India to become aerospace manufacturing hub in next 10 yrs: President

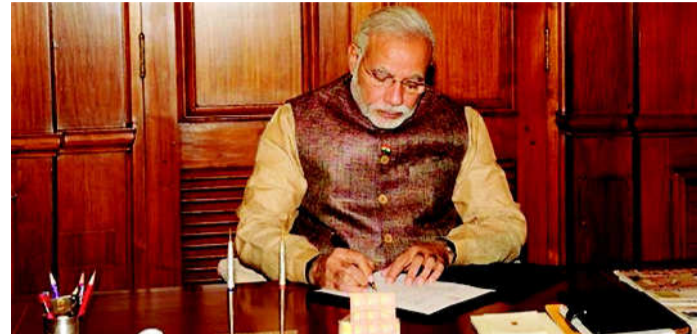
Hyderabad, Mar 16
President Shri Pranab Mukherjee today exuded confidence that India will become a manufacturing hub especially in aerospace technologies in next ten years. He inaugurated the India Aviation 2016 at Begumpet Airport in Hyderabad this evening. He said the country requires 120 billion US dollars during next decade for development of aviation infrastructure in the country. He laid emphasis on linking of small cities and north-eastern states by air services. He further said the country will become third aviation market in the world after the US and China by 2020. He asserted that the country is a

threshold in aviation sector for investments, marketing repair and operation of aircraft. He asserted that Indian aviation is flying high in manufacturing, repair, passenger and tourist growth. Telangana and Andhra Pradesh Governor Shri ESL Narasimhan and Telangana Chief Minister Shri Chandrababu Naidu also took part in the event.

LS approves Constitutional Amendment Bill empowering States to modify SCs list

New Delhi, Mar 16
A bill to amend the Constitution Scheduled Castes Order 1950 was passed in the Lok Sabha yesterday. The Constitution Scheduled Castes Order Amendment Bill, 2016 seeks to give effect to proposals of Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Kerala, Odisha and West Bengal to modify the list of Scheduled Castes. The proposal relates to the

inclusion of certain communities modification and removal of area restriction in respect of certain Communities and exclusion of certain communities in the case of State of Odisha. The Registrar General of India and the National Commission for Scheduled Castes have already conveyed their concurrence to the modifications. Replying to

the debate on the bill, Minister for Justice and Empowerment Shri Thawar Chand Gehlot said, the government has brought several schemes for the upliftment of SCs, STs and OBCs.

The Minister also ruled out any change in the current reservation policy and said the BJP has always supported the reservation for weaker and underprivileged section of the society.

Sunil Chhetri helps Bengaluru beat Myanmar club 1-0 in AFC Cup

Yangon, Mar 16
Captain Sunil Chhetri scored the only goal of the game as Bengaluru FC claimed their first win in Group H of the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) Cup with a 1-0 victory over Ayeyawady United of Myanmar here on Wednesday.

After an even opening first half at Yangon's Youth Training Centre, Bengaluru opened the scoring when Chhetri bundled the ball into the back of the net from 12 yards on 34 minutes. The visitors went in front 11 minutes before the interval when Udanta Singh squared to Chhetri, and although the frontman mishit his left foot strike, the ball bounced past goalkeeper Vanal Hruai into the back of the net.

The home side pushed for the equaliser in the second half, but Yangon were unable to breach the Bengaluru backline as the I-League side held out to move level on points with their opponents.

"Home advantage is quite key as Ayeyawady had not lost a home game in three and a half years," said Bengaluru coach Ashley Westwood after the match.



"But we always knew we'd get chances as they are an attacking side. We have home games to Lao and Ayeyawady. Win both and we have nine points, then we have Johor who will hopefully have qualified by then. The fixtures have been kind to us. It is in our own hands." Bengaluru now are third on the four-team group

India Women begin campaign with big win against Bangladesh

Bangalore, Mar 16
Indian Women's team kicked off their 2016 ICC World Twenty20 campaign in style with a 72-run thumping of Bangladesh in the tournament opener at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium in Bangalore on Tuesday (March 15). Led by a commendable batting performance from their top order - with four of the top-five registering a 35-plus score - India posted their highest ever total in Twenty20 Internationals (T20Is) - a commanding 163/5 from their allotted 20 overs before Anuja Patil and Poonam Yadav picked two wickets apiece to keep Bangladesh to a meagre 91 for 5.

Put in to bat, Mithali Raj and Vellaswamy Vanitha laid the platform with fluent stand worth 62 runs for the first wicket. Vanitha got off the mark with the first boundary of the tournament - an elegant drive through the covers - to close the first over before Raj went on to slam two back-to-back

While the Indian captain played cautiously, Vanitha dealt mostly in boundaries and brought up the fifty for India with a cut past the keeper in the sixth over. Defending champion Novak Djokovic continued his dominance of Philipp Kohlschreiber, winning 7-5, 7-5 in the third round of the BNP Paribas Open on Tuesday. (Read More in Tennis)

Rafael Nadal survived a wild tiebreaker to beat Fernando Verdasco 6-0, 7-6 (9), while two-time champion Serena Williams fired seven aces in a 6-2, 6-2 victory over Kateryna Bondarenko in the fourth round. Djokovic, seeking his fifth title in the desert, beat Kohlschreiber for the eighth time in nine career matches against the German, who had 29 unforced errors. Djokovic had triple match point leading 5-3, 40-love when he missed an easy overhead. He was up a break in the first set when he also dropped serve. "I cannot allow myself any more to react that way in those particular circumstances," he said. "It does stay (in your mind). But it's not the first time that it happens to me, so I think that kind of experience helps," he added.

London calling! Boxing star Vijender Singh aims fifth knockout-win in row



New Delhi, Mar 16
Indian boxing star Vijender Singh will fight his next bout on April 2 in London.

The 2008 Beijing Olympics medallist blew away Hungary's Alexander Horvath at the Liverpool Echo Arena on Saturday to record his fourth successive professional victory.

The 30-year-old, who is fine form will compete in an eight-round fight.

Vijender said that he wants to show the fans in London that what he is all about. "London here I come! I can't wait to fight at Harrow and show the London fans just what Vijender Singh is all about. I've fought around the country in Manchester, Dublin and Liverpool and now I'm heading to the capital for my fifth professional fight. I am aiming for fifth knockout-win in a row," Vijender said.

Nadal, a three-time Indian Wells winner, saved five set points in the tiebreaker and finally closed it out on his second match point when Verdasco's backhand sailed beyond the baseline. "Feel lucky to win the tiebreak, and at the same time I think at the end of the tiebreak I played well with not many mistakes and going for the points," Nadal said.
