regulations have come into force from today. An official release said, the regulations, which have replaced the Adoption Guidelines, 2015, will further strengthen the adoption programme in the country by streamlining the process.

Transparency, early de-institutionalisation of children, informed choice

for the parents, ethical practices and strictly defined timelines in the adoption process are the salient aspects of the Adoption Regulations 2017.

The regulations framed by the Central Adoption Resource Authority as mandated under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 was notified on the 4th of this month.

MoD issues broad parameters

Agrees to accord NOC for bridge connectivity between Bambooflat and Chatham

Port Blair, Jan 16

During the recent visit of Shri Vishal Jolly, State President, BJP A&N Islands to New Delhi, the matter relating to issuance of NOC for bridge connectivity between Bambooflat-Chatham Island was taken up with the Ministry of Defence, Govt of India. In a press release received here today, Shri Vishal Jolly has informed that as a follow up to his earlier meeting with the Minister of Defence (MoD) and the Minister of Shipping, Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) and the officials of NHIDCL, the matter relating to issuance of NOC from Defence point of view was discussed threadbare.

The release further added that the Defence Minister chaired a meeting involving IHQ MoD (N

and NHIDCL wherein the economic viability and technical feasibility of various options and way ahead were discussed. During the meeting, the technical difficulties associated with the earlier proposal to construct a swivel bridge between Chatham and Bambooflat was put forth. Following the detailed deliberations, the Defence Minister has issued broad parameters and directed NHIDCL to

come up with a proposal for construction of a Fixed Bridge with a minimum under bridge air-draught of 50 m above high water and clear span of minimum 200m across the deepest navigable channel, so that Indian Navy as well as Merchant Ships calling on Port Blair port are able to navigate without hindrance.

Shri Vishal Jolly has further informed that construction of other two

bridges on the ATR is also on track. Regarding the proposed bridge over Humphrey's Strait, he said that technical evaluation of the proposals received from 5 participating firms is currently underway and is expected to be finalized soon. Regarding the bridge on Middle Strait, Shri Jolly said that CRZ and Forest Clearance obtained based on proposed alignment, Directorate of Tribal

Encroachments removed from Mohanpura Market; shop owners cautioned

Port Blair, Jan 16

During a demolition drive carried out in the Mohanpura Market today under the supervision of Secretary PBMC, all the encroachments have been removed from the market. It was observed that over a period of time encroachments of different types had come up in the Mohanpura Market. The corridor in front of shops has been encroached by fixing additional rolling shutters and in fact the corridor/passage were illegally made as permanent part of the shop. Similarly, four

staircases were illegally converted into shops by fixing rolling shutters and were occupied unauthorizedly. Available extra space was converted into shop with pucca constructions and semi-permanent structure with tin sheet roofing.

The area encroached was meant for circulation and it cannot be allowed to be blocked. These encroachments not only create hindrance in

circulation of pedestrian and traffic but also affect the evacuation plan and movement of emergency services like Fire, Police and Medical Ambulance etc, most importantly, during any natural disaster.

Though there is no need of any prior intimation for removal of encroachment yet for the sake of peaceful clearance of the public land and also to

Still in the process of reaching her best form, top seed Saina will look to grab the opportunity, especially since none of the top shuttlers are participating at the USD 120,000 tournament. Saina had endured a difficult season last year as she recovered from a foot injury to win the Australian Open but suffered a major knee injury

around the Rio Olympics to bow out of the mega-event in the second round. After regaining her fitness, she made it to the quarterfinals at Macau Open and Hong Kong Open before starting the new season with the Premier Badminton League, where she guided Awadhe Warriors to the semifinals. In men's singles, P Kashyap will be missing in action as he has been ruled out for three

months after hurting his shoulder during the PBL but sixth seed Ajay Jayaram, who has been in good form in the domestic league, will take on a qualifier on the opening day of the main draw. Among others, Harsheel Dani will face Malaysia's Zii Jia Lee, Abhishek Yelagar will meet 13th seed Zulfadli Zulkiffli and Rahul Yadav Chittaboina will take on Chinese Taipei's Hsueh Hsuan Yi at Sibul Indoor Stadium.

Port Blair, Jan 16 The Non-Gazetted Government Officers' Association, A&N Islands has expressed its concern over increase in number of fatal road accidents in Port Blair and its surrounding area. In a letter addressed to the Director General of Police, Chairman, State Transport Authority and others, the General Secretary of the Association, Shri T.S. Sreekumar has requested for providing certain additional measures to curb spiralling road accidents.

The Association proposed compulsory installation of speed governors in all local buses limiting the speed to 40 km/hr as speeding private buses are making most of the fatal accidents. Installation of cameras at various ATR Junctions in Port Blair city so that authorities can book speeding vehicles, dangerously driving bikers and road blocking vehicular processions by marriage groups and others have also been suggested by the Association, a communication said.

(Contd. from page 1) avoid loss of goods kept in the encroached area, few months back, the PBMC issued a public notice in local newspapers advising the encroachers to remove un-authorized extensions and encroachments but it did not yield any result. Similar exercise will be carried out in other Municipal Markets by PBMC. All concerned have been advised to remove all the un-authorized extensions and encroachment from the Municipal Markets immediately failing which actions will be taken without any further notice. The action include demolition/removal of the encroachment at their risk and cost, filing an FIR with the Police for encroachment on the public land and cancellation of allotment and sealing of the Shops, a PBMC communiqué received here said.

ICC introduces new helmet regulations in international cricket

Dubai, Jan 16 The International Cricket Council has introduced new regulations with regards to helmets used by players. Along with the regulations come a strict penalty for those who fail to adhere to it. The new helmets that the ICC specifies should now meet the British Standard BS7928:2013. These standards have already been separately enforced by the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) and the FICA (Federation of International Cricketers Association). If adhered to the standard specified above, the helmets will now undergo a penetration test along with strength tests. The penetration tests are done to eliminate chances of the ball going through the helmet and hitting any part of the head. According to ICC's new regulations, which have been



incorporated effective January 1, 2017 and will be strictly enforced from February 1, 2017, sanctions will be applied for players who do not comply with the regulations two times. If there is a third such offence, the player can be banned for one match. "Our number one priority is to have all batsmen wearing the safest helmets available rather than to see players sanctioned. It has been pleasing to see that

the vast majority of international players have been wearing compliant helmets since 1 January, but some teams have requested more time to assist them in implementing the new regulation before the sanctioning process commences," said Geoff Allardyce, ICC's General Manager Cricket. The regulations have been put in place after recommendations by the ICC Cricket Committee.
